Courier Journal / April 5, 2023 Medicare Minute "Prescription Drug Extra Help"

Anyone who is on Medicare has the option of signing up for prescription drug coverage. This is also known as Medicare Part D. Some people with limited income and resources may be able to get "Extra Help" with the costs related to their Medicare prescription drug plan. This includes help with monthly premiums, annual deductibles and prescription co-payments.

To qualify for "Extra Help" your annual income must not exceed \$21,870 for an individual or \$29,580 for a married couple living together. Some of the things that count as income are: Social Security benefits, Railroad Retirement benefits, Veterans benefits, pensions or annuities and any wages you are earning from a job or self-employment.

You also must not exceed the resource limit to qualify for "Extra Help". Resources would include: bank accounts (including checking, savings and CDs), stocks, bonds, mutual funds, IRAs or any other investments. Cash and any real estate other than your home also counts. The amount of your resources must not exceed \$16,660 for an individual or \$33,240 for a married couple. The amounts listed for both the income and resource limits are for 2023.

Social Security has estimated that "Extra Help" is worth about \$5,000 per year for those who qualify. We meet with many people each year who qualify for this benefit and don't even know it. To find out if you qualify for "Extra Help" you can call or visit your local Social Security office, apply online at www.socialsecurity.gov or you can call or visit our office and we'll be glad to help. Regardless of the way you choose to apply, you will need your income and resource information available.



Special Advocates She (CASA) in 2021. came in wanting to re-establish a CASA presence in the Colbert County court system.

After six weeks of including training. courtroom protocols and participating in a culminating mock trial last week, the volunteers were sworn in by Colbert District Judge Chad Smith.

CASA advocates can work both Colbert and Lauderdale cases.

Begley said Shoals CASĂ is now up to 22 volunteer advocates work who directly with Smith in Colbert County or judges Ben Graves and Will Powell in Lauderdale County on behalf of abused neglected juvenile or dependents.

New advocate, Arlene Merry, retired from teaching at the beginning of the COVID pandemic. She was familiar with CASA and the need for more volunteers.

"I knew the time was right to get involved," she said. "I have the time for it and it's rewarding to be able to help.'

work Advocates directly with the judge to report factual case through information the doublechecking of documentation, DHR assuring court orders being followed, are conducting family member interviews, and interacting with the children.

"We're about providing consistency these for children, especially in this day with such a high turnover with DHR workers," Begley said. DHR "The advocates have the responsibility of following the children through the system until the cases are closed.'

Begley said CASA volunteers not only

advocate for the children and their families, but they are a connection to other resources the children need.

Currently, there are 59 cases being worked by the volunteers. Last vear. there were more than 500 dependency 78 of cases; them were worked by CASA volunteers.

While not all the children are in foster care, the majority are either in foster care or awaiting placement.

"We desperately need more volunteers, especially now that we've added Colbert County," Begley said. want people understand that "We to (advocacy) isn't difficult or demanding; it just takes a lot of time.'

Shoals CASA volunteer coordinator Gloria Stokes said the importance of the role of advocates can't be overstated.

"We're the eyes and ears on these cases for the judge," she said. "We provide consistency and make sure the needs of the children are met, and in some cases the parents need services as well in order to get their children back. We can help these cases move along a little faster, which is good for everyone."

Advocates, on average, meet with the children monthly. Once the volunteer is sworn in, they are assigned their first case.

Gracelyn Morrison, one of the five volunteers sworn in last week, called her involvement with Shoals CASA "a God thing."

"I'm graduating from the University of North Alabama in May and needed an internship for my sociology degree," explained, saying she Shoals CASA welcomed her. "I had no idea at first what it was, but I quickly learned it's the kind of work I'm passionate about.'

"I certainly wasn't required to become a volunteer advocate, but it fits in so perfectly with my passion for helping people and loving children who might not otherwise have anyone,' she said. "I feel like I'm contributing, and I look at this as an amazing opportunity to hopefully inspire someone.

Summer P-EBT **Benefits to Arrive** for 530,000 Children in Coming Months

MONTGOMERY - The Alabama Department of Human Resources (DHR) on Tuesday announced plans to issue Summer Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefits to an estimated 530.000 children who receive free or reducedprice school meals through the National School Lunch Program.

