Children 8 and under can visit the "Farmer for a Day" display and explore unique and interactive activities.

Slawburger Testival

ach April, locals and visitors gather on the Fayetteville square to celebrate a truly unique culinary pairing — the slawburger. The slawburger is a delicious pairing of a juicy and savory hamburger with a tangy and somewhat sweet mustard slaw. It is truly a celebration of flavors for the palate and has become a culinary staple in Fayetteville, thanks to Weston James Stubblefield. In the 1920s, Stubblefield, the founder of Honey's restaurant, made a mustard-based coleslaw and spread it over a hamburger. The burger earned a permanent place on the menu and in the hearts of locals.

Since 2015, the town has come together to celebrate the iconic burger with the festival of the same name — the Slawburger Festival. Taking place on Saturday, April 15, the day will be filled with activities for all ages.

Activities will include a slawburger eating competition, a kids' ice cream eating contest, a dog fashion show, and much more. There will be a variety of food and artisanal vendors. There will also be live music, with performances by Lee Lowe and the local 4 Miles Gone band, who will be performing on the square's southeast corner. Funds raised through the festival are invested in the downtown community through the Fayetteville Main Street nonprofit organization. The nationally-accredited Fayetteville Main Street program has been an active and vital part of the community since 1990. Main Street revitalization is a comprehensive, incremental, self-help economic strategy focusing on developing public-private partnerships to enhance community livability and job creation while maintaining the district's historic character.



Carriage House Players

Turn up the stage lights, raise the curtains, and take in the sights, sounds, and performances of the best in community theatre in Fayetteville — The Carriage House Players. A local nonprofit organization, the players are dedicated to producing a mingling of theatrical styles, including musicals, the classics, contemporary works, comedies, and children's plays. Local longtime member and stage veteran Mickey Johnson said The Carriage House Players are showcasing a must-see season for 2023. The group started the year off with the fun and whimsical musical, "Seussical the Musical."



In April, the audience will help take part in an interactive production of "You're the Jury: The State v. Max Cooper." Summertime welcomes the hilarious production of "Deliver Us From Mama!" that will have you laughing from beginning to end. Johnson said he encourages the public to come and join in on all of the theatrical fun. The organization welcomes those who want to act on stage and lend a hand with props, stage production, makeup, music, and more. There is something for everyone who loves the arts. Productions by The Carriage House Players take place in the historic Fayetteville-Lincoln County Museum, a perfect backdrop for the best show in town.

Cruzin Downtown

Rericans have a powerful emotional attraction to cars from the past. Each September, locals and visitors make their way to downtown Fayetteville to take a gander at the meticulously restored and well-cared-for vehicles. For the annual event, entries of all kinds can be expected. Everything from an old rusted Dodge to a '76 Corvette that looks like it just came off the showroom floor. On average, the event welcomes over 200 entries from all over, with car owners on hand to answer questions, share stories, and reminisce about memories of the good old days when cars like these were a main staple on the roads. The event will also include food vendors and live music. Drawings are also held throughout the event. Whether you are a seasoned expert or a complete automotive novice, Cruzin' Downtown allows everyone to experience the fascinating history of automobiles.





The First Volunteer

The term "volunteer" means a lot in the state of Tennessee. If you're a sports fan, you know Tennessee Volunteers is the nickname for the University of Tennessee's football, basketball, baseball, and other university sports teams.

The state is also known for its brave and dedicated individuals who rise to the challenge when needed, such as to help after a natural disaster or fire or just helping a neighbor. You will always have a fellow Tennessean ready and willing to help. That passion for volunteering has a rich history that spans back more than 200 years. In fact, the state earned its Volunteer nickname right



here in Fayetteville, thanks to a few thousand men who headed the call for volunteers.

During the War of 1812 and the Creek War, the federal government called for 1,500 Tennessee volunteers in late 1812, and approximately 2,000 men offered their services. At the same time, close to 200 East Tennessee volunteers gathered for an expedition to Spanish East Florida. This regiment, formed, supplied, and equipped on its own, exemplified Tennessee's volunteer spirit.

When the Creek War began in the fall of 1813, Tennessee's General Assembly called for 3,500 volunteers. Over 4,000 answered the call, approximately 2,500 from West (now Middle) Tennessee and 1,500 from East Tennessee, which undoubtedly exceeded expectations. By the time of the Battle of Horseshoe Bend in March 1814, Gen. Andrew Jackson's army had grown to about 4,000 men, most of whom were volunteers. For the New Orleans campaign, Tennessee again relied on its volunteer spirit to amass an army of at least 4,200 men. These men, the bulk of Jackson's army, defeated the British at New Orleans on January 8, 1815. Following that victory, Tennessee gained a national reputation as a state known for its military prowess and volunteer spirit.

