K of C Crown Youth District Free Throw Champions

Nine girls and boys ages 9 to 14 were named champions of the 2023 Knights of Columbus District Free Throw Championship and earned the right to compete at the regional level. The district battle took place February 19 at Bedell Family YMCA and was sponsored and run by the Knights of Columbus Iowa Great Lakes Council Knights of

5043, Spirit Lake.

In the competition, the winner of the 9-year-old boys' division was Carsyn Collins and for the girls it was Alexis Thompson. Medaling for the males at age 10 was Sam Graves and for the females, Julia Kaiser. Vince Nelson was the 11-year-old boys' champion and Claire Kruger championed the girls' division. Bric Joynt was the winner of the 12-year-old boys' division, while Max Graves took home the medal for the 13-year-old boys and winning for the 14-year-old boys was Jack Graves.

Brian Nokleby, Grand Knight of Council 5043, said the competition was fierce. "Any time you have the kids competing for a chance to go on to the regional and state levels," Nokleby said, "the competition gets ratcheted

up. Plus, these young athletes were shooting 25 free throws, versus only 15 at the local council level, so fatigue is certainly a factor." Nokleby also thanked the Bedell Family YMCA for its support of events like the Free Throw


Championship and for partnering with the Knights of Columbus in helping develop the youth in our community.

District winners are eligible to compete in the regional competition in Algona March 12, with an eye toward moving on to the state and international levels.





Don't Drink Ethanol's Doomsday Kook-Aid

Things aren't going as planned for deep-pocketed companies seeking IUB permits. They expected to spend billions, acquire land using eminent domain, and lay pipe this year. Instead, projects like the Midwest Carbon Express are going off the rails.

Easements remain unsigned, and landowners won't talk to acquisition agents. Navigator withdrew its application in Illinois because pore space is protected from eminent domain. Wolf/ADM faces fierce opposition in southeast Iowa. At the Capitol, bills to curb eminent domain abuse are gaining traction with legislators.

Consequently, pipeline companies are playing the doomsday card. Ethanol plants sent letters of support for CCS to their corn growers warning of financial ruin. Newspaper reports warned that ethanol producers can't compete in the global market without CCS. Radio commentators claimed 75% of ethanol plants will leave Iowa for neighboring states that use CCS.


The doomsday scenarios were based on a study commissioned by the Iowa Renewable Fuels Association. Not surprisingly, ADM is a member, with Summit, Navigator, and Wolf being associate members. The dubious findings are questionable because of conflicts of interest.

The dire warnings are not credible. Iowa is the pass-through state between MN, NE, and SD where routes lead to sequestration sites in ND and IL. Without our ethanol plants and huge percentage of captured CO2, the remaining states cannot create stand-alone projects.

Handwringing over ethanol's demise without CCS is a scare tactic to sway legislators into voting down eminent domain reform and force landowners into signing easements. Don't drink ethanol's doomsday Kool-Aid.







Celebrate a Century of Memories: Roof Garden Ballroom Marks 100th Anniversary

We are thrilled to announce the 100-year anniversary of the Roof Garden Ballroom in Arnolds Park, Iowa. This historic venue has been the site of numerous events and live performances over

six decades, from the swing era of the '30s and '40s to the memorable rock n' roll revolution that followed. It continues to be a popular destination for those looking for a unique and memorable experience.

the ROOF GARDEN.

The Roof Garden Ballroom has been an iconic fixture of the Arnolds Park community for many years. Built at The Park above the lakeside retail stores by Spencer Construction, the Roof Garden opened on June 23, 1923, under the ownership of Dr. A. L. Peck, with Al Grabel's Broadway Entertainers appearing on stage. With an estimated 400 couples cavorting on the dance floor which had a moonlight effect caused by four spotlights thrown on revolving mirrors - patrons recalled the deck literally rising and falling with the rhythm of the dancing. With a veranda that extended around the entire 100 by 162-foot floor, the Roof Garden was then the second largest dance hall in the country. Customers enjoyed climbing its famous stairway and promenading on the landing and walkway.

