## INGREDIENTS

- 5 cups frozen peas (about 20 ounces), thawed
- 1 celery rib, chopped
- $1 / 2$ cup mayonnaise
- $1 / 3$ cup chopped onion

- $1 / 4$ teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 package ( 6 ounces) stuffing mix


## DIRECTIONS

## FRESH PEA SOUP

## INGREDIENTS

- 2 tablespoons buÑer
- 2 medium shallots, finely chopped
- 2 cups water
- 3 cups fresh shelled green peas
- salt and pepper to taste

- 3 tablespoons whipping cream (Opī onal)


## DIRECTIONS

1. Melt the buÑer in a heavy-boÑomed saucepan over medium heat. Cook the shallots unī I soi and translucent, about 3 minutes. Pour in the water and peas, season to


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taste with salt and pepper. Increase the heat to mediumhigh, bring to a boil, then reduce heat to low, cover, and simmer un I I the peas are tender, 12 to 18 minutes.
2. Puree the peas in a blender or food processor in batches. Strain back into the saucepan, sī $r$ in the cream if using, and reheat. Season to taste with salt and pepper before serving.

## CREAM PEAS

## INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups frozen green peas, thawed
- $2 / 3$ cup water
- $1 / 8$ teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons buÑer
- $1 / 3$ cup heavy cream
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

- 1 tablespoon white sugar


## DIRECTIONS

1. Combine peas, water, and salt in a medium saucepan. Bring to a boil, then sī $r$ in buÑer.
2. Whisk together cream, flour, and sugar in a small bowl. SĪ r mixture into peas. Cook over medium-high heat unī I thick and bubbly, about 5 minutes.

## SPLIT PEA SOUP

## INGREDIENTS

- $21 / 4$ cups dried split peas, sorted and rinsed
- 8 cups water
- 1 large onion, chopped (1 cup)
- 2 medium celery stalks, finely chopped
- $1 / 4$ teaspoon pepper
- 1 ham bone or 2 pounds shanks

- 3 medium carrots, cut into $1 / 4$-inch slices ( $11 / 2$ cups) DIRECTIONS

1. Heat peas and water to boiling in 4-quart Dutch oven. Boil uncovered 2 minutes; remove from heat. Cover and let stand 1 hour.
2. SĪ r in onion, celery and pepper. Add ham bone. Heat to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer about 1 hour 30 minutes or unī I peas are tender.
3. Remove ham bone; remove ham from bone. Trim excess fat from ham; cut ham into $1 / 2$-inch pieces.
4. SĪ r ham and carrots into soup. Heat to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer about 30 minutes or unī I carrots are tender and soup is desired consistency.

## POLISH VEGETABLE SALAD

## INGREDIENTS

- 8 sm potatoes, cooked and sliced into very small pieces (can sub 2 cans cooked potatoes)
- 1 can peas, drained ( 15 oz )
- 1 can carrots, drained and sliced into small pieces (14.5 oz)
- $1 / 2$ c mayonnaise
- 2 tsp lemon juice
- 1 tsp salt
- $1 / 2$ tsp pepper
- $1 / 4$ tsp paprika

- 1 stalk celery, cut up into very small pieces
- 1 apple, any kind, peeled and cored, chopped into small pieces
- 2-3 pickles, chopped into very small pieces
- 2-3 Tbsp sour cream
- 1 tsp mustard
- 3 Tbsp fresh dill

DIRECTIONS

1. Peel and cook potatoes, unless you are using canned. Place very small potato pieces into a large mixing bowl. 2. Add peas, carrots, mayonnaise, lemon juice, salt, pepper, celery, apple, pickles, sour cream, dill, and mustard.
2. Mix well. Sprinkle paprika on top of finished salad for presental̄ on.
3. *You may want to take away or add some ingredients to your liking. I typically have to add more mayonnaise to make it a bit creamier.

## INDIAN SPICED PEAS

## INGREDIENTS

- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- $2 / 3$ cup ( 100 grams) yellow onion, quartered and thinly sliced
- $1 / 2$ cup ( 75 grams) red bell pepper, thinly sliced
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon ground cumin
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon turmeric
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon coriander
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon garam masala
- 2 garlic cloves, grated or finely chopped
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon salt
- $1 / 4$ teaspoon pepper
- 4 tablespoons water
- 12 ounces ( 340 grams) frozen peas, defrosted
- 1 teaspoon fresh mint


## DIRECTIONS

1. To a large pan, heat the oil over medium heat.
2. Add the onions and pepper and cook unī I soi ened, about 8 minutes.
3. Turn down the heat to low. Add the cumin, turmeric, coriander and garam masala. Sī r well and cook for 2 minutes. Add the garlic, salt and pepper and cook for 1 more minute.
4. Add the water and sī $r$ well. SĪ $r$ in the peas. Serve warm, garnished with mint.

## CREAMED GARDEN POTATOES AND PEAS

## INGREDIENTS

- 2 pounds small red potatoes, quartered
- 3 cups fresh or frozen peas
- 2 tablespoons chopped onion
- 2 tablespoons buÑer
- 3 tablespoons plus 1 teaspoon all-purpose flour
- 1-1/2 teaspoons salt
- $1 / 4$ teaspoon pepper
- 2 cups $2 \%$ milk
- 1 cup half-and-half cream


## DIRECTIONS



1. Place potatoes in a large saucepan and cover with 1 cup water. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer unī I tender, 8-12 minutes. Drain.
2. Meanwhile, place peas and water in a small saucepan. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer unī I tender, 3-5 minutes. Drain.
3. In a large saucepan, saute onion in buÑer unī I tender. Sī $r$ in the flour, salt and pepper unī I blended; gradually add milk and cream. Bring to a boil; cook and sī r unī । thickened, about 2 minutes. Sī $r$ in potatoes and peas; heat through.

## Claybank Master Gardeners

March 2023
Greetings Gardeners, This gardener has been a reluctant seed starter when it comes to growing vegetables in our raised bed gardens. Either I planted too early and they grew scraggly long stems, or waited too late and they got too much heat. Yet some seeds grow more healthy plants than the starter plants purchased lately at some of
 the big box stores. I decided to give seeds a try again last month, keeping some on a sunny porch, and also got good results from other seeds that could be planted directly in the garden. One Russian blue kale survived the cold snaps, and it's a beautiful kale with pink stems and large flat leaves. Seeds planted in small peat seed starter pods, using seed starter soil (it's sterilized) did well.Waiting to transplant until they have their second set of leaves is important.

> Here's what you can plant now in our Zone 8 according to the SOW app: beets, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, collards, kale, kohlrabi, lettuce, mustard, onions, sweet peas, radishes, spinach, Swiss chard, turnips, white potatoes. Be sure to keep the soil moist but not too wet, while the plants are developing their roots. I use newspaper or cardboard boxes to cover the baby plants if temperatures get below $35^{\circ}$, but uncover in the morning so the plants can get air and sun.
