

Why I volunteer for Glacial Lakes Conservancy

My first encounter with the Glacial Lakes Conservancy came through my employer, the John Michael Kohler Arts Center. The Art Preserve of the JMKAC adjoins the Willow Creek Preserve in Sheboygan, and once I visited that property, it became my personal mission to advocate for our neighborly relationship, and for the land and wildlife that GLC cares for. When I spend time on the Willow Creek Preserve, which is truly an "urban oasis," it is as if I have been plucked from the noisy city and dropped into a place of quiet introspection. The nearby stores and passing cars are shut out by maple and birch trees, and the birds overhead provide better viewing than what I would see scrolling on my phone. It feels wild yet safe, secluded yet accessible, a perfect entry point for anyone wanting to abandon their devices and obligations for just a little while. With the creek healing and invasive plants being removed, this preserve is sure to only become more inviting and beautiful in the coming years.

As a member of the Outreach Committee, I am able to stay in the know on upcoming GLC happenings and promote them to my colleagues and the community at large. It is gratifying to lend my voice to an organization that affects positive change not only through hard work, but through fun and play as well! GLC staff understands that people need to experience nature in many different ways in order to form a personal connection to it, which explains the diversity of public events offered every season. Some are more passively educational, some are more about simply experiencing the ambience, some involve physical work, and some are for socializing. There is truly something for anyone and everyone who wants to commune with nature or get on board with conservation and preservation efforts.

I have only just begun to familiarize with all that GLC does, and all the properties that they protect.



With so many sites to see around Wisconsin, and so many events and initiatives to be involved in, it may be years before I have seen and done it all! One can have that type of relationship with the Glacial Lakes Conservancy—a relationship of longevity, investment, and growth. I look forward to a future of gaining knowledge from expert naturalists, birders, and conservationists; I look forward to feeling proud of my contributions to fundraising and public awareness; and I look forward to enhancing the wellness of plants, animals, and ecosystems through good old-fashioned grunt work. I never thought I'd need to own a pair of waders, but now it seems silly not to!

I have no doubt that the exciting things happening

with GLC will bring more and more newcomers to the organization. When they do, they will find the same passion that captured my attention and keeps me coming back for more.

Sheboygan Symphony Orchestra Announces Season of New Beginnings, **Extraordinary Music**

The Sheboygan Symphony Orchestra's 104th season has been dubbed A New Beginning for good reason. Not only is it the debut season for new SSO Music Director Ernesto Estigarribia, it also includes two new events to expand community partnerships: a chamber music concert at Sheboygan's Holy Name Church and a special collaboration with Mead Public Library commemorating the Holocaust.



One thing that has not changed is an intriguing lineup of music that offers something for every listener, from the most seasoned classical music lover to newcomers to orchestral music.

Maestro Estigarribia and the SSO will open the season October 8 at The Stefanie H. Weill Center for the Performing Arts with a celebration of dance rhythms of Carnival Time in Brazil by BrazilianAmerican composer Clarice Assad. Next **DECEMBER 10:** on the program is Edvard Grieg's Piano Concerto in A minor, featuring pianist Michael Mizrahi, who has performed in the world's leading concert halls including Carnegie Hall, Toyko's Suntory Hall, the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C., and the Chicago Cultural Center. The concert closes with Shostakovich's Fifth Symphony, a 20th century masterpiece with the full orchestra on display.

"I'm thrilled to begin the 104th season with the phenomenal musicians of the Sheboygan Symphony Orchestra," Estigarribia said. "We open our season with a fantastic piece by living Brazilian composer Clarice Assad. We welcome world-renowned pianist Michael Mizrahi to perform the Grieg Piano Concerto, and the central piece of the program is Shostakovich's Fifth Symphony, which undoubtedly is the most important symphony of the 20th century."

Here's a look at the other concerts scheduled for the 104th season. All performances begin at 7:30 p.m. at the Weill Center, unless noted.

NOVEMBER 12 HOLY NAME CHURCH 807 SUPERIOR AVE., SHEBOYGAN:

The SSO's woodwind and horn players are highlighted in this special chamber concert. The program includes the teenage Mendelssohn's dashing Overture for Winds, followed by the mellow beauty of Mozart's Serenade for eight winds. Dvorak's Serenade for Winds closes this special program. Seating for this concert is general admission.

