

SPEAK OUT!!!

Dear "Speak Out",

I take issue with Ron Powell's rampage against pastors who do not reply to his articles in this publication. Most pastors I know do not have a lot of discretionary time - they are busy taking care of the myriad of responsibilities relating to their congregations and the community at large. Many pastors now serve two congregations and I know of one who serves 4. They are not retired like he is.

I would also like to thank Lauren Berger for introducing me to the concept of the Overton window, and Ad Fontes Media/Media Bias Chart. We usually cannot see our biases until someone points them out to us, and as uncomfortable as it is, we can begin

to see things from different angles.

Now for a comment on socialism, brought up by both Chris Norton and Lauren. While the concept of workers owning the means of production sounds good, there will always be flaws in the practical working it out. I think the ESOP concept is a really great one – Employee Stock Ownership Plan, because there is incentive for making the business be successful and profitable. The idea of each employee having equal say in how a company or manufacturing plant operates only leads to chaos. I also disagree with Lauren's comment in the July 17th Shopper we have no educational, childcare, unemployment, healthcare. or physical... infrastruc-ture." Really? The Rochester Business Journal Schools Report Card that came out in June 2022 is a very scary report. For example, the Rochester City Schools spend almost \$20,000 per student per year, teacher pay is almost in the top third of 59 districts, yet they are 3rd in student absenteeism rate, last in Regents Diplomas awarded, last in 4th grade English competency at 20%, and Math at 4%. These problems are not due to lack of money. Where is individual student responsibility demanded? The people I know who receive Medicaid are well cared for, and I see governmental agencies offering free childcare for working parents in our area. I see more job postings than are being filled, and yet I see healthy young people graduating from high school who are unwilling to get jobs; they live off "the ' Even John Smith found this a problem when he established the Jamestown, Virginia Colony in 1609. He addressed the colonists with these words; "Countrymen, the long experience of our late miseries I hope is sufficient to persuade everyone to a present connection of himself, and think not that either my pains nor the adventurers' purses will ever maintain you in idleness and sloth...the greater part must be more industrious or starve... You must obey this now for a law, that he that will not work shall not eat (except by sickness he be disabled). For the labors of forty honest and industrious men shall not be consumed to maintain a hundred and fifty idle loiterers." (He is quoting from II Thessalonians 3:10 written by the Apostle Paul.) Even Vladimir Lenin quotes that Bible verse in his 1917 The State and Revolution, explaining that in socialist states only productive individuals could be allowed access to the articles of consumption. This part of socialism makes sense.

As to whether Jesus subscribed to socialist ideals? Chris referenced a lot of passages, and I will reference a couple more. The parable of the talents in Matthew 25:14-30 tells of a master entrusting his servants with 5, 2 and 1 talent(s) "according to his ability." (He did not see them as having equal ability, although we like the quote in our Declaration of Independence that says, "all men are created equal" — a different concept altogether.) Some of the points in that parable are that success is a product of our work. (Adam was given a job, to tend the garden...he didn't just sit around all day.) Also, we are held accountable for our work. (The parable of the minas in Luke 19: 11-26 is very similar.) On the other hand, we have the story of the workers in the vineyard in Matthew 20: 1-16 in which each worker is given equal pay whether he worked all day, or just one hour. These are difficult concepts for those who think they have Jesus figured out!

Again, Paul in II Corinthians 9:12 (from The Message version of the Bible) admonishes us, "Carrying out this social relief work involves far more than helping meet the bare needs of poor Christians. It also produces abundant and bountiful thanksgivings to God. This relief offering is a prod to live at your very best, showing your gratitude to God by being openly obedient to the plain meaning of the... (continued)

Message of Christ." I have heard it said that if Jesus visited most churches today, he would still be rejected because of his radical message. We need to be very careful that we don't choose to practice "churchianity" over "Christianity."

I am just glad that we still have the freedom graciously given in this Shopper, and are able to learn from each other. Ron, as a suggestion, it would be helpful if you used a more modern version of the Bible for your quotes. Fewer people relate to King James English and I think you are losing a lot of potential readers by insisting on that version over a more lucid one for today's readers.
