New Crow Wing County Sheriff Eric Klang loves his job

Sat., January 14,

By ANN SCHWARTZ "We in law enforcement have to do a better job of telling our story," said Eric Klang, 57, Baxter, Crow Wing County's newly elected sheriff.

Since 1990, he's lived in the Brainerd area, working as a drug operative, a deputy and the police chief in Pequot Lakes since 2011.

Seeking the position

"I'd accomplished everything I intended to in Pequot Lakes," explained Klang. "I think some of my election platform resonated with people. There was lots of dissatisfaction with the current leadership in place in the sheriff's office. There was a lot of bad press over the last four vears that negatively affected the employees. Lots of people were talking about it. Voters were ready to put something new in. I was overwhelmingly elected. I'm excited to be here and to live up to the expectations of the people."

He took the role on the first Tuesday of January.

In other leadership positions, Mike Davis, a former officer, is the new police chief in Pequot Lakes.

Klang named Andy Bradley as his chief deputy. "This individual had tons of experience

in the sheriff's office. He is well-respected by our deputies and by outside agencies and I believe the job is a great fit for Andy Bradley."

Others continuing on the sheriff's leadership team are Troy Nash, Craig Katzenburger, Adam Kronstead and Keith Fosseson.

One of Klang's top priorities is to recruit staff: jailers, dispatchers, deputies, to work in the sheriff's office. "We live in a great place – people love it here. We have hunting, fishing, lakes, and beautiful scenery. We should be able to find good people who want to work here. Recruitment is a problem nationwide, but we have great things in our area that others don't have."

With the increased staffing, he hopes to reopen two closed pods of the county jail. They were closed during Covid and also for lack of staffing.

Klang has about 80 inmates in the jail along with 150 staff that he oversees. "My philosophy as a leader is to provide good leadership to them and to respect and value our employees. We hire the best and brightest people."

The approach to giving orders has changed with the younger generation. "In my early years, you were told what to do and you did it. Now, the staff wants to know why they are doing a task a certain way."

Despite the bad rap officers have gotten in recent years due to shootings, Klang loves his job and always has. "Crow Wing County isn't like what you see on TV. People love us here. We are constantly receiving treats, words of encouragement and cards. We are well-respected in Crow Wing County."

His favorite part of the job is helping people. A challenge now is since he has so many staff and agencies to deal with that everyone wants a piece of his time.

"But I've been doing this job for three decades and I still love it to this day. If I had to do it all over again I would. I love working with people and assisting them in navigating through difficult situations."

County crime

He said the drug problem, with opioids and fentanyl, is the biggest crime problem in the county. Drug use can also lead to burglaries and theft as addicts will do most anything to get money.

Klang is opposed to legalizing marijuana for casual use. He is not against the medical marijuana issue, but: "You wouldn't want your airline pilot to be high. I've seen the damage done and the effects of marijuana on families. It is a gateway drug. You see cigarettes, beer, marijuana and then meth. It is a cycle I have seen. I have friends who totally support legalization, but I don't."

Active in his church, Klang also teaches 55 Alive classes to help seniors get a discount on their vehicle insurance. He always participates in chamber of commerce activities.

He and his wife Annette have four active sons. Married for 23 years, they are now grandparents and also

Minnesota DNR invites public input on deer population goals

Beginning Monday, Jan. 23, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is asking for public input on deer population goals in 23 deer permit areas in eastern and south-central Minnesota.

Opportunities for input will include an online questionnaire, a webinar, and two in-person public meetings for those who wish to connect directly with an area wildlife manager on the topic. Written comments will also be accepted via email at Deer-GoalSettingSurvey.DNR@ state.mn.us or mailed to: Barb Keller, Fish and Wildlife Division, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, 500 Lafayette Road, St. Paul, MN, 55155. Comments must be received by Feb. 13, to be considered in the goal setting process.

"We're excited to hear people's thoughts and encourage anyone with an interest in deer management to give feedback on deer population block; and trends in the areas where they live, work and recreate," said Todd Froberg, DNR big game program coordinator.

The DNR establishes deer population goals — how much of a population increase or decrease is desired in a particular DPA — as part of managing the state's wild deer.

Population goals established in this process will provide direction for deer management in DPAs for a 10-year period, with a midpoint review at the five-year mark. Goal blocks and the DPAs that comprise them are established based on similar habitat, land uses, deer populations and deer hunter distribution.

The targeted DPAs this year are:

DPAs 152, 155, 156, 157, 159, 172, 183, 221, 222, 225, 248, 249, 604 in the East Central Uplands goal

DPAs 219, 223, 224, 227 229, 235, 236, 285, 338, 605 in the Sand Plain/Big Woods goal block.

The online feedback portal will be open Jan. 23-Feb. 13. Participants will be asked to complete on online questionnaire and indicate whether the deer population in a particular area should increase, decrease, or stay the same and provide their rationale.

A Jan. 23 webinar will give participants information about both goal blocks and explain the goal-setting process. It will be recorded and posted online for those who can't participate. Participants will be able to ask questions and provide input during the webinar.

In-person meetings during the last week of January will present information about each goal-setting block, seek participant input and allow DNR wildlife staff to answer

participants' questions.

"We strongly encourage people to join us for the webinar and in-person meetings," Froberg said. "Anyone may participate, regardless of affiliation or knowledge of the process, and we'll present useful information, answer questions, and provide participants several options to share their opinions."
