A ONE MAN MOVIE SHOW

Tumbleweed Smith

I met Mike Robertson at a restored theater in Spur, where I did my new one-man show OUTRA-GEOUS TEXAS WOMEN OF CHARACTER. Before the show started I saw this man in the audience who looked a lot like Santa Claus. He had a white beard and jolly eyes and when I visited with him for just a few minutes I was convinced that he is genuinely as friendly as the real thing. He does Tumbleweed Smith Santa Claus stuff around the end of the year.

I found out later that he is a speaker, does magic, creates music, sings and is a Baylor grad. That's what really bonded us. During the pandemic Mike went around the state taking pictures of old theaters. Some of them were in poor condition while others had been restored. He put his photos on his website and people seemed interested in the old movie houses. Some suggested he needed to do a coffee table book but that proved too costly. He took thousands of photos and selected 256 of them and developed a one-man show titled THE SHOW MUST GO ON. It'll be at the 157-seat AFS Cinema, 6259 Middle Fiskville Road in Austin at 7 PM Tuesday October 18.

"I had a lot of friends ask if I was going to record it or stream it live," says Mike. "I told them no, that I was not going to do that. We are losing the importance of going out and doing things. Not just movies but music, restaurants and other stuff. It's so easy to stay home and order food or watch a movie or listen to music on your laptop or phone. We've lost the fun and the joy and the community of going out and being with other people. I think it shows in our society. We've gotten too sedentary as a nation. So I tell people the only chance to see this is to be there in a seat."

Mike has used a few of his many talents in putting the show together.

"I thought well I'm a speaker so I should do something where I get to talk. I also design cool slide presentations so should do some kind of cool slide presentation. I created an original song that will be part of the presentation. I'm excited and terrified because I've never rented out a theater and been completely responsible for selling the tickets. I've been actively working on the show for 3 months but like this mooning I spent 3 hours on one slide. It's got to do some pretty important things and convey a lot of information. It'll be on the screen for about 50 seconds. It's filled with some good stuff. And there's a little bit of comedy in the show, too. It'll be a real surprise."

When you think of slide shows you think of dull, boring events where the speaker reads words that are projected on a screen. Forget that. His slide presentations are works of video art. He'll grab a letter from the screen and place it somewhere else. It looks like magic. Other speakers have asked him to help with their slide presentations.

His show, THE SHOW MUSH GO ON, is just over an hour. There will be popcorn, a full concession stand and bar. Tickets are \$20 and are available at his website mytexaspictureshows.com.




