

Dear "Speak Out",

It's always heartening to see a full page of those speaking out and expressing their opinions — especially when folks can identify common ground. Despite the constant effort of so many for-profit endeavors to divide us, we actually have a lot more in common with each other than most of us ever will with someone in D.C. or on national television.

I so appreciate Carolyn's validation that yes, reflecting on our own biases is often very difficult, especially if we are not aware of them. Recognizing that we have a bias does not always or immediately make us incorrect, but examining other viewpoints gives us more perspective and learning new information presents the opportunity to grow, which might even mean changing our minds. Contrary to some reductive political grenades of "flip-flopping," evolution with the embrace of new knowledge is good, actually.

I disagree with the sentiment that funding is the whole of educational infrastructure, because as Carolyn points out the Rochester City Schools are clearly struggling with myriad issues although funding doesn't appear to be one of them. When I envision comprehensive infrastructure it does include funding, but also supportive environments for students material and emotional needs; addressing generational poverty and trauma; and community mutual aid.

My friends and loved ones who qualify for Medicaid are indeed receiving good benefits; I wish more of our tax dollars went to such helpful programs (including WIC). While I've known many who have struggled I cannot recall anyone who lived well – or beyond "ends barely meeting" while on financial support programs.

I think people do want to work – but they want their work to matter. They want to be compensated fairly, they want to earn enough to support their families. The majority of job vacancies I've seen do not offer sufficient wages and benefits. I'm also unable to forget that nearly half a million members of the American workforce died between March of 2020 and March of 2022.

Carolyn made another good point – that any economic system, whether the people own the means or not, there will be flaws in the practical executions, because human error is always a factor. None of us can say for sure what economic system would lead to sure-fire prosperity for everyone. But one thing most of us can absolutely agree on is that this economic landscape – for-profit healthcare, housing crisis, rampant inflation, food insecurity – is not working for us, and hasn't been for a long, long time.

On another note, it's difficult for any of us to fathom a nuanced take of the complex dynamics in the Middle East, particularly with Israel and Palestine, and dangerous to gloss over the twists and turns in the evolution of the apartheid state. However, I also think it's important to note that not a single 9/11 hijacker was from Iran.

I appreciate Carolyn Pollock's comments. But I'm surprised she's against workers making the decisions in a business. It has worked, and is working, in many, many co-ops across the world. That's called democracy. When workers don't make the decisions it's a dictatorship of the boss.

Speaking of dictatorial bosses, I purposefully avoided interpreting any parables in my letter, but since Carolyn Pollock offers her interpretation I'd like to offer mine. To me, the parable of the talents is about a mean boss who makes his money through lending at interest that gets mad at his servant who saved the boss's millions instead of earning interest. Charging interest is always derided as an evil practice over and over and over in the Bible.

To me the parable doesn't say anything about working hard (lending your money so it can earn interest isn't exactly hard work). To me, it shows that bosses who earn their money through usury aren't nice and it asks the listener to decide which side they're on- the boss or the servant who is punished.

As far as Matthew 20:1-16: to me this parable is, like the Prodigal Son and others, about a topic Jesus criticizes again and again - resentfulness. The other vineyard workers resent those who get the same reward as them but Jesus seems to be saying that all people are equally deserving of God's love (& ours).







The New York State Buy American Salt Act legislation is a win-win in so many ways for our region

The Greater Rochester and Finger Lakes area relies on governmental policies that support local employers who create good paying jobs, provide critical domestic supplies and whose operations support other businesses and local governments. Current State policies force municipalities to honor the lowest bid, resulting in contracts awarded to foreign rock salt companies. In many cases, the competing bids can be as close as a few cents per ton. More and more, foreign rock salt companies have moved to undercut the domestically sourced market, importing product from sources having substandard or non-existent environmental, health, safety and workforce standards from places like Chile and Egypt. It is not a level playing field for American salt mining companies. Salt mining is a generational vocation for many people living in Western and Central New York. Salt mining has provided a prosperous living for hundreds of New York State miners, truck drivers, and railroad workers. It has been a major economic driver in the State for decades. This is now being threatened by foreign importers.

At the moment, Governor Kathy Hochul has the opportunity to approve new legislation designed to protect the jobs of American miners here in her own State. This year, legislation entitled the "Buy American Rock Salt Act," sponsored by Assemblyman Harry Bronson (D-Rochester)

and State Senator Tim Kennedy (D-Buffalo) passed both houses and currently awaits Gubernatorial approval. With co-sponsorship from Assemblywoman Marjorie Byrnes (R) and State Senator Patrick Gallivan (R), the Act passed with overwhelming bipartisan support. Simply put, the legislation empowers the municipality by providing the option to choose rock salt mined in the United States, eliminating the requirement that municipalities must go with the lowest bid. To be clear, the legislation does not prohibit foreign suppliers from importing rock salt, or limit their ability to bid the market in any way. There is not a tariff on imported salt, or percentage preference for American mined rock salt. What the legislation does do however, is provide the municipality the right to choose salt that is mined in the United States of America.

The New York State Buy American Salt Act legislation is a win-win in so many ways for our region. By securing good local jobs, strengthening our domestic supply chain, lowering costs for local governments and maintaining a critical, locally sourced product to keep our roads clear and safe during our area's harsh winters, approving this legislation just makes total sense. In the spirit of the Labor Day holiday, our hope is that Governor Hochul will <u>not</u> VETO this legislation, and she will continue her support of New York State Labor and the American Miner!







September Marks National Preparedness Month

Every September, National Preparedness Month is observed around the country to raise awareness about the importance of preparing for disasters and emergencies that could happen at any time.

This year's theme is "A Lasting Legacy: The life you've built is worth protecting. Prepare for disasters to create a lasting legacy for you and your family."

Officials from the County's Department of Health and Office of Emergency Management are encouraging residents to make a plan to prepare for potential disasters starting with a simple emergency preparedness checklist. The checklist can be used to create a disaster supplies kit for the home - a collection of basic items a household may need in the event of an emergency.

"A good rule of thumb is to check your kit when you change your clocks for daylight saving time, replace expired items and update the items as your needs change," added Livingston County Public Health Director Jennifer Rodriguez. "Since you do not know where you will be when an emergency occurs, prepare an emergency supply kit for your car, too."

Examining a range of possible disaster conditions with family members and what to do in each situation is also an important step, said Office of Emergency Management Director Andrew Brodell.

"Discussing a range of possible disaster scenarios with family members and what to do in each situation is also an important step," he added. "Make sure your family has a plan and practices it often. There's a certain level of chaos that often accompanies emergencies so having that plan in place that you've already carried out before can be key to surviving a potentially life-threatening situation."