During the '30s and '40s the hottest big bands in the U.S. made regular stops at The Roof. The Big Band era was a golden time for the Roof Garden, with such marquee acts as Tommy Dorsey, Glenn Miller and Louis Armstrong performing for enthralled music lovers who danced the nights away. The mastermind behind the rock movement, in the 1950s, at the Roof Garden was Darlowe Oleson, who owned and operated the property during its heyday. Oleson was regarded in the industry as a master promoter, turning the Roof Garden into a most sought-after destination for national big name bands. Darlowe was a businessman who knew ballrooms could not continue on with just big bands, there had to be a way to get teens in the doors, ...thus rock and roll. Teens and adults, young and old, rocked to the sounds of some of the most enduring bands of the era: Mitch Ryder & the Detroit Wheels, The Box Tops, The Everly Brothers, The Turtles, Roy Orbison, and The Flippers, just to name a few.

Although the Roof Garden, as a venue, had been maintained at the Park, the lure of the facility was fading. In 2017, Arnolds Park initiated a fundraising effort to rebuild the Roof Garden Ballroom and transform it into once again, a premiere entertainment venue that would draw national acts to perform here. Today, visitors will enjoy the modern architecture, comfort and atmosphere of the new Roof Garden Ballroom. Many of the bands that have performed at this venue have commented "this is a top notch venue and we would love to play here again."

Hawkeye Hoop Heaven

If you are an Iowa basketball fan, you would be hard-pressed to find a better basketball weekend than the one that just occurred inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena! On Saturday, the men's team rallied from a 13-point deficit in the last 1:34 of regulation to force overtime and eventually pull out a stunning 112-106 victory. On Sunday, the #6 Iowa women hosted College Game Day in the morning and then pulled out a thrilling 86-85 victory over #2 Indiana when Caitlyn Clark drained a three-pointer at the buzzer. Both games looked like they were over late in regulation, but the Hawkeyes, fueled by their fans decked out in black and gold, never surrendered and pulled out two victories that will not soon be forgotten.

Let's start with the men's game on Saturday. Iowa was in desperate need of a victory, coming off back-to-back road losses where they really struggled to score the ball, losing 80-60 at Northwestern and then 64-52 at Wisconsin. Points were definitely not an issue on Saturday, as Iowa and Michigan State both played offense at an elite level in a back-and-forth game that was tied 42-42 at halftime. Neither team could gain much separation until the Spartans pulled away late to build what looked like an insurmountable lead. Iowa's Fran McCaffery had just gotten another technical foul, and it looked like the Hawks were heading towards their third straight defeat as they trailed 91-78 with just 1:34 remaining. This is when the madness would start, as Iowa would hit six of nine three pointers and outscore Michigan State 23-10 in the final 94 seconds to force overtime on a Payton Sandfort three-pointer at the end of regulation. For those fans like me who were also watching the ISU/Oklahoma game, yes that 23 points is correct, and sadly is more points scored in 94 seconds by the Hawks than the Cyclones could muster the entire second half (that's an article for another day). Iowa dominated overtime, but not the way one would think after their three-point barrage at the end of regulation, as the Hawks didn't even attempt a three-pointer in overtime but would rely on Kris Murray and Tony Perkins scoring in the paint and pulled away for the unlikely victory. The win pushes Iowa to 18-11 on the season and more importantly keeps them in the top six of the B1G Conference race, as the top six seeds receive a first-round bye in the tournament.

The Iowa women also came into their big weekend game in need of a victory, as they had been thumped by Maryland 96-68 earlier in the week, and had lost to the Hoosiers just two weeks ago. On Sunday, Iowa and Indiana played one of the best college basketball games of the season. Iowa led for most of the first half but would see that lead trimmed to just 40-39 at halftime. The second half was much of the same, with each team trading big baskets with each other until Indiana got a very favorable foul call with just :01.8 remaining and would take an 85-83 lead on two free throws by Mackenzie Holmes. Fortunately for Iowa, in the women's game you can advance the ball to half court with a timeout, and the Hawks had one remaining that they used to draw up their game-winning play. Monika Czinano would set a great screen to free Clark, who took the inbounds pass from Kate Martin and calmy drained the game-winner to send Carver-Hawkeye Arena into a frenzy and give the Hawks a very impressive 86-85 victory. Clark once again showed the she is the best player in women's basketball, scoring 34 points to go with 9 rebounds and 9 assists on the biggest stage of the season.

