





students taking dual enrollment courses at area high schools or on one of the college's campuses. From fall 2021 to fall 2022, NW-SCC saw over a 50% increase in dual students.





**EV ENVY**

with so many other otherwise benign subjects these days: Misinformation and politics. Here are a few of the most egregious examples of EV misinformation I've seen recently.

CLAIM: Batteries die quickly and they cost a fortune to replace FACT: The federal government requires a minimum warranty on EV batteries of 8 years or 100,000 miles. Many manufacturers go way beyond that--up to a lifetime. Reports of 500,000 miles are common. Lots of things factor into the equation

but the bottom line is that EVs have a current life expectancy of at least as long as gas cars. The evolution and reliability of car batteries are increasing rapidly even as costs decrease.

Alabama's Largest Direct Mail Weekly

CLAIM: EVs are bad for the environment because electricity comes from coal power. FACT: There are no coal plants in North Alabama. Éven so, EVs have zero emissions and are far more efficient than gasoline at converting fuel to motion. The pollution equation is complex but still favors EV cars even in coal country. MYTH: We don't have

enough electricity for everyone to charge EVs. FACT: If every American purchased an EV tomorrow, our current grid could charge 85% of them every day during non-peak hours. Obviously, not all of us are going to purchase an EV tomorrow. We will have plenty of car juice as the demand increases and grid power is added.

MYTH: EV cars don't work well in cold weather. FACT: Yeah, I don't either. EV range is significantly reduced in extremely cold temperatures. For the average daily commuter in Alabama, this difference means plugging in the car overnight in your garage once every 3 or 4 days in the winter, versus once every 10-15 days in the summer. Cool fact: Norway (near the north pole, ya know) purchases more

EVs, per capita, than every other country.

EVs are certainly not the best choice for every driver--especially those who travel long distances--but obstacles are being demolished regularly. Within 2 to 5 years, it will not make financial sense to purchase a gas vehicle for most people. Regardless, there are plenty of legitimate pros and cons with EVs. The good news is that you have the ability to learn the facts literally at your fingertips.







Your scarecrow can be traditional or get creative with some props to tell the story of your family, business or organization. Don't forget to make a sign telling us who you are. Laminated signs might withstand the weather better.





## **Burdens Fall Heavy**

#### Editor:

The Alabama legislature imposes among the harshest anti-abortion policies and penalties while ignoring the plight of poor pregnant woman and their newborns. The irony is not lost that Alabama is last in the nation for ideal places to have a baby in 2022 and near last for health care, according to a report from WalletHub.

Alabama ranked 46th in maternal and infant mortality, 49th in low birthweights and 50th in pre-term births. The state lags in parental leave policy options, medical providers, Medicaid expansion, access to birth control, prenatal

care, and maternity practices.

The burden falls heaviest on those with low incomes, who also are least able to seek an abortion in another state. Children born to women denied an abortion are more likely to live in a household without enough money for basic expenses. Two-thirds of women who obtained abortions in 2019 were minority. and 85% were unmarried.

Many conservative state lawmakers said women can give their newborns up for adoption and the state would provide funding increases for foster-care programs. But Alabama's foster-care system has about 6,000 children waiting for new parents to provide them a loving home. The Times Daily recently reported staffing shortages and 54% turnover in the Child Welfare Division.

Having a baby in Alabama is a challenge, and early child-care expensive at \$7200 annually. An unexpected pregnancy should not become a poverty trap for mother and offspring - and a dependency


Dear Dave,

Dear Savvy Senior,

Medicare?



Dear Novice, There are actually three different types of senior-specific flu shots (you only need one) that the CDC is now recommending to people age 65 and older. These FDAapproved annual vaccines are designed to offer extra protection beyond what a standard flu shot provides, which is important for older adults who have weaker immune defenses and have a greater risk of developing dangerous flu complications. Here's more information on these three vaccines.

Flu Vaccines That Are

**Fluzone High-Dose Quadrivalent:** Approved for U.S. use in 2009, the Fluzone High-Dose is a high-potency vaccine that contains four times the amount of antigen as a regular flu shot does, which creates a stronger immune response for better protection. According to a study published in the New England Journal of Medicine, this vaccine was proven 24 percent more effective than the regular dose shot at preventing flu in seniors.

Fluad Quadrivalent: First available in the U.S. in 2016, this adjuvanted vaccine contains an added ingredient called adjuvant MF59 that also helps create a stronger immune response. In a 2013 observational study, Fluad was found 51 percent more effective in preventing flu-related hospitalizations for older patients than a standard flu shot.

