# Only treasures found at Southern Trash

When you wear things that make you feel confident, you are confident.

That is Josephine Manchester Graham's motto. She makes it a mission to make customers look as confident as they feel when they enter Southern Trash, a vintage clothing store on North Wood Avenue in Florence.

At 19, Graham, known affectionately by friends as JoJo, is the face of her family business. Five days a week she can be found behind the counter, or out on the sales floor helping prospective clients.

"That's my favorite part — styling customers," she said. "I just want to help people find great outfits that they feel great wearing. I love it when customers walk in needing an outfit for a special occasion, and I can say, 'I got you.'"

Graham and her parents, Joe and Courtnie Manchester, are no strangers to reinventing or reclaiming used merchandise.

The family owns three other shops in the Seven Points shopping district — Eleven54 on Wood features antiques and vintage décor items; Autographs —where Graham's husband, Payton, works — is a specialty sports memorabilia shop; and up the street across from Walgreens, Florence Trading Co. features more antiques and furniture.

At Southern Trash, Graham's department is style.

Having graduated in March from the Barbizon USA modeling school, Graham enjoys showing off new arrivals weekly on the Southern Trash Instagram page. She was among 20 contestants chosen out of 200 for a Barbizon competition in December. Taking on the business allows her to pursue all her passions.

"It's always been my dream to own a clothing store," Graham said. Her parents purchased the shop from its original owner, Milly Baine, about a year ago. "We owned the other businesses on this

strip, and what Milly was doing fit right in with what we're doing," Courtnie Manchester said, adding that the family decided to keep the original name. "We didn't want to see this business die."

She said the store has always focused on vintage clothing and accessories since it opened in 2015.

"I modernized it," said Graham.

She feels her store can boast the most unique finds in the Shoals area since she and her family often source their inventory by frequenting out-of-town estate sales, or by thrifting other consignment shops in her parents' Michigan hometown.

"We go to Michigan a lot. We have family there, and that's our



picking place," Graham said.

She feels the thrift shops in the Midwest have a greater variety with more diverse style.

"Thrifting here is more of a trend, you know what I mean? Michigan is a bigger place with more options," she said. "Thrift shops here feel more picked over, and it feels like you see a lot of the same thing."

Graham said she prefers marketing on social media because the platform is a better fit for Southern Trash.

"We get asked about our website a lot," she said with a laugh. The store doesn't have one.

"We don't keep the same inventory," her mother explained. "I feel like a website is more for businesses who are selling the same items



from week to week. That's not us. We want things flying off the shelves with new things coming in every day."

She said the family is working to make Graham's goal of expanding the small shop a reality. After purchasing space in the back of the building, Graham said her family is adding "high-end" collectible Nike shoes.

"I want us to grow and expand our inventory," Graham said about next steps for the shop.

In the meantime, she thrills in hand-picking treasures exclusive to Southern Trash.

# Choosy moms choose **Persnicketies**

Persnicketies Consignment Boutique was born out of a new friendship in 2012, when Allison Claunch and Ashley Winkle decided they could offer something different from the traditional consignment scene in the Shoals.

Ten years later, the best friends continue their bi-annual sale that has outgrown multiple venues, nurtured a network of partnerships with fellow moms, and continues to attract local and out-ofstate consigners and shoppers.

Claunch and Winkle retell their business story by starting with how they met. In 2010, the two expecting moms met for the first time in a childbirth preparedness class.

"We became fast friends and later best friends," Claunch said. It was her idea to start the business venture, but she wasn't all that sure Winkle would take her seriously, let alone encourage the idea and run with it.

The two had shopped consignment stores before and wished they could find someplace that offered a more specialized selection.

"When we'd go shop, we'd really have to look. We didn't want the items from Walmart, Target, Old Navy—we have those here local,

and you can buy the merchandise there for about as cheap as you can find in a consignment sale," Claunch said. "Why not comb all that stuff out so customers don't have to weed through to find what they want?"

Winkle said the idea was to aim for topquality brands in baby gear, children's clothing, shoes, accessories and books—later they would expand to add designer purses. Hence the name.

