



under one roof.

"Our new facility will include training rooms, medical response area, a wellness room, a fitness center, and a conferencing center served by catering, team member café and private dining and kitchen," said Bank Independent CEO Rick Wardlaw. 

That success includes five Division I Academic All-America selections and two team appearances in ASUN Conference Championship games.

The University has also continued its upward trajectory, with enrollment climbing more than 24% since 2018. Currently the fastest growing four-year institution in the state of Alabama, UNA also recently became

a doctoral-granting institution.

Additionally, beginning this fall all 14 of North Alabama's athletic teams will be competing together in the ASUN Conference for the first time.



TORTS v. **CRIMES**

Torts are civil, as opposed to criminal, wrongs. Wrongs can be as varied and diverse, as unique and unusual, as is a person's thoughts and actions.

Torts result in lawsuits when someone is careless in doing or failing to do something like yielding the right of way. The injured person sues for a tort.

A crime is a different kind of insult. It is an insult against the state rather than against some other particular person. It is tried in the criminal courts, which are very different than civil courts.

Criminal cases have their own rules of procedure, a different burden of proof, and are geared towards making sure that an innocent person is not convicted. A tort and a crime may be the result of the same trauma (a hit, an injury, a blow). Our law, based on Common-law traditions, requires separate trials in separate courts.

Personal injury lawsuits arise from a duty to act or not act in a particular way that causes harm to another person. Those duties arise from common-law ideas of what a reasonable person would do under the same or similar circumstances. Driving the speed limit in fog so thick you can't see five feet in front of your car is not reasonable. Sure, you're driving the speed limit, but you can't see and that's not reasonable.

Certain automobile accident cases are governed by statute as well. For every 10 mph there has to be 20 feet of distance between you and the car ahead of you. If there is a rear-end collision that particular statute creates a duty that was breached.

Crimes are statutory in nature. Crimes generally require criminal intent to commit a crime. There are some crimes such as statutory rape that are crimes simply because the Legislature says they are. The age of consent in Alabama is 16 years of age and it doesn't matter if her mother said she was 25 years old and had a birth certificate to prove it. I do imagine the court would take that into consideration at sentencing though.

Active Retirees

If you're contemplating moving into an age-restricted community, finding one that's right for you takes some legwork. While active adult communities generally offer the opportunity for a lower-maintenance lifestyle around similar aged people, they vary enormously. Here's what you should know

Today's active adult communities come in all shapes, sizes and price ranges, ranging from small city-based apartment complexes, to single-family homes, to sprawling resort-style locations situated on a gated golf course. Most are owned by their occupants, but a growing number are rentals. Typically, at least one occupant of each property must be at least 55. It's also important to understand that 55-plus active adult

communities are not the same as retirement or independent living communities, which are primarily designed for older seniors in their 70s and 80s. Active adult communities do not typically include meals or have a central dining area, but many of them do offer a range of recreational amenities and activities.

To help you locate and research active adult communities in the areas you're interested in, the best resource is 55places.com. This is a comprehensive website that provides ratings, reviews and information on activities and amenities for thousands of communities across the country.

Once you find a few you like, here are some questions to

ask yourself that can help you choose:

What's our budget? To help you choose the right active adult community you'll first need to determine what you can afford. Consider the home's purchase price, whether you'll need a mortgage, how much the property taxes and insurance are, and how much the homeowners' association or community fees are.

Ideally, this means having easy access to good doctors and hospitals, and a local airport if you plan to travel much. You'll also want to research how far you'll be from essential services like grocery stores, banks and pharmacies, as well as dining, shopping, and recreational attractions

Schedule a Visit

Once you've narrowed your choices, call to make an appointment and visit them. Be sure to allow plenty of time at each community and, if possible, go back to your favorites more than once. Also be sure to ask questions while you are visiting, particularly about the community rules.

Some developments will let you stay overnight in a model home for a few nights to get a feel of what it would be like to live there. While you are there, try the amenities and activities, and speak with as many residents as you can.

Dear Dave,



What do you think we should do?

