

Looking for Meat Cutters

SHOALS-A shortage of qualified meat cutters is leaving Alabama grocery stores and butcher shops desperate for skilled workers. That labor shortfall can also impact the price shoppers pay for their favorite cuts of meat.


To fill the gap in qualified workers, the **Ålabama** Community College System has developed a new course to train the next generation of meat cutters. The pilot program for the course took place last week at the Foodland Plus grocery store in Guntersville, where six students got hands-on training they'll need for jobs as master meat cutters.

"There's a huge need for this, not only for the state of Alabama but all over the country,' said Carey Otwell, Director of Meat for Mitchell Grocery Corp, a wholesale grocery distribution center. "We're really looking for people who want to start a career."

The training is offered through a rapid workforce training curriculum called Skills for Success, which targets training for jobs that Alabama companies say

"This makes me want to get better at it," he said.


Robinson's classmate, Gracyn Kelley, has family members who golf, and now she may just join in.

their parents invest in lessons," Jordan said. The Chris and Patricia Burns Junior Golf

Foundation is funded through golf tournaments and private donations. Thus far, the foundation has enough money to purchase equipment for six schools. The cost of a full kit of equipment is about \$4,200. Larger schools will get a full kit and smaller schools may only require a half kit.

An April golf tournament at Turtle Point Yacht and Country Club in Killen will add to their funds. All money raised goes into SNAG programs.

According to Fowler, the premise of the program is to take the expense of the sport out of the equation as students learn the basics with their starter equipment.

"We've seen a lot of excitement from kids and that's what we want," he said. "The game teaches a lot of lessons to be used in life. However, for many it is cost-prohibitive, and we don't want that to be a barrier."

Fowler hopes to soon partner with the city of Florence to provide a low budget, no or low-cost short course for young golfers.

Burns, a recent inductee into the PGA Section Golf Hall of Fame, is honored to be a part of the initiative to return junior golf to the forefront in the area.

"I'm not so happy for me, but for the kids who are going to benefit from this," he said "That's what is really important. Golf is such a great sport. Hopefully, this will get kids involved in golf who might not otherwise have had a chance. When I was growing up, I had to learn how to play along a dirt road until I was about 12. The game has helped me go a lot of places. I hope the community will embrace it."

What Is Truth?

This is the question that Pilate asked of Jesus who was on trial before him, (John 18:38). It is a question that many confused people are asking today. Sadly, many have attended educational institutions where they have been taught that there is no such thing as absolute truth and have been told that everything is relative.

Although the author of the gospel of John does not give the kind of definition for truth that you might find in a dictionary, he does say in chapter 17, verse 17, "Thy (God's) word is truth." The word "truth" occurs 27 times in the gospel of John and it is safe to say that this was a major theme of his gospel. John tells us that "grace and truth came by Jesus Christ," John 1:17. Man's definition of truth may change from generation to generation, but God's definition of truth does not change!

The wise man said in Proverbs 23:23, "Buy the truth, and do not sell it, get wisdom and instruction and understanding."

He understood that truth was a bedrock, not shifting sand.

In Matthew 7:24, Jesus said that the one who hears and acts upon His words was building upon the rock or foundation that would stand when rain, winds and floods (the trials of this life) came and beat upon that man's life. Jesus never promised that those who serve Him would be exempt from trials and tribulation, but He did promise to sustain us through those difficulties, Philippians 4:9.

Truth is either ACCEPTED or REJECTED. It is not up any man to decide if he only accepts part of truth. God's demands complete obedience (Jeremiah 10:23).

demands complete obedience (Jeremiah 10:23). It is God's desire that "all men be saved and come to a knowledge of the truth," 1 Timothy 2:4. God's love was demonstrated to make salvation available to all men (1 Timothy 2:3-4). One of the most familiar passages of Scripture is John 3:16 which speaks of God "SO" loving the world that He gave His only begotten Son.

If any individual is lost, that will not be what God desires. His WORD is truth and all who obey it will be saved, Hebrews 5:9.

Are We the Byzantines?

The law reigned supreme for nearly a millennium after the emperor Justinian codified a prior 1,000 years of Roman jurisprudence.