March Madness will be in full effect this year for Iowa fans, with both teams cemented to be in the NCAA Tournament. The men are probably looking at a 6-8 seed, depending on how their final week and B1G Tournament goes; while the women should be a 2 seed and will host the first two rounds, which will be a huge advantage with the record crowds this team has drawn this season. For those who turned off the men's game, or if you were like Tyler's Wartburg friends and were at the game but left early, you missed one of the greatest comebacks in NCAA history. On Sunday the women topped off the perfect Hawkeye Hoops Weekend and left the entire nation saying, "how about





Farm Equipment & Diesel Technology Technicians In High Demand

The Iowa Lakes Community College Board of Trustees held their regularly scheduled board meeting late Tuesday afternoon at the Administration offices in Estherville.

Kyle Norris, Executive Dean of the Emmetsburg Campus, began Tuesday's meeting with the Iowa Lakes report by introducing the Farm Equipment and Diesel Technology program faculty, Dan Bredeson and Troy Kleve.

Bredeson has been employed at Iowa Lakes since 2001 and holds a diploma from Western Montgomery Vocational School. Kleve has been with Iowa Lakes since 2006 and has extensive experience in the industry as a diesel mechanic in a private shop and an agricultural implement dealership.

Both Bredeson and Kleve hold numerous industry and management certifications and continuously seek continuing education offerings from the biggest names in the farm machinery and diesel technology industry.

The Farm Equipment and Diesel Technology program at Iowa Lakes allows students to gain real hands-on experience with all aspects of farm equipment and diesel maintenance and repair while earning

an Associate in Applied Science Degree. "Our program focuses on ag equipment, not just over-the-road trucks like other colleges, and our students gain the skills and work experience needed to prepare for a job at any major farm equipment dealership," said Bredeson.

The Farm Equipment and Diesel Technology program at Iowa Lakes immerses students with the training and skills needed for machinery set-up and repair, tractor repair, hydraulics, welding and diesel service while also gaining knowledge in engine repair and diagnostic testing, engine overhaul and failure analysis, clutch repair, transmissions, final drives,

An additional component of the Farm Equipment and Diesel Technology program is that students spend two four-week portions of the program working in a farm while completing coursework.

"We are one of two programs in Iowa

that provide an on-the-job training component as part of the program. This on-the-job training ensures that students know what to expect when entering the workforce and, even better, they'll be

Bierstedt shared why she chose Iowa Lakes.

"I was looking to make a career change that was more hands-on and found that the Farm Equipment and Diesel Technology program at Iowa Lakes was exactly what I was looking for and even better that it was close to home and affordable," said

When Miller was asked why he chose Iowa Lakes, he shared, "The program at Iowa Lakes was different than any other programs that I had visited because of the opportunity for hands-on learning and the opportunity to learn about the agricultural components of diesel mechanics."

According to the Department of Labor and Statistics, the farm equipment and diesel technology industry is projected to grow by 11 percent, nearly five percentage points higher than all other occupations. Farm equipment and diesel mechanic

positions are in high demand. Bredeson shared, "We have a 100 percent placement rate with our students upon graduation. Industry demand exceeds equipment dealership, earning money what we can produce from our program;

Goodenow: Finding Purpose in Serving Others

A lifelong Iowan and 3L at the University of Iowa College of Law, Nick Goodenow has a long track record of serving others. His commitment to service began when he was young, continued throughout college, and will carry on through his new job

as a public defender for the state of Colorado next year. Growing up in Okoboji, Iowa, Goodenow always had a desire to help others. Through his experiences both in and out of the classroom, this desire reaffirmed his passion for public interest. As a public defender, Goodenow will have the opportunity to guide indigent clients in criminal proceedings by defending and protecting their rights,

liberties, and dignity. "He came to law school to serve others and has followed through on his promise to himself while also taking advantage of all the wonderful programs that Iowa Law has to offer including, but not limited to, Appellate Advocacy as a 2L and serving on the Appellate Advocacy board as

a 3L," says Jad Elchahal, a fellow 3L at Iowa Law. "Nick has told me that his experience both in and out of the classroom at Iowa Law has reaffirmed his desire to go into public interest and he has certainly used his resources at Iowa Law to prepare himself for his public

The Appellate Advocacy program is designed to give

second-year students a chance to prepare and argue an interrelated question of law and fact in an adversarial setting. Advocates, like Goodenow, who successfully complete AAI and any spring appellate advocacy program, are eligible to become student judges or part of the Moot Court Executive Board. Selection for these positions is made by the Moot Court Executive Board and are based on participation in Moot Court programs, personal interviews, and an editing sample.

