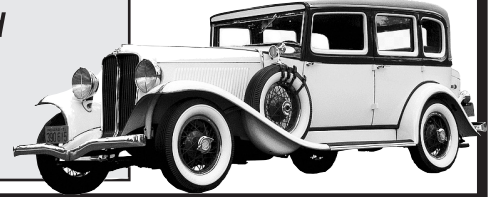

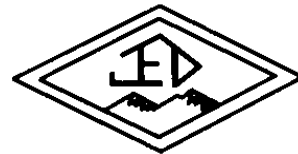

Dear "Speakout",

I am grateful to fellow contributors for taking the time and space to properly digest and respond to assertions made, and I appreciate the opportunity to respond to fellow contributors. I will also gladly avoid being confused with or labeled "a liberal."

While I appreciate fellow contributors acknowledging that the U.S. is indeed not a Christian nation, and other contributors are correct that "separation of Church & State" is not explicitly mentioned in our founding documents (which is why I have never made that assertion). However, many (many.) accounts from the beloved Founding Fathers themselves repeatedly warn against the centralization of any one religion in our governmental structure or behavior. I will save every-one the time of reading repeated quotations of the same.

The presence of biblical language in our founding documents is much more a reflection of the context in which the founders lived (and, honestly, an indictment on its lack of updates in the last few hundred years, something which the U.S. stands unique among developed nations in its age). The support of slavery is also present in our founding documents; ought we abide by this text as well? Veteran Services Director Steps Down

Livingston County Veteran Services Director Jason Skinner served his last day with the County on July 21, 2022, after more than six years leading the County's Veteran Services department.

Skinner first began working with the County's veterans in this role in September of 2015. During his time at the department's helm, he's worked tirelessly to improve the lives of area veterans by fighting for access to benefits, supporting the funding of life-saving mental health resources, and acting as an advocate for veterans as they interact with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

Among his many accomplishments, Skinner said he's most proud of the Veteran Services department's paper-to-digital transition. The office is now 100 percent paperless, with all files being scanned and digitally uploaded directly to the VA, resulting in more efficient and accessible records. Technology upgrades have also given the office the ability to perform virtual appeals hearings directly from the Veterans Services office in Mount Morris. Skinner credits County leadership for his ability to accomplish so much while serving as director.

"I am honored to have served the County in this role and would like to share credit with the Livingston County Board of Supervisors, County Administrator Ian Coyle, and Probation Director Lynne Mignemi for their continued support," he said. "The military instills a sense of responsibility and prepares veterans to become stewards of their community. Public service is a great career path for veterans that want to continue serving honorably, especially with the support of a great employer like Livingston County."

Skinner worked to connect housebound veterans with the VA's Home Based Primary Care team while director. The team provides patients experiencing complex, chronic, progressively disabling diseases with comprehensive, long-term home care. Skinner said this service is life-changing for veterans in need of it, especially in a rural community like Livingston County.

He was also instrumental in the creation of the Livingston County Veteran's Monument, a more than 8,000 square foot memorial in the shape of an American flag, dedicated to the veterans of Livingston County. The monument features 255 red metal poppies, hand crafted by local veterans, which adorn the red stripes of the flag.

Skinner helped negotiate increased funding for the Joseph P. Dwyer Peer-to-Peer Veterans' Support Program with state government during his time as director. His direct advocacy for life-saving peer-to-peer support resources resulted in 150 percent more revenue allocated to each county Veteran Service Agency in New York.

"I join with our County veteran population in thanking Jason for his support and advocacy for veteran's issues," stated Board of Supervisors Chairman David LeFeber. "He's done amazing work during his time here. We're sad to see him go, but wish him all the best in his future endeavors."

Skinner is a veteran of the U.S. Army, which he joined in 2003. He served with the 3rd Squadron of the 17th Cavalry in Iraq, achieving the rank of corporal before his honorable discharge from the armed services. Skinner was recently inducted into the New York State Senate Veteran's Hall of Fame for his efforts on behalf of the state's veteran population.

Beyond his work with the County, Skinner also serves as a New York State County Service Officer Association President, National Association of Counties Veterans and Military Families Vice Chairman, member of the National Association of County Veterans Service Officers, and Finger Lakes Veterans Advocacy Council President.

Livingston County has named Deputy Director of Veteran Services David Terry as the department's Interim Director. Skinner offered words of high praise for Terry's work with Veteran Services.

"Without David Terry none of these achievements would have been possible," said Skinner. "In many cases, David was the backbone of the office's operations."