"We're persnickety about what we take. We want the higher end, upscale kids clothing you find a boutique," Winkle said." It gives moms a different avenue to shop. They know they can look for those kinds of things at the sale. We want to be picky." The business venture has been a learning process for both women, but the sale's booming success led to expansion after expansion. The first consignment sale was held in the activities building of the First Southern Baptist Church, where Claunch's parents attend.

"When we started, there was no end-goal. We were just praying it would work," Claunch said.

The church building allowed them to try their new business venture without too much risk or up-front investment. Still, in that first sale, the ladies had 38 consigners.

"We didn't even think we'd have that many," Claunch said.

Winkle said the two were pleasantly

surprised by the number of shoppers they had as well.

"I can remember that first sale when we had a line," she said. "At that time, social media was not what it is today. People would post things on Facebook, but events didn't get shared like they do today. We were shocked. We looked out the blinds and couldn't believe we had a line. We've had good years and better years. This community has truly supported us since day one."

The consignments sales are so popular and grew so rapidly, finding a large enough venue to house the sale twice a year was the biggest challenge. Eventually, Claunch and Winkle moved their twice-a-

year consignment shop to the Muscle Shoals Fairgrounds facilities, where the pop-up sale still takes place today.

Claunch and Winkle say their boutique-style consignment sales not only offer quality finds for shoppers at a great price, the shop is also a great way for parents to recoup their costs for purchasing the highend merchandise. In fact, consigners have opportunities to recoup 65% to 75% of their money back on namebrand items, the two said.

"Truly, what I think they love most is they can shop and replenish within a week. It's a really quick and easy process—much easier than Facebook Marketplace," Winkle said. "They can make more money with minimal work, especially compared to yard sales and posting items for sale on social media."

The Persnicketies Boutique offers consigners different options as far as dropping off merchandise, tagging and sorting their own items, and even working the bi-annual sales. Consigners who register to put items in the sale can be hands-on throughout the retail process or they can simply drop the items off and forget about them until payday. Those options are outlined on the Persnicketies Boutique website.

Once consigners get their check, Claunch and Winkle say they've seen families take vacations with their earnings, or the resale might bring in enough money to help with bills, dance classes, tee-ball signups, and other familial expenses.

It's also a sustainable and affordable way for families to shop and replenish their children's wardrobes.

"We've built a community and gained many friendships," Claunch said. "Many of these moms have become friends after several years of consigning and shopping."

While many of these partnering moms, grandmothers and other consigners are local, the two said they've generated a lot of interest from Birmingham, Tennessee, Mississippi and Texas. They've even got a regular consigner from



New York.

The two attribute their success in part to the uniqueness of the business. Persnicketies is one of only a handful of "carefully curated" consignment shops, Claunch said.

"We could not pull off the event without all the other moms," Winkle agreed. "They have really rallied around our business and supported it from the beginning. They are the heartbeat of our sale."

The next Persnicketies consignment sale is scheduled for Feb. 16 through 20.

Odette's executive chef Josh Quick has been in the Shoals almost 16 years. He came here from Birmingham to work at the Marriott in Florence.

# *Next day* Thanksgiving eggrolls

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 pack Premade egg roll rappers
- Leftovers from thanksgiving dinner
- Leftover gravy
- Leftover cranberry sauce
- Air fryer or Fry daddy
- Two large eggs

Finally chop turkey, ham, or use your leftover stuffing/whatever you would like to use as a filling.

In a bowl beat two eggs for the egg wash

Spoon approximately 2-3 tablespoons of filling onto each egg roll wrapper and fold according to package directions, using the beaten egg to seal the edges of the wrappers as you go.

Heat the oil to 350 degrees. Fry 3-4 egg rolls at a time, turning occasionally, until browned all over, approximately 3-5 minutes.

Drain on paper towels, then serve with dipping sauce of your choice.

I like to use the gravy or the cranberry sauce can also be put into a blender to make a great dipping sauce.



# Sweet Potato Benedict

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

• Sweet potato waffle, Shredded ham, Poached egg, Cranberry hollandaise

#### Sweet Potato Waffles:

- 1 ½ cups leftover sweet potato souffle
- 2/3 1 cup milk
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons melted butter
- 11/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 11/2 tablespoons baking powder
- 1/8 teaspoon salt

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

1. Preheat a waffle iron according to manufacturer's instructions.

2. Stir sweet potato souffle, milk, egg, and butter together in a bowl. Whisk flour and salt together in a separate large bowl. Add potato mixture to flour mixture; stir until batter is just combined.

