

Tips for Being a Long-Distance Caregiver Dear Savvy Senior,

What tips do you recommend for long-distance caregivers? I help take care of my stubborn 86-year-old mother who still lives at home about 150 miles from me. Need Advice

Dear Need,

Providing care and support for an aging parent who lives far away can present a variety challenges that can make the job difficult and stressful. Here are some tips and resources that may help you.

Long-Distance Caregiving

When it comes to monitoring and caring for an aging parent from afar, you have a couple of options. You can hire a professional to oversee your mom's needs, or you can manage things yourself by building a support system, tapping into available resources, and utilizing technology devices that can help you keep tabs on her.

If your mom needs a lot of help, you should consider hiring a geriatric care manager who will give her a thorough assessment to identify her needs and will set up and manage all aspects of her care. But geriatric care managers are expensive typically charging between \$100 and \$250 per hour after an initial assessment of \$150 to \$750 and are not covered by Medicare.

To find a geriatric care manager in your mom's area, visit AgingLifeCare.org or contact the nearest Area Agency on Aging (call 800-677-1116) to see if they have a list of providers.

If, however, your mom only needs occasional help, or if you can't afford to use a care manager, here are some things you can do yourself to help her.

Create a care team: Put together a network of people (nearby friends or family, neighbors, clergy, etc.) who can check on your mom regularly, and who you can call on from time to time for occasional help. Also put together a list of reliable services you can call for household needs like lawn care, handyman services, plumber, etc. **Tap local resources:** Most communities offer a range of

free or subsidized services that can help seniors with basic needs such as home delivered meals, transportation, senior companion services and more. Contact the nearby Area Aging Agency to find out what's available. Use financial tools: If your mom needs help with her

financial chores, arrange for direct deposit for her income sources, and set up automatic payments for her utilities and other routine bills. You can also set up her online banking service, so you can pay bills and monitor her account anytime Or, if you need help, hire a daily money manager (AADMM. com) to do it for you. They charge between \$25 and \$100 per hour.

Check essential documents: This is also a good time to make sure your mom has the following essential legal documents: a will; a living will and health-care proxy, which allows you to make medical decisions on her behalf if she became incapacitated; and a durable power of attorney, which gives you similar legal authority for financial decisions, if needed.

If she doesn't have these documents prepared, now is the time to make them. And if they are prepared, make sure they're updated and know where they are located.

Hire in-home help: Depending on your mom's needs, you may need to hire a part-time home-care aide that can help with things like preparing meals, housekeeping or personal care. Costs can run anywhere from \$12 up to \$25 per hour. To find someone, try websites like Care.com or CareLinx.com.

Utilize technology: To help you keep tabs on your mom from afar, there are various technologies that can help. For example, there are medical alert systems, video camera monitors, wearable activity trackers, and electronic pill boxes that can notify you if she has taken her medications. And to help you coordinate her care with members of her care team there are websites like *LotsAHelpingHands.com*. For more tips, call the National Institute on Aging at





Medicare Minute "Year-end Reminders"

We have spent the past two months discussing the Medicare Annual Enrollment Period. We have talked about Medicare health plans. We have covered the different types of health plans and how to choose the one that may be best for you. We also discussed Medicare prescription drug plans and how they can change and need to be reviewed each year. But, just because the Annual Enrollment Period is over doesn't mean you can go to sleep at the wheel. There are some things you need to stay on top of.

To begin with you should make sure you have received your enrollment card from each insurance company you signed up with. If you enrolled into a Medicare Supplement and prescription drug plan you should have received two cards. One card from the company handling your supplement and another card from the company handling your drug plan. If you enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan you should have received one card and that's from the company your Advantage plan is with.

The second thing to verify is your premium is coming from the appropriate place such as your bank account or Social Security check. You may not know this until January. If the premium is taken out of your bank account, for example, and you don't see it deducted in January you will want to contact the company. You don't want to go two or three months without paying the premium and then have to pay those months at one time. It's better to address it up front.

THIS IS AN UPDATED ARTICLE FROM A FEW YEARS AGO. It deserves a repeat because I've had two people call me this past week claiming they've experienced this.

I received a call from a friend

recently. Let's call her "Mabel" just because I think that name is funny. She excitedly explained that her email account had been hacked.

Someone using her name sent an email to all her friends in her contacts list telling them that she, Mabel, was stranded in London and

punctuation errors included), "I'm stuck in London, England right now, I came down here for a short vacation then i was robbed, worse of it is that bags, cash and cards and my cell phone were stolen at GÚN PÔINT, it's such a crazy experience for me, I need help flying back home. Please i need you to loan me some money, will refund you as soon as i'm back home, i promise. All i need is (\$900 USD) but dont know how much you would be able to spare..we will be waiting to hear back from you on how you can get the fund to me

please."

This scammer asked Mabel's friends to wire the money to them via Western Union or gift cards. Some recipients of this kind of message might be skeptical of the claim and might ask a question or two to make sure it is really their friend who is stranded. Because the scammer has access to Mabel's entire email account and knows some details, the scammer can often respond with convincing replies.

Here is the anatomy of this scam: First, a scammer hacks

into a random email account. There are various ways of doing this such as a phishing scam attack. In such attacks, the scammers will send out large numbers of bogus emails that try to fool users into providing their email account login details. Unfortunately, at least a few of the recipients fall for the ruse and hand over their email address and password to the scammer. Once he has access to your account, the scammer will usually change your password and lock you out of your own account.

Next, the scammer sends a version of the "stranded" story to everyone in the "Contacts" list. Of course, many friends know you well enough to know when you are in town but some of them fall for the trap

out of your own email account, you may be a victim of this scam. The only thing you can do is call your email provider and get them to assist you. If you've not yet been scammed, just remember that your email or Internet provider will never, ever ask you for your email login credentials. So, be skeptical of anyone claiming to be a representative of AT&T or Comcast or whoever your provider is. Be even more skeptical of anyone other than me asking for money.

Things You Need To Do After A **Car Accident**

Over six million car accidents occur each year in the United States. Fortunately, most of them involve only property damage (damage to the vehicle as opposed to the occupants). But one in three accidents involve personal injury to the driver or passengers and out of that number, two out of every ten

accidents lead to fatal injuries. If you are involved in an automobile accident, there are certain things you can do to protect yourself and your interests. The following is a list of the things you should do if you are in an automobile accident.

Make sure to call law enforcement and have a report made. It is important to call police to an accident once it has occurred. The police officer will do a preliminary investigation, examine the scene, interview the parties and any witnesses, as well as provide a determination as to who was at fault. An accident report sets forth who was at fault and is the single most persuasive piece of evidence proving liability. It is difficult to make an insurance claim without one

Obtain witness contact information. If there are witnesses to the accident, you should obtain their contact information.

Seek medical treatment. If you believe you have been injured in the accident, you should receive medical treatment immediately or as soon as possible. The longer you wait to receive medical treatment, the more likely the insurance company will argue that you were not hurt as a result of the accident. This is the defense that the insurance companies raise most often.

Do not give statements to an insurance company. Never give a statement to an insurance company following an accident (not even your own). Insurance companies will seek to obtain a statement that they can use later against you when you are seeking compensation for your injuries. You should notify your insurance company that the accident occurred, but you should tell them that you do not want to give any statement until you have consulted an attorney.

Complete your medical treatment. It is important to follow through with all prescribed medical treatment following an accident. If you do not complete your treatment, the insurance company will argue that you are not injured to the extent that you claim. Keep up with your copays and out of pocket expenses.

Many of us focus more intently on Christ during this season than we do at other times. He deserves all the focus we can devote at any point.


