You're in a pretty deep hole, but your income as an anesthesiologist gives you a really big shovel you can use to carve out some steps, get up out of that hole, and fill it in so you never fall in again.

Now, this is going to *an* mean some real lifestyle *best*. changes for a few years. I'm talking about beans and rice, and no vacations. There's no more living like a rich doctor, because you're not a rich doctoryou're a broke doctor. We're going to *temporarily* stop adding to your retirement fund, not cash it out, and we're going to start living on a written, monthly budget where every single dollar is given a name and a purpose. Cleaning up \$270,000 of

debt sounds scary. But with a \$260,000 income and the other changes we talked about, you could put \$90,000 a year toward all this and have it completely cleaned up in just three years. Thaṫ's whát I'd do if woke up in your shoes. It will set you free for the rest of your lives to invest and save.

Social Media and Lawsuits "Have you altered, deleted, changed, modified, rendered private,

or de-activated any social media account existing as of the date of the accident made the basis of this suit? If so, state the username of the account affected, the changes made and the type of social media account.

Note: Now that this request has been made, you are reminded of your obligation under the Alabama Rules of Civil Procedure to preserve all such social media data and to refrain from altering, modifying, changing, deleting, rendering private or de-activating any such account during the course of this lifigation under potential spoliation sanction.

This is an actual question clients are asked by insurance companies in almost every lawsuit.

People think that they can change their account settings to private or that they have some right of privacy when they file a lawsuit, but they don't.

The only things that are private are communications between the attorney and the client and probably psychiatric records. If there's a claim of mental anguish, (the wreck has made me too anxious to drive), then those psychiatric records probably become relevant and admissible.

The point being if you claim a shoulder injury don't post a video on Facebook of yourself pitching softball with your child. Even if it did hurt later, a jury won't believe it. People look for consistency.

The reality is that most people don't, and have no reason to understand how the legal system works. People believe what they think are facts and they're not. People believe that if the other person was at fault, that is all that matters. That's just where it begins. There is no reason for anyone who doesn't have to, to read a doctor's deposition. I have to take one in every case that goes to trial. You wouldn't believe what defense lawyers ask doctors all the way down to "couldn't something else have happened that you don't know about have caused the injury?

What is a doctor to say to that? I guess or like what, a meteor? The insurance defense lawyers never give in unless it's a broken bone that happened in the wreck and not falling out of the car after the wreck. Even then they will make the point that the bone healed just fine and the person is okay now.

If you are injured don't do a lot of posting about it on social media.








Learning From History





Medicare Minute "Medicare Part A & B Review"

The past couple of weeks we have discussed Medicare Parts A & B in detail. These are the two parts of Medicare that are received through the federal government. This week let's review what we have discussed.

Although Medicare Part A and Part B are great programs that cover a lot of services there are some things Medicare does not cover. They include most dental care, eye exams related to prescribing glasses, dentures, acupuncture and hearing aids.

Medicare Part A is primarily used to cover your inpatient care. Part A has a \$1,600 deductible for each benefit period, meaning the deductible can be applied more than once in a calendar year. This deductible covers hospital services, including semi-private rooms, meals, general nursing, drugs as part of your inpatient treatment, and other hospital services and supplies. Part A is "free" to most Medicare beneficiaries. "Free" meaning you may not have to pay Medicare to have Part A. It does not excuse the deductibles and co-insurance.

In most cases Part B is used to cover your outpatient services. These include visits to your primary care physician and/or specialist. It also may cover transportation by ambulance, durable medical equipment, preventive services and mental health treatment. Part B also entitles you to an annual "Wellness" visit to a qualified provider. Most Medicare beneficiaries joining Medicare Part B for the first time in 2023 pay a monthly premium to Medicare of \$164.90 (or higher depending on your income). Part B has an annual deductible of \$226 and a coinsurance the beneficiary pays of 20%, after the deductible is met.


To cover the deductibles and coinsurance that Part A and Part B have you would need to look at some type of supplemental policy sold through private insurance companies. These include Medicare supplement plans or Medicare Advantage Plans. 
