

Fall is a Patchwork Quilt of Colors

labama is beautiful throughout the year but especially in the fall. As the greens of summer surrender to glittering yellow poplars, scarlet dogwoods, orange maples and golden hickories, Alabama unfolds its patchwork quilt of color. This blend of brilliant autumn foliage, coupled with cooler temperatures and an occasional gentle breeze, makes for an unforgettable experience. Fall colors will begin showing in the mountains of North Alabama in early October and then sweep across the region. Colors will be at their peak from late October to early November.

At Oak Mountain State Park in Pelham, take in the view from Peavine Overlook and Peavine Head north to Falls. Oneonta/Blount County and enjoy the color from Horton Mill, Old Easley or Swann covered bridges and Palisades Park. Take the drive on I-59 up Whitney Mountain near Oneonta, and proceed up U.S. 231. The Ave

Maria Grotto and the 431 out of Guntersville. 277-foot-long, 90-foot-high Clarkson Covered Bridge offer excellent views in Cullman/Cullman County, as do scenic drives U.S. 31 and 278. From Bankhead National Forest, take AL 195 to Double Springs, to AL 33, then take Forest Service roads 249, 262, 245 and 255 to CO 63 and back to AL 33.

Developed from network of Indian trails between Natchez, Miss., Nashville, and Tenn.. the Natchez Trace cuts across diagonally the northwestern corner of the state. Road work currently prohibits access between Highway 20 in Lauderdale Co. and US 72 in Colbert Co. However, the scenery on either side can be magnificent. Head to Joe Wheeler State Park in Rogersville and admire the view from the Joe Wheeler Dam near the cabin area on the Lawrence County side. After leaving U.S. 72, take a four-mile scenic drive into the park's resort area on the Lauderdale County side. In Huntsville, Monte Sano State Park offers beautiful foliage on Warpath Ridge Trail and its overlooks. Take scenic drives U.S. 72

A recommended viewing spot in Scottsboro/ Jackson County is Russell Cave National Monument. Scenic drives: AL 79 across Skyline Mountain, AL 279, AL 65 through the Paint Rock River Valley, and U.S. 72.

See Lake Guntersville State Park from the lodge atop the mountain, then take AL 227 through the park and into Buck's Pocket State Park and DeKalb nearby and counties. Etowah In Gadsden/Etowah County (10), Noccalula Falls Park provides a bounty of fall color, as do drives on US 278, 11 and 411. Head to Ft. Payne and check out DeSoto State Park and Lodge, DeSoto Falls, and Little River Canyon.

Lookout Mountain Parkway, DeSoto Parkway, and Old DeSoto Parkway provide lovely views. AL 176 includes scenic overlooks of Little River Cheaha State Canyon. Park is the highest point in the state at 2,407 feet above sea level. Enjoy fall color from Bald Rock and Pulpit Rock trails as well as Talladega Scenic Drive, Skyline Drive, and Skyway Motorway.

other people in this situation — people who, like Connor, don't want to be sick with addiction,' Jim said.

A UNA professor, who knew the Fishers were looking for an opportunity to help, told them about the new program within school's health the services department.

The program creates environment for an students to support and inspire them to change unhealthy life patterns without shame or secrecy, according to Maggie Stutts, a senior mental health counselor.

"Substance abuse does not discriminate," she said. "It doesn't matter your age, race, or gender. Substance abuse and recovery are not topics we shy away from."

Lion Recovery The Program is a resource students have at their disposal to adjust to university life.

Counselors are available for assessment of needs or problems, short-term counseling, group presentations. crisis intervention and facilitation of referrals for students. UNA faculty and staff can also refer students for services.

For the Fishers, the program represents hope for young people who are struggling.

Jim Fisher said his son, an avid outdoorsman loved his family who and friends fiercely, had gone through recovery treatment three times.

At the time of his death,

he was well on his way to realizing his dream of starting a recovery program, along with his counselor, for others battling addiction.

"He wanted to open Connors House, a place for others to get free of bad influences," Jim said. "It was to be an 18-month program."

While the Fishers haven't given up on bringing Connor's dream to fruition, they wanted to also do something to help immediately.

"Anyone who has dealt with addiction knows that there's an immediacy factor," he said. "And Connor's House is still very much our dream, too.'

The Fisher's donation is the first financial gift to the Lion Recovery Program, though the couple hopes it is one of many to come.

K.C. White, the vice president of student affairs at UNA, said the donation will allow the program to expand its offerings, programs, and resources while focusing support for students who wish to change behaviors including the misuse of substances.

"This is one more way we're able to provide resources to students as they navigate their pathway to their degrees,' she said.

