Boat Insurance Basics: What's Covered

Did you know that boat insurance is one of the earliest known forms of insurance? Ancient sailors knew firsthand about the risks of a life at sea and sought to insure their boats against hurricanes and other unpredictable weather and waters.

do not cover based on a number of considerations, including the type of boat, the waters it will traffic, and how many months of the year the boat will be used. Still, there are a few basic kinds of coverage you can expect to receive, as well as some potential discounts for safe boaters.

Physical damage

This coverage insures your boat against damage and loss caused by common risks, such as sinking, fire, storms, theft and collision. The property covered can vary, but the policy will usually cover the hull and other components, such as:

- Motors
 - Extra fuel tanks, batteries, etc.
 - Anchors Onboard safety equipment, such as flotation devices and

A boat trailer may or may not be covered, depending on the policy. Talk with your agent to determine if your boat insurance policy covers your trailer.

When choosing your policy, be sure to ask whether you will be insured for the boat's replacement cost or its actual cash value. A replacement cost policy will reimburse you the cost of repairing the boat to its original condition or replacing the boat with the same or a similar model. A policy based on actual cash value will reimburse you for the current market value of the repair or replacement (the original price minus depreciation). Some insurance policies may include agreed value loss settlement for total loss situations. This ensures you receive the policy coverage limits if your boat Is determined to be a total loss.

Liability coverage

This coverage applies if your boat causes injury to others or damage to other boats, docks or structures. Keep in mind that the injury or damage can be due to direct contact with your vessel or situations caused by your vessel, such as large wakes. Boat liability coverage typically protects you from covered claims and lawsuits including payment of settlements and legal fees.

Other coverage

Discounts

million contract with Volkert Inc. for engineering and design services for the West College Street extension and bridge project.

That signals a move toward providing access that has been gone for generations. The bridge was west of where West Mobile and West College streets join.

resolution The to approve the contract was presented by Mayor Andy Betterton and District 1 Councilwoman Kaytrina Simmons whose district includes west Florence.

"We feel pretty confident that it's going to happen," said Simmons. "The council is certainly supportive of it. It'll open up that area and I'm certain it'll help economically."

Volkert's scope work will include a field survey, corridor study, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers permitting, Alabama Department of permit Transportation plan assembly, roadway and bridge plans, bridge hydraulic report and assessment, geotechnical services and right-of-way, according to the contract. Volkerť completed

feasibility studv for the city in August and recommended connecting west Florence with Alabama 20 at Gunwaleford Road. According to the firm, the project will cost just over \$17 million.

"West Florence and that whole area would love to have it happen, and I'd love to make it happen as well," said Betterton. "I think this will open up west Florence and western Lauderdale County

Florence is looking to the state to help fund the project. According to Betterton, once Florence developed a plan for the project, the governor's office asked the city to have an engineering study. The next step after that would be for it to go out to bid.

The mayor estimated the process taking 5-8 years. Like it or not, the speed of government is slow. The city is aware we'll have to match some of those dollars,' Betterton said.



Small Ones Achieving Big Things

Writer's note: Recently, my sister, Debra, wrote an essay for ESPN about her senior year's state championship basketball team. ESPN is doing a documentary on this Hendersonville, NC 1A team of 4 black guys that beat a 4A team in 1972. I have extracted only the sentences in the essay that tell about Dee making cheerleading.

I am a fan. I always have been. Some of my earliest memories are of mom and dad piling us in the car and riding to West End to see a baseball game at Ninth Avenue School. We'd sit on the hill and yell for our favorite team. Or we'd go to the gym to watch a basketball game and cheer the team on. My mom loved sports and she instilled that in us. She played basketball at Ninth Avenue in the 1940's... To hear the stories, they were the best basketball players on the best team there ever was! One of their favorite stories was of mom having eye surgery and being told she couldn't play. The team was losing and mom decided that against her mother's wishes and her doctor's instructions that she had to play. She took the bandage off her eye and went into the game. They won! That was my mom. 100% effort all the time, never give up. Don't let people down. Play your hardest. Have fun. Win.

...In 1965 my family, the Landrums and about eight other families were the first blacks to integrate Hendersonville schools... I was in the 5th grade...I don't remember any animosity or resistance from the teachers or the students even though I heard that our parents did. I do remember that my only friends were a new girl from New Jersev (Nancy) and a Jewish girl (Judy) who was also new. I guess we were all kind of different so it made it easy to connect. But they were my first white friends.

...The next year, the entire school system integrated, and I returned to Ninth Avenue/ Hendersonville Jr. High... We never missed a home game. That was when I decided I wanted to be a cheerleader. I tried out for the cheerleading squad in the sixth, seventh, and eighth grades. I did not make it, but I didn't let that stop me.

...In the ninth grade I entered HHS, I had Ms. Geraldine Hensley for homeroom, that's when I found out she was the advisor for the cheerleaders. She was tough and kind of scary. She was a strict disciplinarian. I tried to stay on her good side. I tried out for the cheerleading again. No luck.

Junior year was the fifth time I tried out for cheerleading. Everyone, and black white encouraged me. I knew it was unlikely that I'd make it because by then the girls who had cheered since junior high were pretty much established. I tried not to focus on that. So what if no black girl had ever made the squad before. I'd try anyway. For five years I had

practiced and practiced. I had worn the grass down in our front yard, jumping and cheering and cart wheeling and hoping. In 1970-1971 I became the first Black cheerleader at HHS. Finally! A dream come true!!

Ms. Hensley was still tough; but the girls on the squad were great. They made me feel at home and the captain, Debbie Davis, became one of my dearest friends. Cheering at the various schools that year was truly an experience. Only Edneyville HS had a Black cheerleader and she had been in my class at Ninth Avenue. The fans attitudes ranged from hostile to accepting, but the HHS fans always had my back.

