



•When to remove snow, ice, and accumulations? Snow and ice needs to be cleared from sidewalks in the downtown business commercial district within 12 hours after a snowfall and 24 hours for all other

- •Where to Shovel? Clear full width Mailboxes of the sidewalk. Salt and sand VI All mailboxes must be located icy spots.
- •What happens if I don't remove snow, ice, and accumulations? The City may do so and assess the costs plus a \$25.00 administrative fee against property owner. Property owner will also be guilty of a municipal infraction punishable by a fine of \$100 first offense, \$150 second offense, \$250 subsequent offenses.
- •How do I avoid a \$25 snow tickets? Garbage Collection If it is snowing or if snow is in the forecast keep vehicles off streets and alleys until the street has been plowed curb to curb. Violators will be ticketed \$25 per offense.
- •What happens if I throw, push, or place snow/ice from private property onto a street or alley? You will be charged with a simple misdemeanor.
- •What happens if I push snow/ice across any portion of a street in a residential neighborhood? You will be charged with a simple misdemeanor.
- •How can I get notifications when there is a snow emergency for Milford? Register for notifications at www.dcem.us (Dickinson County Emergency Management) • Drive carefully, obey posted speed limits, and adjust your speed according to the current conditions. (Note: the speed limit is 25 mph unless otherwise posted)

Snowmobiles

Snowmobiles may only be operated on city streets when traveling directly to or from the nearest designated snowmobile trail on the most direct route.

ATVS

ATVs may be driven on city streets by licensed driver's age 18 years or

with the front of the mailbox a minimum six inches behind the back edge of the curb. The City will repair or replace a damaged or destroyed mailbox if it is deemed to result from a direct hit by plow equipment. Mailboxes damaged by snow load off the plow equipment <u>will not</u> be eligible for repair or replacement by the City.

- •Residential garbage collection is every Tuesday unless Monday is a holiday then collection will be on Wednesday. Please have all garbage containers to the curb no later than 7 a.m. If you forget to place your garbage container to the curb you will have to wait until the next scheduled Tuesday collection.
- •If you have extra bags of trash that will not fit in the cart, bag tags can be purchased at Milford City Clerk's office for \$2.50 per tag.
- •Tags for white goods may be purchased at the City Clerk's office at any time during the year. Items such as furniture, mattresses etc. you may contact Waste Management at 888-960-0008 to arrange a pickup or you may take those items to the landfill east of Bridges Bay for disposal.

Recycling

 Residential curbside recycling service is split into two weeks, Gold Week and Green Week, both serviced on Tuesdays every other week. All residences located on the South side of 13th Street/220th Street will be Gold Week. All residences located on the North Side of 13th Street/220th Street will be Green Week.

Posting your address

For emergency purposes it is important that all occupied buildings post addresses that are clearly visible to the street in figures not less than 2 ¹/₂ inches in height and of a contrasting color with their background.

DYLAN WRITES LOVE LETTERS, TOO? Daughter of former flame puts letters up for auction

A recent Associated Press story written by Mark Pratt explains a lot about famed singer/ songwriter, Bob Dylan, now 81, and his younger days. One of the letters Dylan wrote to high school girl Ann Hewitt, between 1957 and 1959 explained his plans to change his last name from Zimmerman to something else. After considering several names (Little Willie and Elston are mentioned by Pratt), the singer, of course, settled on Bob Dylan, instead of Robert Allen Zimmerman. Dylan also told Hewitt that after changing his name he would sell a million records. (Pratt notes he sold about 125 million!).

Sometime after the letter-writing ceased, Dylan wrote to his former sweetheart asking that she return the pictures he had sent her. And, Pratt

learned that sometime in the late 1960s Dylan called Hewitt asking that she move to California -- which he said she declined.