Handel's "Messiah" returns as Maestro Estigarribia leads his first SSO Messiah, continuing an SSO holiday tradition of this sacred masterpiece with the Symphony Chorus. This will once again be a "sing-along" Messiah, in addition to featuring a special lineup of soloists.

FEBRUARY 18, 2023:

A special concert for the whole family as the SSO stages the world-famous production of "Beethoven Lives Upstairs." This theatrical symphony concert is an imaginative way to introduce young audiences to the life and music of Ludwig Van Beethoven.

MARCH 11, 2023:

The evening begins with Lyric for Strings by George Walker, an American composer, pianist and organist, and the first African-American to win the Pulitzer Prize for Music. Mozart's sublime Clarinet Concerto, one of his last completed works, will feature Milwaukee Symphony principal clarinet Todd Levy. The concert closes with Dvořák's Sixth Symphony, a piece rich in melody and Czech dance rhythms.

APRIL 16, 2023, **MEAD PUBLIC LIBRARY** 710 N. 8TH STREET. SHEBOYGAN:

To commemorate Holocaust Remembrance Day (April 17), the SSO String Quartet, the Sheboygan Symphony Chorus and the Sheboygan Symphony Chamber Singers partner with Mead Public Library to present a very special concert of music by composers tragically silenced by the Nazis, plus a moving set of Hebrew Love Songs by Eric Whitacre. This concert is sure to be a poignant experience that will remind all of us that, indeed, "Love Conquers Hate." Seating for this concert is general admission.

MAY 20, 2023:

The program opens with "Into the Wild" by Minnesota-born composer Jacob Bancks, which takes audiences to both rural and urban "wild" spaces, followed by Prokofiev's dazzling Second Violin Concerto featuring Bella Hristova, acclaimed for her "passionate and powerful performances." The season finale triumphantly concludes with one of the repertoire's most celebrated works, Beethoven's Fifth Symphony.

The Sheboygan Symphony Orchestra, founded in 1918, is the longest continually active orchestra in the state of Wisconsin. Over the span of more than a century, extraordinary musical experiences have evolved into a legacy of old and new traditions. As a communitybased professional orchestra, most SSO musicians call Sheboygan County home, but the ensemble brings together musicians from all over Wisconsin. 

SHEBOYGAN MARSH PARK NEW EDUCATIONAL CENTER DEDICATION AND OPEN HOUSE PLANNED

It was a spectacular late summer day when the Kohler Center for Marsh Education was dedicated on September 7th, 2022. The Friends of the Marsh welcomed local dignitaries and the large donors to an open house reception at the facility. All were amazed and pleased with the beautiful building that had been in the works for over ten years at the Broughton Sheboygan County Marsh Park.

Real tree trunks were used in the construction and actually support the roof of the log and fieldstone structure. Expansive windows everywhere provide lots of natural light and enable those inside to see the marsh and surrounding park and campgrounds. The building is LEED certified, (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design), meaning it is designed to reduce stress on the

two wings are connected by a soaring atrium full of natural light. A large ash tree that was harvested about 1000 feet from where the structure stands in the marsh park is the centerpiece and supports the ceiling of the atrium.

The Friends of the Marsh worked hard for many years to raise the funds needed from a multitude of businesses, sportsman and conservation groups, and individuals, whose generous donations have provided the spectacular structure which will benefit future generations to come. Sheboygan County funded portions of the infrastructure and will be maintaining the structure going forward.

Adam Payne, Sheboygan County's Administrator, provided opening remarks and gave his heartfelt thanks to all of the donors who made the project possible. Payne, an avid nature lover and sportsman himself, spoke



days previously. Mr. Kohler as well as Laura and her siblings Rachel and David had shared the vision and helped step up the generosity of Kohler Company's participation in the progress to assure the LEED certification. They are very proud to have the Kohler naming rights of the building.

