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



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I'VE RECOMMENDED LASTPASS AS A PASSWORD MANAGER for years. A

password manager is a convenient tool that remembers our passwords for us. Some of you may have come across a headline recently that

LastPass was catastrophically hacked. You may have read that all your personal data was stolen and that you must change the password on all your websites

immediately or doom, despair, and agony awaits!

I'm often critical of hyped headlines but this is not too much of an exaggeration. LastPass really was hacked and a lot of data was stolen.

LASTPASS DISASTER

by "The Computer Skeptic"

That data has been published in areas of the internet where criminals live. If you use LastPass (as I do), how concerned should you be? I'd say about medium to high.

Some basics: LastPass is, arguably, the king of password managers. They were one of the first ones and are generally considered to be a market leader. It remembers your passwords on both mobile and desktop/laptop computers. In addition to remembering passwords, LastPass can store your various shipping addresses and credit card

numbers in a secure place. LastPass will fill in that information for you instead of typing it all manually every time. That's awfully convenient but, of course, this convenience and popularity make LastPass a valuable target for hackers.

So, some hacker somewhere gained access to a LastPass developer's work computer. Exactly how this happened is not known, but this commonly happens through some sort of fake email scam. This developer had access to the underlying code for LastPass.

LEXUS: LS 460L, 2011 \$20,950. Luxury! Long-wheel base, only 90K miles, black on black leather, all options, Michelin tires, factory chrome wheels, all keys and books Must See This Amazing Carl! 256-527-2125

That means that the hackers had access to that code, too. That hacker was able to download the entirety of LastPass' user data. I suspect this developer is now available for employment elsewhere.

The hackers downloaded "meta" data. This metadata is unencrypted, easy-to-read stuff such as your IP address and the websites you visited. That's not a big deal. Your internet provider knows all this, too, and it's not really considered "private." But the hackers also downloaded your encrypted data. Encrypted means that the data is scrambled and extremely (if not impossible) to break unless the "master password" is known. This last part may or may not be a problem for you.

I happen to have a very long, fairly complicated master

password for my LastPass data. It would take someone a very long time to decrypt my vault of data. So I'm not too terribly worried about my data but some of you may not have used a strong password. If that describes you, you need to immediately change your LastPass password and begin the laborious process of changing the passwords to all the websites. This stinks but it needs to be done.

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


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Medicare Minute "Qualifying for Medicare"

When I began working with Medicare health plans a few years ago it became obvious to me that people aging into Medicare were joining a health insurance program that they really didn't understand. Although the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) do all they can to educate Americans about the benefits of Medicare it still isn't enough for them to fully understand what they have as far as medical coverage through the federal government. Over the next the next few weeks we're going to discuss the basics of and what is covered under Medicare. But first let's look at how Medicare started.

On July 30, 1965, President Lyndon B. Johnson signed into law the bill, Title XVIII of the Social Security Act, which led to the establishment of Medicare. The original bill included Part A (Hospital Insurance) and Part B (Medical Insurance). Today we know these 2 parts as "Original Medicare". In the beginning Medicare was created to provide health insurance to people 65 years of age and older, regardless of income or medical history.

Over the past five decades changes have been made as to who qualifies for Medicare. In addition to people over the age of 65, Medicare now covers people under the age of 65 who are permanently disabled and have been receiving Social Security Disability Insurance for 24 months. Also anyone at any age can receive Medicare if they have End Stage Renal Disease or ALS.

Although Medicare provides medical coverage for those who qualify it is not 100% coverage!! We often hear "once I go on Medicare my medical insurance worries are over." Medicare has deductibles and coinsurance that the Medicare beneficiary is responsible for unless the beneficiary has additional coverage to supplement Medicare.

Editor:

I would like to thank Jamey Hagan from Killen for saving my legs from possible amputation.

I had an accident while at my friend's house in Lawrenceburg, TN where I was dragged for several yards by my heavy old pickup which caused deep scrapes into my feet, shins, and knees.