The hand-written letters were found by Hewitt's daughter-with their envelopes -- after her mother died, in 2020. RR Auction Company will be conducting the sale. Executive Vice President Bobby Livingston, who is quoted as being "a Big Dylan Fan," noted, "This archive is one of the most

culturally important of the 20th century we have ever offered." RR is based in Boston. The opening bid is \$250,000, for the entire package. Bidding on the lot closes November 17th. ..



Now we have a more complete, but still tentative, song list.

Along with the holiday music you are most familiar with, the concert band will feature a song written to observe the 100th anniversary of the day the first woman joined the U.S. Marine Corps. Opha Mae Johnson was 40 years old when she enlisted in 1918 to become the first woman to wear a Marine uniform. The MSCT presentation includes many more youthful performers than any of his books or the movie that he narrated before he passed away. Then there's also Basin Street Blues, performed by Pete Fountain on a LeBlanc clarinet, with four gold keys! Then, RD also notes Benny Goodman's Sing, Sing, Sing, a summertime favorite of the Dick Bauman Big Band at the Pearson Lakes Art Center. Sunday, according to RD, calls for the song, A Beautiful Day, June Christy's 1957 studio album, Gone for the Day, which features the title track as well as When the Sun Comes Out, written by Harold Arlen and Ted Koehler. Then there's also It's a Most Unusual Day, the Jimmy McHugh, Harold composition from The Great American Songbook. The tune was used in a 2021 television commercial for Lincoln automobiles.



Annual Dairy Discussions Seminar to Focus on Cybersecurity

The Iowa State University Extension and Outreach Dairy Team will host its annual Dairy Discussions Seminar on Thursday, December 1, from 10:00am to 2:00pm, at the ISU Extension and Outreach Sioux County Office in Orange City.

This year's focus is on cybersecurity issues for food producers including farmers, manufacturers, and processors.

"Cybersecurity is a bigger problem than many realize, unless they have been directly affected," said Fred Hall, dairy specialist with ISU Extension and Outreach. "There will be four presentations all relating back to the issue of cybersecurity and our food supply providers.'

On-Farm Cybersecurity Threats - During the first presentation, "On-Farm Cybersecurity Threats," Dr. Doug Jacobson will help producers understand where threats are and how they can manifest in farm systems.

Jacobson is Director of the ISU Center for Cybersecurity Innovation and Outreach, and Professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering. He is the lead PI in the National Centers of Academic Excellence in Cybersecurity sponsored ReCIPE coalition which is focused on securing cyber-physical systems. Doug also created the Iowa Cyber Hub which is dedicated to increasing the cyber workforce in Iowa.

The Law and Cyber Security - Special Agent Ward Crawley of the Iowa Department of Criminal Investigations Cyber Crime Bureau knows that living in the Digital Age makes life simpler for us, but also for the bad guys! He is working to combat the surge of cybercrime in Iowa food producers and processors.

Crawley is a lifelong resident of Iowa. He received his undergraduate degree from ISU in 1995. Later that year, he graduated from the Iowa Department of Public Safety Basic Academy and began his employment with the Division of Criminal Investigation. While working for the DCI, Ward has been assigned to the Casino Gaming Unit, the DPS Intelligence Bureau, and most recently, the Cyber Crime Bureau.

Safeguarding Your Social Media Sites - ISU Network Field Specialist Scott Saunders believes that social media - specifically Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram - are useful tools to promote your business, but they also come with cybersecurity risks. He will walk through ways to protect yourself and your business.

"What Are You Doing to Protect Your Farm?" Dairy Producer Panel Discussion - Dairy producer panel moderator, Deb Wehde, is a field representative for Agropur. She works with dairy farmers in South Dakota, Iowa, Nebraska, and Minnesota who sell their milk to the company's cheese plant in Hull. She will lead the discussion with local dairy producers on what cybersecurity issues they are concerned with. The producer panel will feature Kurt Wierda, Plymouth Dairy; Anthony Nunes, NuStar Dairy; and Michael Nettinga, M&M Dairy.