Today, the Camp Blount Historic Site is located in Fayetteville and encompasses 40 acres of the original site. The First Volunteer statue can be seen as you enter the site and leads you into Volunteer Plaza. Visitors can marvel at the 1812 era artillery piece and walk through history on several trails throughout the grounds. The site is a tribute to all present, past, and future volunteers.

Legislative Appreciation Day

hat do you get when you mix fresh-grilled hamburgers with state government? You get the opportunity to attend one of the most delicious days at the Tennessee Capitol — "Hamburger Day on the Hill."

Formerly known as Legislative Appreciation Day, Fayetteville-Lincoln County hosts legislators and staff for lunch at the Cordell Hull Building in Nashville each year. Now in its 35th year, the lunch is hosted by the city of Fayetteville, Lincoln County, the Lincoln County Livestock Association, and the Lincoln County Chamber of Commerce. This year's event took place on March 29, and Lincoln Countians were invited to visit with Gov. Bill Lee and elected officials from across the state as well as committee members, commissioners, and others who impact Lincoln County.



The Lincoln County Livestock Association fired up the grills and charbroiled approximately 1,200 mouth-watering and locally raised hamburgers provided by Kickin' S Farm. Other local contributors included Sun Drop, Gerald's Foodland, Frito-Lay, and Shoney's, and all Lincoln Countians were welcome to attend. For a small fee, all who wanted to attend could take a bus round trip and enjoy the festivities. By attending, they enjoyed getting to know others and talking about hometown issues.

Lincoln County Museum

ome to Lincoln County's history, along with hosting several community events, is the Fayetteville-Lincoln County Museum. The museum is the only public location that houses artifacts from the community's history. With recent upgrades, such as LED-lighting, museum visitors can enjoy touring the 14 different areas housing artifacts from Lincoln County's history within its 33,000-square-foot building. Built in 1927 for the Borden Milk Plant, the company closed its Middle Tennessee operation on Dec. 15, 1967, but was credited with bringing Lincoln County out of the grips of the Great Depression. The building was donated in 1987 by the William R. Carter family to serve as the local museum because of its convenient location, structural soundness, vast available space, and its link to the county's history.

Museum visitors include students, civic clubs, locals, and outof-towners. All those who visit can learn about the agricultural display, the second largest in the state that features antique tractors, historic implements, and traditional food preparation. The military room displays various items from numerous wars and conflicts as well as the area's relationship to the Space and Missile Defense industry. Other exhibits highlight pioneer life, local industry, local schools and education, traditional professions, and much more. Visitors can scan the QR Code at exhibits and tour at their own pace.


The museum also hosts a publicly available Civic Center that is available for rent for events and displays. The Fayetteville-Lincoln County Museum, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit administered by a board of directors, is operated by volunteers, and the operating budget is made possible solely through donations and gifts. Safety first, fun on the water second

Blueway project provides security and enjoyment for Tennessee's waterways.

The Volunteer state is home to over 50,000 miles of winding, enchanting rivers and streams, with over a half-million acres of pristine lakes and eco-diverse marshes. For outdoor enthusiasts looking to experience some of the state's many water trails in the Southeastern region, look no further than the Elk River Blueway Project.

Launched by Experience Tennessee and the Fayetteville Lincoln County Industrial Development Board in 2022, the project makes floating the river safer. There is signage along the Elk River now. Boat entry points along the river have been GPS located, mapped, videoed, and photographed. This project also maps the entirety of the Elk River from Tims Ford Dam through Lincoln County before crossing into Alabama. River access points include Tims Ford Dam, Farris Creek Bridge, Old Dam Ford, Shiloh Bridge, Stump Shoals, Chenault Ford Road, and Stone Bridge Park. Signs show how long it takes to get from one access point to the next, with an estimated 22 hours to float from Tims Ford Dam to Stonebridge Park.

The signage is also a benefit for Emergency Medical Services, enabling them to respond quickly in the case of an emergency. For more information about the Elk River Blueway, visit the Float in Tennessee website at FloatinTN.com. The site includes the Elk River Blueway map and links to TVA, Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency, and Fish Tennessee. The site enables visitors to check for safe-to-float water levels, safety tips, if TVA is generating, purchase a fishing license, and more. You can also pick up a brochure at information centers, including the Fayetteville-Lincoln County Chamber of Commerce, or download the Experience Tennessee mobile app.

Industry in Lincoln County

Fayetteville-Lincoln County Industrial Development Board welcomes new opportunities in 2023.

The Fayetteville-Lincoln County is booming for 2023. The Fayetteville-Lincoln County Industrial Development Board (FLCIDB) is taking its commitment to growing job and investment opportunities to the next level. A prime location for many industries, the county is looking to expand its industrial offerings thanks to several new developments.

