Why I volunteer with Glacial Lakes Conservancy

My involvement with GLC all started a couple of years ago with dinner at a local restaurant, where I first learned of Sheboygan's "urban oasis", Willow Creek Preserve. Having been relatively new to the community at the time, I was interested in exploring volunteer opportunities that involved citizen science, environmental conservation, and community engagement. From that initial conversation, I have since become involved with the Willow Creek Committee team, and Team Turtle!

As a member of the Committee team, I have the pleasure of working with a wonderful group of people who are passionate about environmental restoration and land management. The team is supportive when advocating for, and engaging in community involvement, so while my background is in engineering, they welcomed me as a citizen scientist, and helped me to reconnect with nature and discover a passion for turtles.

In addition to being involved with the Willow Creek Committee team, I have become an enthusiastic supporter of Team Turtle. Over the past year and a half, I have been volunteering my time by training volunteers and staff in the how-to's of radio telemetry, and by using radio telemetry equipment to track radioed

turtles. As a self-proclaimed turtle whisperer (with telemetry equipment in hand), I have slowly become attuned to the individual personalities and preferences of each of the turtles as they traverse the Willow Creek property. One, an adventurer, and another, a homebody, are reminders for me that there are many ways to experience nature; I love to get out to hike and observe and explore, but I also enjoy the peaceful, reflective moments spent outdoors.

Along the way, I've come to appreciate the educational opportunities provided through GLC, the Willow Creek Committee team, and Team Turtle, whether it is sharing pictures of turtles, sharing newfound facts about turtles with friends and family, telling curious coworkers how to handle turtles. I digress. The data gathered by Team Turtle is one of the many pieces of information gathered by the Willow Creek Committee team that allows GLC to make informed decisions about the future of the Willow Creek Property. Additionally, the time I've spent with GLC has allowed me to support wildlife monitoring activities not only at Willow Creek, but at other GLC properties as well. I have fond memories of pollinator walks at Bella Terra, amphibian trapping sessions at Willow Creek, crayfish sightings at Willow Creek Preserve and Hunner Preserve, to name a few.

I thoroughly enjoy my time with GLC, both as a volunteer and as a casual observer, and look forward to the adventures yet to come. Life with GLC is "turtle-y" awesome!

answer September Mystery Photo



The September Mystery Photo is from the "Vintage Parade" held as part of the first Elkhart Lake Road Races in 1950. The vintage cars are entering W. Rhine Street just before the intersection with Lake Street.

Additional Information - The 1950 "Vintage Parade" was a parade of the vehicles entered in the Concours d'Elegance (Event # 4 in the Program) intended to let the spectators see and admire the vintage Concours cars and the owners to show off their prized possessions. It was not a listed event in the Program, so less is known about its origin and how it fit in with the listed events.

To read the many articles written about the Elkhart Lake Sports Car events, one might think they were only about the sports car races but for automobile enthusiasts, the Concours d'Elegance events held each year were of equal importance. The Concours d'Elegance was the pinnacle of car

collection and winning an award in a Concours was as important to vintage car collectors as winning a race was to sports car owners. In fact the two types of events overlapped as several sports car owners were vintage car collectors as well, including both C. Bayard Sheldon and Fred Wacker. (The Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) had originally been an organization for car collectors and only recently stepped in to become the sponsor of sports car racing in America.)

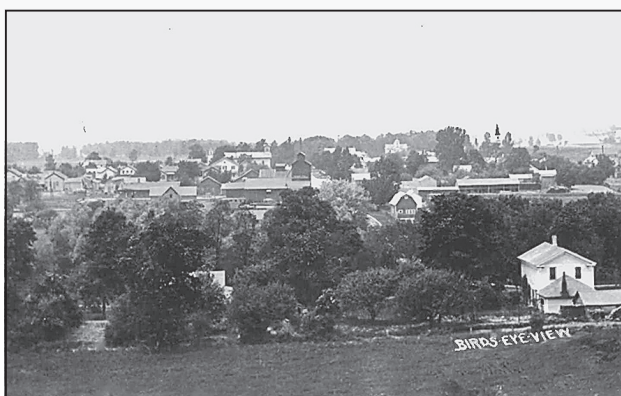
The "Vintage Parade" was most likely planned and organized by D. Cameron Peck who organized and judged the Concours d'Elegance events held during all three years Of the Elkhart Lake Races. Peck was President of the SCCA in 1950 and 1951 and was one of the founders of the Chicago Region. He was a wealthy heir to the Bowman Dairy fortune and owned a large vintage car collection housed in Evanston, IL At its height his collection contained well over a hundred restored and drivable vehicles. The Pecks Alley historical marker on CTY JP commemorates his contribution to the Elkhart Lake vintage car collector events.