Qualifying households will get \$120 for each participating student to buy SNAP-eligible food at stores that accept Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) cards. The benefits are expected to start rolling out in midto-late summer. has

"Inflation transformed each grocery trip into a balancing act for low-income families struggling to afford food for their children on top of other costs like housing and transportation, said Alabama DHR Commissioner Nancv Buckner. "Every dollar of support from programs like P-EBT strengthens their spending power and weakens the prospect of hunger, while promoting nutritious meals for children.'

benefits are limited to students who receive reduced-price free or meals from the National School Lunch Program by application or through the Community Eligibility Provision, Provision 2 or Provision 3.

To become eligible for Summer P-EBT, families may apply for the National School Lunch Program by contacting their schools. Applications for the lunch program must be approved by May 16 to qualify for Summer P-EBT benefits. Families should contact their schools with any questions about eligibility.

Households with eligible students who received P-EBT benefits previously will access Summer P-EBT benefits on their existing EBT cards. Those who are new to the National School Lunch Program will get EBT cards in the mail. All recipients should keep their EBT cards in case additional benefits are added in the future.

Eligible families are encouraged to monitor dhr.alabama.gov for updates including information about a timeframe for the arrival of benefits.

DHR oversees the distribution of P-EBT benefits with assistance from the Alabama State Department of Education. U.S. Department The of Agriculture Food and Nutrition Service administers the program at the federal level.



associated straightline winds that destroyed homes, thousands of trees, and reportedly knocked out power to some 28,000 Lauderdale county homes that Friday night.

Initial cleanup efforts were slow, but steady. Many utility companies from outside our area have been assisting the Florence Utilities Electricity Department with the dangerous and painstaking work. In addition, what many of us don't realize is that downed or severely damaged trees have to be cut

up and removed before significant utility repair work can commence. There are a limited number of tree services available, and work is also tedious and dangerous.







Dear Savvy Senior,

I have some hip and back problems and could use a walking cane to help me get around. Is there anything I should know about canes before I buy one?

Limping Linda

Dear Linda,

When it comes to choosing a cane, most people don't give it much thought, but they should. Walking canes come in many different styles, shapes and sizes today, so you need to take into account your needs and preferences to ensure you choose one that's appropriate for you. Here are some tips that can help.

Types of Canes

The first thing you need to consider is how much support you need. That will help you determine the kind of cane you choose. The three basic types of canes you'll have to choose from include:

1. Straight canes: These are basic, single point canes that typically incorporate a rounded "crook" handle or "L-shaped" ergonomic handle. Usually made of lightweight aluminum or wood, most of the aluminum models are adjustable in height and some even fold up.

2. Offset-handle canes: These also are single point straight canes but come with a swan neck curve in the upper part of the shaft that puts the user's weight directly over the cane tip for added stability. These canes are typically aluminum, adjustable-height and come with a flat, soft grip handle that's easy on the hands.

Some straight canes and offset-handle canes also come with triple or quad tipped bases that can add gripping support and allow the cane to stand up on its own when you let go, which is very convenient.

Both straight and offset-handle canes are best suited for people with a slight walking impairment.

3. Quad canes: These work best for people who need maximum weight bearing and support. Quad canes come with four separate tips at the base, they usually have an offset flat handle, and can stand up on its own.

Fitting the Cane

Once you decide on the type of cane, you need to make sure it has the weight capacity to support you, and it fits your height. To do this, stand up with your arms hanging straight down at your side. The top of the cane should line up with the crease in your wrist, so your arm is slightly bent at the elbow when you grip the cane.

The cane should also have a rubber tip at the bottom to prevent slipping. A worn or torn rubber tip is dangerous, so check the tip frequently to ensure it's in good condition and replace it when necessary.

The grip is also very important, so choose one that's ergonomically designed, or one that has a molded rubber or

foam grip that's comfortable to hold on to.

And if you travel much, consider getting a folding cane that can be packed or stored away easily.

How to Use

When using a cane, it should always be held in the hand opposite of the leg that needs support. For example, if your knee pain is on your left side, you should use the cane in your right hand. The cane should then move forward as you step forward with the bad leg.

