

Medicare Minute Medicare Part A & B

The past couple of weeks we have discussed Medicare Parts A & B in detail. These are the two parts of Medicare that are received through the federal government. This week let's review what we have discussed.

Although Medicare Part A and Part B are great programs that cover a lot of services there are some things Medicare does not cover. They include most dental care, eye exams related

to prescribing glasses, dentures, acupuncture and hearing aids. Medicare Part A is primarily used to cover your inpatient care. Part A has a \$1,556 deductible for each benefit period, meaning the deductible can be applied more than once in a calendar year. This deductible covers hospital services, including semi-private rooms, meals, general nursing, drugs as part of your inpatient treatment, and other hospital services and supplies. Part A is "free" to most Medicare beneficiaries. 'Free" meaning you may not have to pay Medicare to have Part A. It does not excuse the deductibles and co-insurance.

In most cases Part B is used to cover your outpatient services. These include visits to your primary care physician and/or specialist. It also may cover transportation by ambulance, durable medical equipment, preventive services and mental health treatment. Part B also entitles you to an annual "Wellness" visit to a qualified provider. Most Medicare beneficiaries joining Medicare Part B for the first time in 2021 pay a monthly premium to Medicare of \$170.10. Part B has an annual deductible of \$233 and a coinsurance the beneficiary pays of 20%, after the deductible is met.

To cover the deductibles and coinsurance that Part A and Part B have you would need to look at some type of supplemental policy sold through private insurance companies. These include Medicare supplement plans or Medicare Advantage Plans. If you want to study Part A or Part B in more detail you can look at previous Medicare Minute articles or give our office a call and we'll be glad to discuss this with you.

school and UNA girls' and boys' basketball and volleyball games for over 50 years.

Shirley used her artistic talents to help Grady put on great events, from the Harlon Hill Banquet to receptions in the Sportsman's Club at UNA games," said lifelong friend, Betty Burdine. Grady Liles passed away in March 2013, leaving Shirley a widow. After Grady's death, Shirley continued to attend all of UNA games and remained an active member of the Sportsman's Club.

Shirley was Miss Deshler High in 1954, head cheerleader, and a member of the Vanity Club, but her passion was tennis. Shirley played several days a week and was known by many to be one of the best tennis players in the Shoals. She was still beating young players when she was in her 50's. Standing 5' 11" and stunningly beautiful, Shirley rarely went unnoticed. However, there are things that many people never knew about her.

Shirley is an artist. She can see many things most people overlook. She loves nature and all its splendor. When Shirley and Grady built their home, she had it built high on a bluff and refused to remove any trees other than those needed to build her house. Every day she still faithfully feeds the wild animals she shares her land with. She has a second-generation hawk that will wait patiently for her every morning. Her bird feeders are never empty, and birds always have a clean bath from which to drink. While other people sit in front of a television all

day, Shirley is enjoying God's perfect creation. She thanks Him every day for the beautiful life she has been given and for her blessings He has

bestowed upon her. Grady and Shirley never had children of their own. However, Shirley's brother, Tom Hendrix, had three sons, Danny, Trace, and Tommy. They each recall how Grady and Shirley were very active and attended nearly every game and activity they had. Later, as they had children, it continued.

Danny and his wife Deborah recalled that Shirley's support of family goes back for decades. She and Grady Shirley's never missed a wrestling match when Danny was wrestling at Coffee. They traveled all over to attend his matches. Years later they were like a set of grandparents to Jay Mark, their son. They made it to basketball, soccer, baseball games, and a few band concerts. When Jay Mark was very small, Grady and Shirley would pick him up and go out to eat and attend fun

events. He would come home with all sorts of treats and gifts, and they always had some of those for him to bring mom and dad, too.

"There were times when Shirley would take a day off work herself to keep Jay Mark while Deborah and I both worked, and he could not go to the babysitter,' Danny recalled.

Deborah also commented on how Shirley's talents extend various to creative "She areas. creates beautiful custom flower arrangements for her church and for many different occasions. Deborah said. "Shirley created all the flowers used in Jay Mark's wedding, from the bridal bouquet to the boutonnieres. Things like this happened often, from what we all hear."

Trace spends many hours a week helping Shirley with tasks since Grady has passed away. Shirley doesn't know what she would have done





Dear Renaye, It's completely understandable that your mother-in-law moving in tightened things up for you guys—to a point. But it also means some changes have to be made in terms of the day-to-day finances around your place. You're going to have to sit down with your husband and separate the wants from the needs.