Lincoln County recently received a site development grant from the Department of Economic and Community Development. The county received \$1 million toward property grading and preparation. The grants are designed to help communities invest in infrastructure and engineering improvements to land economic development projects and achieve select Tennessee site certification.

The county will also be welcoming Ariens Company to their family of industry. The company will invest \$38 million to locate its new manufacturing and warehouse facility in Tennessee. Headquartered in Brillion, Wisconsin, AriensCo will create 369 new jobs in Fayetteville as the company establishes operations in the former Direct Coil Building. The company's expansion to Tennessee is in direct response to AriensCo's increase in demand, which has outpaced current production capacity. The new Fayetteville site will position AriensCo to be geographically closer to its dealer partners, customers, and material suppliers in the Southeastern U.S. It will also serve as the hub for AriensCo's Gravely® brand of commercial outdoor power equipment.

The county is also continuing its work with clean energy with the Elora Solar Energy Center. The project features more than 500,000 solar panels situated on more than 1,500 acres of farmland capable of generating up to 150 megawatts of lowcost, home-grown energy. Over the next 20 years, the project is expected to generate millions of dollars in additional tax revenue for Lincoln County. Additionally, the facility doesn't require water to generate electricity and doesn't create air or water pollution.

According to the FLCIDB, the board is looking forward to continued growth in 2023 and bringing even more opportunities to Lincoln County. Visit our showroom for unique designs as unique as you are.

Chamber Votes Organization of the Year

• n October 7, 1813, Andrew Jackson arrived in Fayetteville to command the troops gathered to march southward into the Creek Nation. It was a military campaign that would come to be known as a sub-conflict of the War of 1812. The history of their campground, named Camp Blount in honor of then-governor Willie Blount, remained relatively unrecognized until the Tennessee War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission identified the importance of the camp's preservation. The State of Tennessee purchased the remaining available camp property, and the state and the City of Fayetteville now manage the area.

Supporting and celebrating the legacy and history of Camp Blount is the ongoing mission of the Camp Blount Historic Site Association (CBHSA). CBHSA has been instrumental in improving and maintaining the grounds and educating today's youth and the community on the importance of the activities on the property.

Dr. Farris Beasley, vice chairman of CBHSA, is incredibly proud of the association's youth educational programs.

"I think our young people really need to know where we

came from and who we are and appreciate all the people that went on before them," Beasley said.

Last year's improvements to the property added to the public's opportunities to learn about the property's rich history by adding a 40-by-16 open-air pavilion surrounded by six signs memorializing and depicting the property's past. These are impressive additions considering funding necessities.

Beasley said, "We don't get any direct funding from the state. They own the property, but we are a historic site, not a historical park. The parks have a budget, but there's no direct source of income from the state for a site, so we have to [rely on] grants, and that's just a continual fight."

CBHSA hosts an annual Volunteer Days event, September 29 & 30, a two-day event featuring a presentation of the camp's history by life historians in period dress and displays depicting life during that era.

The award affirms the community's hard work to bring the site to life, and the CBHSA is excited to see the ongoing activities and projects for its preservation.

"Lincoln County is a great place to raise a family and instill the appropriate values in children. There's just so much about the community that I love," J.B. said.

But he attributes the best of who he is to Nancy.

He said, "My wife and I are a tremendous team, and she's the best of who I am as a person. Her spirit and heart and how she gives to others unselfishly have been a great example for me in my life."

Another positive influence early in his life was Joel Hastings, his high school U.S. government teacher, who said he wouldn't be surprised to see Cox as governor one day.

"He's one of the people that opened my eyes to the possibility of being able to do bigger things. His level of faith and confidence in the possibility of my future went a long way for me to be comfortable taking more chances and doing more things," said Cox.

nowing where your food lived before it reached your table means you know exactly what you're feeding those you love. At Pilaroc Farms, you can see not just where it lived but how it lived. You can also shop for other items from local farmers and agriculture businesses while selecting your favorite cuts of beef, pork, and lamb from Pilaroc's large selection of items butchered on-site.

Owners Jennie Schutte-Patrick and her husband, Walt Patrick, are passionate about connections. They connect Lincoln County residents with local growers. They want to be sure you know the value of your dollar when it's reinvested in the community, a connection that pays off for everyone. And they want to help you know the history of your food, enabling you to connect its source with your health and wholeness.

