



### Public Input on Trace Bridge

TUPELO-The National Park Service (NPS) is seeking input from the public for an ethnographic study of the John Coffee Memorial Bridge on Natchez Trace Parkway. The purpose of the study is to gain a comprehensive understanding of the Coffee Memorial Bridge and surrounding area as the Parkway initiates a project to repair or replace the bridge.

The bridge was built in 1964 and is showing signs of deterioration that may require its complete rehabilitation or replacement. In compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act and the National Historic Preservation Act, the NPS has contracted WSP, an environmental and engineering firm, to conduct

an Environmental
Assessment and cultural
resources studies.
These studies include
ethnographic research
to determine the
cultural and traditional
significance of the
bridge and surrounding
area.

This effort will be led by New South Associates, Inc. (NSA), a subcontractor of WSP. The surrounding area maintains significant cultural and historical value for various groups of people. The Parkway and NSA will reach out to an extensive list of stakeholders for input during the design and compliance phases of the project.

October is designated **Breast Cancer Awareness** Month, and the Shoals Community Clinic's Well Woman Project is helping the women of our area to know their health status. The Well Woman Project provides cancer screening to low-income, uninsured women of the Shoals throughout the year with medical exams, mammograms, and education programs that promote healthy lifestyle choices. The clinic provides free clinical exams, pap smears, and mammograms for qualifying women. In this program, there is always someone helping the patient navigate through the process of screening, detection, treatment, and recovery in a safe and encouraging atmosphere.

The pandemic has caused many women to fall behind on their regular health screenings, and it is important to stay on schedule with breast cancer detection. 



### **Medicare Minute**

#### "Annual Enrollment Period"

Open enrollment season for Medicare beneficiaries begins on October 15th and extends through December 7th. This is also known as the Annual Enrollment Period (AEP). AEP is an important time for anyone who is already on Medicare. These dates are very specific. You cannot enroll in a plan prior to October 15th or after December 7th unless you have a special circumstance.

AEP is specifically designed to give you an opportunity to enroll into a Medicare Advantage Plan (MA) or prescription drug plan (PDP) for 2023. If you are already on a MA or PDP it is the time for you to review your plan and determine if you want to make any changes for the next year. Either way there are some things that you'll want to consider.

If you are currently on or are considering a MA or PDP you want to look at the premium, copays, deductibles, coinsurance and the providers that take the plan. You will also want to look at the plan's drug formulary to be sure the prescription drugs you are taking are covered. Plan details can change from year to year so don't assume the 2023 plans will be exactly like the 2022 plans. Also, companies may introduce a new plan in your area for 2023 that may fit your needs better than the plan you are currently on.

A confusing thing about AEP is how Medicare supplements are treated. If you are on a Medicare supplement you do not have to wait until AEP to change plans. If you want to change to another supplement you can do that at any time during the year if you meet the new plan's guidelines. But if you are enrolled in a stand-alone PDP with your supplement the only time you can change the PDP is during AEP.

#### Free Online Hearing Tests You Can Take at Home

Dear Savvy Senior, Can you recommend any good online hearing tests? My husband has hearing loss, but I can't get him to go in and get his hearing checked, so I thought a simple online test could help him recognize he has a problem. What can you tell me? Loud Talking Linda

Dear Linda,

There's actually a growing number of very good online and app-based hearing tests available that will let your husband check his hearing on his own. These tests are a quick and convenient option for the millions of Americans that have mild to moderate hearing loss but often ignore it, or don't want to go through the hassle or expense of visiting an audiologist for a hearing exam.

Who Should Test?

Hearing loss for most people develops gradually over many years of wear and tear, which is the reason many people don't realize they actually have a hearing problem.

Anyone who has difficulty hearing or understanding what people say, especially in noisier environments or over the phone. Or, if you need a higher volume of music or TV than other people, should take a few minutes to test their hearing.
Self-Hearing Tests

Online and app-based hearing tests can serve as a great screening tool. They are not meant to be a diagnosis, but rather to give you an idea of how bad your hearing loss is and what can be done about it.

For most do-it-yourself hearing tests, you'll be advised

to wear ear headphones or earbuds and sit in a quiet spot. You also need to know that there are two different type of tests available. One type is known as pure-tone testing, where tones are played in decreasing volumes to determine your specific level of hearing loss. And the other type is known as speech-in-noise or digits-in-noise (DIN) where you'll be asked to identify words, numbers, or phrases amid background noise.

Where to Test

If your husband uses a smartphone or tablet, two of my favorite app-based hearing tests are the hearWHO app created by the World Health Organization, and the Mimi Hearing Test app. Both apps are free to use and are available through the App Store and Google Play.

HearWHO allows users to check their hearing status and monitor it over time using a DIN test, while Mimi uses

pure-tone and masked threshold tests to give you a detailed picture of your hearing abilities.

There are also a wide variety of online hearing tests your husband can take on a computer.

