

This month's photo really captures some major Elkhart Lake history.

The excursion boat is the "Hope" operated by WP Schwartz Boat. It was steam powered. The picture is from around 1900 because the "Hope" was scrapped when gasoline power came about. Probably 1910-1920.


One of Mr Schwartz's children was Ben. He captained boats on Elkhart for many years after his father. He's a bit of a legend himself. Before captaining he did other things including being in WWI. I was fortunate as a kid to have known him. As a 6 or eight year old kid I remember him telling me worldly

stories and giving me exotic coins from his travels. I still have a post card he sent me in 1964.

Behind the "Hope" is the Villa Gottfried. Erected in the 1880's and sadly torn down in 1946. It was built by a Chicago brewer of German descent named Mathias Gottfried in the form of a German castle. You can also see the top of the bandstand/gazebo that was built off shore. I think he liked to have fun!

Finally in front is a row boat probably rented from Mr Schwartz's business. I think that's Tom Wiese rowing the boat.

Elktoberfest Result of Partnership

When Elkhart Lake celebrates its inaugural Elktoberfest on September 23-25, it will culminate the efforts of a successful partnership between the Elkhart Lake Chamber, Elkhart Lake Tourism and a talented group of Lakeland University marketing students.

Folks in Elkhart Lake have been talking about creating a new fall event for several years. As the village emerged from the COVID pandemic, the idea of an Octoberfest-type celebration took shape.

When Elkhart Chamber Executive Director Melissa Koehler got a message from Lakeland marketing teacher Kim Viglietti searching for a project for her marketing management course, the planning kicked into high gear.

"Lakeland's interest could not have come at the more perfect time," said Kathleen Eickhoff, executive director of Elkhart Lake Tourism. "This was an amazing gift. It gave us an opportunity to have some young minds about the age of people we're trying to bring into the village help us come up with new and fresh ideas."

Viglietti, a resident of Elkhart Lake, was searching for a hands-on learning project for her spring capstone class that would allow her students to take the knowledge they had acquired from previous classes and put it all together in a real-world situation.

She divided her 15 students into small groups, and the class delivered a complete marketing plan with financials, logo ideas, a plan for the weekend's activities and targets for attendance from local and non-local visitors. Lakeland students researched Octoberfest celebrations held all over the world, and generated ideas to match Elkhart Lake's goal of hosting a family friendly event.

"We came into their class three times," said Koehler, who worked as director of Lakeland's Milwaukee Center from 2002-07. "The first time we talked through the event and shared information about Elkhart Lake. The second time was a and various children's activities, and SwitchGear Brewing Company's annual party and festivities. The weekend closes with a fall community breakfast on Sunday morning.

Students helped write a successful Travel Wisconsin JEM Grant application, a process that Eickhoff said requires significant research and ideas that will show the grant selection committee



brainstorm session with several members of the planning committee, and the last time the students presented their plan. Many times, we shared ideas back and forth via email directly with students."

Elktoberfest weekend begins with a stein social and community prost featuring beer from Elkhart Lake's brewery, SwitchGear Brewing Company. Live music will be featured throughout the village during the weekend.

Saturday brings a day full of fall activities for the entire family – 5K Wine & Beer Run/Walk, traditional Oktoberfest games for adults, the Root Beer Garten an event that's unique and worthy of funding.

"The work the students did was very inspiring," Eickhoff said. "They really brought some exciting and clever ideas that we think were a big reason we got the grant. The root beer garden was a key component which was their idea and we loved it."

Skylar Garza, a member of the class who graduated in May and is working as marketing manager at Above & Beyond Children's Museum in Sheboygan, said the experience helped her learn she loves event planning. "There is something almost breathtaking watching ideas that were scribbled on the whiteboard come to life," Garza said. "This experience also taught me that not every idea or concept makes it to the final draft and that's okay."

As part of their research, Garza and a group of fellow classmates drove through Elkhart Lake to learn more about the community and draw some inspiration.

