THE CENTRAL TEXAS BEEKEEPERS SCHOOL

Tumbleweed Smith



"Out of every three bites of food that you put in your mouth, two bites were there because a bee pollinated something," says Michael Kelling of Brenham who manages the Central Texas Beekeepers School, now in its 13th year. When he started the school it was right after a tornado and he had it in

Tumbleweed Smith his house. Thirty-three people showed up. Since then it has grown quite a bit. "Last year we had 750 people at our one-day bee school."

More are expected this year when it takes place April first at the high school in Brenham. The location keeps changing because the number of attendees keeps growing. "We have about 45 speakers who come in. Some 60 people in our group put it on. The classes are in the band hall and auditorium and we'll have about 45 vendors in the gym."

For the 85 dollar cost those attending get a book on beekeeping and a meal. "And Blue Bell Ice Cream for Dessert. We are in Brenham, after all." The curriculum is varied. A dozen sessions are going on simultaneously. "We have a morning session that is just for beginners. Out of 750 last year 80% were brand new beekeepers. We do have classes for immediate and advanced students also. It's more than just about honey, which is what everybody thinks about. But that's a minor part of what they contribute.

"We will have 12 bee hives on site and provide the suit, the veil and all the protective gear. If you want to, you can suit up and go stand behind a bee hive while a beekeeper opens it up and shows you the parts of the hive, the live bees, the queen the honey, the baby bees, all kinds of things. You can get into beekeeping with a minimum about of expense."

Michael, who has 150 bee hives, says people come to the school from all parts of Texas and other states, even from Canada. There is a big interest in bees. "Eight or nine years ago there were 13 bee clubs in the state of Texas. Now there are 65. People have become aware of their importance."

Attendees learn that fungicides and insecticides have caused a decrease in the number of bees. The life span of a queen used to be 7 years. Now it's 3. Bees don't hibernate during cold weather. "They create a cluster with the queen in the middle. They vibrate their wins to create heat. The queen is laying eggs all the time and is the mother of all bees in the hive. She will lay up to 2,000 eggs every day. A worker bee gathers nectar and pollen and lasts about 6 weeks. Drone bees do nothing but mate and they mate one time in their life and die. They mate with the queen outside the hive. It's a fascinating ongoing process."

The school in Brenham is from 8 AM to 5 PM. Then door prizes are awarded. Last year there were so many it took some extra time.
