Why I Volunteer for Glacial Lakes Conservancy

Preservation of whole working ecosystems is very important to me. The number of birds in North America has dropped drastically in the last 50 years, and I want to do what I can to slow this decline, and the decline of all species. GLC gives me the opportunity to work on preserving and restoring some vital ecosystems which support a wide variety of species.

Since I was a young person, conservation has been very important to me. My parents often took me camping in northern Wisconsin, and we visited some national parks around the country. These experiences solidified my love of natural places. I studied biology and conservation at UW-Madison and then taught in the Sheboygan School District. I taught general science at Urban Middle School and biology and botany at North High School, which gave me the opportunity to share and teach ecology to the next generation.

I spend a great deal of time exploring natural places. I enjoy backpacking, and I completed the 485-mile Colorado Trail two summers ago. I also enjoy canoe camping, cross-country skiing, and bird watching. My wife, Amy, and I have a tandem, and a few years ago, we took a seven-week bicycle camping tour across Europe with our two daughters. My family has also explored many natural areas, including many of our national parks. The common thread in my interests is that they all involve being outside. I love being outside, particularly in natural settings.

I have enjoyed interacting with the staff and other volunteers at GLC. It is nice to interact with like-minded people. GLC gives me the opportunity to help preserve ecosystems. I have helped remove invasive species and plant native trees at Willow Creek Preserve.. I want to stay involved in working on the Willow Creek Preserve and other preserves.

I look forward to seeing the land protected by GLC expand and improve over the years. We need to hand off this planet to the next generation as diverse with life as it was when we arrived upon it.





This photo is the entrance to the Karting Kettle taken facing northwest. That is the Elementary school in the background. Based on the addition shown the photo is sometime after 1980, the car might be a 1985 Dodge Charger. This entrance was from Highway 67/Lincoln

I belive my Grandfather, Arthur Menne painted that sign. The mini golf was added in about 1971, and originally built and run by Jerry Bella and another man from Kiel whose name I don't

The Karting Kettle was started in about 1959 or '60, by my grandfather and the Wolf Brothers. By the time of this photo it was fully owned and operated by my father, Peter Menne. I'm not sure of the date the Wolf Brothers exited the business. That was prior to my memory!



My childhood and young adult summers were spent at the track. Working and later learning from my Dad how to run a business. Eventually (probably shortly before the time of this photo) we also ran the mini golf concession. Young folks from around the area helped us run the track, as Dad had a full time job elsewhere.

So many memories and friends were made here. From hosting weekend races for Plymouth Rock campers, to Parent weekends for Harand Camp. I even met Paul Newman at our go-kart track the day before I graduated from Elkhart Lake Glenbeulah High School in 1982! That June weekend was also mentioned in a 1985 National Geographic article about him.














Welcome to Elkhart Lake!



The company currently employs approximately 30 people and continues to invest in additional equipment to keep up with growing demand. Safety Fresh is owned and operated by the Maglio family which has been in the food business since 1902.

With the help and guidance of the SCEDC throughout the RLF process, Safety Fresh Foods was able to purchase new equipment for their business, a purchase that significantly impacted their growth in the last four years.

"The HPP business comes with very high start-up costs," said Mark Maglio, director of Safety Fresh Foods. "The RLF helped Safety Fresh purchase its initial piece of Avure processing equipment. Sales have grown by over 600 percent in four years, and Safety Fresh is now looking to purchase additional machines to accommodate the increased demand."

Maglio added, "The SCEDC was incredibly helpful as we navigated opening a business in a new location. While Maglio Companies has operated in Wisconsin since the 1940s, we are new to Sheboygan County. The SCEDC was tremendous, assisting with the RLF process and providing introductions to vendors and customers alike."





special operations within the airborne infantry communities, served two tours at the Pentagon with a three year additional duty assignment at the White House as a Social Aide under President Bill Clinton.

Colonel Kuehl's key command opportunities included commanding the 18th Personnel Services Battalion in Fort Bragg, North Carolina. After three months of leading, training and readying his unit of 300 soldiers for war, his unit was selected as the first personnel and administration unit to deploy to Afghanistan after 9/11 in 2001.

Further assignments included Director for Human Resources, United States Special Operations Command, and subsequently Chief of Staff for Special Operations Forces in the Joint Special Operations Command in Balad, Iraq. Thanks to Colonel Kuehl's leadership and policy development between the branches of our military services, the Marine Special Operations Command came into being, and the Marines that serve in it are justly compensated for their more hazardous assignments.