Í made the squad again our senior year. They elected me Captain. It was a huge honor and a lot of responsibility. That summer we won first place at ACA Cheerleading camp. We were good. I worked closely with Ms. Hensley, Coach Pardue, and Jack Johnson who was our Guidance Counselor and Girls Basketball Coach. They supported me unfailingly.

Dee went on to be a cheerleader at an HBCU. She then coached that squad for 15 years and later was installed into the university's Hall of Fame. My sister delivered Ms. Hensley's eulogy. Dee is a lot like my mom was – like my hometown was – tenacious.

man-made landscapes using traditional oil painting materials and techniques.

O'Brien Is originally from Massachusetts, but he has lived in North Alabama for many years. Most of O'Brien's works are painted in the realist tradition.

"I paint mostly about northern Alabama and southern Tennessee," said the artist. "Occasionally, I paint about other places when traveling. Most of my paintings are done on prepared panels, and I sometimes paint on prepared linen canvas.

"My paintings range in size from just a few inches to as much as 48", O'Brien added. "My work has been shown in art museums, galleries, and can be found in a number of private and public collections across the country."

O'Brien said, "It's a little difficult to say why I paint about a particular place. me, the ae For aesthetic considerations when experiencing a location involve more than any traditional beauty. The abstract shapes of the land, the angles formed perspective, by the

juxtaposition of natural and artificial elements of the environment—all these things interest me.

"There is often some other element about the scene that draws me to it which I can't explain,' O'Brien continued. "There is beauty and interest in every place and thing, no matter how mundane. Personal Injury and Bankruptcy

Injuries have more consequences than pain. Injuries are more than a distraction. Certainly people who are injured and in pain can not function as they usually do. Often injuries create financial hardship. Most people don't have the financial resources to go without a paycheck for very long, but when they're injured, they have no choice. Occasionally, after an accident, people file bankruptcy for protection from their creditors.

The Bankruptcy Court technically owns everything that a bankrupt person has above their state exemptions. Each state allows an amount of money per person for a home, personal effects, tools of the trade, clothing and automobiles. Money or property over the amount allowed by your state is available to be distributed to creditors. The vast majority of people who file bankruptcy never run into a repayment situation because people who file generally don't have too many assets.

A personal injury case is an asset. It may not be one you want, but when the court system trades pain and suffering and lost wages into a monetary payment by the wrongdoer that payment is an asset. If a person files bankruptcy and has a personal injury case, they have to notify the Bankruptcy Court.

A lawyer has to be appointed and approved as "special counsel" by the Bankruptcy Court for representation in the personal injury case. If a person does not disclose that they have a personal injury case to the Bankruptcy Court their claim can be held to be invalid and dismissed in State Court.

It's important to know and remember that if a person has an injury claim and files bankruptcy that they tell their bankruptcy lawyer and their personal injury lawyer about their personal injury case.





master at reaching out to bereaved Black families in high-profile situations at their most vulnerable times. Think about it: The funeral of a slain loved one being conducted by a noted civil rights activist and getting national network attention. Few families will pass up opportunity that to memorably send off their loved one.

Sure, we can continue the effort of shaming all white people for their institutionalized racism and discrediting all law enforcement officers. That's what our ratingsdriven racially focused alphabet media would like to see. There are a lot of important national issues that should be the daily focus, but those take a back seat to sensationalism.

All that aside, there are other, more realistic aspects of Tyre's death and those like his that must be considered, because these types of attacks happen far too often, and not by police.

This isn't about racism. It's not even about police brutality. It's about the progressive mindset that traditional family the unit is dismissed as nonessential in society; that it is just one of several options.

Out of wedlock births are more frequent in all areas of society. Black, White, Latino, young and old, and in all socio-economic levels. However, the tendency for out of wedlock births is far more prevalent among Blacks and in urban areas, now at a disheartening 70%.

The increasing absence of a responsible father in the household puts that much more stress responsibility and on the mother. It is unfortunate that women are put in such untenable situations.

Let's face it, single mothersdoanamazingjob of holding their families together. However, а strong mother cannot do the job of a strong mother AND father in the household. In rare cases, a child breaks through to a successful, productive life, but not often. They mimic their usually peers, and those people are on the wrong path.

A father is important

for stability, as a role model, a protector, a leader, a provider, and as a disciplinarian. His absence leaves children with a lot of idol time. Priorities get skewed and the outside culture gets a foothold.

Tyre has a mother and a stepfather. He's fortunate, but he too can't easily escape the culture that is all around. It didn't deter the officers who detained him.

These officers ranged in age from 24-32; young men with young viewpoints. The scene with Tyre and the officers was as if a lone member of one gang ventured too far into another gang's territory. Why did the situation deteriorate like that? Who in the police group was threatened by the moderately resistant 150-pound suspect? Why did anyone need pepper spray?

The mentality gang with combative, aggressive behavior That culture abounds. children in threatens the solid, two-parent families as well.

Suddenly, it all becomes about race, about being noticed, settling disputes with force. It's all about people not wanting to be overlooked, taken for granted, or disrespected.

We can see it in society all around. Look at pro athletes and entertainers as a prime example. They have more money and influence than 99.9% of the people on the planet. Yet, most still act as if they are oppressed or have been slighted. They can make a tackle with their team behind by four touchdowns and will still run out of the pile to be seen as special.

The culture we've adopted that removes the importance of God and family from daily life is designed to produce bad outcomes. It has taken decades to deteriorate this far. It will take a long time to turn around such dysfunctional behaviors. However, there has to be a starting point.