You also need to be aware that both the Fluzone High-Dose and Fluad vaccines can cause more of the mild side effects that can occur with a standard-dose flu shot, like pain or tenderness where you got the shot, muscle aches, headache or fatigue. And neither vaccine is recommended for seniors who are allergic to chicken eggs, or those who have had a severe reaction to a flu vaccine in the past.

Also note that the CDC does not recommend one vaccination over the other.

FluBlok Quadrivalent: For older adults that are allergic to eggs, FluBlok, which is a recombinant vaccine that does not use chicken eggs in their manufacturing process is your best option. This vaccine is proven to be 30 percent more effective than a standard-dose influenza

vaccine in preventing flu in people age 50 and older. All of these vaccines are covered 100 percent by Medicare Part B as long as your doctor, health clinic or pharmacy agrees not to charge you more than Medicare pays. Pneumonia Vaccines

Another important vaccination the CDC recommends to seniors, especially this time of year, are the pneumococcal vaccines for pneumonia. Around 1.5 million Americans visit medical emergency departments each year because

of pneumonia, and about 50,000 people die from it. The CDC recently updated their recommendations for the pneumococcal vaccine and now recommend that everyone 65 and older who has not previously received any pneumococcal vaccine should get either PCV20 (Prevnar 20) or PCV15 (Vaxneuvance). If PCV15 is (Pneumovax23) at least one year later. Or, if you've previously received a PPSV23 shot, you should get one dose of PCV15 or PCV20 at least one year

later.

Medicare Part B also covers two different pneumococcal shots – the first shot at any time and a different, second shot if it's given at least one year after the first shot. **COVID Booster** 

If you haven't already done so, you should also get a COVID-19 booster shot this fall. Both Moderna and Pfizer have developed new bivalent booster vaccines that adds an Omicron BA 4/5 component to the old formula, which provides better protection.

Camp Lejeune Justice Act is part of a larger bill: H.R. 3967 -Honoring out PACT act of 2022.

The Bill was signed into an Act of August 10, 2022.

You have two (2) years from enactment of Act (August 10, 2022) to file a claim.

A person must have been exposed to the contaminated water at Camp Lejeune from August 1, 1953 to December 31, 1987 for at least 30 days and the injury was caused by exposure to the contaminated water.

Death cases that would have been past the statute of limitations before this Act are now able to be filed.

Exposure to the contaminated water is required. This concerns extends mainly to civilian contractors. Merely being present on the base will not be enough.

Some health problems are "Tier 1" and are presumed to have been caused by the contaminated water at Camp Lejeune. The conditions contained in Tier 1 include: Bladder Cancer, Breast Cancer, Esophageal Cancer, Kidney Cancer, Leukemia, Lung Cancer, Multiple Myeloma, Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma, Female Infertility, Hepatic Steatosis, Miscarriage, Myelodysplastic Syndromes, Neurobehavioral Effects, Parkinson's Disease, Renal Toxicity, Scleroderma.

There are some "Tier 2" health problems that are included but those require more proof.







## Medicare Minute "Medicare Pre-AEP"

Each year anyone who is on Medicare and enrolled in a Medicare Advantage Plan (MA) or Prescription Drug Plan (PDP) has an open enrollment period to make changes in their plan if they wish. This open enrollment period is called the Annual Election Period (AEP). It extends from October 15th to December 7th. There is also a period from October 1st to October 14th that is commonly called Pre-AEP.

Pre-AEP is an important time for Medicare beneficiaries. Insurance companies who offer MAs or PDPs cannot release their plan information for 2023 until October 1st. You can use this time to review your current plan to see if there has been any significant changes in your premium or copays. It's also a good time to review the prescription drug coverage of your plan, especially if you have had changes in the drugs you are taking. If any new plans are coming into your county, this is the time they are announced so be on the lookout for those.

Pre-AEP can also be a confusing time. Although it's designed for you to gather information on any changes that are coming for 2023, you may get phone calls or letters from insurance companies or your local agent. Local agents, in particular, like to use Pre-AEP to reach out to their clients and do policy reviews for the next year. This is totally acceptable under Medicare rules. It is also acceptable for you to attend a meeting or seminar during Pre-AEP to hear the details of 2023 plans. The one thing you cannot do is officially sign up for a new plan until after October 15th.

The good news is if you're happy with the plan you are in you won't have to do a thing. You will automatically roll into the 2023 plan as long as it's still offered in your area. If you have any questions about Pre-AEP you can contact our office for more information.
