GORHAM, ME (August 8, 2022) -- Absentee ballots are now available for request for the November 8, 2022 Annual Municipal Election and State Election. You may request an absentee ballot by visiting http:// www.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl, or by calling the Town Clerk's office at 222-1670, and one will be sent to you when available.

Absentee ballots must be returned no later than 8pm on Election Day. You can return your ballots by mail (two stamps required) or drop them off in the Ballot Box at the Municipal Center.

You may also return you ballots in person to the Town Clerk's Office during regular business hours.

We will mail your ballot to you once absentee ballots arrive (around October 8)

October 10 – Absentee voting begins If you requested your ballot, we will mail it to you. If you would like to vote absentee in person, you may do so at the Town City Clerk's office, starting Monday, October 10 and any time the Town Clerk's office is open: Monday-Wednesday, 8:00am-4:00pm, Thursday, 8:00-6:30 and Friday, 8:00-1:00.

October 18 - Last day for Registrar's office to receive mail-in voter cards

After this date, voter registration changes and enrollments must be done in person

Beginning October 24 thru November

You may vote absentee in the Council Chambers at the Municipal Center, October 24-October 28; Monday - Wednesday, 8:00am-4:00pm, Thursday, 8:00am-6:30pm, Friday, 8:00am-1:00p, and October 31-November 3; Monday-Wednesday, 8:00am-4:00pm, Thursday, 8:00am-7:00pm.

November 3 - Last day an absentee ballot may be requested without special circumstances

November 8 - Election Day! All polling places will be open from 7:00am-8:00pm.

Absentee ballots must be returned to the Town Clerk's Office by 8:00pm. New voters may register to vote and vote at the polling place on Election Day.

Newsmakers, Names & Faces MaineHealth, Partnering Institutions Awarded \$20M Grant

PORTLAND, ME (August 8, 2022) - The National Institutes of Health (NIH) has announced a five-year, \$20 million research grant to the MaineHealth Institute for Research (MHIR) and its partnering institutions, the University of Vermont and the University of Southern Maine, to expand the transformative work of the Northern New England Clinical and Translational Research Network (NNE-CTR) in improving community health through biomedical research in rural New England.

The NNE-CTR was established five years ago to give researchers in rural communities the tools they need to develop and implement innovative medical treatments for chronic diseases common in Northern New England such as cancer, heart disease, obesity, diabetes, Alzheimer's disease and substance use disorder. Principal Investigators Cliff Rosen, MD, Director of the NNE-Center for Clinical and Translational Research at MHIR, and Gary Stein, PhD, Chair of the Department of Biochemistry at the Larner College of Medicine at the University of Vermont, established a set of research cores to support clinical and translational research in Northern New England, with one focus being the engagement of rural providers and practices in research. Some of the pilot projects that researchers developed, such as using telemedicine to quickly identify newborns at rural hospitals who need treatment with therapeutic hypothermia, have now become standards of care in

Once the COVID-19 pandemic became a threat to health throughout the region, the NNE-CTR also supported the NIH-funded RECOVER study of long COVID, a study of COVID-19 vaccine hesitancy, as well as the National COVID Cohort Collaborative registry that shares clinical data as a part of national COVID research.

"In just a few years, we are seeing the impact that access to clinical research has on rural communities," Dr. Rosen said. "This new grant will help us build on this success and do more to address health equity and disparities encountered by at-risk populations."

Funding from the new grant will allow the NNE-CTR to invest in professional development for young researchers, new pilot programs to develop innovative disease treatments, community engagement throughout Northern New England, and improved data collection and research navigation capabilities. The NNE-CTR also is focused on ensuring that the research reflects Northern New England's diversity in race, gender and socioeconomics.

"The MaineHealth Institute for Research is invested in improving the health of all members of our community," said Liz Jacobs, MD, MPP, Vice President for Research at MaineHealth. "We appreciate that the NIH recognizes the importance of engaging our rural and at-risk populations as we search for treatments to chronic disease in our region."