"The class worked together like a real project management team or marketing team would in order to complete a project," Garza said. "We did a lot of work, however, it didn't feel like it. Our class collaborated extremely well making the workload less stressful and overwhelming."

Garza said the project allowed students to demonstrate they understood how skills they learned in the classroom translated to real-world situations.

"Lakeland is always offering unique experience for students," Garza said. "Kim Viglietti, specifically, uses her connections, knowledge and talent to ensure her students are prepared for postgraduation and I am so thankful for the opportunities she has created for me."

Viglietti said she hopes to work with Elkhart Lake in the future after they delivered a perfect opportunity for her students to learn.

"I'm very proud of these students," Viglietti said. "This was the cream of the crop and we put our best foot forward."

Why I volunteer for Glacial Lakes Conservancy

I grew up in Green Bay, WI and spent most of my childhood outdoors. Behind my house, my brother and I would spend our days exploring the woods and all the wildlife that lived in it. My parents encouraged our curiosity, although my mom did have to regularly enforce her rule of "no critters in the house!" I spent many years in Boy Scouts where I continued to experience Wisconsin's natural areas. A few years after graduating college, I met a group of people at a weekly birding club. I quickly got hooked on birding, which led to my growing interest in conservation opportunities in my community.

My early volunteer experiences with GLC were removing invasive plant species on properties and participating in Birdathons. Last summer, I was excited to dig out my waders to support the turtle monitoring project at Willow Creek. My favorite part about volunteering is hanging out with the wildlife, and GLC provides excellent resources for learning. I enjoy working with the naturalists that come to our properties and share their knowledge. The more I learn, the more exciting it is to be part of an organization that works to protect nature.

As a new member of the GLC Land Management Committee, I am starting to help perform land surveys. Many of the land owners have spent decades planting trees, controlling invasives, and monitoring the wildlife to ensure that their land continues to support our native species. I admire the patience that goes into maintaining these properties, plus the trust they have in GLC to protect this land forever.



Over the past two years, we have all been forced to reevaluate our domestic surroundings as sources of encouragement, delight, and, curiosity that we once sought elsewhere.

Artists have always drawn inspiration from their homes. Sarah McEneaney and Lydia Ricci mine the objects and events that animate and populate their everyday lives to highlight the constant presence of exciting potential in seemingly ordinary circumstances.

Through her daily practice of meticulously painting images of her home and studio,

and the happenings within those spaces, McEneaney examines the rich opportunities for reflection that abound around us. She, and her pets, inhabit a lushly colored and detailed haven where activities and events such as drinking water and a rainstorm unfold into poetic moments of meaning.

Ricci's miniature objects, made from hoarded paper and cardboard, act as standins for emotionally charged experiences and relationships. Their diminutive scale provides a safe distance for contemplation of the difficult situations or memories they contain.

Sundance Farm to host Horse Trial in Plymouth, Wisconsin!

A unique opportunity for horse-interested spectators is coming soon. Riders from IL, WI, IA, MN, KS, ND, MO, and NE, will be competing for top honors in the Midwest.

The Sundance Farm Horse Trials will be taking place September 30-October 2, 2022. This is a nationally recognized competition approved by the United States Eventing Association. Riders will begin the competition on Friday, with dressage rides in three rings. This test requires riders to do specific maneuvers on horseback showing the communication of horse and rider throughout the ride. Riders wear black coats, light colored breeches and tall black boots. Dressage begins at 8:00am



On Friday afternoon and Sunday, riders must switch equipment and apparel to compete in the next phase of the competition. This would be the stadium jumping which is held on the grass. The colorful course of jumps is situated on reasonably flatterrain, however there are some hilly rolls and dipstothe course that add challenge to conquering the jumps. All the poles sit on shallow metal cups. If the horse happens to lightly rub any of the jumps the poles will fall down and the competitor will garner 4 penalties per jump. Horses are also penalized for refusing jumps or for doing the course too slowly. Equipment for this phase includes protection for the horse's legs and helmetsfortheriders. The saddlesarealso different as they help place the rider more forward for staying over the horse's center of gravity for jumping. Some horses and riders have difficulties with bright fences, while others have problems with the wider oxer jumps, or the combinations that require the horse to jump, take two strides and immediately take a second jump. The morning starts with the more advanced levels where the jumps are higher and wider. There are also more jumps and the optimum time is shorter. Stadium jumping begins at 11:30am on

time is required, so again, riders must keep up the pace and cut corners where they can.