3. Ladle batter into the preheated waffle iron and cook until waffles are golden and crisp, about 3 minutes.

#### Poaching the eggs:

1. Add about three cups of water in a small deep sauce pot. Add 1 teaspoon kosher salt and 2 teaspoons white vinegar and bring to a simmer over medium heat. Meanwhile, crack 1 very fresh cold large egg into a custard cup or small ramekin.

2. Carefully drop the egg into the center of the water.

3. Turn off the heat, cover the pan and set your timer for 5 minutes. Don't peek, poke, stir or accost the egg in any way.

4. Remove the egg with a slotted spoon and serve immediately.

#### Hollandaise Sauce:

1.5 fl. oz. white wine vinegar

1 fl. oz. water

3 egg yolks

- 1/2 fl. oz. lemon juice
- 1/2 pt. butter, melted and kept warm (2 sticks)
- 1/4 cup cranberry sauce
- To taste salt and white pepper
- To taste cayenne pepper (optional)

#### **Directions:**

2. Combine vinegar and water in a small saucepan and reduce by half.

3. Place the egg yolks in a stainless-steel bowl. Pour the vinegar reduction over the yolks.

4. Place the bowl with the yolks on a double boiler and whisk thoroughly until the mixture has thickened, and you can leave a trail across the surface with the whisk.

5. Begin adding the warm clarified butter very slowly while whisking constantly.

6. Add the warm cranberry sauce and mix well.

7. Add the lemon juice and adjust seasoning.

#### To assemble the Sweet Potato Benedict:

1. Cut a slice of leftover ham and warm up.

2. Place one quarter of a waffle on a plate, add the slice of ham on top.

3. Add the poached egg on top of the ham, then spoon a liberal amount of Cranberry Hollandaise sauce over the eggs.

4. Garnish with sliced fresh chives

### Alternative use *for* Sweet Potato Waffles:

Stir 1 cup maple syrup, ½ cup cranberry sauce, and 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon together in a saucepan over medium heat. Cook, stirring occasionally, until well-combined and heated through, 5 to 10 minutes.

Place warm waffles on a plate and pour syrup over along with a dab of butter.

### Green Bean Casserole Turnovers with creamy mushroom sauce

Four leaves of frozen Phyllo dough, each brushed with melted butter

Place 12 oz. of leftover green bean casserole atop the brushed dough sheets.

Carefully roll the dough around the green bean casserole.

Brush the roll with melted butter and bake at 335°F for 15 minutes, or until pastry is golden in color.

Cut into portions and serve immediately with creamy mushroom sauce

**Creamy Mushroom sauce:** 

2 oz. onion diced

- 1/2 oz. (tablespoon) butter
- 6 oz. mushrooms, sliced
- Salt and ground pepper to taste
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 sprig fresh thyme
- 1/4 cup white wine
- 1/4 cup chicken broth
- 1/2 cup heavy cream
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 2 tablespoons fresh parsley

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

Sautee onion in butter until softened, about 3-5 minutes.

Add mushrooms, salt and pepper. Cook until mushrooms have released juices. Add garlic and thyme and cook until fragrant, about 1 minute.

Add the wine to deglaze and loosen any bits off the pan and simmer a few minutes until the wine has almost evaporated.

Add the chicken broth and cream. Simmer 5 minutes or until reduced by half.

To thicken the sauce further, combine cornstarch with 2 tablespoons of water (or broth) and mix well. Add cornstarch mixture into the broth a little bit at a time to reach desired consistency. You may not need all of the cornstarch mixture.

Let simmer 1 minute.

Season with parsley, salt and pepper to taste.

# Day after Curry Turkey Croquettes *with* cranberry-yogurt dip

#### Yield: 8 croquettes

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 cup butternut squash hash
- 1 cup diced turkey
- 2 cup mashed potato casserole
- 2 tbsp yellow curry powder
- 2 tbsp chopped parsley
- 1 tbsp chopped chives
- Pinch of cayenne
- 2 tbsp Greek yogurt
- 2 eggs
- ½ 8oz wheel of brie cut into 8 pcs
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup flour
- 2 cups fine bread crumbs
- Salt and pepper
- Oil for frying

Pre-heat oven to 400°F.