Maine's Congressional delegation has shown strong support for the NNE-CTR and biomedical research in the state

"We welcome this funding, which will help spur the advancement of treatments, means of prevention, and cures for diseases that affect nearly every American family as well as improve the delivery of health care in rural communities. The establishment of this consortium five years ago has already yielded a number of benefits for Maine patients, and its continuation is a true credit to the skilled scientists at the MaineHealth

Institute for Research and its partnering institutions, including the University of Southern Maine," said Senators Susan Collins and Angus King in a joint statement. "By helping to foster collaboration among researchers and implement innovative medical treatments, this investment will help us conquer so many diseases that take both an emotional and financial toll."

My daughter, Elizabeth, has a friend, Patrick Thornton, who is a member of The Boothbay Country Club, and knows how Liz and I love flowers, have our own gardens, and travel to flower garden tours in Lewiston, Auburn, Portland, South Portland, Brunswick, Bath, to mention a few, and any other place we hear about. He wanted to surprise us with tickets to the Boothbay Country Club's flower garden reserved for its members and their guests.

We were thrilled and looked forward to the date. It was like no other garden tour we had been on where we wander through flower beds, appreciate the flowers, take pictures and sometimes stop at flower shops or stands on the way home to buy more plants!

It was mid-June and we entered the Boothbay Country Club, gave our tickets and were told the tour was ready to start outside the front door. We went out to where a small group of 5 of 6 women were waiting. But what we saw surprised us. They

were all holding open notebooks with pencils of pens poised on the page. What a picture!

Liz and I glanced at each other, realizing we were unprepared and these women must be serious gardeners! We stood straighter and prepared to listen intently. Seconds later, the Club's Horticulturist, Karen Neill arrived. She welcomed us to the Horticultural Educational Tour!

We learned about Karen's job. She works full time and has help. Each year the garden beds are dug up and the bulbs are stored. A color and flower theme is chosen every year and is repeated throughout the beds.

Karen talked about fertilizing techniques, plant combinations, and how to "save" a plant that is not doing well. Karen gave us several tips and tricks for our gardens. The women had several questions about their own gardens and Karen was able to answer in detail so everyone was satisfied.

This year's theme featured a riot of color with

Karen designs and lays out a plan over the winter and presents It to her manager, the Director of Operations. If it meets with his approval, it is presented to Paul Coulombe, Owner of the Boothbay Country Club. Paul is particular and has his hand in mostly everything. He gets final approval on everything, down to wine glass choices and flower beds.

Karen has learned Paul does NOT like yellow so there are no yellow flowers. He does like orange, however, and big showy flowers. Paul Coulombe is a native of Lewiston and is well known there as the owner of White Rock Distilleries which he sold and then purchased The Boothbay Country Club which is one of the top five golf clubs in Maine.

As Karen continued her educational tour, we admired the beautiful flower garden beds, and many, many beautiful trees along the winding paved roads. Karen spoke of each flower or tree and answered questions as we walked along.

Directions and Parking

Directions

The main launch site for the festival is Simard-Payne Memorial Park (formerly Railroad Park), off Oxford Street in Lewiston.

From Points North Take the Maine Turnpike (I-95) to Exit 80, Lewiston. At the light, turn left and follow ME-196 W/Lisbon Street downtown (about 2.5 mi.). At the intersection of Lisbon Street and Main, turn left. At the next light, turn left onto Lincoln Street. Si-Memorial mard-Payne Park is located off Oxford Street, one block over from Lincoln

From Points South

Take the Maine Turnpike (I-95) to Exit 75, Auburn. At the light, turn left and follow US-202/ME-4/ ME-100/Auburn (Washington Street and Minot Avenue) for about 4.75 mi., to the intersection with Court Street. Turn right onto Court Street. Cross the bridge into Lewiston. Take the first right onto Lincoln Street. Simard-Payne Memorial Park is located off Oxford Street, one block over from Lincoln.

