

## answer March Mystery Photo

The winner is Nancy Zimmermann. Thank you to everyone who submitted an entry for this photo. Please contact the Elkhart Lake Chamber at 920-876-2922 to arrange pick-up.

The picture in the March issue is Kiel, Wisconsin in the 1920's looking east from 7th Street down Fremont Street. The large white building on the north side at 626 Fremont was the Meyer Store, which later became the White Store and then Cristel Department Store in 1930's and became Ramminger's Furniture Store in the 1970's.

Across the street at 629 Fremont Street was the Kiel Mercantile Association, which became the Red Owl Grocery Store in the 1950's and other grocery stores until the building was converted to apartments and a small office in 1979.

The tower on the north side at 602 Fremont Street was originally built as the Grand Central House by William Koehring Sr in 1892. In the 1920's it was owned by Philip Mueller and was known as the Mueller's Hotel. Since 2002 the building has been restored and is known as Koehring's Grahnd Central House owned and operated by Connie Brost and Fred Lubely.

Behind the tower is the steele of the St. Peter Evangelical and Reformed Church which is now St. Peter United Church of

Across the street at 601 Fremont Street, the building was originally built in 1902 by W. J. Guetzloe as the United State Post Office and by the 1920's it was the Citizen's State Bank with a variety of doctor and dental offices on the second floor of the brick building.

The steeple on the south side of Fremont Street is from the SS. Peter and Paul Catholic Church.

Other shops along the south side of the Fremont Street in the 1920's were the Jagla Jewelry Store, Raushschwalbe Hotel and Quality Grocery, Sweet Shop Restaurant, Kretsch Brothers Electric Company. Kuhn's Men's Clothing Store.

Other shops on the north side of Fremont Street were United States Post Office, Schubert Photo Studio, Vollstedt or Eckardt Meat Markets, Brill Jewelry Store, Amman Cigar Store, State Bank of Kiel, and the Rexal or Kiel Pharmacy.
















## "40 Under 40 List" Includes LTC President Paul Carlsen

## Mental Health America Lakeshore Celebrates 70 Years in the Community

Mental Health America (MHA) Lakeshore is an affiliate of the nation's leading community-based nonprofit, MHA, dedicated to addressing the needs of those with mental illness. Their mission is to promote overall mental health through education, support, public health reform, and advocacy, with a vision to create mentally healthy communities where all individuals thrive. MHA Lakeshore is one of two affiliates remaining in Wisconsin.

#### The History of MHA Lakeshore

On March 6th, 1953, a small group of Sheboygan County residents formed a mental health chapter to address the needs of mental health and mental illness in our community. This group developed into the Mental Health Association of Sheboygan County, then Mental Health America in Sheboygan County, to what it is now: Mental Health America (MHA) Lakeshore.

MHA Lakeshore changed its name from MHA in Sheboygan County last year to accurately represent the community it serves. While Sheboygan County remains its primary area of service, they are receiving increased requests for services from surrounding counties such as Manitowoc, Ozaukee, Calumet, and more. They wanted to ensure that individuals, workplaces, and community organizations were not deterred from reaching out because of its name.

MHA Lakeshore experienced another substantial change recently: a move from their leased office space in Sheboygan to the purchase of their first brick-andmortar building in Plymouth, WI. With this expansion, MHA can offer more services to the community, such as workshops, additional support groups, yoga, and more.

## MHA Lakeshore's Programming

While MHA Lakeshore does not provide direct clinical services, they have robust program offerings. Their original program, Information and Assistance (IAP) is still strong. People in need can receive navigation of mental health resources to assist them on their healing journey through the Information and Assistance Program. Whether someone needs a referral to a therapist, medication assistance, educational resources, or a support group to assist them in their recovery, their program will continue assisting anyone who needs it. All



individuals experiencing a mental health struggle themselves or have a friend or loved one they are trying to support should give MHA a call or email. Their Mental Health Resource Specialist will walk you through your options and help you find your path to improvement.

In addition to IAP, MHA offers education and training within schools, workplaces, and community organizations. These range from resiliency education in classrooms to suicide prevention training for the community and Emotional Agility training at workplaces. There has been a significant uptick in requests across the community and organizations for mental health education.

Within schools, MHA provides training on anxiety, depression, mindfulness, and more. Their newest update to school programming is the Resilient Classroom Project. The Resilient Classroom Project (RPC) is a classroom initiative to provide students with the tools and resources they need to build their resilience. Resilience comprises many skills, including self-awareness, relationship skills, self-regulation/control, and responsible decision-making. The RPC teaches these skills to students so they can use them throughout the school day and at home. This program will be available for students and educators in Fall 2023.

Beyond that, MHA educates on early



signs and symptoms of a mental health condition, how to recognize them, how to support a loved one who is going through a mental health challenge, and the importance of early intervention. MHA looks at a mental health issue just like a physical health issue, with equal importance. The sooner symptoms are examined and addressed, the better the outcome and recovery for the individual.

Reducing stigma surrounding mental illness and promoting mental wellness is needed now more than ever. MHA works to reduce stigma and educate through their Support Not Stigma pledge campaign and Ambassador Programs. They provide education, support, and advocacy to improve the mental health for all community members. Individuals should not feel shame, hesitation, or guilt when reaching out for support. If you are experiencing symptoms of strep, you go to the doctor and seek help without shame. Mental health should be looked at no differently. You can find MHA Lakeshore's stigma pledge at https:// mhalakeshore.org/advocacy, where there is also information about their Ambassador Programs.