The good news, Renaye, is that with a budget you can analyze, in detail, the need to cut expenses, generate extra income—or both. But for this thing to work, you've got to create a little margin. Because if you continue to just wander along without a plan, you're going to have a real mess on your hands.

going to hurt a little to change but you simply have to ditch those addresses. Why? Because ABCA fed you to the lions years ago. The lion may not have feasted on you yet, but it's coming.

I often deal with people who get locked out of their ABCA email accounts. Sometimes it's because they fell for a phishing scam because ABCA doesn't bother to filter that stuff. Sometimes it's the result of a massive attack on insecure ACBA servers that reveal millions of usernames and passwords. ABCA

often doesn't give users a handy way of recovering their accounts so that, once a scammer has hacked an account, they have unlimited use of your email address for years to come and there's not a darn thing you can do about it.

These things happen because ABCA doesn't care about you one bit. ABCA technicians perform the absolute minimum to keep the email servers running. That often means the email is running on older hardware and software. Making it more secure costs money that they are unwilling

to spend. Their spam filters are completely worthless. ABCA doesn't make a dime off your email so they don't care if you become a scam victim.

There are so many free alternatives to ABCA that offer world-class spam filtering and other perks. My picks for free ones are Outlook.com, Gmail. com, and (if you are an Apple/ Macintosh user) iCloud. There are plenty of excellent paid services (i.e. Proton Mail, Fastmail) that are beyond the scope of this article. If privacy is a priority for you, you should do a little research on these paid services.

Lastly (and I'm sorry but this may sting a little), when a website such as Netflix is hacked and your username and passwords are revealed to the scammers of the world, those with ABCA addresses

will go to the top of the target list. That's because an ABCA address indicates that you are not very tech-savvy, and are probably old and thus more likely to be manipulated by scammers.

I know that moving away from one email address to another can be a cumbersome, tedious experience but you really should prioritize this. I have a bit of an "easy button" that we will discuss in my next exciting installment.

Wrongful Termination

We get calls all the time from people who tell us they were fired for the wrong reason. The problem with that is there are very few wrong reasons. We had a lady who had a great job making over \$150,000 a year who refused to get a COVID shot. They fired her. A lot of people would argue that's not a valid reason. She didn't even get unemployment.

We have people call who get in arguments with co-workers that they didn't start or really even

participate in who were fired. We have people call who were let go for no reason or the wrong reason.

There's not anything that the court system can do in those situations. Private employers can fire people in the State of Alabama for good cause, bad cause or no cause at all. That's the law.

Alabama has never expanded worker's rights beyond those protected under the United States Constitution or other federal law except for in one particular situation.

That particular situation is a restriction on employers who may not fire an employee for asserting an on the job injury claim. If an employer fires an injured worker because they asserted a worker's compensation claim, that's a dandy lawsuit and we'd like to have it. Oddly enough, the worker's compensation part of that case is tried only by a judge, while the retaliatory discharge case is tried by a jury.

The law often doesn't make sense. For instance, the law in all of its wisdom forbids the rich as well as the poor from sleeping under bridges. Employees can quit a job anytime for any reason. By the same token, employers can fire an employee at anytime for any reason except race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, certain disabilities and on the job injuries. The Federal Government's EEOC website is quite informative.

that is troubling. After all, a popular publication used it. It's the carelessness of such a hasty posting and not seeing the entire image, one he insists he would not have posted.

Maybe it's just the skeptic in me or some graphic arts background. The row of black dots on the beige background doesn't hide on a totally red, beige, and blue image unless one is paying little attention and rushing to make a point. 





She dipped a brush in the jars, painted on her fabric and was instantly won over. "When you put color from the ground on fabric, it looks quite different from synthetic dye," she said. She used clay dug from the vibrant Alabama dirt for fabric dye in her batik paintings. While Alabama is known for its deep, red clay soil, Schulman's batiks include shades of red,


yellow, brown, pink, purple, gray, and green. native of Franklin County, she said her home area has provided a wealth of clays. At one site, she was able to collect about 25 colors in an area about the size of a football field. "I use only water and clay. You can't mix it like paint. If you do, you get mud.'

"It started as a whim, but I kept working that way," she said. "You can't really imagine until you see a synthetic dye

next to a clay dye, and one of them just looks like it's alive." Her technique eventually earned a spot for five of her works in the permanent collection of the Smithsonian Institution National Museum of American History.

The subjects of Schulman's paintings include flowers, musical instruments, animals. landscapes, people, and abstract designs. Often, she said, she doesn't set out with a specific image in mind but just starts putting down colors and waits to see if anything jumps out at her. "When I did the first batik I loved it." Schulman said, "And you would have to love it to do it because of the time it takes and the mess it makes." For many years, Jean Schulman graced us with her presence and support. She is truly missed.