Yet, this millennium-old crown jewel of the ancient world, once home to 800,000 citizens, had only 50,000 inhabitants left when it fell. There were only 7,000 defenders on the walls to hold back a huge Turkish army of over 150,000 attackers.

The Islamic winners took over the once magical city of Constantine and renamed it Istanbul. It had been the home of the renowned Santa Sophia, the largest Christian church in the world for over 900 years. Almost immediately, this "Church of the Holy Wisdom" was converted into what was then largest the mosque in the Islamic world, with minarets to follow.

So what happened to the once indomitable city fortress and its empire?

Christendom had cannibalized itself. Western Catholicism and Eastern Orthodoxy fought endlessly. Westerners often hated each other more than they hated their common enemy.

In the final days of Constantinople, almost no help was sent from Western Europe to the besieged city.

In fact 250 years earlier, the Western Franks of the Fourth Crusade had detoured from the Holy Land to storm the supposedly allied Christian city of Constantinople. Then they ransacked it and hijacked the Byzantine Empire for a half-century. Constantinople never quite recovered.

The 14th-century Black Plague killed tens of thousands of Byzantines and scared thousands more into moving out of the cramped city.

However, the aging and dying empire battled more than the challenges of internal divisions, or an unforeseen but deadly pandemic and the empire's disastrous responses to it.

The last generations of Byzantines had inherited a global reputation and standard of living that they themselves no longer earned. They neglected their former civic values and fought endless battles over obscure religious texts, doctrines, and vocabulary.

They did not expand their anemic army and navy. They did not reunite their scattered, Greek-speaking empire. They did not properly maintain their once life-giving walls.

Instead of earning money through their accustomed nonstop trade, the Byzantines inflated their currency and were forced to melt down the city's inherited gold and silver fixtures.

The once canny and shrewd Byzantines grew smug and naive. Childlessness became common. Most now preferred to live outside of what had become a half-empty, often dirty, and poorly maintained city.

Meanwhile, they underestimated the growing power of the Ottomans, who systematically pruned away their empire. By the mid-15th century, Islamic armies were ready to exploit fatal Byzantine weaknesses.

The Sultan Mehmed II grandly announced that the Ottomans were now the real, the only world power. Ascendant Ottoman armies would eventually move on to the very gates of Vienna in an effort to rule all the lands of the ancient Roman empire.

We should take heed from the last generations of the Byzantines.

Nowhere is it foreordained that it is America's birthright to remain the world's preeminent civilization.

An ascendant China seems eerily similar to the Ottomans. Beijing believes that the United States is decadent, undeserving of its affluence, living beyond its means on the fumes of the past—and very soon vulnerable enough to challenge openly.

Left and Right seem to hate each other more than they do their common enemies.

Like the Byzantines, Americans gave up defending their own borders, and simply shrugged as millions overran them as they pleased.

Our once iconic downtowns, like end-stage Constantinople before the fall, are now dirty, half-deserted, dangerous, and dysfunctional.

America prints rather than makes money, as its banks totter near bankruptcy.

Americans similarly believe they are invincible without ensuring in reality that they are. Our military is more worried about being "woke" than deadly.

Like Byzantines, Americans have become snarky iconoclasts, eager to tear down art and sculpture that they no longer have the talent to create.

Current woke dogma, obscure word fights, and sanctimonious cancel culture are as antithetical to the past generations of World War II as the last generation of Constantinople was to the former great eras of the emperors Constantine, Justinian, Heraclius, and Leo.

The Byzantines never woke up in time to understand what they had become.

So far, neither have Americans.



It just takes more time with some people— and in some cases even parents—for those kinds of things to heal. You have to remember, in their minds there's an element of responsibility and trust involved here. But considering it's your mom and dad we're talking about, I'd say they'll lighten up and become a little easier to be around with time. Until that happens, maybe though, you could look for chances to mention your new approach to finances

during conversations them. with Even something as simple as an off-hand remark about how much you were able to put into savings from vour recent pavchecks may encourage them to see things in a different light. Letting them know you're actively working to change your ways and gain control of your finances could mean a lot to them.