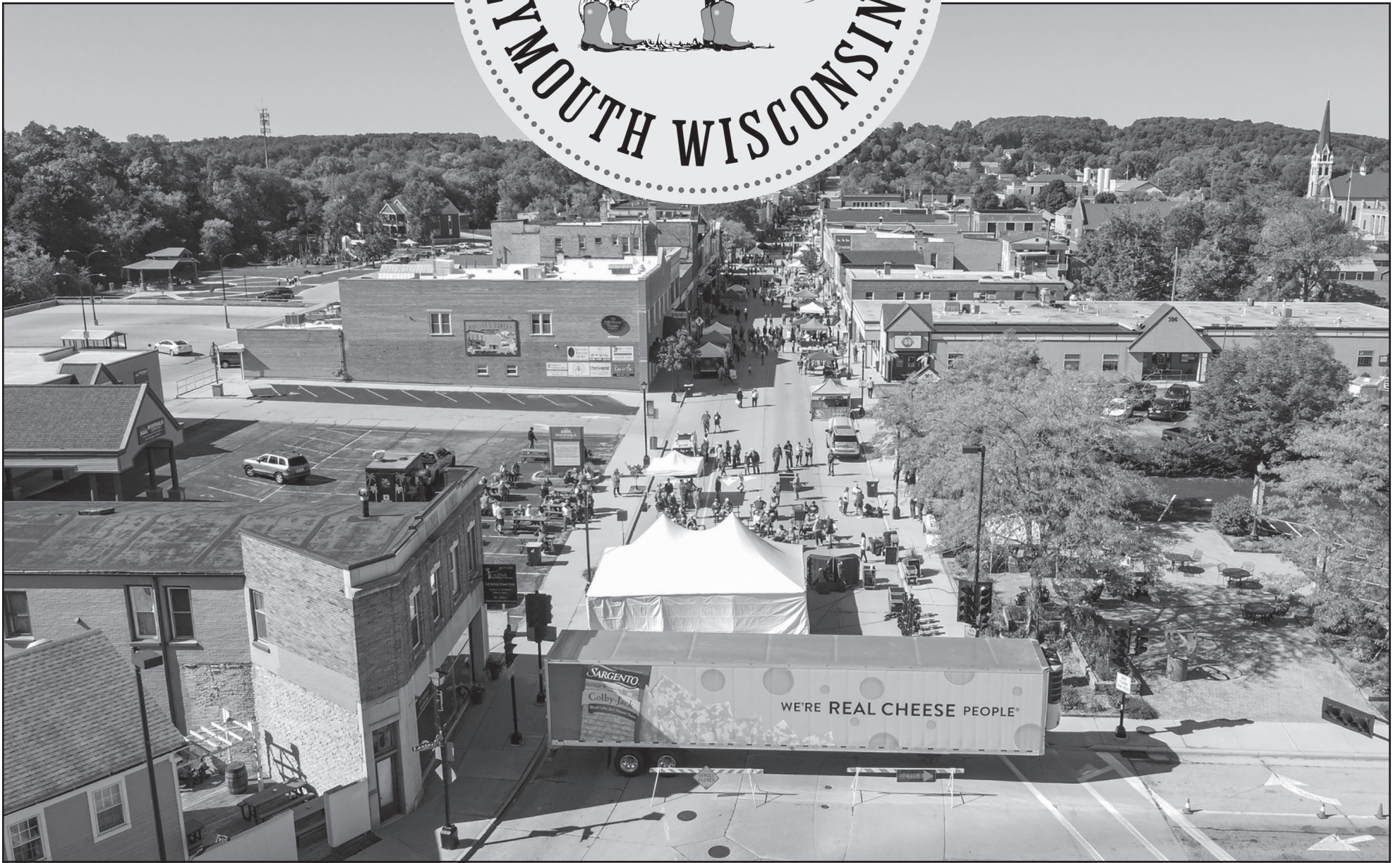

State Representatives Join Roundtable Discussion Focusing on LTC's \$1.64 Million Workforce Innovation Grant

Representatives from the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation and Department of Workforce Development were at Lakeshore Technical College October 12 to participate in a roundtable discussion with partners in the \$1.64 million Workforce Innovations Grant awarded to the college in June by Governor Tony Evers. The grant is funding the "Lakeshore Industry 4.0 Pathways and Upskilling" project.