While riders are permitted to walk the course as many times as they want, beforehand, the horses are not allowed to see the course ahead of time. Trust between horse and rider is a big part of this day's competition. Horses wear protective leg gear. Riders are required to wear protective helmets and vests. It is traditional for competitors to outfit themselves and horses in a specific color theme. All the equipment and rider attire will be the same color, so leg wraps match saddle pads and protective vests making for ease of spectators to identify their favorite rider.

This particular horse trial, while only in its 9th year, is becoming known for the bright triangular Sargento cheese wedges that the horses must jump over, along with the Bank First National Picture Frame jump that the upper level horses must jump through. Various stone wall fence lines have been cut through to offer better gallops on course and a path through the hollow is now available for easy viewing by spectators. The Sundance Farm Horse Trial has been featured in the National Eventing magazine as an 'Up and Coming' attraction in the Midwest. 



As this will be my final update, I would like to recognize and thank all members of the District for their continued hard work, contributions and dedication. At




ELGS, we are very fortunate to have a staff and school board who work diligently as a team, joining together to

The State of Wisconsin sets standards that all communities in the State must be valued at 100% of market value or be kept within 10% of that value. The Village has fallen below these standards. The last revaluation was done in 2008. The Village has contracted with Grota Appraisals to have all properties assessed at 100% of market value as of January 1, 2023. Grota has sent letters out to all property owners about the process. The Village has approved an exterior inspection process only. Grota has been busy with this project over the last month. They have visited a majority of the lake properties and now will begin with other residents and commercial properties. Even though the work is being done now, these values will not be in effect until the December 2023 tax bill. A badge with photo ID will be worn by assessment staff while in the field. LABOR DAY – GARBAGE PICKUP DATE CHANGED & VILLAGE OFFICES CLOSED

A reminder that garbage collection will be one day later when we are celebrating a Monday Holiday. For Labor Day week garbage pickup will be on Tuesday, September 6, 2022, due to Labor Day. The Village offices will also be closed on Monday, September 5, 2022 due to Labor Day.

VILLAGE WATER SYSTEM

The Village hired a contractor, who spent the last few months cleaning one of the Village's wells and also providing pump refurbishment. This well had not been cleaned since it was originally put into service in the early 2000s. This cleaning should help to improve water quality. The Village is working on putting together a longterm maintenance plan for both wells and water towers.

2021 WATER CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT AVAILABLE

The Village is always testing its water for contaminants. In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the EPA prescribes regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The Elkhart Lake Water Utility annually files a Consumer Confidence Report about the water quality in the Village. GOOSE ISSUE

The Village is aware that there is a goose issue in the Victory Park Subdivision. They are making a mess on the sidewalks and roads in this area. We are working with Werner Homes on options to help with this problem. We will be trying a few methods this fall to try to keep the geese near the pond. These include having a fake coyote in the area, tying string at a few levels to keep the geese from crossing onto the sidewalks, and leaving some areas of the grass longer. We will continue to work with Werner Homes on a longterm solution.

YARD WASTE DUMPSTER

The yard waste dumpster is unattended. We have installed a new set of stairs that will make using the dumpster easier for residents. Please follow the signs about using the dumpster, you are on camera. If you require assistance, we ask that you set up an appointment with the public works department (920-876-2231), so someone can help you. The dumpster is provided at the Village garage from the end of May through October. This dumpster is for yard waste only, not lake waste. A truck for large brush or trees can be obtained by calling the Village garage at 920-876-2231.