Even as controversial as this statement is, I must agree with DeSantis! Russia's invasion of

Ukraine a year ago was triggered, in part, by Ukraine's moves toward joining the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO). This issue was being encouraged by the U.S. resulting in Russia asserting its territorial sovereign and integrity was being threatened. Russia President Putin has a valid point in stating the Ukraine's alliance with NATO would be a threat to Russia!

The U.S. is hardly in a position to condemn the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Since 1798 the United States has used troops no less that 154 times around the world to 'protect U.S. interests.' This includes 11 times in Cuba, 7 times in Mexico, 4 trips to Haiti, 3 times to Dominican Republic and 8 incursions into Nicaragua! Ostensibly, these forays were us exercising our sovereign rights under the Monroe Doctrine of 1823

Nonetheless, how can the U.S. possibly condemn Putin in Ukraine when our nation has routinely practiced the same "big stick policy" since this nation began? Does the word hypocrisy come to mind?

As of January 30, 2023, aid and support to Ukraine totaled \$76.8 billion with billions more planned. In your opinion, with so many dire needs in our country-the border problem, infrastructure, etc, is this justified?

No doubt, this debate is just beginning. You have about 19 months to decide. Remember to vote in November 2024!



Medicare Minute "Physician Charges"

There are three ways your doctor can be paid if you are on Medicare. The three ways are through Medicare assignment, Medicare excess charges or by not taking Medicare at all. Today we will discuss these three methods.

The most common way a physician gets paid is by Medicare assignment. These physicians are called "participating doctors". After the Part B deductible of \$226 is met, participating doctors will accept the Medicare approved amount for their services. These doctors charge Medicare 80% and the beneficiary 20% of the cost of the benefit. For example, if your doctor charges \$200 for a service and Medicare only approves \$100, Medicare would pay 80%, or \$80, and you would be responsible for the other 20%, or \$20.

A "non-participating doctor" can choose to accept or not accept Medicare assignment. If the doctor does not accept Medicare assignment you may have to pay an additional 15% of the cost of the service the doctor provided. This is call a Medicare excess charge. It means you would be responsible for 35% of the Medicare reduced amount instead of 20%. If we follow the example in the previous paragraph, if your doctor charges \$200 for a service and Medicare only approves \$100, Medicare would pay 80%, or \$80, but you would be responsible for 35%, or \$35.

Doctors who opt out of Medicare can charge whatever they want for their services and you are responsible of 100% of the cost. The majority of doctors in north Alabama accept Medicare, so you won't be faced with this situation very often.

Most people who have Medicare also have a supplemental policy that helps cover the 20% Medicare doesn't cover. If you are just entering Medicare and would like to know which policies cover what Medicare doesn't pay, you can contact our office for more information.








Recently on TV I heard of a scam that can fraudulently sell your home without your knowledge. I assume this is done by Quitclaim Deed. Is this in fact true and how can a homeowner protect against this?

I have seen one on television where some police officer talked about the Life Lock or some other service that will protect the title to your home.

I find this to be much ado about

nothing. We've all heard stories about somebody selling the Brooklyn Bridge or people joke that they will sell you the Golden Gate Bridge. With appropriate recognition of George Strait, he has a song about ocean front property in Arizona he'll sell you and throw in the Golden Gate for free.

Jokes aside, the law is very clear that a person can't give what they don't have. If a person fraudulently signs a deed conveying a property they don't own, the person that gets it doesn't get anything. You can't get what they don't have.

There are different types of deeds that are used for different legal purposes but that's not the principle that comes into play here. The principle that is important to understand is that the sale of property generally carries with it a warranty that you own it. A Quitclaim Deed merely gives whatever interest you have, be that all, some, or none by virtue of the deed.

The only problem that I do see is that if that situation arose, you would have to hire a lawyer immediately and get the issue of forgery or fraud before the court. It would not be wise to wait. I know lawyers are expensive, but this issue is one that would have to be handled quickly.

One of the issues that would come up is where's the money? If someone bought your property there would be a record of where their money came from and who it was paid to. Without a record of payment or funds, and an allegation of fraud, any judge would become suspicious and protect the homeowner.