"As the community driver for technical education in our district, this grant is helping us respond to our partners' requests to provide training where students are at. Locations will include local high schools, manufacturing facilities, and community-based organizations," said Lakeshore President Dr. Paul Carlsen.

Lakeshore's grant is intended to increase workforce participation in advanced manufacturing jobs involving robotics. Labor shortages intensified in east-central Wisconsin during the pandemic, specifically among manufacturing industries vital to the region's economic vitality. Many manufacturers have increased their use of robotics due to labor shortages, leading to an increased need for robotics expertise, which is a high-paying field.

Activities will also involve underserved and untapped

populations that experienced less workforce participation and more socio-economic hardships due to the pandemic.

Key to the implementation of the grant is the launch of a new mobile learning lab. The lab will offer automated education opportunities at no cost to learners who will be able to build upon what they learn. Grant partners stated they anticipate exposure to the lab will help targeted individuals envision themselves learning skills paying family-sustaining wages.

When asked by Missy Hughes, secretary and CEO of the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation, how the need to provide training at non-campus locations and to non-traditional populations was identified, Carlsen shared the success Lakeshore had with offering virtual welding training at its Sheboygan and Manitowoc locations. He said listening to business partners helped all involved realize the "strong appetite" in the community to deliver training where students are at.

Additional grant partners represented at the roundtable included United Way Manitowoc County, Amerequip, Valdres High School, New North, and Bay Area Workforce Development.

Riley Jahnke has traveled most of them during her LU experience.



Jahnke, who attends Lakeland as a commuter, takes full advantage of Lakeland's flexible course platforms as she's taken face-to-face courses, online live classes and fully online classes, which allows her to work during the day.

She's also a key member of the Lakeland women's soccer team, having started each game for the Muskies since her freshman season and earning Northern Athletics Collegiate Conference Scholar-Athlete honors in her first two seasons.

"I thoroughly enjoy everything I am a part of," said Jahnke, a recipient of several scholarships who this December will graduate after two and a half years at LU with a four-year degree in communication.

"I like to work. I like learning in different formats and modalities, and I can hold myself accountable. It just so happens the soccer schedule works because we have morning practices, and the flexibility of online learning was huge. I'm proud to be at Lakeland."

Although she initially thought about teaching as a career, Jahnke developed a love for writing in high school and through some career discovery landed on the public relations/marketing route.

Her marketing role for Lakeland's Co-Op team introduced her to creating social media content – and told her that wasn't the right career path for her – while also allowing her to write blog and newsletter items, which further developed her skill set.

"I wanted to get experience in all aspects of marketing because there is so much overlap with communication," she said. "Having worked in the customer service industry (at both Gessert's Ice Cream and Confectionery and Lake Street Café in Elkhart Lake) I have that in-person communication down.

"I knew I wanted to get more professional on the writing side and that drove my class selection and my job experiences to help me grow those skills."

Jahnke's career choice was solidified when she landed the CMO role for Launch. She worked 15-20 hours a week developing and executing Launch's marketing strategies to increase sales and promote Launch's various ventures like Musko's Campus Shop.

At EPIC, Jahnke assists the content team with all media needs such as press releases, media kits and alerts and blog writing. She's had opportunities to interact with clients as she learns how an agency operates.

This semester, she's working about 15 hours a week for EPIC, 10 for Launch, taking classes and playing soccer.

"Launch offered me opportunities to grow the skills I wanted to grow and immerse myself in the writing side of marketing," said Jahnke, noting that Launch's professional environment prepared her well for her EPIC experience.