If you have to go upstairs, you should lead with the good leg. And when you go downstairs, you should put your cane on the step first and then step down with your bad leg.

The Mayo Clinic offers a slide show at <u>MayoClinic.com/</u> <u>health/canes/HA00064</u> that will show you how to choose and use a cane. It's also a smart idea to work with a physical therapist.

Where to Buy

You can buy canes at drugstores, discount retailers, medical supply stores and online, usually between \$10 and \$50. You'll also be happy to know that Medicare covers canes with a written prescription from a physician.

wanted the soap bear to be a surprise for him - for his birthday!



2-1-1, a 24/7 resource line administered by the United Way of Northwest Alabama that can quickly put callers in touch with productive people and services.

Those who remain with power and have not experienced an extended power outage simply can't understand the financial, emotional, and psychological impact it can have on people. Couple that with house/ roof damage, and it can seem almost unbearable.

Many remember the widespread outages from the surprise ice storm in February 1994. My wife and I were among those just off of downtown in Florence without power for over two weeks. We were happy that families in the houses across the street had power restored after 3-4 days, but it didn't help our attitude or our situation. However, we uninjured, were had access to food and a shower, and our house was intact.

It's easy to describe overall damage as lightto-moderate while watching TV from your sofa with a warm meal. Those with no power and three-quarters of a house left might have a different viewpoint. So would some of the many tree crews and utility workers. With such significant damage in so many areas, it truly is miraculous that several lives were not lost in our area. Social media is full of interesting circumstances, events,

and timing of movements that, had they been a few feet away or occurred a few seconds later, could have significantly altered local injury and death statistics. SO MANY "what ifs" turned out favorably.

Local utility workers and those from outside our area deserve a big thank you for their hard work over the last 10-12 days. Most worked at a hectic pace for hours that the rest of us can't imagine - while some of their families slept alone without power and hot water.

Public complaints were plentiful, as is to be expected when patience knowledge and relevant facts are low.

In this and other similar circumstances, trying pray often, reach out to neighbors, and look opportunities for to help. Anything can be be significant, and sometimes the smallest gestures can mean the most.

Not only is it saving the furniture, but also it saves time in cleaning. I can pick up the plastic sheeting and see exactly where it needs to be wiped off. A WISE WEEDER

It is time to do the dreaded task of weeding my flower gardens. With the mild winter we have had and the rain, I have a million (looks like it) weeds that have sprouted up on the top of the mulch beds. 



Don't Become a Victim of Fraud!

MONTGOMERY

According to the recently released Federal Trade Commission (FTC) Sentinel Consumer Network report, lost consumers \$8.8 billion to fraud in 2022. Residents of Alabama lost \$53.9 million in scams perpetrated across the state. In recognition of Consumer Protection the Week. Alabama Securities Commission (ASC) is providing tips help Alabamians to protect their wallets from fraudsters.

"When a victim is defrauded, the loss is more than monetary. It impacts their physical, mental, and emotional health," said ASC Chief Deputy Director Amanda Senn. "The ASC strives daily to protect investors from ever experiencing the life-altering consequences of losing money in an investment scam."

The 2022 FTC report shows that investmentrelated fraud is the fourth most commonly reported scam. Consumers lost \$3.8 billion in investmentrelated frauds. the highest among all fraud categories. According to the report, 77% of individuals targeted lost money to a con artist- the highest percentage of all categories. Investmentscams related also account for the highest average loss at \$5,000.

The most popular contact method used by fraudsters continues to by text and phone call. Ditch the urge to prank or chat with scam callers. Senn says it is best to ignore anything from an unknown number to combat the proliferation of scam calls.

"Even if the number

appears to be from your area code, let it go to voicemail," said Senn. "Fraudsters can utilize technology to make it look like they are calling from a local number. When in all likelihood, they are based somewhere overseas."

Scamsters also use the internet and social media to entice and meet victims. When using a platform's chat function, be careful about striking up a conversation or romance with someone vou've never met in person. A quick profession of love, grammatical errors, requests or demands for cash "for an emergency" or plane tickets, are all tactics fraudsters use to get you to fork over your hard-earned cash.