Colonel Kuehl's military service began as a means to an end and ended as a means to serve his country proudly and honor all of the communities he became a part of along the way. He taught soldiers how to be leaders both in the classroom and through leading by example. 

We had 671 voters who cast ballots and 22 people register to vote on election day. Our turnout nearly 84%.

SNOW REMOVAL WARNING

PARKING REGULATIONS

Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 2 am. and 6 am, and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 am until 9 am commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

The Waelderhaus is managed by Kohler Foundation, a non-profit, private foundation dedicated to supporting the arts, education, and art preservation initiatives in the state of Wisconsin.

Tracked Wheelchair Open for Reservations

Enjoying the outdoors is an activity that many people are able to participate in, but there are still those that are in need of assistance.

Thanks to a cooperative effort between the Northern Kettles Chapter of the National Wild Turkey Federation—a member of the Sheboygan County Conservation Association—and American Legion Post 149 of Sheboygan Falls, individuals with mobility difficulties are able to reserve a tracked wheelchair at no cost, allowing these individuals to enjoy the outdoors as independently as possible.

The tracked wheelchair program was founded by Monica Spaeni, the founder and president of Access Ability Wisconsin, INC. Access Ability Wisconsin is a charitable, non-profit organization that has the goal, according to their website, to place at least one all-terrain outdoor wheelchair with an enclosed trailer in every county in Wisconsin.

The idea to utilize the tracked wheelchair program, as relayed by the president of the Northern Kettles Chapter of the NWTF Dennis Stuckmann, took root during a fundraising banquet at Millhome Supper Club in Kiel. Among those present at the banquet was longtime member Frank Sterzin, who has a disabled son. This

father had gotten to know Spaeni through his son, and approached the organization's leaders and mentioned his son's experience with a tracked wheelchair. The father then questioned if there would be interest for the organization to utilize one as well.

Northern Kettles Chapter of NWTF worked with Access Ability Wisconsin and in a matter of five months, funds were raised and a tracked wheelchair was purchased for people to utilize.

The tracked wheelchair can be reserved and is available on a first-come, first-served basis and instruction for use of the chair at time of pickup. There is no cost to reserve the chair, but the organization is open to donations to help maintain the chair so others may also use this tool to help enjoy the outdoors. Those that have been able to use the chair have been pleased, and hopefully others will be able to do the same.

Additional information regarding how to reserve the tracked wheelchair can be found at sheboyganconservation.org/programs, as well as the forms, calendar showing available dates, owner's manual and liability information.

After 27 Years, Road America's Track is Repaved

at Road America is being repaved in preparation for the 2023 season.

In a presentation done in September 2022 by engineering manager Craig Donze and project manager Heather Sayler from Walbec Group, the history of Road America, plan and theoretical timeline of the repavement were laid out to those in attendance.

Starting the presentation was the history of the track, beginning with Road America first being built in 1954 and the track being paved in 1955. One inch of hot mix asphalt was laid on the track in 1974 and then Road America decided to rehabilitate the track. The rehabilitation included pulverizing the existing HMA with six

For the first time since 1995, the track inches of existing gravel base course, which in fact increased the structural support. The presentation also reported that the Go Kart Track (Motorplex) was paved for the first time in 1999 and additional patchwork was also done that same year.

> The timeline presented the numerous jobs that were accomplished at Road America over the years, but it was time for the main track to receive attention.

> Donze during the presentation spoke of the impressive geometry regarding the track that was built in the Kettle Moraine area, from track length, to elevation change and curve radius.

> In addition to the geometry within the

track, Donze stated and presented that they needed to know exactly what the track was built on. With the track being constructed along a glacial landform, tests showed that the soils the track was built on were predominately glacial till with high silt content, with Donze describing silt as "finer than sand, coarser than dust and extremely moisture sensitive."

All the tests done regarding the track were in order to keep Road America's uniqueness and, as Donze said during the presentation, "we put it right back how we found it." The track is also to be made with what Donze called a "fancy asphalt mix." which will perform well sustaining the friction created during the race as well as surviving the winter months. Sayler also

stated during the presentation that the track needed to match what they wanted alongside meeting industry standards.

Sayler also explained during the presentation the theoretical timeline beginning Oct. 3 with coring, sawing and pipe work, with Oct. 26 being the goal finish date if all goes well. Workers on the project needed to remove 17,195 tons of asphalt, which is approximately 860 dump trucks. When it came time to pave, Sayler explained the paving would be done side by side, with the lower layer being 10,045 tons of asphalt, which is approximately 486 dump trucks, and the upper layer being 6,450 tons of asphalt, which is approximately 287 dump trucks.