Parking

Ample parking is available in the downtown area and in several lots adjacent to the festival grounds. Many non-profit organizations will be raising money for their organizations by offering parking for a donation. This parking will be located around the Bates Mill and along Lincoln Street in Lewiston. The City of Lewiston is graciously donating the use of these areas to the non-profit organizations. This does not include the parking lot across from the Franco Center on Oxford St.

Handicap parking is available just over the bridge, inside the main gate to Simard-Payne Memorial Park. The Auburn Municipal Parking Garage also has many handicap spaces.

Balloon Ride Information



Balloon rides are available for 6 launches throughout the weekend. Morning flights launch at 6 a.m. and evening flights lift off at 6 p.m.

All balloon rides are free-flying and go where the wind takes them. Balloons range in size—from 2 to 10 passengers. Whatever the size of your group, we can find a balloon to fit your needs. At the end of each balloon ride, there will be a champagne toast to celebrate your adventure.

The earlier you book, the better the selection. Availability

What are hot air balloons made of? The bag or envelope is made of a reinforced fabric called rip-stop nylon (some balloons are made of dacron). The material is very lightweight but very strong. The fabric is coated to prevent leaks.

What are the baskets made of? The baskets are made from rattan or wicker. The material is lightweight and very durable. Each basket is individually woven by hand.

How fast does it go? As fast or as slow as the wind. Since the balloon has no forward propulsion system, its speed is determined entirely by the speed of the wind. That is why balloon competitions are strictly for accuracy, not for speed.

How high does it go? The balloons will fly from ground level to anywhere from tree level to a couple of thousand feet above ground level, depending on wind direction and speed.

When is the best time to fly? Usually just after sunrise and one or two hours before sunset. This is the

time of day when the winds are calmest and the air the most stable.

How long can the balloon stay up? It depends. Normally, the balloon carries enough fuel to remain aloft for 1 to 2 hours, but factors like outside air temperature, the weight being carried in the basket and weather conditions determine the duration of the flight. Our pilots try to get in at least 45 minutes of airtime each flight.

What kind of fuel is used? Propane is kept in pressurized tanks in the basket. The balloon carries 30-40 gallons of liquid propane. It is carried under pressure through flexible hoses to the burner. When the valves are opened, the propane atomizes and is ignited by a pilot light in the burner. The flame may shoot out as much as ten to twenty feet, making a loud whoosh.

How do you get back? With the help of friends, who drive a chase vehicle. The chase crew will follow the flight of the balloon (as well as existing roads allow)

and should be on hand to make the recovery when the balloon touches down.

What should I wear? We recommend wearing casual clothing and comfortable shoes. Consider light layers of warm clothing so you can easily adjust to the temperature as the sun comes up. The coolest you will be is on the ground. Once you're in flight, the burners tend to keep the baskets nice and warm.

DISCLAIMER:

Due to weather conditions, the best times for balloon launches are 6 a.m. for morning launches and 6 p.m. for evening launches. Launches are always weathered permitting and times may vary depending on conditions.

The Moonglow (hot air balloons tethered and lit up with propane) is scheduled for Friday night (usually at dusk) after the balloons return from the evening launch. If the weather doesn't allow the Moonglow show on Friday night there will be one on Saturday night instead.

The first impression that comes to mind when we see hot air balloons is the free spirit and grace of floating where ever the wind decides to take you. But there is much more to a hot air balloon launch and flight than just riding the wind.

Hot air balloons are considered aircraft and are regulated by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) just as fixed-wing aircraft are. Hot air balloon pilots must pass a yearly in-flight certification to maintain his or her license as a commercial pilot. The Great Falls Balloon only invites pilots who have met these qualifications.

The balloons themselves must pass a yearly safety inspection which includes testing the fabric of the balloon, fuel system, integrity of the basket, burners, and all other related equipment before the balloon receives its annual airworthiness certificate to fly.