"At Launch, I am higher up and able to delegate tasks, and at EPIC I am the one getting the tasks. It's interesting to see the differences. It's helped me to be confident in my role to talk about the projects we're working on and ask questions when I might be confused. I've gained a lot of leadership from Launch."

Between classes, work, soccer and some social time, Jahnke's schedule is always packed, but she knows it is positioning her for post-graduation success.

"Having that experience in college is what employers are looking for," she said. "I don't want an entry-level position or internship when I graduate. I want a job at a higher level where I will be held accountable and know I can handle the responsibilities."

Kym Leibham, Lakeland's director of strategic outreach and Launch's staff mentor, said Jahnke's work ethic and desire to expand her skills allowed her to quickly learn how to create effective, long-term marketing strategies while managing daily opportunities.

"She became an exceptional role model and mentor for other Launch team members as a trustworthy and approachable leader," Leibham said. "Riley can quickly assess opportunities and reliably create an execution approach. Launch provided her the opportunity to elevate her marketing and promotional skills while understanding how to mentor and lead her peers.

"Riley will leave a legacy with Launch, and she will positively impact her workplace throughout her career."

Co-Op also connected Jahnke with 2001 Lakeland graduate Brian Badura, a veteran of the marketing and PR world who has helped her learn more about the nuances of the industry, create a resume that will stand out and navigate the job application process.

Jahnke's road to Lakeland is an interesting story on its own. Her maternal grandmother, JoAnn Lutzke, worked for about a decade as a housekeeper at what was then Lakeland College. Riley's mother, Amy, attended Lakeland, played basketball, met her future husband/Riley's father, soccer player Toby Jahnke, and the two graduated in the late 1980s.

Their two oldest children both graduated from Lakeland, Taylor in 2013 and Garrett in 2016, and both played soccer for the Muskies. Riley's aunt, Jodi Lutzke, was also a Lakeland graduate.

"It didn't seem like a choice," Riley said with a smile. "I grew up on campus. I knew where I was going to go."

Village of Elkhart Lake Updates

TRICK OR TREAT

The Trick or Treat hours have been set for the Village. Trick or Treat hours will be on Sunday, October 30, 2022 from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm.

2023 BUDGET

The Village Board will hold a public hearing on its 2023 budget on November 21st, 2022 at 5:50 pm. More information will be posted on the budget over the coming weeks. Please watch the posting places and Plymouth Review for the official public hearing notice for the 2023 budget.

WINTER RULES

BEGIN NOVEMBER 15TH

Winter parking regulations go into effect on November 15th. As a reminder, here is the ordinance.

Parking is allowed overnight in the N. East Street parking lot overnight until 6 am, at that time your vehicle must be moved.

PARKING REGULATIONS

All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 2 am. and 6 am, and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 am until 9 am commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

SNOW REMOVAL

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snow-fall in a 24-hour period.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

SNOW REMOVAL WARNING

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the Village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient and you will be in violation.

AUTO PAY YOUR WATER BILL

The Village of Elkhart Lake accepts Automatic Clearing House (ACH) payments for your water/sewer bills. If you are interested in having your water/sewer bill automatically debited from your bank account, please contact the Village at 920-876-2122 or email clerk@elkhartlakewi.gov and we will work to set you up on the program.

SEWER RATE INCREASE FOR 2022

The Village Board will be increasing sewer rates in 2022. Rates will go up by \$.05 per 100 cubic feet. This means starting in January (billed in April), sewer rates will be \$7.15 per 100 cubic feet.

YARD WASTE DUMPSTER

The Yard Waste Dumpster are open for the year. The dumpster will remain unattended for the foreseeable future. The yard waste dumpster generally closes by early to mid-November. Watch our website for information on when it will close. Please follow the signs about using the dumpster, you are on camera. If you require assistance, we ask that you set up an appointment with the public works department (920-876-2231), so someone can help you. This dumpster is for yard waste only, not lake waste. A truck for large brush or trees can be obtained by calling the Village garage at 920-876-2231.

PRESCRIPTION DRUG DROP OFF BOX

Please make sure you safely dispose of your old prescription drugs. There is a collection box located outside the police department where you can dispose of old/unused medications. Please take your medications out of their containers and just drop the pills in the box. We do not accept liquids or needles.

