## CHEESY LASAGNA SOUP

## Ingredients

- 8 ounces whole-milk ricotta cheese (about 1 cup)
- 2 ounces Parmesan cheese, finely grated (about $11 / 4$ cups)
- $1 / 8$ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- $1 \frac{1}{4}$ teaspoons kosher salt, divided

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 pound ground chuck
- 1 medium-size yellow onion, chopped (about 1 cup)
- 3 medium garlic cloves, finely chopped (about 1 Tbsp.)
- 2 (15-oz.) cans diced tomatoes
- 6 cups chicken stock
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ tablespoons granulated sugar
- 8 ounces uncooked lasagna noodles, broken into $11 / 2$ - to 2 inch pieces
- 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar
- 4 ounces low-moisture mozzarella cheese, shredded (about 1 cup)
- $1 / 4$ cup small basil leaves


## Directions

1. Stir together ricotta, Parmesan, nutmeg, and $1 / 4$ teaspoon of the salt in a medium bowl. Cover and refrigerate until ready to serve.
2. Heat oil in a large Dutch oven over medium-high. Add ground chuck. Cook, stirring and breaking up into pieces, until browned and just cooked through, about 3 minutes.

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Using a slotted spoon, transfer beef to a small bowl lined with paper towels; set aside.
3. Do not wipe Dutch oven clean. Add onion to Dutch oven. Cook over medium-high, stirring occasionally, until softened and starting to caramelize, about 4 minutes. Add garlic. Cook, stirring constantly, until fragrant, about 1 minute. Stir in diced tomatoes and stock; bring to a boil over high. Stir in sugar and remaining 1 teaspoon salt. Add lasagna pieces. Cook, stirring occasionally, until noodles are just cooked through and almost al dente, about 8 minutes. Stir in browned beef. Remove from heat, and stir in vinegar. Divide soup evenly among 4 bowls; top with mozzarella and dollops of reserved ricotta mixture. Top bowls with basil leaves before serving.

## OYSTER STEW

## Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 2 shallots, minced
- $1 / 2$ cup dry sherry or dry white wine

- 24 freshly shucked oysters, oyster liquor reserved
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups whole milk
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups heavy cream
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley
- sea salt to taste
- 1 pinch sweet paprika
- 1 cup oyster crackers


## Directions

1. Stir butter and garlic in a stockpot over medium heat until butter begins to brown. Remove garlic and discard.
2. Stir shallots into browned butter. Cook and stir until translucent, 5 to 7 minutes.
3. Pour sherry over shallots in the stockpot and bring to a boil while scraping any browned bits off of the bottom of the pot. Simmer until liquid is reduced by half, 3 to 5 minutes.
4. Pour reserved oyster liquor, milk, and cream into the stockpot; bring mixture to a simmer. Reduce heat to medium-low and stir in oysters; cook until oyster edges begin to ruffle, about 3 minutes. Remove from heat.
5. Stir in parsley; season with sea salt to taste. Ladle into bowls and garnish with sweet paprika and oyster crackers.
6. Cook's Note:
7. If using canned oysters, drain the oysters over a bowl to collect the liquid. Use this liquid in place of oyster liquor.

## VEGETABLE BEEF SOUP

## Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 2 pounds beef stew meat
- salt and pepper to taste
- $1 / 2$ cup onion chopped
- 3 carrots peeled, halved and sliced
- 2 stalks celery sliced
- 2 teaspoons minced garlic
- 28 ounce can diced tomatoes do not drain
- $11 / 2$ teaspoons Italian seasoning
- 1 bay leaf
- 7 cups beef broth
- 2 cups Russet potato peeled and cut into $1 / 2$ inch pieces
- $1 / 2$ cup frozen corn
- 1/2 cup frozen peas
- 3/4 cup frozen cut green beans
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley


## Directions

1. Heat the olive oil in a large pan over medium high heat. Season the stew meat with salt and pepper to taste.
2. Place half of the meat in the pan in a single layer. Cook for 3-4 minutes per side or until browned.
3. Repeat the process with the remaining beef. Place the meat on a plate and cover to keep warm.
4. Add the onion, carrot and celery to the pan. Cook for 4-5 minutes or until softened. Add the garlic and cook for 30 seconds.
5. Add the beef back to the pot along with the tomatoes, Italian seasoning, bay leaf and beef broth. Bring to a low simmer.
6. Simmer for 60 minutes or until beef is tender.
7. Add the potatoes to the pot and cook for an additional 20 minutes or until tender.
8. Stir in the corn, peas and green beans. Cook for 5 minutes. Season the soup to taste with salt and pepper.
9. Discard bay leaf. Sprinkle with parsley and serve.

## OLD BAY MARYLAND CRAB SOUP

## INGREDIENTS

1 can (28 ounces) whole tomatoes, cut into small pieces
3 cups water
2 cups beef broth
1 cup frozen lima beans


1 cup frozen baby carrots (chopped)
1 cup frozen yellow sweet corn
2 tablespoons McCormick ${ }^{\circledR}$ Chopped Onions
1 tablespoon OLD BAY ${ }^{\circledR}$ Seasoning
1 pound lump crabmeat or imitation crabmeat

## CABBAGE SOUP WITH SMOKED SAUSAGE

 Ingredients1/2 tablespoon olive or vegetable oil
1 (16-ounce) package smoked Kielbasa sausage, cut into 1/4-inch slices
1 tablespoon butter
2 carrots, peeled and thinly sliced
1 medium sweet onion, chopped
2 cloves garlic, minced
1 small head green cabbage, chopped
1 (14.5-ounce) can chicken broth
$11 / 2$ cups water
1 chicken bouillon cube
2 medium potatoes, peeled and cut into $1 / 2$-inch cubes
1 tablespoon packed brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon black pepper
1/4 teaspoon caraway seeds, optional
1/4 teaspoon dried thyme
1/3 cup heavy cream

## Directions

Heat oil in a Dutch oven. Add sausage and cook until browned. Remove with a slotted spoon and set aside. Add butter to the grease in the Dutch oven and cook carrots and onion over medium-heat until soft. Add garlic and cook 1 minute.
Add cabbage and cook and stir for a minute or two, until the cabbage wilts some.
Add potatoes, chicken broth, water, bouillon cube, and brown sugar.
Bring to a simmer, cover and cook until potatoes are soft. Add sausage, black pepper, caraway seeds, thyme, and heavy cream. Bring to a simmer. Serve.

## Claybank Master Gardeners

Happy New Year Gardeners, Here's hoping your winter plants and veggie gardens are making it through the deep freezes and yo-yo weather cycles we're blessed with in Lower Alabama (LA). Remember to uncover your plants to let the rains in and then air them out before recovering them for the freezes (voice of experience speaking here). If you didn't know that December is a good time to plant flower seeds, you can still sow them in January. Lightly cover the seeds with pine straw or something to keep the birds from eating the seeds, and their root systems will have a great start by the time the hot weather gets going.

Plant collards, broccoli, alliums (onions, chives, garlic, etc.) kale, swiss chard, and hearty lettuces now, Potatoes that are in your pantry and growing "eyes" can be planted deeply, (cut each potato into 4 parts, each with an eye) and keep them covered with soil if they come to the surface. Cover with newspapers or cloth anchored down against the winds \& frost yet to come.

With last year's high heat and long droughts, I learned that frequent watering and protection with shade cloth will help your fruit trees and veggies survive better. Extra Black Kow or other composted manure will also give them the nutrition they need.
