City officials await historical study to move ahead on demolitions

It's been more than a year since the City of Russellville received a \$300,000 grant for demolition of 11 dilapidated structures, but the projects remain in limbo and history, quite literally, is not on the city's side.

The funding was approved through a Community Development Block Grant administered by the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs from funds made available by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The total project cost is expected to be around \$341,000, with \$300,000 in grant funds and the balance coming from the City of Russellville and Russellville City Schools, which owns College Avenue Elementary School, one of the 11 properties slated for demolition.

Although city officials received the grant in January 2022, the demolition process is on hold pending the completion of a study by the Alabama Department of Archives and History as to the historical significance of each building to be demolished.

Until that historical study is

Dowdy facing multiple lawsuits, charges from dog attacks

With the filing of a lawsuit on behalf of the estate of an Alabama Department of Public Health worker killed in a dog mauling last April, there are now two civil actions and four felony charges pending against Red Bay resident Brandy Dowdy.

The civil action brought by by Max D. Wright, as Administrator of the Estate of Jacqueline Summer Beard, was filed December 15, 2022. A previous lawsuit on behalf of Michelle Sheeks against Dowdy and her father, Billy Joe Crumpton, was filed June 16, 2022.

At the time of that filing, Sheeks was hospitalized from injuries she

received in a vicious dog attack the morning of April 28, 2022. Sheeks was walking near County Highway 11 in Red Bay when a pack of dogs attacked and mauled her.

Sheeks was hospitalized for more than two months before succumbing to her injuries on July 14, 2022. Her death means the lawsuit will be modified to include a wrongful death count.

According to the attorney who filed the lawsuit, it will be amended to be brought in the name of the Administrator of the Estate of Michelle Sheeks.

Although the June lawsuit only named Dowdy, the alleged owner of the dogs, and Crumpton, who owned the property alleged to have been

The Russellville City Council approved payment of an annual premium for workers compensation insurance at a short January

3rd meeting.

The \$56,371 payment to Alabama's **Municipal Workers** Compensation Fund was for workers compensation coverage for the city's full-time workers.

Councilman Darren Woodruff asked for an update on the demolition of 11 properties to be paid for by a \$300,000 grant received by the City of Russellville last vear.


Department of Archives and History.

completed, city officials can not move forward on soliciting bids to perform the demolition work.

"We're working with NACOLG which is negotiating with the Department of Archives and History to get permission on the school and florist building," said Bill Fuller, the City of Russellville Building Inspector. "Once that is done, we'll let the project out for bids. I'm working on consent forms for each property owner to sign that will allow the contractor to come onto their property to do the work."

College Avenue, School was constructed in 1936, with an addition built in the early 1950s. School officials are in support of demolishing the structures, as they have been in a continuous state of disrepair for many years.

In addition to College Avenue School, the other properties to be razed include:

--902 S. Washington Ave.

--726 Jackson Ave. S (old Winston florist building)

--801, 807 Franklin St.

E. ,

--108 Lauderdale St. NE

One of those properties is the old home donated by the Norris family to the City of Russellville. That property, at 108 Lauderdale St. NE, was donated with the condition it be used to house a new library/media center.

While city leaders support the demolition and debris cleanup on these properties, the process of waiting for the Alabama Department of Archives and History has become frustrating to some.

"I was very excited when we received the grant money from the State of Alabama, only to become frustrated with the delay from the Historical Society," said Russellville City Councilman Darren Woodruff. "This is an unreasonable delay. These buildings should already be down and something already in their place."

the dogs' home, it will be amended to include the additional defendants named in the Beard lawsuit, according to Birmingham attorney Ryan Myers.

Those defendants include Franklin County, Franklin County Emergency Communications District, the Franklin County Animal Control Officer and Assistant, and four deputies.

Sheeks' multi-count lawsuit includes allegations of strict liability under Alabama Code Sec. 3-1-3, which holds a person legally responsible who owns or keeps a 'vicious or dangerous animal....and another person, without fault on his part, is injured by the animal,' a count of negligence and wantonness.

The plaintiff asked for a jury trial, which would not be set until at least 2024.

Additionally, Dowdy remains in the Franklin County Jail after her bond on the manslaughter cases was revoked when she was arrested for Unlawful Possession of a Controlled Substance.

At issue in both the civil and criminal actions will be the guestion of whether Dowdy owned the

dogs or whether the dogs were in her care or control. At the bond revocation hearing in November, Dowdy's attorney, Jessica Bugge, told Circuit Judge Brian Hamilton the dogs that attacked Beard and Sheeks were 'loose dogs' that were not owned or cared for by Dowdy.

Bugge said there were 27 dogs "murdered at one time and no evidence was presented," so it would be impossible to determine which dogs caused the fatal

"In a case like this they must have someone at fault, so that's what happened when they arrested Ms. Dowdy. There's no evidence that any dogs involved belonged to her and the home is owned by her father," Bugge said.

If convicted of the felony charges, Dowdy faces 2-20 years in prison for the manslaughter counts and 1-10 years on each Emily's Law (dangerous or vicious dog law).
