#### **Agriculture Politics**

TO: Honorable Thomas J. Vilsack Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, D.C.

#### Dear Sir,

My friend, Buba Peterson, over at Donaldsonville, GA, received a check for \$1,000 from the government for not raising hogs. So, I want to go into the "not raising hogs" business next year. What I want to know is, in your opinion, what is the best kind of farm not to raise hogs on, and what is the best breed of hogs not to raise? #### **BAKED FRIED OKRA**

#### 6 Servings Ingredients

- 1 pound okra ends trimmed and sliced
- 1 egg
- 1/4 cup low-fat buttermilk
- 1 teaspoon hot sauce
- 1/2 cup cornmeal
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- cooking spray

#### Instructions

1. Whisk together egg, buttermilk, and hot sauce in a medium bowl. Add okra and stir to coat well. Let sit while you prepare the other ingredients.

2. Combine cornmeal, flour, paprika, salt and pepper in a ziptop bag

3. Spray a baking sheet with cooking spray and preheat oven to 425 degrees.

4. Toss about 5 to 6 pieces of okra at a time into the bag and shake to coat with cornmeal mixture. Place coated okra on baking sheet and repeat with remaining okra.

5. Spray okra well with cooking spray and bake 25 to 30 minutes, stirring halfway through.

6. Season to taste with salt.





#### **OKRA STEW WITH SPINACH & CARROTS**

#### 8 Servings Ingredients

- 1/3 Cup Olive Oil
- 1 Large Onion; Chopped
- 6 Carrots
- 2 Lbs. Okra
- 6 Oz. Tomato Paste
- 1 Lb. Fresh Spinach
- 3 Garlic Cloves; Chopped
- 2 Tbsp. Better Than Bouillon Vegetable Paste
- 1 Tsp. Salt
- 4 Cups Water
- 1/4 Cup Fresh Parsley
- 3 Garlic Cloves; Chopped
- 1 Tbsp. Allspice; Or use 1 ½ Tsp. Ground Cloves
- 1/2 Tsp. Black Pepper
- 1/4 Cup Water For Slurry
- 1 Tbsp. Cayenne Pepper For Slurry
- 1 Tsp. Cayenne Pepper; Optional

#### Instructions

•

1. Chop the onions, carrot, garlic, and parsley. Set aside. Over medium high heat in a skillet, add the oil. Once heated, add the carrots and onions. Cook for 5 minutes. Add the okra. Stir and cook for about 25 minutes. Use the spoon to mash the okra as they become tender.

Cover with a lid and continue cooking for 10 minutes. Stir to avoid sticking at the bottom, and continue to mash with the spoon. This process should take about 5 minutes. Cover and cook for additional 10 minutes.

Remove the cover, and add in the tomato paste. Stir well to combine. Then add ½ cup of water.

2. While mixing, add in the spinach a little at time until you have used half of the spinach bag. Add in 1 ½ cups of water. Cover and allow to cook for about 10 minutes to allow the spinach to wilt.

Uncover, stir and add in the remaining spinach. Next, add in the parsley and garlic. Add in the remaining 2 cups of water. Cover and cook for about 10 minutes.

3. After 10 minutes, uncover, stir, and add in the spices, cayenne pepper, and vegetable paste. Stir well, then add the slurry. Cover to simmer over medium heat for an additional 15 minutes over medium heat. Serve over white rice or with yellow yams.







#### **OLIVE OIL ROASTED OKRA**

#### 3 Servings Ingredients

- 1 lb. fresh okra
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt (or ½ teaspoon sea salt)
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder Instructions



degrees. Line a large rimmed baking sheet with foil.

2. Rinse the okra and dry it on a clean kitchen towel. Trim the ends.


3. Place the okra in a large bowl and toss with the olive oil, salt, pepper, and garlic powder.

4. Transfer the okra to the prepared baking sheet. Roast it until lightly browned and tender, about 20 minutes, stirring halfway through baking. Serve immediately.

#### **CREOLE OKRA**

#### 4 Servings Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- ½ large onion, chopped



- ½ green bell pepper, chopped
- 1 (16 ounce) can diced tomatoes in juice
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub> teaspoon dried thyme
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- ¼ teaspoon cayenne pepper
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 (16 ounce) package frozen cut okra

#### Directions

1. Heat the olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Saute the onion and garlic until limp. Add the green pepper; cook and stir until tender. Drain the tomatoes, reserving juice, and pour them into the skillet. Season with thyme, parsley, cayenne, salt, and pepper. Simmer for 5 minutes over medium heat.

