4 Tips to Creating a Dementia-**Friendly Holiday Season**

from the Alzheimer's Foundation of America

NEW YORK - With the holiday season underway, Alzheimer's Foundation of America (AFA) is providing four tips to help families affected by dementia enjoy the spirit of the season in a dementiafriendly way.

"The holiday season can be both joyful and stressful for all of us, especially individuals living with a dementiarelated illness," said
Tennifor Reeder, LCSW, AFA's Director of Educational and Social Services. "Being proactive, adaptable, and inclusive of the person's wishes and abilities are the best ways to help them have a happy and joyful holiday season."

partners Families. and friends caring for someone with dementia should consider the following steps:

 Avoid overdecorating Decorating is part of the holiday season fun, however, too much stimulation may challenging for someone Keep with dementia. festive, decorations but simple--too many flickering lights or noisy items could be overwhelming. Instead of elaborate decorations, try choosing a few favorite items. Phase in decorations over a period of days instead of all at once, so that changes to the person's environment are less confusing.

· Create a safe and calm space. Don't use fragile decorations (which can shatter and create sharp fragments) or ones that could be mistaken for edible treats. Be mindful of potential tripping hazards on the floor, such as wires for decorations. Securely hook Christmas trees to

the wall to avoid falls and use menorahs or kinaras with electric candles to reduce fire hazards. As well as a physically safe environment, create a space where your loved one can sit in comfort and where guests can visit in small groups or one-to-one. As much as possible, maintain the person's normal routine when scheduling visits.

 Adapt past favorite traditions or create ones. Build on new old traditions when appropriate, such as enjoying favorite music or movies, or looking at pictures of past holiday celebrations. Start new ones that center on activities and events the person enjoys and can do, such as touring neighborhood holiday lights, and do it together. Take strengthsa and based personcentered approach and incorporate what person can do and what they choose to do now, rather than dwelling on what they used to do. Focus on those things that bring joy and let go of activities that seem too stressful.

• Involve the person in the planning and preparations. Whenever possible, involve person by asking what traditions are important to them—it keeps them active and involved and helps you prioritize and plan appropriately. For example, if they always sent out holiday cards or baked holiday cookies and still want to do so, do it together with them. If they can no longer shop for gifts for their loved ones, invite them to help with wrapping the gifts so that they feel they are contributing.



The closure came after concluding there was no actual evidence of extraterrestrial spaceships behind the 12,618 UFO sightings it had collected.
- On December 18, 1912, amateur archaeologist Charles Dawson discovered human remains in the Piltdown gravel pit in Sussex, England. Dubbed the "Piltdown Man," he was thought to represent the missing evolutionary link between apes and mankind until it was confirmed at a 1953 international congress of paleontologists that

the specimen was a fraud, consisting of skull parts both human and orangutan.

• On Dec. 20, 1957, Elvis Presley received his Army draft notice while

spending the holiday season at his newly purchased mansion, Graceland, Distraught fans sent thousands of letters to the Army asking for him to be spared, but Elvis himself

had no hesitation about entering, though he did receive a deferment that allowed him to finish work on the movie "King Creole."

What can you do to try to avoid hitting deer and other animals when driving on highways and roads?

As night begins to fall and visibility becomes more difficult, an animal can easily move onto the busy road. It's not an uncommon sight for many drivers, especially

There may be no real way to keep animals off the road, but these important safety tips can help prevent animal strikes.

Tips To Avoid Animals On The Road

- Stay alert. Pay attention to "deer crossing" and "wildlife crossing" signs and be cautious in areas near woods or water.
- Use high beams. Flicking your high beams on an animal in the road may cause the animal to scurry away. High beams also help illuminate dark roads.
- Don't swerve. If a car crash is inevitable, maintain control of your vehicle and don't veer off the road.
- Brake as necessary. If you can avoid hitting the animal, reduce your speed, honk your horn and tap your brakes to warn other drivers. If there are no drivers behind you, brake hard.
- Remember peak season. Animal collisions happen most during October through December, which is hunting and mating season.
- Remember meal time. Watch for animals in the road between dusk and dawn.
- Watch for herds. If you see one deer, there are probably more nearby.
- Don't use a whistle. No scientific evidence supports that car-mounted deer whistles work.
- Wear seat belts. Always obey speed limits and wear seat belts.

There is an error on my credit card bill. What can I

Fortunately, there is a federal law known as the Fair Credit Billing Act which provides an avenue for relief for those who are charged wrongly, incorrectly, or

unfairly. Under the Fair Credit Billing Act, you must notify that creditor of the error promptly (within 60 days of first receiving said notice). You should contact the creditor by telephone, email, or writing as soon as you see the error and explain the error as to ensure the triggering of the protections of this law.

Your letter (which you should send by certified mail) should contain your name and the account number on which the error took place. Your belief as to the specific billing error and the amount of the errors, and the reasons why this is in error (never charged, wrong amount charged, double billing, etc.)

The good news is that a creditor cannot harm or threaten to harm your credit rating during the pendency of the particular dispute. If you have a dispute, you can use a federal law known as the Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act of 2003 (FACTA) provides that consumers have free access to their credit reports and the revealing of their credit scores. Consumers can also receive their credit scores from companies, such as Experian, Trans Union, and Equifax.

It's a good idea to use your right to a yearly, free credit report to review your credit history and ensure there are no discrepancies or suspicious activity.

