Everything you need to donate a car

Have an older car sitting around? While there's always the option to clean it up and attempt to sell it, chances are it won't generate much of a profit. And it may prove to be more work than it's worth. There is another option for unloading an old car, and that includes donating it for a tax deduction.

As you navigate the process of donating a car, it's best to get the facts and work with reputable organizations. This ensures the easiest and safest donation process. In fact, some charities will even pick up the vehicle and do much of the legwork for donors.

First and foremost, ensure the charitable organization is qualified to receive tax-deductible donations and has a 501(c)(3) status with the Internal Revenue Service. The IRS Tax Exempt Organization Search Tool can be a useful resource during this part of the process.

Secondly, research the charity and confirm that it is transparent with its efforts, including what percentage of contributions go to charitable programs. Keep in mind that even le-

gitimate charities may not fully disclose how they utilize donations.

Keep in mind that not too long ago a person could deduct the "fair market value" of the vehicle donated, but that is no longer the case, says Edmunds.com. It's important for donors to learn the proper procedures, which may require finding out what the charity ends up selling the donated vehicle for. If the car is valued at \$1,000, but the charity gets \$500 for it, then that person should only deduct \$500 on their taxes, indicates Consumer Affairs.

Charitable groups often have different procedures regarding vehicle donations. For example, the National Kidney Foundation's TowKars program will have a towing company pick up the vehicle after a person visits the website or calls to register the donation. After that, the vehicle will be picked up and then a tax receipt will be sent. Forbes Advisor lists Habitat for Humanity, Disabled American Veterans and the Make-A-Wish Foundation as well-known and reputable charity groups that

Ways for individuals with disabilities to give back

The World Health Organization reports that around 15% of the world's population, or roughly 1 billion people, have some sort of disability, making them the world's largest minority demographic. Advocating for issues that directly relate to them may be something people with disabilities want to pursue. Various charitable groups help volunteers with

disabilities find the support they need. The following are some of those groups.

▪ Easterseals. This or-

ganization was formed in 1919 by Edgar Allen in response to the lack of medical care available to peo-

ple with disabilities. Easterseals today provides job training and other support services.

▪ Special Olympics. The Special Olympics was started by the Shriver family after a friend expressed frustration regarding the lack of recreational opportunities for disabled individuals. The Special Olympics is now a global movement that empowers athletes of all abilities and ages. It provides year-round sports training and athletic events.

▪ United Cerebral Palsy. This organization was founded in 1949 by the Goldensons to improve quality of life for children with cerebral palsy and other disabilities. Today it assists hundreds of thou-

sands of people, helping them to live independently and productively.

▪ Goodwill Industries. This organization was founded by Reverend Edgar Helms in Boston in 1902. It is the leading provider of educational and workforce-related services. It helps people overcome barriers to employment, including disability, to find work and land lasting careers.

People with disabilities are urged to get involved in any way they can. In addition to general charitable groups, such individuals may find working with organizations devoted to the disabled to be especially rewarding.

Avoid these 4 charity scams

Charitable giving grew in 2021. According to Blackbaud Institute, a social good innovator, giving not only increased after COVID-19, but actually rebounded more than it had in a decade — increasing in the United States by 9% overall.

Annual private philanthropy as a percentage of GDP is about 1.44% in the United States. Philanthropy Roundtable reports that rate in Canada is 0.77%.

People tend to give the most to charity at the end of the year. While legitimate organizations may step up their solicitation of donations at this time, scammers also realize the months of November and December is prime giving season. So many scammers increase their deceptive tactics to

cheat unsuspecting individuals at this time of year.

Here are four common charity scams that every prospective donor should be aware of.

1. Impersonating another charity

Most philanthropic groups have an online presence in some shape or form. Scammers will replicate the look of the charitable group's website or social media account, or may contact you through email or text to solicit funds. Thinking it is a legitimate charity, you may follow a link to enter donation information. To avoid this scam, do not click on any links. Rather, enter the exact email address of a charity, if you

know it, or use a trusted resource like Charity Navigator for contact information. If you're still leery about online transactions, call the charity and ask to be sent a donation statement in the mail, which you should be able to mail back postage-paid.

2. The hard sell

A legitimate charity is happy to welcome a donation any time you're able to give it. A scam operation may employ a hard sell or a deadline by which the donation must be made. In addition, a fraudulent "charity" might ask for payment only by cash, gift card or wire transfer (because it is difficult to trace), and this should raise a red flag that something is amiss.

3. A thank-you for your donation

AARP warns that some scammers will send you a thank-you for a donation that you supposedly already made to entice you to give again. This is designed to lower your inhibitions about a soliciting charity. It's always a good idea to keep records of charitable giving, especially for tax-related reporting, so you can easily verify if you gave to a group in the past.

4. Cryptocurrency wallet

As methods of making payments change, scam groups often ride the wave. The Federal Trade Commission learned that when the

government of Ukraine announced it would be accepting donations to support their efforts via a cryptocurrency wallet, scammers started getting in on the action. But instead of the funds getting sent to the government's wallet, the donations headed to a private wallet.