"For as long as I've known Nick, he's been a strong leader committed to serving others. At our undergraduate institution, Creighton University, Nick led Welcome Week, Creighton's month-long new student orientation, Summer Preview, Creighton's summer-term sneak peek for incoming students, and was involved in campus ministry," says Elchahal.

Even before law school, Goodenow was intrigued by a career in public interest but wasn't exactly sure what that would look like. His focus towards the field took charge during his time volunteering with a nonprofit doing home repair for low-income communities in Appalachia.

"Having the opportunity to work with, talk to, and get to know people hovering the poverty line helped me develop a better understanding of what a meaningful and fulfilling career would look like," says Goodenow.

Goodenow's inspiration to pursue a career in public defense also came from his professor Alison Guernsey, who teaches in and directs the law school's Federal Criminal Defense Clinic. "Professor Guernsey has a passion for public defense that is evident to anyone who speaks with her about the subject," says Goodenow.

"I kept coming back to criminal law because it asks important, relevant questions about

mass incarceration, liberty, dignity, poverty, humanity, etc. Criminal defense is, or should be,

client-focused. Working with and getting to know clients is both challenging and rewarding. Plus, I've always enjoyed public speaking, so it seemed like a good idea to get involved with the trial and appellate advocacy programs. Public defense seemed like a perfect fit," says Goodenow. Needless to say, Goodenow isn't the only one who sees public defense as his calling. "Nick has the perfect personality for a public defender," says Professor Guernsey. "He's

bright, kind, curious, and persistent. And when he engages you in conversation, you can feel that he is really listening and not just biding his time until he gets to respond. This skill - real, true listening - is the core of what it takes to be a good lawyer.

Outside the classroom, Goodenow has sat on multiple criminal trials while working for a district court judge during the summer after his 1L year. The following summer, he had the opportunity to work with indigent clients himself.

'My biggest take away watching trials and working with clients is that defendants are just people. People with hopes, dreams, fears, and families who are going through an incredibly dehumanizing experience. To me, working as a public defender means providing a preferential option to vulnerable, indigent clients who are, for the most part, out of options. I have a hard time thinking that I could be doing anything else with my law degree," says Goodenow.



An Update On Eliminating Eurasian Watermilfoil by Steve Weisman

The news early last fall that the exotic invasive plant Eurasian watermilfoil had been discovered on the lower Okoboji chain (all but West Lake Okoboji) was a shock to residents and nonresidents alike. According to Mike Hawkins, district Fisheries Biologist at the Spirit Lake Hatchery, the discovery was made in late August during the DNR's

ongoing surveillance program for invasive species, which is done twice each summer at 153 different sites throughout the lakes as an early warning system for invasive species. The survey earlier in the summer had found nothing out of the ordinary.

Then in late August came the discovery. The largest area was around the boat ramp on Upper Gar. That was certainly problematic with all the boats entering and leaving. So, that area was treated with a herbicide immediately. Additional surveys showed Eurasian watermilfoil in multiple areas in East Okoboji, Minnewashta, Lower Gar, and of course, Upper Gar.

Hawkins explains what happened next. "What followed was an extraordinary effort to put together a plan (unique in its scale and timing) and to find the \$300,000 to pull off this monumental task of treating the entire lower system. As the Iowa Great Lakes area often does, we rose to the challenge."

The Okoboji Protective Association, East Okoboji Lakes Improvement Corporation, Dickinson County Supervisors, and Dickinson County Taxpayers Association matched the Iowa DNR's contribution in a matter of weeks. Other organizations and cities were also standing by if more funds were needed. Meanwhile, the DNR's biologists were working with consultants and product manufacturers to develop this very aggressive plan.