If you find information that is not accurate on your credit report, you can notify the reporting agency under the Fair Credit Reporting Act. This Act generally gives consumers the right to make a statement explaining the consumer's side of the dispute.





Blessing and Cursing

Editor:

heard so many people talking about TV streaming series but never had time to acquaint myself with it until COVID hit. I'm blessed with unusually good health but tested positive last Christmas. The doctor told me to stay at home for a week. As President Obama famously said, I had a phone and a pen, and I tried to carry on ministry from afar.

And I don't watch much television. I'd rather read. I remember religiously watching "Dallas" so long ago, but I vowed never to get hooked like that again. But home confinement was a good time to see what everybody was talking about, so I watched a few episodes.

Allow me a few observations.

First, this series has no heroes since I never found "the good guy." At least on "Dallas" we had Bobby and Pam Ewing who tried to walk the straight and narrow. And "Walker Texas Ranger," Alex and Trivette always made good choices! But the new series shows humanity at its worst with murder, scheming and revenge. Thus no one to root for, and no one who says, "we need to do the right thing."

But the most overriding observation I took away was the crutch word the cast used in almost every sentence. It's a crude word for sexual relations. It trivializes this gift from God and debases our language. I'm not sure how this word became so popular and began to be used so frequently, but it's in every script for this program.

Schoolteachers in my generation exhorted us not to curse but to learn the beauty of language and use it to advantage.

Two of the men on Mt. Rushmore agreed.

The Father of our country, Gen. Washington, said, "The foolish and wicked practice of profane cursing and swearing is a vice so mean and low that

every person of sense and character detests and despises it."

And President Teddy Roosevelt noted, "Profanity is the parlance of the fool. Why curse when there is such a magnificent language with which to discourse?"

I know it's just a TV show, but it's popular enough to be in the top ten. And one can't argue that film and music don't influence American language and culture.

So that's my critic's review, for what it's worth. Now it's time to find a book.







ships, storms, or voice assistants except in direct quotations. We are to use 'it" instead.

that because all Is females in society the insulted - like all are Warriors, Redskins, the Fighting Sioux, were supposedly insulted by the traditional admiration and inspiration for athletic team names? Or was it just a handful of woke complainers?

In more serious matters, early this year Colorado Governor, Jared Polis, signed the Reproductive Health Equity Act into law allowing for on-demand abortion up to the moment of birth in his state.

Unconcerned with reality and biological facts, the *AP Stylebook* then recommended using the term "pregnant people" in place of "women," so we wouldn't misinterpret anyone's preferred gender identity.

The APStylebook's abortion language stipulations continued earlier this month. use the modifiers antiabortion or abortionrights; don't use pro-life, pro-choice or pro-abortion unless they are in quotes or proper names. Avoid the term "abortionist" which connotes a person who performs clandestine abortions."

Replacing the term "prochoice" and "pro-abortion" "abortion-rights" assumes that women have a right to end the life of a child in their womb. Nothing in the Declaration of Independence or the Constitution provides such an elective right to end a pregnancy. Bible certainly doesn't.

Stylebook's The decision to replace the term "pro-life" with "antiabortion" is a purposeful effort to cloak the pro-life community in further negativity. It flies in the face of an ever-growing pro-life community consisting of more than 3,000 pregnancy centers, millions care millions Americans, and thousands who take the journey with women through time and resource investments during and after unplanned pregnancies.

AP outdid itself last week with a new revelation requesting that journalists not use the phrase "lateterm abortion." justification for this is that "The American College Obstetricians and of Gynecologists defines late term as 41 weeks through 41 weeks and 6 days of gestation, and abortion does not happen in this period. Instead, use the term 'abortion later in pregnancy.'

Well, according to the bill signed into law by Governor Polis referenced above, abortion does AND SHOULD happen in "this period." And what level of brilliance in that organization allowed such a narrowly-framed window "late term?" Any objective mind would concede that late term extends well back through third trimester AT LEAST. regardless of what any

Regardless, we can only pray for her peace, support her physical and emotional recovery afterward, and prosecute the vermin responsible for her being in that situation.



Medicare Minute "Post AEP Sign Up"

December 7th. This means that, except for a few exceptions, anyone who was on a Medicare prescription drug plan during 2022 will have to wait until next October to make changes to their plan. If you are enrolled in an Advantage Plan beginning January 1st you will have an additional period to make plan changes. This period is called Open Enrollment Period and runs January 1st through March

As we have stated before, AEP is only for those people who are already on Medicare and wish to enroll in or make changes to their prescription drug plan or Medicare Advantage Plan for 2023. AEP does not affect anyone who is getting Medicare for the first time in 2023 or is on Medicare and leaving employer coverage in the coming year. Medicare will give you a Special Election Period (SEP) for these situations.

If you are getting Medicare for the first time and not on employer insurance you will have 3 months to sign up for a Medicare plan. The 3 months begins the month after your Medicare becomes effective. If you are leaving employer coverage you will have 60 days to enroll. This time starts the day you leave your employer coverage. Although you will have a SEP for both these situations it's a good idea to have your Medicare plan in place before your SEP begins.

It is also important to remember that AEP does not affect Medicare supplements. You can enroll in or make changes to your Medicare supplement at any time during the year. Keep in mind that you may have to go through underwriting to make changes to your supplement. If you are getting Medicare for the first time or leaving employer coverage you can sign up for the supplement 6 months prior to your coverage starting.