Unlike fixed-wing

aircraft, a hot air balloon is dependent upon fair weather. Ideal conditions are calm winds below 8 mph and cool temperatures. Since wind and heat come with the sun, the ideal time for a balloon to fly is early in the morning before the sun gets too high in the sky and in the early evening as the sun begins to descend. The exception to this rule would be wintertime flying when the sun is less intense.

To inflate the balloon, pilots use inflation fans to fill the balloon with outside air. This process is called cold packing. When the balloon is inflated enough the pilot uses his burner to heat the inside air to approximately one hundred degrees warmer than the outside temperature. This is when the balloon takes shape and is ready to fly on a new adventure.

It is the heat inside the balloon that makes the balloon rise. If the outside air temperature is too high, the pilot would need to add more heat to the balloon to compensate. High heat can cause damage to the fabric of the balloon. This is why balloons rarely fly in the heat of the day.

Hot air balloon pilots are always aware of the weather and the function of their equipment. The safety of the people in the basket is a top priority for the pilots always have the final say in whether the conditions are right for them to fly.

The experience that our visitors get at the Great Falls Balloon Festival is rare in the ballooning world. At most festivals, spectators are not allowed in the area where balloons are launching.

However, this upclose-and-personal venue also poses some challenges. Our main launch site is small. Our visiting balloons are huge. Our visitors are smitten. But our pilots and crews need space. A lot of it. They also need to be able to see and hear each *See* Guest Guide, *page 12*

Based at Simard-Payne Memorial Park in Lewiston-with additional entertainment

and food offerings at Festival Plaza in Auburn-the festival attracts approximately 100,000 visitors throughout the weekend. The Androscoggin River and rocky Great Falls provide a picturesque setting for the dozens of balloons that visit each year, including some special shape balloons. With free admission, hundreds of thousands of dollars raised by participating non-profits and economic impact in excess of \$2,000,000, it's easy to see why our community eagerly anticipates the festival each year.

Balloon launches are scheduled for 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily, weather permitting. When the balloons aren't overhead, there is still plenty to do: dozens of food booths offer everything from lime rickeys to taco salad, pancake breakfast follows the morning launches, craft and trade booths invite browsing, a children's area with games,

a bounce house, and face painting and live entertainment on two stages. Carnival rides, a parade, and demonstrations various and contests round out the weekend's events.

other to keep themselves and everyone else on the field safe.

Maintaining a safe environment is a top priority, and it is crucial to the future of the festival.

Below are some things to keep in mind when visiting the festival: THE BIG 4:

Don't Smoke. Our visiting balloons carry tanks full of propane gas. Due to the obvious fire hazard created by the use of propane gas, as well as the risk of damage to the balloon envelopes, smoking is prohibited.

Don't bring your dog. Or your cat, or bird, or snake. With the exception of service animals, NO PETS of any kind are allowed on festival grounds.

Don't bring your wheels. This includes bikes, skateboards, scooters, roller skates, and unicycles. The level of foot traffic on the walkway around the park is very high, especially at launch time.

Don't drink. No alcohol is allowed on festival grounds.

LAUNCH TIMES AND SITES Launches are sched-

uled for 6 am and 6 pm throughout the weekend and are always weather permitting. This includes wind and clouds as well as more obvious conditions like rain and lightning.

In the event of questionable conditions, Our Balloonmeister will wait as long as they can in hopes of a turn for the better. However, a launch decision may be delayed by up to an hour if weather conditions are changing. Ideally, the balloons will launch by 6:45 p.m. This time frame provides a fair ride for our passengers and gets everyone back on the ground before we run out of daylight.

Simard-Payne Memorial Park in Lewiston is our main launch site. Additional launch sites may be added if needed.

SPECIAL SHAPE BALLOONS

Specials fly only in the morning. At our evening launches, the special shape balloons will inflate and stay at the field to glow for the crowd. They are large, complex, and hard to pack up in the dark.