Groundhog Day

Saturday felt like the movie Groundhog Day when watching the Iowa/Wisconsin and Iowa State/Oklahoma State games. Iowa rode another elite defensive and special teams' performance to a nice 24-10 win over Wisconsin despite the Hawkeye offense being very unproductive, while Iowa State wasted another excellent performance by their defense enroute to a very frustrating 20-14 loss at Oklahoma State. I feel like I watch the same thing from these teams every Saturday, with the difference lately being Iowa finding ways to win games with their defense scoring points while Iowa State finds new ways to lose games they should win.

We'll start with the victorious Hawkeyes this week. Sensational sophomore, and NW IA product Cooper DeJean had one of the better performances I've seen in a long time on Saturday. DeJean had a pick-six in the second quarter to put Iowa up 14-3 and later returned a punt 41 yards to the Wisconsin 18yard line to set the Iowa offense up with a short field where they were able to score on a TD to put the game away at 21-10 early in the fourth quarter. DeJean also hustled downfield on a Tory Taylor punt and flipped it back to be downed on the 1-yard line. At one point in the game on Saturday, DeJean, a defensive back was outgaining the anemic Iowa offense, 114-104 yards. Speaking of offense, Iowa won the game despite another abhorrent performance from this group, that appeared heading in the right direction the last two weeks, but they took a big step back on Saturday. How good are Iowa's special teams and defense to win a B1G game by 14 points despite the following numbers? Iowa averaged 2.1 yards per play and had the lowest total yards (146) in a 14+ point victory in FBS since 2011; Iowa is now 2-2 this season when averaging 2.1 yards per play, the rest of FBS teams are a combined 0-22 when gaining below 3.0 yards per play; Iowa had only 11 first

downs and gave up six Wisconsin sacks. Most teams that have those offensive numbers would lose a conference game by at least two scores, but this Hawkeye group sticks together and continues to rely on their defense and special teams to win games. Shockingly, Iowa now controls their own destiny for a chance to win their second straight B1G West championship.

Meanwhile in Ames, the Cyclones continue to find new ways to lose one possession games. Saturday was an excellent opportunity for ISU to inch closer to bowl eligibility, facing a wounded Oklahoma State team that was once ranked #9 in the nation but was coming off back-to-back lopsided conference road losses. Instead, the Cyclones turned the ball over an astonishing five times, dropped a potential game-winning touchdown (for the fourth time this year), and had five pre-snap penalties, including three in the fourth quarter. Iowa State's offense again wasted a special performance by their defense, which held the Cowboys to 11 first downs, 244 total yards 1-14 on third down conversions. It's hard, however, to win any game, let alone a conference road game against a team with 13-straight home wins, with five turnovers and the aforementioned mistakes. Oklahoma State came into the game with the worst overall Big 12 defense allowing 466 total yards per game, and the second worst conference defense allowing 175 rushing yards and 31.8 points per game, but all the Cyclones could muster against this porous defense was 333 total yards, a meager 59 rushing yards and 14 points. Iowa State is wasting an all-time great defense with an inconsistent offense that just has not improved this season. This would have been a big-time win for ISU, but instead, for the fifth time this season the Cyclones lose a one possession game and leaves their fans living the Bill Murray movie for yet another week!





Veterans in Agriculture and 2022 Crop Progress and Outlook

November 11 is a legal U.S. holiday dedicated to American veterans of all wars. Commemorated in many countries as Armi-

stice Day, in 1938, November 11 became a federal holiday. Armistice Day became Veterans Day in the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War. Beginning in 1978, President Gerald Ford signed a new law making the observation of Veterans Day on November 11 due to this date's historical and



patriotic significance to many Americans.

As of April 2021, the U.S. living veteran (served in at least one war) population was 19.4 million. Here are some facts about the U.S. veteran

population(https://www.va.gov/vetdata/Veteran_Population.asp):

- 11 percent are women
 - 80 percent designate white

• 16 million Americans served during World War II (about 240,000 were still alive as of 2021)

- 933,000 served during the Korean War
- 5.9 million served during the Vietnam War
- 7.8 million served in the Gulf War era

• As of 2021, the top three states with the highest percentage of Veterans were Alaska (360K), Virginia (708K) and Montana (79K); Iowa counts for 178 thousand.

