Safety awards were also given by the DNR and presented by Bob Nack, R3 Team Supervisor and April Dombrowski Section Chief.


Individuals that were also recognized during the awards night was Kevin Roertvedt, who was honored the Educator

ELG Grad Leads Northern Michigan University to NCAA Division II Tourney

By the end of his senior year in 2008 at Elkhart Lake Glenbeulah High School, Matt Majkrzak knew he wanted to be a coach. His Mom, Lisa Sadiq, remembers him talking about basketball and either becoming an agent, scout, or coach as early as kindergarten. It's been a long time since kindergarten, but now Majkrzak is fulfilling that dream. Majkrzak is the head coach of

the Northern Michigan University Men's Basketball team and led the Wildcats to a 25-8 record, a conference championship, and for the first time in 23 years to the NCAA tournament. It's been a rewarding experience coaching at NMU for Majkrzak and he loves to see the players experience success and develop on and off the floor. "I also became friends with so many athletes and nonathletes that it made me into a more well-rounded person," Majkrzak said. 
ELG Participates in SeaPerch Competition



In an effort aiming to provide additional support to underrepresented student groups, Lakeshore Technical College is partnering with the Hmong Mutual Assistance Association of Sheboygan by providing on-site staffing at the association's 2304 Superior Ave. location.

"By placing a program counselor on site, we are able to provide accessible academic planning and connection to student support services that can keep students on track to degree completion," says Lakeshore Executive Director of Program Counseling and Student Resources Foua Hang.

The partnership also helps HMAAS provide educational programming that promotes post-secondary education.

"With having LTC here at the Hmong Mutual Assistance Association of Sheboygan, we are able to provide another service to the community. HMAAS and LTC together are helping students explore, begin, or continue their higher education," says Moua Yang, HMAAS board president.

Lakeshore Program Counselor and Sheboygan resident Choua Lee began holding office hours at HMAAS in January. Lee is fluent in both Hmong and English. She works with individuals enrolled in high-demand health and human services related programs including nursing assistant, early childhood education, dental assistant, and medical coder.

Lee is available at HMAAS by appointment 8 a.m.-3 p.m. on Wednesdays with dropins welcome 3-4:30 p.m. Wednesdays. She can be reached at 920-693-1237 or choua.lee@gotoltc.edu.

Census data for Sheboygan County shows 7,200 Asian American and Pacific Islander residents, with the largest group among them from the Hmong community. According to Lakeshore, the college currently serves 646 Asian American and Pacific Islander students. Almost 300 are undergraduate students living in Sheboygan County.

LTC Earns Military Friendly School Designation

For the 14th consecutive year, Lakeshore Technical College earned the Military Friendly School designation. Schools earning the designation were evaluated using public data sources and responses from a proprietary survey. Only 665 of over 1,800 schools participating in the 2023-2024 survey earned special awards for going above the standard. Lakeshore earned a gold award, which indicates leading practices, outcomes, and effective programs for veterans transitioning from military careers to school and satisfying careers as civilians.

"Receiving this honor year after year is a result of our ongoing commitment to welcoming veterans to learn with us and supporting them throughout their education journeys," said Lakeshore President Dr. Paul Carlsen.

Lakeshore works with County Veterans Services, Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs, and the Federal Veterans Administration to ensure veterans have access to resources that can support success. Through the Wisconsin GI Bill, veterans and their dependents can apply for tuition and material fee waivers. Lakeshore also For information about Lakeshore's processes state level Retraining Grant Applications for veterans who are



dislocated workers, National Guard Tuition Grant Applications, and VetEd Reimbursement Grants. Those eligible for the Federal GI Bill can benefit from tuition assistance, housing allowance, and additional stipends to cover education costs.

Registration for new and returning veterans begins April 3 for Lakeshore's summer and fall terms. Alumni, returning, and new program students can begin registering April 4. Registration will be open to everyone on April 14.

Court Reporting Program Recertified at LTC

The Council on Approved Student Education has awarded Lakeshore Technical College's court reporting program recertification though January 2028. The organization bases its decision on standards set forth by the National Court Reporters Association.

"Our recertification reflects the high quality program and instruction provided to our students, who are graduating and enjoying fulfilling careers throughout our community," said Lakeshore Interim Vice President of Instruction Tanya Boman.

According to Lakeshore's most recent data, its court reporting graduates report 100% job placement and a \$48,859 median annual income within six month of graduating.

Lakeshore offers one of only two NCRAapproved programs in the state and the only program currently accepting new students. The program can be started in August each year and typically takes four semesters to complete. It is offered 100% online and through the college's iFlex delivery mode, which includes a blend of online and in-person instruction.







BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED

If you are planning a construction project on your home or business, you must apply for a building permit. Permits must be issued prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

BEACH PASS INFORMATION

The Village is reminding people that the Village beach is for residents of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Joint School District only, per Village Ordinance. The police will be monitoring beach use more frequently. The prices of the passes is \$5 for residents and \$40 for school district residents, which are good for an even and odd year (this is the first year of the beach pass). These passes will be available by May 16th. The price of replacement passes is \$25 for Village residents and \$50 for school district residents. Rental properties are to have their guests use Fireman's Park. This is the public access to the lake that should be used for guests. Some of the other regulations include:


- No person shall allow a dog to be on any public beaches owned or leased by the Village.