I'm 65 with diabetes and painful neuropathy in my feet and legs, so this meant I was in serious condition. In addition, my husband was out of state in Oklahoma.

I didn't want to worry my husband, so I didn't tell him about the ordeal. When he got home days later, he took me to Platinum Wellness Center in Pulaski, TN, owned and operated by Jamey Hagan, MSN, FNP-C.

After cleaning the injuries really well, Jamey gave me injections of ozone into the wounds which caused them to go into healing mode in spite of my lack of circulation from diabetes and neuropathy. He also sent us home with an ozone generator, a bottle of medical oxygen, and limb bags large enough to place my legs in for the ozone treatments.

This saved my legs! Thank you Jamey for all you kindly did to save my legs! I would recommend Ozone injections to anyone who needs any kind of healing in their body.

Lastly, I would also like to thank Rick Lanning who quickly came to the aid of my friend, Polly, as she screamed for help while the truck mishap was occurring. This man, who owns Rick's Barbeque, made a mad dash down a steep hill to the scene of the accident and was kind enough to assist us in several ways, initially by calming us both down. I didn't know who he was at the time, but I was impressed at how he

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Moments in History

• On Jan. 9, 1859, Carrie Lane (later Catt) entered the world in Ripon, Wisconsin. A staunch women's suffragist and peace advocate, she founded the League of Women Voters in 1920 and was highly instrumental in the passing



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of the Constitution's 19th Amendment, which granted women the right to vote that same year.

- On Jan. 15, 1870, a
 Harper's Weekly cartoon
 criticizing former
 Secretary of War Edwin
 Stanton with the caption,
 "A Live Jackass Kicking
 a Dead Lion" helped
 popularize the use of
 a donkey to symbolize
 America's Democratic
 Party.
- On Jan. 12, 1908, American inventor and electronics pioneer Lee de Forest, sometimes called the "Father of Radio," transmitted a longdistance radio message from the top of the Eiffel Tower for the first time, heard by an audience of 50.
- On Jan. 10, 1942, Mickey Rooney married Ava Gardner. Since both were under contract to MGM, they had to get permission from its head, Louis B. Mayer. According to Gardner, the studio "owned both of us, and did not look kindly on any change in Andy Hardy's status."

Though the marriage was short-lived, Rooney later called it "one of the most memorable moments of my life."

- On Jan. 14, 1943, Franklin D. Roosevelt and Winston Churchill met at Casablanca in Morocco to begin work on World War II strategy. At its conclusion, they held a joint news conference at which Roosevelt announced that peace would come "by the total elimination of German and Japanese war power. That means the unconditional surrender of Germany, Italy and Japan.'
- On Jan. 11, 1964, U.S. Surgeon General Dr. Luther Terry issued the

first governmental report stating that smoking could be injurious to one's health. Its Saturday date was chosen to minimize the effect on the stock market and maximize coverage in the Sunday papers, and was, Terry said, "a lead story on every radio and television station in the United States and many abroad."

• On Jan. 13, 1989, computers across Britain were hit by the Jerusalem (aka "Friday the 13th") virus, created in Israel the previous year to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the creation of the Jewish state. Fortunately, since the advent of Windows, it is now obsolete.

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

the War of 1812, the Indian Removal Act, and eventually, the Trail of Tears. The removal of the southeastern Native Americans from the east to the west of the Mississippi River was a plan long in the making. This presentation will help to develop the context during which this horrendous event occurred.

Commander Matheny began his career military member of the United States Navy Reserve in 1981. He holds a Bachelor Science Degree in Business Administration from the University of Tennessee, a Master of Education Degree from Middle Tennessee State University, and a Master Science Degree in Rusiness Management from Naval Post Graduate School.



