## **First lawsuit filed in fatal** dog mauling in Red Bay

A lawsuit has been filed arising out of the Red Bay dog mauling that killed Alabama Department of Public employee Health Jacqueline Summer Beard last April.


The civil action was filed in the name of Max D. Wright, Administrator of the Estate of Jacqueline Summer Beard, on December 15, 2022, in Franklin County Circuit Court.

Attorney Ryan Myers with the Birmingham firm of Belt, Bruner & Barnett, P.C., filed the case on behalf of Beard's estate.

On April 29, 2022, Beard went to a residence on Crumpton Road near Red Bay to investigate a dog attack that happened the previous day. Red Bay resident Michelle Sheeks was out for a morning walk when she was attacked by a pack of dogs at the home of Red Bay resident Brandy Dowdy.

Sheeks spent more than two



## **Inmate pleads to assault on** fellow inmate with broom

An inmate at the Franklin County Jail pled guilty last week to felony assault resulting from his attack of another inmate with a broom handle.

Joseph Thomas Postell, 33, pled guilty to the charge of Assault, Second Degree, a Class C felony.

While a Class C felony carries a 1-10 year prison sentence upon conviction, Postell's prior convictions enhanced the range of punishment. Postell was sentenced to a 15-year prison sentence, split to serve 30 months in custody. Postell's application for Community Corrections was denied by Circuit Judge Glenn Thompson, but Thompson told

Postell he could re-apply at the end of January 2023. Thompson was appointed after Franklin County Brian Hamilton Circuit Judge recused himself due to a conflict.

While in jail on a charge of violating Alabama's sex offender registration act, Postell assaulted another inmate with a broom handle.

Franklin County District Attorney Joey Rushing said the victim was beaten until he was unconscious. After the attack, Postell stole some of the victim's commissary items including personal effects and food.

Postell was indicted in November 2021 by a Franklin County Grand Jury on charges of Assault First Degree and Robbery Second Degree. The plea agreement called

for Postell to plead to the reduced charge of Assault Second Degree. The robbery charge was dismissed.

The State of Alabama opposed Postell's request for community corrections, and Rushing said the State would oppose any future requests.


"This was a very serious crime that was violent and involved the defendant stealing from his victim," Rushing said. "It doesn't change the law that he victim was also an inmate, and we treated the case seriously as we do all violent crimes."

estate, Myers said he is representing the estate and a civil action will be filed soon in that case.

Dowdy, who lived in the residence with her father, Billy Joe Crumpton, and three other adults, was charged with two counts of manslaughter as well as felony charges under Alabama's 'Emily's Law,' which provides criminal penalties for an owner not controlling dangerous dogs when the dogs cause serious physical injury.

Those cases are pending in Franklin County Circuit Court and Dowdy remains in the Franklin County Jail after her bond on the manslaughter charges was revoked when she was arrested for illegal drug possession.

The civil action names a number of different defendants, including Dowdy and her father, along with Franklin County (served through the Franklin County Commission), the Franklin County Emergency Communications District, Franklin County Animal Control Officer Joey

Wingo, Deputy Animal Control Officer Matt Mayfield, Franklin County Deputies Clint Holcombe, Chris Hill, Kyle Palmer and Colt Montgomery.

The lawsuit also names several fictitious party defendants, whose names are unknown to the plaintiffs at the time of filing but may be supplemented at a later time once their identities are known.

As of December 30, 2022, none of the defendants had filed answers to the lawsuit.

Defendants have 30 days from the date they are served with the complaint to respond.

The lawsuit alleges two

different legal claims against the defendants. First, the allegation is that Franklin County had a more than 20-year history of "unjustifiable inaction," that dates back to 1997.

The second count alleges negligence and/or wantonness against each defendant.

The 51-page complaint details allegations of the pack of seven to nine dogs "terrorizing the community" for more than a year. That includes, according to the lawsuit, unsuccessful attempts by Dowdy to find a shelter or pound to accept the dogs and multiple attacks by the dogs, including two instances of killing livestock that were reported to Franklin County officials, along with two attacks that resulted in physical injury to Dowdy's neighbors within seven days of the day Sheeks was attacked.

Beard went to the residence to investigate whether the dogs were vaccinated against rabies and whether Dowdy or Crumpton had vaccination records, which the complaint alleges they did not.

On April 23, 2022, the dogs allegedly bit the child of one of Dowdy's neighbors. The following day, the dogs bit another neighbor who was mowing his grass.

The complaint seeks an unspecified amount of punitive and compensatory damages as a result of the alleged "negligent, wanton, reckless, willful, wrongful and/or unlawful conduct of the defendants.

It is important to note the civil complaint presents allegations that must be later proved by a preponderance of the evidence in a courtroom. Each defendant will have the opportunity to defend the claims and present evidence that contradicts the plaintiff's claim.

Alabama law provides that a wrongful death lawsuit be filed by the personal representative of the decedent's estate. If a jury finds in favor of the plaintiff in a wrongful death civil action, punitive damages, meaning damages designed to deter and/or punish conduct, shall be awarded.

It will be months, and possibly years, until the matter comes to trial in the courtroom of Franklin County Circuit Judge Brian Hamilton. The lawsuit requests the case be tried to a jury, which is the right of a plaintiff in a wrongful death case.
