


### Winter Games Cheerleaders: The Votes Are In!

### Category 5 Culture Working for Cyclones

The Iowa State basketball team was supposed to take a step back this season following last year's improbable run to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 after losing leading scorer Iziah Brockington to graduation and then having star freshman PG Tyrese Hunter transfer to Texas. One thing we are learning about this TJ Otzelberger led program, however, is to not underestimate them, ever! "Otz" as he's often referred to by Cyclone Nation, led one of the greatest turnarounds in NCAA history with last year's 22-13 season coming off one of the worst seasons in school history during Steve Prohm's last year, where the Cyclones finished with a 2-22 mark, including an 0-18 Big 12 record. After last Saturday's thrilling 69-67 win at #17 TCU on Gabe Kalscheur's 3-pointer with :01.6 left, Iowa State is sitting atop the Big 12 with Kansas and Kansas State with a 3-0 league mark and overall record of 12-2.


I had the opportunity to watch this team practice this fall with my basketball staff and was absolutely blown away by the positive energy that every member of the team and staff had during the entire practice. You can tell when energy and enthusiasm is "fake" and I can 100% guarantee that this ISU team has not one ounce of "fake" in them. Just watch the reaction of the bench when a big play happens, they celebrate for their teammates more than they do themselves, and this all starts at the top with Otz, and the culture he has brought into the Cyclone program. ISU's culture is built on a C5C motto, which means Category 5 Culture; those five categories are Gratitude, Enthusiasm, Toughness, Unity and Integrity. Many programs have mottos and sayings that they claim to live by, but this ISU program under Otz truly is living out these five categories daily, and that is evident with how together they are. Even after their worst performance of the year in their 75-56 loss at Iowa earlier this year, there was no finger pointing, no panicking, just a mindset of we have to get better and we have to do it together. This team has no superstar, they are a misfit group of transfers and high school recruits that are showing the world that you don't need superstars to win at this level. There are no five-star recruits on this year's team, just guys who buy into their role of doing whatever it takes for the team to succeed. One night it might be Caleb Grill going off for 31 points in an upset of then #1 North Carolina, or another night it's Kalscheur scoring 23 points in last weekend's upset of #12 Baylor, or maybe it's Jaren Holmes, who leads the team with 13 points per game while just consistently scoring 10-17 points in each game.

I don't know how far this team will go this season, or if they can duplicate last year's NCAA Tournament run. The Big 12 is definitely the best conference in college basketball, and ISU's 3-0 record could quickly be flipped with a losing streak. I do believe that Otz has built this team with toughness and a defensive mindset, that they will be able to compete night in and night out, and also believe that they are better offensively than they were last season when they set several Hilton Coliseum records for fewest points scored in several games. This Category 5 Culture Otz has implemented is definitely working in Ames, as he has signed a Top 10 recruiting class for 2023 and has commitments for a 2024 class that is also Top 10 nationally. It appears that ISU is Otz's dream job, and the way he has things rolling, let's hope he keeps his Category 5 Culture in Ames for a very long time as his dream job is a dream come true for Cyclone Nation!

### Active Shooter Training on MLK Day

The Spirit Lake Community School District is hosting Last Resort Firearms training on Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Monday, January 16. MLK was a man who stood for peace, equality and justice. A man who was shot and killed by a gun toting assassin. This is heartbreaking and mind boggling that ANYONE would find this appropriate, let alone educational leaders.

Please visit Last Resort Firearms Facebook and the personal page of owner, Ed Monk. You'll discover many disturbing, tasteless and crass posts and images, including a photo of Monk with Kyle Rittenhouse, the Wisconsin teen who gunned down 3 people. Monk also posted a photo of a trick or treat basket with guns with the caption "one per child". Another post has Easter eggs filled with ammunition. Why is he being allowed to set foot on school grounds?

Rather than offering THIS to the general public, I implore the Spirit Lake School District and school board to offer the Be Smart Training- a conversation about kids, guns & safety. Each year in the US nearly 350 kids 17 and younger gain access to a firearm and unintentionally shoot themselves or someone else. Every year, nearly 700 kids 17 and younger die by suicide with a gun. The Be Smart campaign was launched to raise awareness that secure gun storage can save lives. In around 74% of school shooting incidents, the firearm used was obtained from the student's home or from that of a friend or relative.

In order to effectively address violence in our schools, we must first acknowledge that school violence is, in part, a gun violence problem. Many "comprehensive" school safety plans have been proposed over the last 20 years. Few have thoroughly addressed the issue common in all school shootings: easy access to guns for those at risk of committing harm. Everytown, the AFT, and the NEA firmly believe that any effective school safety plan must involve an effort to enact gun safety policies that enable intervention before a prospective shooter can get their hands on a gun. These policies work hand in hand with school-based interventions to create safer school climates and to intervene before a student becomes a shooter.

I applaud the district for many facets of the safety plan, including enhanced mental health resources for at-risk students. The problem is access to guns. Having gun owners in every community secure their weapons is imperative. The Be Smart Plan could be included in school registration each year as a reminder to families to secure their weapons.

FYI, here is the board policy re: use of facilities: http://spirit-lake.isfis.net/.../10051-community-use...

Iowa Code section 297.9 authorizes the school board to determine use of facilities, and then it looks like the SL Board policy places ALL of that discretion with the Superintendent Smith. The Constitution prohibits public funds from being used for private gain. If the school is paying for the Last Resort Firearms presentation. As of Monday, January 9, the school administration had not answered who is sponsoring Last Resort Firearms. There is speculation that the Iowa Firearms Coalition may be the sponsor. We should NOT have to speculate. The SL admin. should be transparent. It is also distasteful that this training will take place on a teacher inservice day in our Sami Center, a venue dedicated to the celebration of both arts and education in our district. I sincerely hope Superintendent David Smith will not force our faculty to attend. All they've been told is that there is a "special speaker" in the morning.

As a Spirit Lake grad with 3 children in the district I am appalled at the actions of David Smith. This November 3 board members must run for reelection. Please consider running for the SL School Board. The faculty and students desperately need someone who puts education first & has the courage to stand up to and question David Smith. Respectfully,