While Veterans Day pays tribute to all American veterans, living or dead, it especially gives thanks to living vets who served their country honorably during wars and at peacetime. Veterans Day is not to be confused with Memorial Day. The latter, on the fourth Monday in May, honors American service members who lost their lives while serving their country, or as the result of injuries incurred during battle.

In 2020, the Iowa Veterans in Agriculture (VIA) announced they were one of 17 recipients to receive a military veterans' federal program grant. VIA is partnering with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach, among others, on this three-year program called "Connecting Veterans to Agri-Food System Opportunities." When returning to civilian life, many veterans are interested in ag/food careers. Supporting these transitions are the following statistics:

• 46 percent of active military personnel are from rural areas

• 75 percent of Iowa's farmland is owned by people over the age of 75

•68 percent of Iowa farmers report they have no adult children presently engaged in farming.

The grant approach is multi-faceted to support different farm-entry options for veterans who individually represent a unique set of skills, knowledge, and interests. For more information, visit: https://www.extension.iastate.edu/news/veterans-agriculture-partner-extension-ag-connections-program.

2022 Crop Progress and Outlook

Mostly favorable weather has allowed a to-date faster pace to 2022 northwest Iowa corn and soybean harvesting. As of November 7, Iowa total corn harvested is 89 percent, a 12-point increase during the last week. Iowa total harvested soybeans were 97 percent complete.

On November 1, the fall crop insurance indemnification was announced as \$6.86 for corn and \$13.31 for soybeans. Corn was higher to the Spring (\$5.90) and soybeans (\$14.33) lower. Both were significantly below the 2021 crop insurance prices.

The November 9 WASDE (https://www.usda.gov/oce/commodity/wasde/wasde1122.pdf) shows 2022 domestic corn and soybeans stocks slightly higher, when compared to October. Both reflect very small changes to yields/production, when compared to last month. The 2021 and the 2022 crop market price projections for corn (\$6.00; \$6.80) and soybeans (\$13.30; \$14.00) remain unchanged from last month.





December 5 is the Last Day to Return Ballots

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) began mailing ballots this week for the Farm Service Agency (FSA) county and urban county committee elections to all eligible agricultural producers and private landowners across the country. Elections are occurring in certain Local Administrative Areas (LAA) for these committee members who make important decisions about how federal farm programs are administered locally. Producers and landowners must return ballots to their local FSA county office or have their ballots be postmarked by December 5,2022, in order for those ballots to be counted.

"County committees provide an opportunity for producers to play a meaningful role in delivering farm programs, but in order for county committees to be effective, they must truly represent all who are producing," said Matt Russell, State Executive Director for FSA in Iowa. "Voting in these elections is your opportunity to help ensure our county committees in Iowa reflect the diversity of our agriculture. Your voice and vote matter, don't miss your chance to cast your ballot."

Producers must participate or cooperate in an FSA program to be eligible to vote in the county committee election. A cooperating producer is someone who has provided information about their farming or ranching operation but may not have applied or received FSA program benefits. Additionally, producers who are not of legal voting age but supervise and conduct farming operations for an entire farm are eligible to vote in these elections.

Each committee has from three to 11 elected members who serve three-year terms, and at least one seat representing an LAA is up for election each year. Ballots must be in the mail or delivered in person by close of business December 5, 2022, to be counted. Newly elected committee members will take office January 1, 2023.

Producers can find out if their LAA is up for election and if they are eligible to vote by contacting their local FSA county office. Eligible voters who do not receive a ballot in the mail can request one from their local FSA county office. Visit farmers.gov/service-locator to find your local USDA Service Center and fsa.usda.gov/elections for more information.