Medicare Minute "Medicare Advantage Plans"

Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) extends from October 15th through December 7th. This is the time of year you can sign up for or make any changes to your Medicare Advantage Plan (MA) or Prescription Drug Plan (PDP). Over the next few weeks we are going to look at MA and PDP plans and what to look for when choosing these plans.

Medicare Advantage Plans, or Part C Medicare, are offered through private insurance companies that Medicare approves. If you join a Medicare Advantage Plan you still have Medicare but will receive your Medicare Part A and Medicare Part B coverage through the private insurance company offering the MA plan you join. Medicare Advantage Plans are not Medicare supplements.

Here are a couple of rules to remember if considering a Medicare Advantage Plan. To be eligible to join a Medicare Advantage Plan you must be enrolled in Part A and Part B Medicare. You must also live in the service area of the plan. For example, if you live in Lauderdale or Colbert counties you are only eligible for plans that are offered in your county. Just because a plan is offered in Huntsville or Birmingham does not mean it's available in Lauderdale or Colbert counties. Also, you do not have to be 65 to join an Advantage Plan. If you have been on Social Security disability for 24 months and have Medicare you can join a plan.

Over the next few weeks we will begin to look at the six things to consider when choosing a Medicare Advantage Plan. Those six things are premium, copays, coinsurance, deductibles, provider networks and the drug formulary of the plan. We will also discuss the difference between your plan options such as a HMO and a PPO. In the meantime if you have any questions about Medicare Advantage Plans you can contact our office.



Things You Need To Do After A **Car Accident**

occur each year in the United States. Fortunately, most of them involve only property damage (damage to the vehicle as opposed to the occupants). But one in three accidents involve personal injury to the driver or passengers and out of that number, two out of every ten accidents lead to fatal injuries.

If you are involved in an automobile accident, there are certain things you can do to protect yourself and your interests. The following is a list of the things you should do if you are in an automobile accident.

Make sure to call law enforcement and have a report made. It is important to call police to an accident once it has occurred. The police officer will do a preliminary investigation, examine the scene, interview the parties and any witnesses, as well as provide a determination as to who was at fault. An accident report sets forth who was at fault and is the single most persuasive piece of evidence proving liability. It is difficult to make an insurance claim without one.

Obtain witness contact information. If there are witnesses to the accident, you should obtain their contact information.

injured in the accident, you should receive medical treatment immediately or as soon as possible. The longer you wait to receive medical treatment, the more likely the insurance company will argue that you were not hurt as a result of the accident. This is the defense that the insurance companies raise most often.

Do not give statements to an insurance company. Never give a statement to an insurance company following an accident (not even your own). Insurance companies will seek to obtain a statement that they can use later against you when you are seeking compensation for your injuries. You should notify your insurance company that the accident occurred, but you should tell them that you do not want to give any statement until you have consulted an attorney.

Complete your medical treatment. It is important to follow through with all prescribed medical treatment following an accident. If you do not complete your treatment, the insurance company will argue that you are not injured to the extent that you claim. Keep up with your copays and out of pocket expenses.



account had been overcharged and they were due a refund. This kind of scam email is precisely why I begged both of my readers a few weeks ago to drop AOL, Comcast, AT&T, and Yahoo addresses. Legit email companies would never let this get through the filters.

The refund scam starts when the victim calls the phone number listed in the email. The scammer then offers an instant refund directly into the bank account. All the victim needs to do is install some remote control software so the

scammer can show the victim what to do. Once the scammer has access to your computer they will ask you to log into your bank account so they can show you how to receive their refund. How nice.

Then a clever, terrifying (and a bit complicated) thing happens: The scammer then asks the victim to pull up the balance of their bank account on their screen so he can transfer the \$600 back into their account. Then the scammer blanks the screen for a moment while he accesses the "HTML

code" on your computer that lies behind the bank balance screen. The scammer then changes that balance to make it appear that the bank balance is thousands or even tens of thousands more. Again, this amount is fake. The actual bank balance has not been touched at this point.

The scammer then unblanks the screen and expresses horror that he accidentally transferred \$60,0000 dollars (instead of \$600) into your account and begs the client to please transfer the money back as soon as possible. Most clients, being the good, honest people they are, dutifully comply by sending that \$60,000 wire transfer via Western Union directly into the scammer's account.

Here is the absolutely infuriating thing: A local bank let this happen. They

are reading this now and they know who they are. Shame on you! How in the world does a transaction this large--to Western Union, no less-- not trigger a phone call from a bank employee warning the client of a potential scam? This is truly unacceptable, local bank! I highly recommend that people of a certain age call their bank and ask if they have any safeguards preventing this kind of thing. If they do not, please find another bank.