## Support Groups

If individuals are looking for an opportunity to connect with others dealing with similar situations in life, sharing stories, perspectives, inspiration, and empathy, support groups are a great option. MHA offers several monthly support groups with common human challenges and offers a healthy emotional connection. We often think we are the only ones struggling, but coming together with others can remind us that we are not alone. MHA's support groups range from suicide loss to women's chronic pain, mental health recovery, and more. For a full list of MHA's support groups; you can visit https://mhalakeshore.org/supportgroups.














## SCALE; New Accelerator Program Partnership

Participants will also engage in a weekly networking event, community partner meetings and regular sessions with staff or mentors who will help them navigate their industries. All sessions take place at Jake's, A Lakeland Community in downtown Sheboygan.

SCALE's curriculum utilizes a unique combination of known and proven methodologies and is organized by Stephanie Hoskins, Lakeland's Herbert Kohler & Frank Jacobson Chair of Business and Entrepreneurship.

Throughout the program, participants will be taught by subject matter experts who have professional experience.

SCALE accepts applications from all types of startups across all industries and business models. The program goal is to help startups reach the point where they are ready to go to an equity-based accelerator or raise from angels, crowd investing, or pre-sales.

Employee Owned Auto Group expands into Milwaukee market





"That is simply not the case. We feed people of all ages from all walks of life. ## **Holocaust Remembrance Day**

This year, Holocaust Remembrance Day is on April 18, 2023. This date corresponds to the 80th anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising in 1943, the largest and most symbolic resistance to Nazioccupied Europe during World War II. The internationally recognized date for Holocaust Remembrance Day corresponds to the 27th day of Nisan on the Hebrew calendar.

About 140,000 Holocaust survivors immigrated to the United States after the war, and about 1,000 eventually settled in Wisconsin, with a fairly substantial group in Sheboygan. None of the Sheboygan Holocaust survivors remain living.

In 2001, with the support and vision of community leaders, a very special collection was established at Mead Public Library to preserve the stories of Sheboygan residents who survived the Holocaust and its aftermath.

The collection includes personal archives, photographs, and documents that represent the journeys of all the Holocaust survivors who immigrated to Sheboygan – starting with life in a displaced persons camp following liberation, through the



arrival in the United States, and ultimately settlement in Sheboygan. The collection is located in the Fela and Anschel Warschau Room on the 2nd floor of Mead Public Library. For more information, see www. meadpl.org/warschau-collection.



## **DOG LICENSES**

## **Economic Impact Numbers of Road America**



Road America, the world-renowned motorsports facility in Sheboygan County, is more than just an exciting place to watch races. It is also a significant economic driver for the state of Wisconsin.

The Washington Economics Group (WEG) was retained by Road America as independent consultants to estimate the comprehensive economic impacts associated with the ongoing operations of Road America on both Sheboygan County as well as the entire state of Wisconsin. These include both qualitative and quantitative categories of economic impacts. According to the Study, the total economic Impact of Road America each year is \$254 million throughout Sheboygan County. Of this total, \$181 million (or 71 percent) is due to direct economic effects, with \$73 million (or 29 percent) attributable to indirect and induced economic effects. In addition, this economic activity supports 2,975 jobs, generates \$83 million in Household Income, \$131 million in GDP, and \$34 million in Federal, State & Local Fiscal Revenues throughout the County.

WEG also quantified the estimated Impact of Road America's planned capital expenditures through Spring 2024. These include paying and routine Health & Social Services, Arts,

repair costs, the construction of new infrastructure and fencing, improvements to the spectator areas, and remodeling of the bathrooms and other facilities. These improvements will attract even more annual visitors once completed in 2024, further contributing to the annual impacts.

The Total Economic Impact of Road America each year is \$403 million for the entire State of Wisconsin. This is \$149 million larger than Road America's Impact on Sheboygan County due to larger indirect and induced economic multipliers relative to Sheboygan and the additional impact of out-of-County visitors. WEG added that \$354 million of the \$403 million in statewide impacts is due to visitor spending. Additional offsite lodging, dining, shopping, travel, and entertainment expenditures made by race fans, race competitors, and all other visitors as they shop and take advantage of different amenities throughout the local area, especially out-of-town visitors, contributed to the total figures.

The main portion of the Study presents the economic impacts at a summary level. Direct, Indirect, and Induced Impacts are aggregated into the Total impact, and Industries are summarized by function.



## **Elkhart Lake Improvement Association (ELIA) Receives DNR Grants**

ELIA has recently received 4 DNR for calendar 2023. These grants which require matching funds will help Keep Elkhart Blue in the coming years.

The first grant covers our Clean Boat Clean Water program f(CBCW)or another year. This onsite educational program helps inform boaters coming onto and leaving the lake about invasives. CBCW activity has been in place for over a decade. CBCW also provides information to boaters about the lake and rules of the road while they are enjoying the lake.

The other three grants break new ground and are part of an overall watershed assessment project that ELIA is working on with the DNR, Sheboygan County Planning and Environment, and Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP). Details of these grants will be announced once they have received final reviews but are all centered around remediation of nutrient and sediment inputs from around the lake shore and will help us Keep Elkhart Blue for all to enjoy.

ELIA will continue its annual invasive

weed program to locate and remove or terminate invasive weed beds around the lake. Based on a recent 2022 assessment by the DNR, we have seen a significant decrease in invasive weeds due to this program, while at the same time allowing native weeds to provide excellent fishery coverage for our sport fishing enthusiasts.