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

FILE BANKRUPTCY? THAT'S REALLY BAD **ADVICE**

Dear Dave,

My husband co-signed a loan for an old girlfriend four years ago. Apparently, she hasn't made a payment in almost two years, and a collection agency called him last week wanting the balance of \$3,000. We make about \$80,000 a year combined, and an attorney we spoke with recommended we file bankruptcy. Is this really the best thing to do? Scarlett



Dear Scarlett,

If you have the money, and you can pay it off without putting yourselves in a bind financially, do it. That's the right thing to do, both morally and legally. If you don't have that kind of cash on hand, try haggling with them. See if they'll agree to settle for \$1,500. At this point, they might even take less. But if they go for the idea, do not give them electronic access to

your bank account. Make sure you get the agreement in writing, too, before

sending them a penny.

Here's the deal. This collector bought the loan for pennies on the dollar. It's an old debt, and that means the expectation for collection is very low. At the same time, your husband did co-sign for the loan. They'll probably threaten to sue and whatnot, but my guess is you can work something out. It might take two or three weeks and a little patience—but that's a small price to pay if it saves you a bunch of money.

Oh, and the attorney you talked to? He doesn't sound very bright. A bankruptcy stays on your record for years. Trashing your financial life over \$3,000 would be stupid.

Calling On The Name Of The Lord

Many sincere religious individuals read the Apostle Paul's statement in Romans 10:13 - "For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved" and conclude that all any individual is required to do is to say something along the line of "Lord, please save me." As appealing as that might sound, ask yourself if that is really what Paul was communicating? Paul had himself in the earlier days of his life been an avid persecutor of Christians and at that stage of his life was known as Saul of Tarsus. When Saul was on the road to Damascus to arrest Christians and bring them back to Jerusalem, he was blinded by the bright light and fell to the ground and heard a voice say, "Saul, Saul, why persecutest me?" He then asked, "Who art thou Lord?" He was instructed to go into Damascus and it would to him what he MUST do (Acts 9:6). Think

him what he MUST do (Acts 9:6). Think for a moment what Saul (later known as Paul) did when he called upon the name (of the Lord). We find the answer in Acts 22:16 where a Christian by the name of Ananias came to

him and, after restoring his sight, said to him, "And now why tarriest thou? Arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, CALLING ON THE NAME OF THE LORD."

Calling on the name of the Lord involves obeying what He has asked us to do. In Matthew's account of the gospel, we see him quoting Jesus in chapter seven, verse 21, "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of the Father which is in heaven." In Luke 6:46, we see Jesus saying, "And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?"

The context of Romans 10:13 shows that Paul was arguing that God is not a respecter of persons...his mercy is extended to all (both Jew and Gentile) who believe in and obey the commands of the Lord. Even after obeying the requirements of faith, repentance and baptism, II Timothy 2:19 tells us that an individual that nameth the name of Christ should depart from iniquity. This is telling us that when individuals become Christians, they will have to cease engaging in activities that are contrary to the Lord's will. Jesus gave us an example and challenges us to follow his steps, I Peter 2:21. Obedience to the commands of Scripture does not "earn" salvation, God's grace... unearned favor...does that, but his grace is only given to those who do the will of the Father.




About the film, "History vs. Hollywood" writes:

So, will American reimburse reparations-paying taxpayers?



UNA currently plays as an Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) member. FCS memberships include teams in 14 conferences. That division has a 16team playoff to crown a champion. The move up would be to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) which includes conferences and a fourteam playoff to crown a champion. The SEC and the ACC conferences are among the conferences that play as an FBS member.

new football conference, seeking to secure FBS status, will be formed with UNA as a member. The noted article also states that UNA has already signed a "multiparty term sheet agreement" to commit to the new conference. This is not putting the cart in front of the horse; it's putting wagons in front. The UNA Board of Trustees President has stated, "If you were going to make a major move, there would be major implications financial for that. We haven't reviewed that. None of that has been presented to us (Trustees). All these

kinds of things would be required if we were going to make a move.' Wagons!

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

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
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Life After Death



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