Medicare Minute

Medicare Part A Part 2

Last week we discussed how Medicare Part A will cover you if you are admitted into the hospital. A hospital, under Medicare, can be acute care hospitals, critical care hospitals, inpatient rehabilitation facilities, long term care hospitals or mental health care.

The one aspect of Medicare Part A we get the most questions about is coverage at a skilled nursing facility (SNF). To be covered by Medicare at a SNF certain criteria has to be met. First, of course, is you must have Medicare Part A. Next your doctor has determined that you need daily skilled care given by, or under the supervision of, skilled nursing or therapy personnel. Your skilled nursing care will have to be in a SNF that is certified by Medicare.

What a lot of people don't know is that you must have a "qualifying" hospital stay to be covered at a SNF. Under Medicare a "qualifying" hospital stay is at least a 3-day inpatient stay prior to being admitted to the SNF. If you go to the ER and are held one day for observation and are admitted into the hospital for two days this does not constitute a "qualifying" hospital stay. If you are admitted on a Monday and discharged the following Wednesday this is not a "qualifying" hospital stay. In the two examples above those are 2-day inpatient stays. A good rule of thumb is you must be admitted as inpatient for at least three midnights.

You also need to know that Medicare Part A will only cover you for 100 days at a SNF and only 20 of those days are at 100%. In other words days 1-20 are covered at 100%. Days 21-100 you will pay the first \$194.50 per day and Medicare pays the rest of the cost. Starting with day 101 you will pay 100% of the bill.







after filling the litter pan increases odor absorption. After scooping out the waste, the remaining corn litter may be put into the compost or tossed around the yard for fertilization. Ground corn makes an excellent fertilizer with anti-fungal properties. It can also be mixed with water to make a soothing dip for pets with flea or skin allergies. Ground corn may be purchased at feed stores, farm and ranch supply stores. Be sure to ask for ground corn, not corn meal. Kristie in Boerne, Texas



School Bus Safety Tips

It's back to school time, here are some tips about school bus safety rules for children, parents and school bus drivers.

School Bus Safety Facts

- Back to school means taking extra precautions.
- According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), less than 1% of all traffic fatalities nationwide are on school transportation vehicles.
- Every year preventable crashes occur involving school buses.
- Every state has school bus traffic laws, and it is important for everyone to know what those are.

Everything about a school bus is specifically designed for safety the flashing lights, giant mirrors, color, shape and even the high seat backs.

School bus designs and regulations have changed

over the years which helps reduce the risk of injury or accidents for riders.

Safety Tips for Children and Parents

- Review bus stop rules such as waiting away from the road and always crossing in front of the bus, not behind.
- Wait with the little ones at the bus stop. Make sure you and your child are visible.
- Teach your kids to stand, at a minimum, three giant steps from the curb and board one at a time using the handrail when getting on and off the bus.
- Look both ways before crossing the street.
- Look carefully to make sure the bus driver sees them.
- Take five giant steps in front of the bus.
- Cross the street only when the driver gives them the goahead that it's safe.
- Teach your kids to wait until the school bus completely stops before getting off, and always walk in front of the bus, not behind.
- Remind kids to sit quietly while the bus is in motion and follow any additional rules the bus driver has.
- Teach your child the importance of behaving on the bus since any disruption can cause the bus driver to become distracted and could result in a crash.

Safety Tips for School Bus Drivers

- Be aware of your environment.
- Know the neighborhoods you are driving in.
- Be alert and cognizant of the surroundings and of the
- Slow down and prepare to stop if another bus is flashing its lights. This means the bus is preparing to stop (yellow) or already stopped (red), and people are getting on or off.

Safety Tips for Drivers Follow the speed limit and laws especially in school zones and at bus stops.

- Never drive distracted or use a phone or device while
- Pay attention to flashing lights and never pass another vehicle with the stop-arm extended.
- Slow down and watch for children walking in the street, especially when there are no sidewalks.
- When backing out of a driveway or leaving a garage, watch out for children walking or bicycling to school.