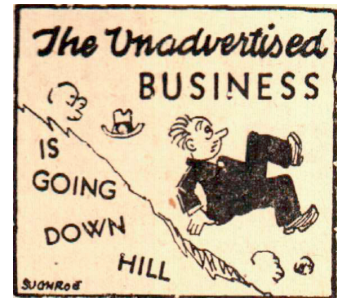

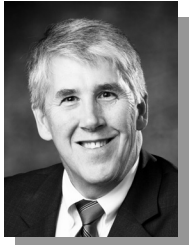

Recently half page advertisements have been run in the Shopper regarding a proposed trailer park expansion. One of those ads note a "July 26" cancelled zoning board meeting. That is inaccurate. There was no meeting scheduled for that date. The applicants requested a public hearing for that date; however, a quorum of board members could not be met for that date, nor could revised project proposal plans be reviewed by the county planning board for that date. The entire process took a couple hours, and no meeting was ever set. Regarding the two other cancelled dates, one was cancelled by the applicants due to not being able to get the requested information ready, the other cancelled due to unexpected lack of a quorum. It would have been a waste of taxpayers' money to hold a meeting just to say that the meeting was cancelled. It also would have been an illegal meeting due to a lack of quorum.

Here is a "Cliff Notes" version of a building or zoning application. [Two separate issues with two different application processes]. First an application is made to the Code Enforcement-Zoning Enforcement Officer. He then approves or disapproves the application. If the applicant chooses, he can either modify the application to meet code requirements to get approval or submit an application for zoning board review . . . if it is a zoning matter . . .The zoning board reviews the application [sending it to the county planning board if required] and makes the decision after a public hearing. There are two types of meetings: public meetings, which are relatively informal, and public hearings, which are more formal and require notice to landowners and possibly local government offices as needed. Public Hearings include public input. Even public meetings must be posted under New York's Public Meetings Law.

The zoning board may issue a variance. There are two types of variances: "use variances" and "area variances." Use variances are very hard to approve. In 2019 no use variances were issued in New York State. [Source: New York State Department of State]. The applicant receives a formal notification of the hearing results. The zoning board acts as a "pressure valve" from overly strict enforcement of codes by a case by case review by a citizen volunteer board. For instance, the board can take into account unusual circumstances associated with a property, [ie: slope, springs, etc.] to make a fair and just decision, while preserving the quality of life for the community.

When it comes to family planning, prenatal care can be easy to overlook. But prenatal care is one of the most important factors in having a healthy pregnancy, both for women and their babies. Proper prenatal care means that problems can be identified early and appropriate treatment administered as soon as possible.

Whether you are planning for pregnancy or already pregnant, there are ways to take care of yourself and your future family members:

- Eat a healthy diet, including fruits, vegetables, and whole grains.
 - Exercise regularly; about thirty minutes per day is recommended. Regular exercise can lead to easier recovery after childbirth.
 - Take at least 400 micrograms of folic acid every day to help prevent against certain birth defects.
 - See your health care provider as soon as possible after becoming pregnant so they can set up a schedule for your prenatal care.
 - Avoid tobacco, drinking alcohol, and taking drugs. Many of these substances can affect fetal development and may even lead to premature birth.
 - Talk to your health care provider about any vaccines you may benefit from during pregnancy.
- Following these steps can help both you and your child have a healthy beginning.

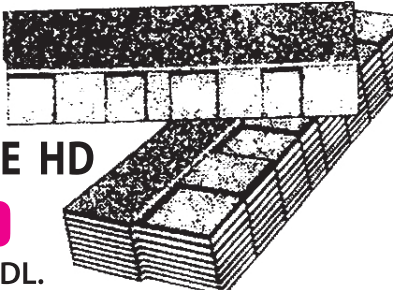

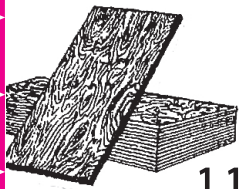

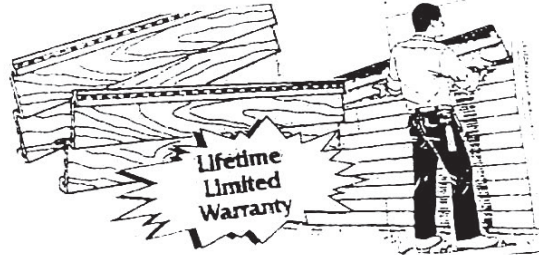