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

1. Combine first eight ingredients in a large mixing bowl with one of the eggs.

2. Using a large mixing spoon, mash together until well combined.

3. Divide potato-turkey mixture into 16 equal portions. Form each portion around the brie to make a football or ball shape. Set in refrigerator for 30 minutes.

4. Mix together the other egg and the cup of milk (egg wash). Season the flour and bread crumbs separately.

5. Lightly coat each croquette in flour, then egg wash, and then the bread crumbs.



6. Heat a high sided skillet or fryer to 350°F. Working in batches of 3-4 croquettes at a time, fry until golden brown.

7. Season with a little salt when they come out of the frying oil, set them on a cookie sheet, and finish warming them in the preheated oven. Enjoy with the cranberry yogurt dip!

#### Cranberry yogurt dip:

1 cup Greek yogurt

1/2 cup cranberry-orange compote

2 tbsp za'atar or 1 tbsp Italian seasoning and 1 tbsp toasted sesame seeds

1/2 tsp fresh ground black pepper

1/4 tsp salt

Juice of one lime

Mix together well with either a whisk or an immersion blender

# Tips for baking betee betee bakshas babaas

Cookies and other baked treats are everywhere come the holiday season. It's not uncommon to give cookies as gifts or arrive at holiday gatherings with cakes and other decadent desserts.

Cookies are a classic holiday treat, and some families even build entire traditions around baking Christmas cookies.

Novice bakers making cookies for the first time may be a little overwhelmed when perusing recipes. Baking is a science, and sometimes it takes practice to get the results just right. However, there are some tips that can help yield better, buttery bounties.

#### Handle butter with care

Butter can make or break a cookie recipe, as butter is often the glue that holds the cookie together. Therefore, it is key to follow the directions carefully regarding how to handle butter. Smithsonian. com says to leave butter at room temperature for 30 to 60 minutes to properly soften it. This takes patience, but fiddling with butter too much can damage its delectable integrity. While purists may say butter is best, margarine may be acceptable if it has a high fat content; otherwise, cookies may spread out and flatten.

When it comes time to cream the butter with sugar, be sure to do so thoroughly to incorporate air into the butter and remove the grainy texture of the sugar.

#### Measure flour properly

Measuring flour the right way can ensure cookies come out right. The Cooking Channel says to spoon the flour lightly into a dry measuring cup, then level it off with a knife. Do not dip the measuring cup into the flour or tap the knife against the cup. This will pack too much flour into the measuring cup and result in dry, tough

#### Slow down the eggs

cookies.

Add eggs one at a time to make sure each will emulsify properly with the fat in the butter. Adding eggs en masse may cause the emulsification to fail.

#### Chill out

Follow recipes that call for chilling cookie dough carefully. This process is important for making sliced and shaped cookies. By chilling, the dough becomes more malleable for rolling and even slicing.

#### Use a bottom rack

Too much heat may compromise cookie integrity. The food experts at Delish say to try moving cookies onto a lower rack in the oven if they aren't retaining their shape when baked. Put an empty cookie sheet on the top rack. That will block the cookies from the most intense heat that rises to the top of the oven.

Mastering cookies takes a little patience and some trial and error. Once bakers get their feet wet, Christmas-cookie-baking becomes even more special.

# How to create a DURABLE GINGERBREAD HOUSE DU BY METRO NEWS





Gingerbread cookies and houses are one of the many symbols of the holiday season, alongside **Christmas trees** and twinkling lights. In fact, few confections symbolize the holidays more so than gingerbread.

Many a child (or a child at heart) has spent hours carefully trying to create decorative gingerbread houses. Although gingerbread recipes span various cultures, gingerbread houses originated in 16th century Germany. The fairy tale "Hansel and Gretel" helped solidify the popularity of gingerbread, which became part of Christmas traditions.

