SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speakout",

The Silent Pulpit.

I am truly saddened with the lack of response of all the ministers, church leaders and congregations in our area not responding to my encouragement to submit their views. This is a direct indication of "silent pulpits" and "apostasy" in our area churches.

Apparently, our area churches are asleep as the pulpits are silent. Jesus Christ commanded us to go into all the world. "And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature." Mark 16:15 KJV.

Jesus did not say to only preach the Gospel to those people who enter our church buildings. I recently was told by a church leader if people want to hear God's Word preached, they need to come to her church. Jesus did not say to wait until people come into a building to hear His Word but that we are to go into our culture.

During the first century people wrote to one another with events they experienced to inform and encourage one another. We tend to limit the scope of our influence to our small congregations when we could be impacting thousands each week with the Gospel. Area churches could reach 100 times as many people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ if they utilized the "Speakout". The Church in the first century grew at an astronomi-

The Church in the first century grew at an astronomical rate because the disciples went into all the known world of that day with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. People are hungry and thirsty for encouragement in their lives. This is a very difficult time in history to live and we need each other's encouragement to persevere and exist. Wherever I go people are complaining about issues which affect them. When I suggest "speaking out" in the "Speak Out" section, they repeatedly tell me that their input would not change a thing and would be a waste of their time.

Most of us today are suffering in one way or another whether it be from loneliness, depression, difficulty paying our bills, medical issues, unemployment, drug issues, family problems and many other things. Some are even considering suicide as a solution. The "Speak Out" section could help so many people get through the problems in their lives if only we would utilize this wonderful platform. I very much appreciate Lauren Berger for her articles and especially our area Amish community who have expressed their avid interest in my "Speak Out" articles.

Lord willing, see you again next week.

Board of Supervisors Approves Use of ARPA Funding for Capital Improvement Plan

The Livingston County Board of Supervisors approved the distribution of \$2,775,000 as part of its multi-year spending plan of one-time federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) stimulus monies.

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 is a federal bill passed by Congress and signed into law by President Biden on March 11, 2021. It was created to support projects that provide for economic resiliency and enhance communities negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Livingston County government is slated to receive approximately \$12,200,000 from ARPA over two distributions, with a requirement that all funds be spent by the end of calendar year 2024.

Following its meeting on August 10, the Board of Supervisors announced commitments to numerous initiatives as part of the County's Capital Improvement Plan. Using ARPA funding, significant updates will be made to Al Lorenz Park, the Government Center Complex in Geneseo and the Mount Morris Campus, Information Technology and further efforts will be made to strengthen the County's emergency response infrastructure.

"Through federal funding received from the American Rescue Plan Act, Livingston County will be able to make investments in critical areas that may have previously gone unfunded," added Livingston County Administrator Ian M. Coyle. "With these investments, the County will continue to bolster its abilities to serve the residents of Livingston County in an impactful way."

As part of its Capital Improvement Plan, the County will begin working on the following initiatives:

• \$800,000 to the Central Services Department to make significant improvements to the electrical infrastructure on the Mt. Morris Campus including a secondary feed. The current infrastructure dates back to the 1930s when parts of the campus were originally constructed.

• \$700,000 for a Livingston County Information and Technology Services plan to further improve network infrastructure, increase storage capacities, construct new servers and improve the overall end-user experience.

• \$675,000 to the Central Services Department to upgrade parking lot lighting, replace curbs and to repave the Government Center Complex in Geneseo.

• \$500,000 to Central Services to install electric feeds and lighting at AI Lorenz Park.

• \$100,000 to the Office of Emergency Management to improve and strengthen the Livingston County emergency response infrastructure through improvements to the EMS facility.

The announcement marks the latest distribution of funding through ARPA as the County approved five initiatives earlier this year. Those transfers were used to enhance broadband technology, community development, tourism, mental health resources and more.