Drop off anytime Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED

If you are planning a construction project on your home or business, you must apply for a building permit. Permits must be obtained prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

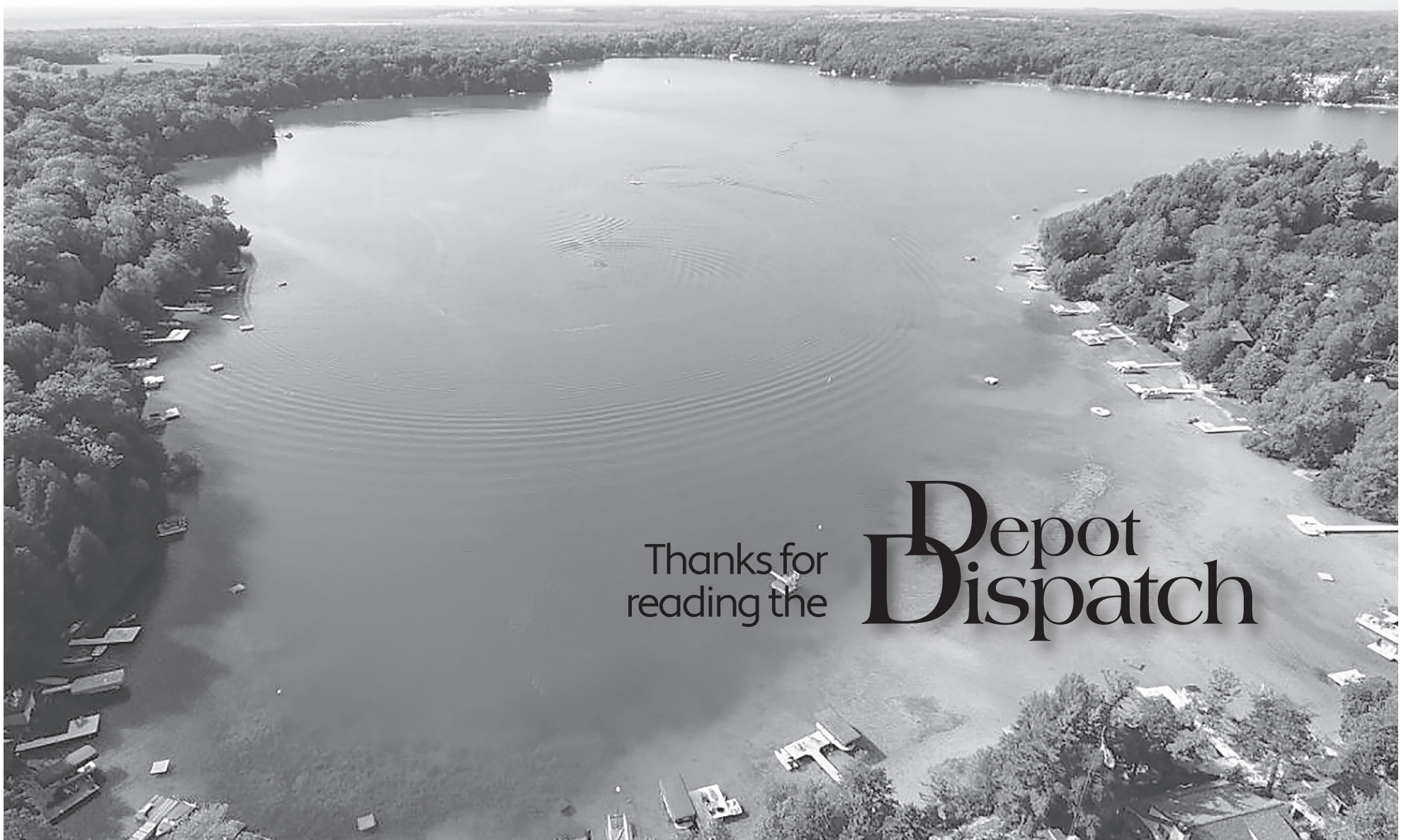

\$25,000 Awarded to Lakeshore Technical College School of Agriculture by Compeer Financial

The School of Agriculture at Lakeshore Technical College has been awarded \$25,000 through Compeer Financial's Agriculture and Rural Initiative. Funds are being used to purchase an additional calf and ultrasound simulator that provides students the opportunity to practice animal health care techniques in a safe environment.