Other recognition and acknowledgements as well as the closing remarks were given by Lil Pipping, President of the Friends of the Broughton Sheboygan County Marsh. Lil and her husband Ken Pipping have been active in supporting sportsman and conservation programs for decades and had great vision on what could be done to enhance the Sheboygan marsh park. Lil Pipping first led the Friends group through designing, collecting funds for and building the tallest wooden observation tower in the state of Wisconsin that park visitors have fairgrounds.

The Sheboygan County Conservation Association was already strong in youth development, and with their involvement Sterling Strathe was hired and the log structure was built to house one of the first educational centers in the state. A rock from every township in the county was donated and used in the fieldstone fireplace inside that building, which housed the conservation, education, and firearms safety programs for years. Those programs eventually evolved into the Outdoor Skills Program at Camp Y-Koda. That building is now used for offices and security management at the fairgrounds.

Eventually the need for a home base for the Skills Center at the Marsh Park grew, and Sargento Company generously donated the semi-truck trailer where



been enjoying for a decade. Without skipping a beat Lil and Ken donated countless hours leading the Friends of the Marsh through the more complex and challenging process of bringing this new structure to life at the park.

The Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce oversaw the ribbon cutting which completed the dedication.

The children for whom the Kohler Center is designed to most benefit have actually already been using the structure for the outdoor skills and education programs sponsored by YMCA Camp Y-Koda and offered to all area school children as well. The sky is the limit to what the future will bring now that this exciting new educational facility is available which was designed with their needs in mind. equipment was housed and children gathered to study the wonders of the marsh. Camp Y-Koda's success at program development outgrew the trailer long ago and, as Roy Kalmerton so aptly put it, the new educational center is "a dream come true"!



The annual celebration of vintage and historic race cars attracted over 300 entries


as the festivities began Friday with practice sessions and a welcome social gathering at the Road America Center.



HELP US REDUCE CHLORIDE LEVELS – SOFTENERS, SALT, AND YOU

Background

It is estimated that most of the groundwater in the United Sates has some degree of hardness. Basic hardness is produced by the presence of calcium and magnesium dissolved in water. These minerals, if not removed from your water, may build up as scale on pipes and porcelain or metal fixtures. They coat water-heater elements. They may cause increased laundry detergent usage. This is way most people have water softeners.

The Problem

The chlorides discharged from the home water softeners end up at the wastewater treatment plant. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) is asking the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to reduce these chloride levels.

What can our customers do about our chloride problem?

They can have their water softening equipment inspected and adjusted to make them more efficient reducing the chlorides going to the wastewater treatment plant. When replacing or upgrading old water softeners use a high efficiency softener that is metered demand. Our goal is to reduce the chlorides entering the environment by reducing the rate of salt used by our water softener, while still delivering continued quality water. This in turn, will simply help keep long-term sewer rates down. You may also see some reduction in your water and salt usage, thus saving you money!

PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATE

The Planning Commission approved a right turn only driveway off of Highway 67 for Cleveland State Bank. Dorothy Farrell has also been recently appointed to the Planning Commission.

SEWER RATE INCREASE FOR 2022

The Village Board will be increasing sewer rates in 2022. Rates will go up by \$.05 per 100 cubic feet. This means starting in January (billed in April), sewer rates will be \$7.15 per 100 cubic the end of May through October. This dumpster is for yard waste only, not lake waste. A truck for large brush or trees can be obtained by calling the Village garage at 920-876-2231.

VILLAGE-WIDE REVALUATION

The State of Wisconsin sets standards that all communities in the State must be valued at 100% of market value or be kept within 10% of that value. The Village has fallen below these standards. The last revaluation was done in 2008. The Village has contracted with Grota Appraisals to have all properties assessed at 100% of market value as of January 1, 2023. Grota has sent letters out to all property owners about the process. The Village has approved an exterior inspection process only. Grota has been busy with this project over the last month. Grota is nearly done visiting the Village properties. Even though the work is being done now, these values will not be in effect until the **December 2023 <u>tax bill</u>**. A badge with photo ID will be worn by assessment staff while in the field. If you have any questions, please contact Jessica at 920-876-2122.

GOOSE ISSUE

The Village is working with a wildlife management class from UW-Madison to help develop a plan for the goose issue in the Victory Park Subdivision. They will spend the semester developing the plan for the Village, so we can put it into action next year.