Always conduct an online search of the wallet address

to confirm that money is being sent to the right place. Typically you can't reverse cryptocurrency payments, so due diligence is required.

Individuals need to be extra cautious with charitable giving to avoid common scams.

Give life with blood and plasma donations

Financial donations and volunteering are popular ways to give back to nonprofit organizations. However, there are many additional ways to give back, including donations that can help save lives.

Donating blood can be a worthwhile effort for someone looking to make a difference. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services says every two seconds someone in the United States needs blood or blood products. When people think of donating blood products, they may think about donating whole blood. However, there's a need for other components, namely plasma. Here's a deeper look at what's involved in the blood and plasma donation process.

Blood versus plasma

Whole blood donations include donating all four blood components: red blood cells, white blood cells, platelets, and plasma. Whole blood is used to treat blood loss that occurs during an injury or surgery.

Patients in need of plasma may have cancer, immunodeficiencies or rare diseases that can benefit from plasma treatment. Additionally, there is a global demand for plasma-derived medicine, such as immunoglobulin, according to the Immune Deficiency Foundation. One patient who needs Ig for a year requires 130 to 1,200 plasma donations to procure enough plasma.

Plasma is separated from whole blood, and there is not enough plasma in the whole blood supply to cover the demand for whole blood as well as plasma separately.

Eligibility

Donors must meet some eligibility requirements, according to the American Red Cross.

Blood: Blood can be donated once every 56 days. Individuals must be in good health, at least 16 years old in most areas, and must weigh at least 110 pounds.

Plasma: All blood types can give plasma, but only AB plasma type is universal. People with AB blood are considered elite plasma donors. Plasma can be donated once every 28 days.

Good health is required and donors must be at least 17 years old and weight no less than 110 pounds.

Donors also can donate red blood cells and platelets separately from whole blood or plasma. There are different eligibility requirements for these blood components.

Time commitment

It takes roughly 60 minutes to make a whole blood donation, says HHS. Plasma donation wait times can vary. An initial donation can take about two hours, while subsequent donations may be 90 minutes.

Benefits

Apart from the feeling of satisfaction from helping others, donating blood can help save the lives of up to three people. Since plasma donations are so important, and there is a greater time commitment to donation, some plasma donors are financially reimbursed.

Preparation

Individuals interested in donating blood products are urged to maintain a healthy lifestyle. Twenty-four hours before the appointment, the American Red Cross recommends drinking nine to 13 cups of water, and an additional two cups prior to the donation. Meals full of iron and protein are essential, and caffeine, alcohol, tobacco, and fatty foods should be avoided.

Kids can share information by telling friends and family what they learned over a dinner, sharing a report at school, or providing information for others with an action

item to take.

GIVING BACK

When is the right time for kids to start volunteering?

Aristotle once said the essence of life is “to serve others and do good.” It’s well documented that volunteerism offers many benefits to those who are recipients of the charitable work as well as the volunteers.

According to The Corporation for National & Community Service, one in four Americans volunteers. Volunteers come from all walks of life and various age groups. Nearly one-quarter of all volunteers are people under the age of 24.

Parents and guardians who want to introduce their children to volunteerism may not know when is the right age to do so. Many experts agree that there isn’t a definitive age for children to get involved in volunteering. In fact, no child is too young to volunteer.

Joseph F. Hagan Jr., M.D., a clinical professor of pediatrics at Larner College of Medicine at

the University of Vermont, says helping out during the toddler and preschool years helps shape a child’s sense of morality.

Rather than wondering if a child is too young to volunteer, adults should focus on finding the right activity to match the child’s age. For example, a three- or four-year-old child can fill bags or boxes with donated food or help gather blankets and towels to donate to an animal rescue. However, a toddler or preschooler may not have the stamina to complete a 5K walk.

Volunteerism doesn’t even have to be in the traditional sense of working with an established charity. A youngster can pick flowers from a field and deliver them to an elderly neighbor. Or a preschooler can invite a child playing alone to come play together. A toddler who loves sorting items can help sort recycling items at

home and watch a parent deliver them to the recycling center.

Another way to engage kids in volunteer work is to match their interests with the tasks. Many kids can’t get enough of animals, so they may want to help out an animal organization or be involved with a conservation group. A child can collect change to “adopt” an endangered species.

Kids also can visit a children’s hospital and deliver gifts to youngsters battling illnesses. In such situations, kids may be more engaged if they can help kids their own ages.

Children are never too young to volunteer. Finding the right fit can inspire a lifetime of giving back that benefits youngsters throughout their lives.

Find the right volunteer opportunity for you

Giving back to one's community can provide a sense of purpose and improve an individual's overall well-being. Data from Volunteer Hub indicates that people who volunteer improve their health by strengthening their bodies, improving their moods and reducing stress.

- Define your goals. Have goals in mind when selecting opportunities. Defining a goal can help

you maintain the motivation to volunteer and see a project through to completion.

- Start small. Wade into a volunteer opportunity slowly to see if it is the right fit. This may include volunteering one day a week or month. Increase the time you spend volunteering once you've found the right place for you.