We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.


All Saints Chapel Joins Chamber

New member of the Elkhart Lake Chamber, All Saints Chapel at N7902 CTH P, is a mission chapel of Grace Episcopal Church in Sheboygan, that continues to serve Elkhart Lake residents, visitors and many others for services, weddings and other religious events and recreational expeditions.

Built in an English country style, All Saints Chapel was built by the Hayssen Family with the help of Grace Episcopal Church of Sheboygan and consecrated in 1951. Since then, the chapel has offered services from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend to Elkhart Lake locals and tourists and has also offered weddings and other religious services throughout the year by appointment. Auxiliary clergy are called on to officiate most of the services at the chapel, but the Head Priest/Rector of Grace Episcopal is also the head priest of the quaint, stone chapel.

Alongside the services, visitors are welcome at any time to enjoy the peace and beauty of the chapel and





property for prayer, meditation, landscape painting and photography.

The property at one time, prior to being acquired by Grace Episcopal, had a hunter's cabin. Currently, that area of the property has St. Hubertus Hall for gatherings, named after the patron saint of hunters. The chapel also has a leaded glass window dedicated to the saint, depicting a crucified Jesus on a stag's antlers. The chapel celebrates St. Hubertus Day in early November with a Blessing of the Hunters. This year's blessing of hunters and their gear is scheduled for Saturday, November 5 at 11 a.m.


Prior to being recognized as a saint in 743, Hubertus was born in 656 in what is modern-day France. The son of a duke, Hubertus loved the outdoors and spent time hunting, even on holy days which was considered sacrilege, and was known as an expert bowman.


After his wife and hunting companion died during Holy Week in 684, Hubertus went hunting on Good Friday. While hunting, he had a vision of the crucifix between a stag's antlers and was told by Jesus Christ that he needs to find purpose and comfort in hunting, but more importantly by serving the Gospel.

Hubertus then committed to the Gospel, giving his

wealth to the poor, his titles to his brother and became a priest. He shared the Gospel among country people and hunters and took care of the poorest in the countryside and was considered a wise steward of the forest and wildlife. He became the Bishop of Liege, and in 727 died peacefully.



MHA Lakeshore Holding Walk



September is National Suicide Awareness Month, and Mental Health America Lakeshore-MHA Lakeshore-will be holding their seventeenth annual There is Hope walk on Saturday, Sept. 10 along Lake Michigan at Deland Park.

MHA Lakeshore's annual walk for suicide awareness and prevention is their largest educational fundraiser event. According to their website-www.mhalakeshore.orgover 500 people participate in this event that supports people that have lost a loved one to suicide, and brings the community together to help make a difference around suicide awareness.

Following the success of 2021's virtual event of 550 local, national and international participants, this year's event will be in-person and virtual to allow participation from anywhere. With every donation and participation in the event, the proceeds will benefit MHA Lakeshore's access to services, support services for families and individuals in Sheboygan County and beyond and strengthen the programs MHA has to offer. The funds will also help increase mental health education and stigma reduction.

According to information from MHA Lakeshore's executive director, Julie Preder, suicide is a public health epidemic. It is the twelfth leading cause of death in the United States and the second leading cause of death between ages 15-24. Adding to the sobering information is that 130 people each day on average will take their own life and 1.2 million people attempted suicide in 2020 alone.

Sheboygan County had the highest suicide rate ever recorded in 2021, and MHA's services have increased over 500 percent since the beginning of the pandemic.

Among the events MHA Lakeshore has planned, there is also a community suicide awareness class scheduled at Ebenezer Church, 3215 Saemann Ave., Sheboygan, for Oct. 5 at 6 p.m. to help recognize the signs and symptoms of suicide. Those interested in the class can register under the event on their website.

Serving Sheboygan County since 1953, MHA Lakeshore-formerly known as Mental Health America in Sheboygan County-is a nonprofit mental health resource agency with suicide prevention as the foundation of their work.