It was determined that Sonar A. S. was the best choice for the treatment because it has very little impact on native aquatic plants, is extremely easy to apply and has the potential to eradicate Eurasian watermilfoil. According to Hawkins, "Sonar A.S. and the active ingredient fluridone has an excellent safety profile. The EPA has labeled this herbicide for even the most sensitive areas and in lakes used as drinking water sources. There are no restrictions boat ramp. on fishing, swimming, or irrigation during or after

the application. In fact, the EPA label does not have applicator personal protective equipment requirements."

Another positive, it has been successfully used to eradicate Eurasian watermilfoil on smaller lakes and ponds in Iowa since the 1990s. Hawkins says, "However, this effort on 2,240 acres is one of the largest and most logistically challenging of its kind ever performed in the nation."

The plan - On September 20-21, the Iowa DNR made the first application of a targeted herbicide treatment. For success, the herbicide must stay in contact with the plant for a long period of time, preventing it from making food from sunlight, eventually starving it. The concentration of the herbicide must be maintained into the spring of 2023 to accomplish this.

Hawkins explains, "Water samples are pulled from each lake segment every couple of weeks and additional doses are calculated and administered to each lake section as needed. The herbicide and the application method are designed to have minimal impacts on native plants. Because of the timing of the treatment, another invasive plant, curlyleaf pondweed, will also be mostly eliminated in the treated areas. However, because this plant forms a kind of seed bed, the treatment will likely only have one year of control."

A mid-winter update - Hawkins says, "A week after the first application, we took our first FasTest consisting of taking a two-ounce water sample in the middle of each lake segment. The samples are sent to the herbicide manufacturer's laboratory in North Carolina for analysis. Initial concentrations looked very good and well within our target range. We have been taking samples every few weeks and adjusting the concentration with small amounts of herbicide as needed. During the latest round of samples on December 20, the herbicide concentrations in all lake segments was between 3.4 and 4 parts per billion. This is exactly where we wanted to see it. Our staff have been very pleased with how things have been going.'

The future - Herbicide concentration monitoring will continue through spring. Spring rains and snowmelt will dilute the concentration requiring more product to be added. As the Eurasian watermilfoil germinates early this spring, it will get its final dose - eliminating anything left over after the fall treatment period. Plant sampling throughout the spring and summer will give an indication of whether it has been wiped out. As more data is gathered, the DNR and project partners will provide the community with updates.

ATTENTION RESIDENTS & VISITORS OF ARNOLDS PARK

On November 9, 2022, the Arnolds Park City Council passed an Ordinance that requires all golf carts operated within the City of Arnolds Park to be registered with the City. Permits will be issued through the Arnolds Park City Hall.

Applications will be available beginning January 3, 2023 for permits valid for the calendar years of 2023 and 2024. Owners information, address, and proof of insurance will be required on each application. Permits are \$50 per golf cart and are good for up to two years, with the expiration date of December 31 of evenly numbered calendar years. There will be no proration or refund of the registration fee.

A registration sticker will be issued for each application/permit. The sticker shall be placed on the front of the golf cart near the driver's side and visible to oncoming traffic. Each sticker is specific to the golf cart registered and is non-transferable. If a new golf cart is purchased after the permit is issued, a new application must be completed, the \$50 fee paid for the new cart, and a new sticker will be issued.

All golf carts that operate within the City limits of Arnolds Park must have a valid City of Arnolds Park issued golf cart permit. This applies to all residents and visitors alike whether you are here for a day, a weekend, a month, the summer, or year-round. Permits issued by other cities are not recognized by the City of Arnolds Park.

The Arnolds Park Police Department will be strictly enforcing the new ordinance. Failure to follow the rules as outlined by the new ordinance will result in the issuance of a municipal infraction of not less than \$100 per violation.

The operation of a golf cart within the City of Arnolds Park requires the driver to possess a valid driver's license and to be at least 16 years of age. Operation of golf carts by an underage person within the City of Arnolds Park may result in the issuance of a Uniform Citation under Iowa Code 321.219 issued to the parent/guardian for allowing an unauthorized minor to drive.

Please also be aware you must follow all State Laws and City Ordinances when operating a golf cart and park within the designated parking locations in the City of Arnolds Park. Golf carts cannot be operated on U.S. Hwy. 71, bike trails, or sidewalks. You may cross the highway at a 90-degree angle, preferably at a location where there is a stoplight.