2. Add the frozen okra, and pour in enough of the reserved juice from the tomatoes to cover the bottom of the pan. Cover, and cook for 15 minutes, or until okra is tender.

#### 2 cups okra cut in round pieces

Ingredients

- 1 1/4 cups self-rising
- 1/2 cup all purpose flour
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup onion finely
- 1 1/2 cups buttermilk
- Salt & Pepper (Optional)
- 1 cup oil

#### Instructions



 In a large mixing bowl with a spoon mix together all ingredients except okra and oil. Fold in the okra. Heat the oil in a large skillet. Drop by spoonfuls into the hot oil. (I use a 1/4 cup measuring cup for each fritter). Fry on one side about 2 minutes or until good and crusty, turn and fry the other side. Drain on paper towels. Slather with butter and enjoy

#### FRESH CORN SAUTE WITH TOMATOES, SQUASH, & FRIED OKRA


#### 4 to 6 Servings

#### Ingredients

- 1/2 cup yellow cornmeal
- 1/4 teaspoon (or more) cayenne pepper
- 12 okra pods, cut crosswise into 1/2-inch pieces
- 6 tablespoons olive oil, divided
- 2 cups fresh corn kernels (cut from about 3 ears of corn)
- 6 baby green pattypan squash, each cut into 6 pieces
- 2 garlic cloves, chopped
- 1 12-ounce bag cherry tomatoes, halved (2 cups)
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro
- 2 green onions, chopped

Mix cornmeal and 1/4 teaspoon cayenne in small bowl. Add okra and toss lightly to coat. Pour okra into sieve and shake off excess cornmeal.

Heat 4 tablespoons oil in heavy large skillet over medium heat. Add okra and sauté until coating is golden brown, stirring occasionally, about 6 minutes. Using slotted spoon, transfer okra to paper towels to drain; sprinkle with salt and pepper. Wipe out skillet. Heat remaining 2 tablespoons oil in same skillet over medium heat. Add corn, squash, and garlic; sauté 2 minutes. Add tomatoes; cover and cook until squash is crisp-tender, about 5 minutes. Mix in okra, cilantro, and green onions. Remove from heat. Season to taste with salt, pepper, and more cayenne, if desired.

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

Colossians 4:6 When you talk, you should always be kind and wise. Then you will be able to answer everyone in the way you should. (ERV)



Use our words to bring out the best in others.

Being always careful with our words, because once they are said, they can be only forgiven, not forgotten. People may not remember what you said, but they will remember how our words made them feel.

Every word we say will have an effect on others. Positive words will encourage and strengthen other people, but negative words will tear down and harm them. You must decide whether to speak positively or negatively.

## Speak without thinking, and your words can cut like a knife. Be wise, and your words can heal. Proverbs 12:18

Words have energy and power with the ability to help, to heal, to hinder, to hurt, to harm, to humiliate, and to humble. *Proverbs 16:24 Kind words are like honey; they are easy to accept and good for your health.* 

Please understand that speaking positively requires a deliberate decision, whereas speaking negatively comes easy, for it is human nature. Therefore, actively strive to speak positive and encouraging words to others. *Ephesians 4:29 When you talk, don't say anything bad. But say the good things that people need—whatever will help them grow stronger. Then what you say will be a blessing to those who hear you.*



\*\*There are so many newcomers arriving in our area and we welcome you! Of course, you may be wondering how to grow things in SE Alabama?" If you seek out the local Extension agents and Master Gardener groups in your county, you'll find them more than willing to share information to get you started. This gardener came from a tropical



climate of South Florida, with two seasons: wet and dry! I knew nothing about growing in clay soils, in seasonal changes, with a combination of heavy rains, high temperatures and droughts. Not to mention plants and shrubs and grasses completely foreign to me! But going to Master Gardener meetings and meeting such friendly folks and then taking the Master Gardener Course, I learned so much!

\*\*What do you know about butterflies? These lovely "flying flowers" have an important role in our gardens as pollinators, swooping from one plant to another, pollinating the plants on the way to help them develop flowers and bear fruit. There are so many amazing things to learn about butterflies, and as Debi Breedlove, Secretary at DABG announced at our August Master Gardener meeting, the Dothan Area Botanical Gardens (DABG) has just opened it's Wings of Wonder butterfly house. Or make your own with equal parts potting soil (without fertilizer!), perlite, sterile compost, and worm castings which keep the mix light and nutritious. 