Some top online tests – all offered by hearing aid manufacturers – for speech-in-noise or DIN tests can be accessed at ReSound (//resound.com/en-us/onlinehearing-test) and Mircle Ear (//miracle-ear.com/onlinehearing-test).

And some good online hearing tests for pure-tone testing are available by Signia (//signia.net/en/service/hearingtest); Ergo (//eargo.com/hearing-health/hearing-check); and MD Hearing Aid (//mdhearingaid.com/hearing-test).

All of these hearing tests are completely free to use and take less than five minutes to complete.

What to do with Results

If the tests indicate your husband has hearing loss, it's best to think of that as a starting point. He should take

results to his doctor or an audiologist for further evaluation.

Many insurance providers and Medicare Advantage plans cover routine hearing exams, however original Medicare

If his hearing loss is mild to moderate, he should look into the new over-the-counter (OTC) hearing aids, which are available this fall online and at retailers like Best Buy, Walgreens and CVS.

OTC hearing aids don't require a prescription or medical examination for purchase and they're much more affordable than traditional ĥearing aids you Ďuy through an audiologist or a licensed hearing instrument specialist

their research also documented collusion between many highprofile Americans with a foreign country, China. For Americans knowingly involved this was treason as well and for a foreign country, an act of war against the United States (See. 18 US Code 2384 Seditious Conspiracy and 18 U.S. Code 2381-treason).

Phillips Engelbrecht took their documents to the FBI. At the lower levels of the organization, they received support and encouragement, but as the evidence went up the ladder, hostility. The FBI began accusing them of having stolen their documentation from China (X22 Report, Ep. 2849b, Aug. 15, 2022, 18:55). They found themselves being investigated by the

FBI instead of the FBI investigating the server in Wuhan University that had a data base on 1.8 million Americans. This was everyone who had worked as a volunteer in an election in the United States. Their private personal information had been collected and stored by the China Communist Party. Some Americans had colluded with the Chinese government in what is potentially the crime of the millenniaat least since Columbus 1492 discovered America. 4) "And since they own the data and it belongs to them, once the data is inside mainland China, they can do whatever they want with it."

5) "It was discovered by Catherine Engelbrecht and Gregg Phillips of True The Vote that China has been downloading some of the data running over these CCP connected EMS apps and platforms. The detailed personal identification, PII, from 1.8 million US election workers is just the start of what the CCP considers itself to own."

6) "CCP wrote the code for, manages, and operates the EMS system in multiple countries. It considers all the data it gets its hands on via the EMS system, to be theirs and they can do whatever they see fit with it."

7). "This makes removing the CCP controls and affiliates for apps and platforms from the US election system in hundreds of U.S. counties a serious matter of national security" (X22 Report, Ep. 2866b, September 4, 2022, 25:00-30:00).


He told us what must be done after the country is fully awakened to the fact that "our election system has been corrupted by a hostile foreign power." Then all "CCP controlled affiliate EMS apps and platforms" and machines must be discarded, and we must return to only paper ballots.

### **Car Totaled or Stolen?** All coverage doesn't pay equally

Gap insurance can make sense, especially if the loan balance exceeds the car value.

As almost everyone knows, the moment you drive your new car home, it begins to lose value — very quickly in some cases. But if you are ever unfortunate enough to experience a total loss due to accident or theft, most standard insurance policies pay the actual cash value of

the car at the time of the

incident.

That means if you still owe more on your loan, you'll be on the hook to pay it.

If you financed your car through the dealer, you may have been offered

"GAP insurance" as part of a range of options provided when you buy the car. Although they must by law fully explain it, there's still a lot of misinformation about GAP (Guaranteed Asset Protection) insurance, which is often now included in many full-featured auto insurance policies.

#### Here's the scoop on GAP insurance

Let's say you buy a \$40,000 car. Two years later, you're in an accident, and your car is declared a total loss by your insurance carrier.

The market value of your car at this point is \$22,000, yet you still owe \$26,000 on your loan. That \$4,000 GAP is money you would still owe your lender, so GAP insurance pays off that difference.

GAP insurance may make sense under some conditions, especially those where the loan balance is likely to exceed the depreciated car value for most or all of the loan term. This might be the case in the following situations:

- You've made a down payment of 20% or less, so the depreciated value will be less than the loan amount still due for most of the loan.
- You've financed your car for a relatively long period of time, such as 60 months or more, so in later months when the car is worth much less than at the time of purchase you still have a significant loan balance.
- You've bought a new car that has a record of depreciating quickly so your payments don't reduce the loan as fast as the declining value of the car.



Most dealers — and some banks — offer some type of GAP insurance as part of the vehicle loan, but rates and coverage can vary considerably. Be sure to figure out the total cost and read the fine print, as it can add a significant amount to your monthly payment.







Now then, see if you can rearrange the scheme of things so that each vertical row consists of all heads or all tails simply by touching and manipulating just one coin.

That is to say, rearrange the setup, for instance, so that the first and third rows are all heads, and the second and fourth row tails.

And all this by touching and manipulating one coin.