Even though gingerbread houses can be fun to make, there's no denving it can be exacting work --especially for those who strive for perfection. Prepackaged kits attempt to take some of the guesswork out of the equation, but those who are crafting from scratch can employ these tips as they build their gingerbread houses.

• Go for form and not flavor. Few gingerbread houses ever get eaten, so focus on finding a dough that will bake up rock hard as opposed to one that tastes good.

• Get the right icing texture. Pastry artist **Catherine Beddall** says royal icing is the preferred "glue" to

adhere gingerbread pieces. Beddall says icing should be thick like peanut butter and not runny.

• Mind the dough. Do not roll out the gingerbread dough too thin or it may become brittle after being cooked. Always cut out shapes before the gingerbread is baked. Let the baked pieces sit overnight to cool completely before using them to build.

• Patience is key. Allow the icing to dry for at least a couple of hours after adhering each piece and before moving and handling the house, says Beddall. Work in stages so that individual items can be decorated and allowed to dry. Then the walls can be put together, followed by the roof pieces.

• Kids likely will need help. Children may not have the patience or steadiness to handle complete gingerbread construction. They can decorate the separate pieces of the house while the components are laying flat, which is easier for kids. Adults can do the main assembly later on.

• Utilize a template. Free-handing may not be easy. Cut out templates using cardboard or posterboard for various gingerbread pieces.

One of the most important tips is to have fun. Don't take gingerbread house making too seriously as a novice. Rather, enjoy the experience and the centuries-old tradition.

# Distinctive holiday festival growing in popularity

Tuscumbia's distinctive holiday festival, "It's a Dickens Christmas, Y'all," continues to grow in popularity each year since its inception.

The community driven event, now in its 12th year, is perhaps even more highly anticipated this season after being scaled back in the last two years due to the COVID pandemic, according to organizers May Woodie Christopher and Ninon Parker. The Dickens

Christmas event was

never cancelled, only downsized, said Christopher, the president of the Tuscumbia Retail Development Association.

"When you stop hosting something like these events, it can be hard to start it back up again," she said. "We had a really good crowd last year. (The pandemic) affected us, but it did not kill us."

Parker agreed and said the pandemic may even help build angst for this





year's festival, set for Dec. 10 in downtown Tuscumbia. She said the pandemic put such a damper on community events happening across the state, she feels people are eager to get out and get involved.

It's a Dickens Christmas, Y'all started from humble beginnings, but has become a beloved event for the area since. "When we began Dickens Christmas, we didn't know what to expect. We didn't know whether we'd have crowds of people lining the streets, or if it would just be a flyby event with people's busy schedules around the holidays," said Parker.

She said the group of organizers weren't "totally surprised" by the event's initial success because Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol" is a cherished classic, but the organizing ladies are thrilled the festival has been so well-received by the community.

"It is really gratifying to see how well people have responded. So many people love this event and look forward to it year after year," she said.

This year's event

will see the return of Scrooge, Marley and other familiar faces from Dickens' popular Christmas tale. This year will also bring back favorite activities like the Scones and Moans event that was cancelled in 2020 and 2021.

"In 2020, we cancelled all indoor activities and events, but we tried to keep as much as feasible. Thank goodness





we could do things outdoors," Christopher said.

Though many of those festival features are returning, Christopher said an annual Dickens Christmas feast is not making a comeback.

"We've had trouble finding a caterer that can accommodate 200 people," she explained. "I loved the feast. Guests could dress in period clothing, and it was customary to have entertainment at a nice, seated dinner. People don't do that anymore."

She said she would love to see the feat return but admitted some festivities like the feast can be difficult to put together without additional volunteers.

"We've got a good many people that help every year," Christopher said. "For the High Tea, we've got plenty of help. We need people for the information tent, and we can always use people to help decorate. We've got things all over for people to do."

It's a Dickens Christmas, Y'all gets the entire community involved for two days of holiday fun. Shops and eateries in downtown Tuscumbia will offer holiday specials, vendors and food trucks are expected to return.

The event will kick off on Dec. 9, with a Run Rudolph 5K race. Saturday morning, the event will open with Scones and Moans, and a Dickens Market tent featuring arts and crafts vendors. The festival will also feature crowd favorite carriage rides with the Clydesdale horses, Pride and Clyde.