Jennie said, "We're both obsessed with animal agriculture. Beyond a handful of petting zoos in the area, no one taught about livestock. For this reason, we feel it's our responsibility and Pilaroc's mission to educate on where your food comes from." The Marketplace at Pilaroc Farms is located at 178 Patrick Road, Fayetteville, and offers you the opportunity to see the farm's livestock firsthand. You can also shop from local farmers selling farm-direct items such as eggs, goat cheese, ice cream, maple syrup, grits, bison, goat soaps, and even crickets! In the middle room, they butcher their own meats in their further processing facility. In a further processing facility, livestock is taken to a United States Department of Agriculture-inspected butcher to "kill and chill." The carcass sides are brought back to their facility and broken down into steaks, their flavors of sausage links, specific burgers, grinds, and more.

Pilaroc connects the community through its ongoing events and classes. Where else can you learn raising, butchering, and cooking rabbits; pressure canning; and wreath making? Educational and wellness events supporting breast cancer awareness and agricultural awareness are ongoing.

At the end of the day, Jennie and her family sleep best, knowing everyone around them has access to the local resources that let us live our best lives.



Applicants must show proof of U.S. citizenship; proof of any name change; two proofs of TN residency with name - NO P.O. BOXES; proof of social security number.

*We do not perform road tests in bad weather.

PET LAWS

The ordinance regarding pet laws within City Limits of Fayetteville states that dogs must be confined or controlled by a leash and all pets should be given rabies shots and must wear tags indicating they have had these shots. If, for any reason, an animal needs to be picked up off of the street, one can call the Animal Control Office number, (931) 433-3726. Rabies clinics are sponsored by the Health Department during the spring of each year and are announced in the newspaper and on the local radio stations. Rabies shots are given by any of the veterinarians in the City throughout the year.

VOTING LAWS

Newcomers to the City and County may register to vote after living in the state of Tennessee as soon as they become residents. Tennessee is the only state that has no durational requirement for becoming a resident. The Election Commissioner's Office is located at 208 E Davidson Drive. Anyone who is 18 years of age or who will be 18 on the day of the next election, can register to vote. The books for voter registration are closed 30 days before an election. The hours of the Election Commission Office are 8 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Any registered voter can vote early.

Property taxes are due on the first day of October of each year, and are delinquent as of the first day of March. There is a 1.5% interest rate per month and a penalty charged to any delinquent taxes. City taxes are payable at the City Clerk's Office in the Municipal Building in downtown Fayetteville. County property taxes are payable in the Trustee's Office, Room 103, at the County Courthouse.

If you have moved to this area from outside of the state, you need to apply for a title and a Tennessee license plate. You should make the purchase as soon as possible. These licenses may be obtained from the County Court Clerk's Office, Room 102, in the Lincoln County Courthouse. The office is open Monday – Friday 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., and open the last Saturday of the month from 9:00 a.m.–Noon. You must also purchase a wheel tax sticker, which is \$110 per year. Registration and proof of insurance must be in the glove box of the vehicle at all times.



TN Promise & tnAchieves THEC Announces Record-Breaking Year of Tennessee Promise Students

T NThe Tennessee Higher Education Commission (THEC) recently launched a state-level vision and initiative to create a momentum-building year with key goals to increase the college-going rate and better align education to meet the state's growing workforce needs.

As an early indicator for the momentum year, a recordbreaking number of students applied for Tennessee Promise program in the most recent application cycle that closed on November 1, 2022.

Preliminary data for the High School Class of 2023 show that 64,612 high school seniors applied for Tennessee Promise, the most in the program's history to date.

The Tennessee Promise program includes a last-dollar scholarship that provides recent high school graduates the opportunity to complete an associate degree or certificate program free of tuition and mandatory fees at a public community college, a Tennessee College of Applied Technology (TCAT), or a public or private university with an eligible associate degree program. As a last-dollar scholarship, Tennessee Promise funds the remaining balance of tuition and mandatory fees after all other gift aid has been applied. The program pairs Tennessee Promise students with a mentor and support through the state's partnering organizations, tnAchieves and The Ayers Foundation. Each year, THEC produces a report outlining the impact of Tennessee Promise. The annual report presents descriptive data on Tennessee Promise applicants and students, student outcomes, student transfer behavior, and program finances.

The Tennessee Promise Annual Report for 2022 with several key findings:

- Since inception, over 123,000 Tennessee Promise students have received over \$181 million in scholarships to alleviate college costs.
- Over 31,000 Tennessee Promise students have earned a credential since the program began. This translates to 47.9% of cohort one, 45.3% of cohort two, 40.8% of cohort three, and 35.1% of cohort four earning a credential. Like with transfer, the number of degrees earned will continue to grow as the program matures.
- Over 15,000 Tennessee Promise students have transferred to a four-year Tennessee public university to continue their education. This number continues to grow as the Promise program matures.



Don Davidson/ Lions Club Complex

The complex has five softball fields and one baseball field. It has a newly built dog park with water stations and has a divided area to separate dogs from each other. It has a lake with a nature walking trail around it which leads into the woods below it, where you can walk around the lower perimeter of the complex.




