Crop comments: Avon again leads the Crop to start the season. The five-time defending Region 6 champs look to make it six in a row. The Eagles will look to take a step forward after falling to Akron Hoban for the fourth time in the Division II playoffs. Will 2022 be the year they take the next step? The Eagles will have to deal with a competitive Southwestern Conference. ... Olmsted Falls, which shared the conference title with Avon in 2021, is bringing back two All-Ohioans on offense, Rocco Conti and Dominic Rivera. after making a run to the regional semifinal. ... Avon Lake defeated the Eagles in the regular season. However, the Shoremen fell to the SWC's Berea-Midpark (7-5) and Midview the next two weeks after, leading to a first-round exit in the playoffs. ... Elyria played its first season in the SWC, finishing in the middle of the pack. The Pioneers look to build on a season in which they earned the 10th seed in Division I, Region 1. They fell to seventh seed Cleveland Heights, 29-22,

in devastating fashion. ... Expect a tight race for the GLC Western Division title between Elyria Catholic and North Olmsted. The Panthers are coming off a regional final appearance in Division V. In 2022, Elyria Catholic bumps up to Division IV, as it returns numerous All-Ohioans on both sides of the ball, including quarterback Brady Cook and running back Levi Ellis. Finding a replacement for 6-foot-7 wide receiver Jack Kenneally is a tall order, but Colin Ginley caught six touchdown passes for the Panthers and will be returning for his senior year. ... North Olmsted has a nice duo with quarterback Xavier Balson and wide receiver Jared Kelley, who were All-Ohioans in 2021 and will return for their senior seasons. The Eagles look to become top contenders for the GLC crown, which Rocky River took under the new conference format. ... The Pirates lost a lot of seniors, including quarterback Braedon Spies and Matt Wilhelm Award winner Tommy Bebie. But they are still capable of being competitive in the GLC West along with the Demons in Westlake and the Rockets in Bay. Flip-flopping from Division IV to Division V are the Keystone Wildcats. They'll be without 2021 Golden Helmet Award winner Gideon Lampron, who impacted both sides of the ball. However, their offense still has star power with Ryne Shackelford and Konner Roddick coming back to become top contenders for the Lorain County League. The good news for Keystone is that it doesn't have to play in Region 14 in Division IV as they fell to two eventual state champs and state semifinalists Port Clinton in the past three seasons.

Elyria Catholic ready to run it back

Core seniors are aiming for Panthers' fourth state crown

There is an empty extra space next to Elyria Catholic's three football state championship banners at Dan Reaser Stadium, as if it's reserved for another Panthers team to reach the mountaintop.

Could 2022 be the year for Elyria Catholic? The senior class has nine players who started as sophomores. Panthers coach Brian Fox saw their potential from the start.

Now that potential is coming together for one more year. They are returning five All-Ohioans, at quarterback, running back and on defense after an 11-3 season with a Division V regional final appearance.

"I think that it's about really bought into the program and everything that coach Fox has been doing and preaching. I think us buying into (the process) has really become big for us," said running back Levi Ellis.

Every year, the Avon seniors have a rock signing day to mark a new year for Avon football.

It is painted over the previous senior classes to represent the legacy they bring to the program and touched by players before heading out to every home game under the lights.

"The significance of (the rock signing) is to remember the tradition of all of the guys that led (Avon football) before you and the responsibilities that come with carrying it forward," said Mike Elder, Avon's coach. "We do have great culture and it is built on tradition and responsibility to our school and our community. I think these (seniors) are such a great group and are going to embrace that type of culture and protect it."

The culture Elder and the Eagles have built since 2007 has resulted in 11 Southwestern Conference titles, a state runner-up (2008), and five straight Division II, Region 6 championships.

With all that success, the one that has eluded is a state championship — especially with D-II powerdefeated the Eagles, 30-24, in a state semifinal.

Avon's out-of-conference schedule includes traveling to Florida on Aug. 19 to face Stratford from South Carolina. Avon then plays Division I regional semifinalpowerhouse Glenville before squaring off against Avon Lake in Week 4.

"With our first four games, we recognize that if we don't play well, we will be 0-4. So, we have to come out of the gates ready to go," said Elder.

He won a BCS national championship in college and the Super Bowl with the Green Bay Packers during his sevenyear NFL career.

RB Jakorion Caffey, Jr., Avon: Caffey is a returning second-team All-Ohio selection for Division II and the state semifinalist Eagles. He rushed for 1,478 yards and 24 touchdowns. Caffey is described as a complete running back who can make

plays when handed the ball or thrown to. He has multiple Power 5 offers and will look to get more.

WR Ryne Shackelford. Sr., Keystone: Over the summer, the four-time state champion sprinter committed to Purdue. He is a thirdteam All-Ohioan who had 49 receptions for 522 yards and eight touchdowns.

RB Rocco Conti, Sr., Olmsted Falls: Was a finalist for the 2021 Wilhelm Award, earning SWC Offensive Player of the Year honors along with Division II District Offensive Player of the Year.