If you are concerned that you gave a con artist personal banking information, look at your most recent statement to get the contact information for your bank/credit card company and notify them immediately. Remember, a bank or credit card company will not ask you to verify your account information in full. Another key

Another key component of protecting your finances is to review your annual free credit report from one of the three nationwide credit reporting companies: Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion.

ASK THE **ATTORNEY** Avoiding **Probate**

I have had two families that I have known for a very long time come in this week with Wills that they wanted to probate. In each case, the parents had already deeded the land and homes that they owned to the children and all bank accounts were set up in a way that named the children as beneficiaries.

I was able to tell both families that there was no need to pay a service to the residents lawyer to probate those Wills.

The only time you need to probate a Will is when you have property to sell that will need a clear title or when you have money or stocks to get that require probate to receive.

If a person doesn't have land and all of their bank accounts are set up so that the beneficiaries are named, then there may be no reason to go through the expense of hiring a lawyer.

This is especially true if all of the children agree about dividing the furniture and personal property of their parents.

That said, Wills are only good for five years after death and it's a lot less expensive to probate a Will than it is to administer an estate without a Will because that requires a bond.

There are often occasions where a parent will own stock through an employee stock ownership program (ESOP) or have other unknown assets, such as a life insurance policy, where an estate will need to be set up so that claims can be filed and the proper party to be paid determined by the court. There certainly are times when tax considerations will persuade one that filing an estate for the tax benefits is the smart thing to do.

That said, if someone is careful in their planning they can certainly set up their estate in such a way as to avoid probate.

• **On April 9, 2009**, the U.S. stopped running its global network of secret prisons used to detain and interrogate terrorism suspects, sometimes with





days earlier for her feature "Jimmy's World," published in the Post on Sept. 29, 1980, about an 8-year-old heroin addict, after admitting she made up the story.

• On April 4, 2013, American film critic Roger Ebert died of cancer just two days after announcing he would write fewer reviews due to the disease's recurrence. His thumbs up/thumbs down rating system with fellow critic Gene Siskel turned the pair into household names and became a popular part of American culture.

• On April 13, 1999, Jack Kevorkian, aka "Dr. Death," was sentenced to 10 to 25 years in prison for the second degree murder of 52-year-old Thomas Youk, who was in the final stages of ALS. Youk's assisted suicide the previous year was videotaped and shown on the Nov. 23, 1998, broadcast of "60 Minutes." Kevorkian served eight years before being released on parole for good behavior.

Tips To Protect Your Property From Severe Weather And Wind Events

- Vehicles. Garage or store vehicles you plan to leave behind. If you don't have a garage, move them to higher ground, in case of flooding.
- Boats: Develop a plan and a checklist to protect your boat in case of storms or hurricanes.
 - Determine the safest place for your boat to ride out a storm ahead of time so it's easy to take action.
- 2. Remove all externally-mounted electronics that might be damaged by a storm.
- 3. Check with your marina about any guidelines or contractual requirements to safeguard your boat in the event of heavy weather.
- Surroundings. Place garbage cans, patio furniture, grills and other potentially wind-borne objects inside your home or garage.
- Board your residence up. Board up windows and glass doors with shutters or plywood to minimize damage from broken glass, in case of high winds.
- Secure and shut off your outdoor pool. Turn off the circuit breaker to your outdoor pool and remove the motor to prevent damage.
- Remove risky tree branches. Prune branches that might break off during the storm and either hurt someone or cause damage to your home or vehicles.
- Manufactured homes. Even when equipped with new straps and tie-downs, manufactured homes may expose occupants to a greater risk of injury than structures with permanent foundations.
- Weather advisories. Monitor the radio for weather updates. If you are instructed to evacuate, go to a shelter as directed by local authorities and:
 - 1. Lock doors and windows before you go.
 - 2. Bring your survival kit and other supplies. For a helpful list of what your kit should include, visit American Red Cross.
 - 3. Let friends and relatives know where you plan to be.

If there is no time to get to a shelter, retreat to your safe room if you have one. Otherwise, stay in the middle of your home or basement, away from windows, and try to take cover under a staircase or a heavy piece of furniture.




