Gov. Walz visits fish hatchery to highlight investments ahead of opener



FISHING OPENER BREAKFAST



Governor Tim Walz and Lieutenant Governor Peggy Flanagan toured a state fish hatchery on May 1 in St. Paul ahead of the fishing opener. The facility was the first state-run hatchery established in Minnesota. Today, the facility produces young walleye, muskellunge, and tiger muskie used to stock lakes across the state.

"Fishing is one of our greatest outdoor traditions, and it makes up a \$4.4 billion dollar industry in Minnesota," said Governor Walz. "Hatcheries are an essential part of conservation and the system we have to ensure the continuation of our fishing and outdoor recreation industry. We need to make investments to repair and improve our aging fish hatcheries and outdoor infrastructure to ensure world-class fishing for decades to come."

The St. Paul Fish Hatchery is one of 15 hatcheries operated by DNR, each of Minnesota makes in managwhich specializes in one or more fish species. Like the St. Paul hatchery, most of these facilities were constructed decades ago—many predate the 1960s-and need renewal and modernization. Critical issues, including biosecurity, aging infrastructure, and safety, need to be addressed within the hatchery system. The One Minnesota Budget for DNR proposes investments in these facilities, fisheries management, and the lakes and rivers where Minnesotans fish.

"Like so many Minnesotans, I can't wait to get back out on open water and cast a line for walleye this fishing opener weekend. The outstanding and diverse angling opportunities we experience during opening weekend and throughout the season depend on the work and dedication of DNR staff and partners, and the investments ing our fisheries resources," DNR Commissioner Sarah Strommen said. "By investing in the infrastructure, places, and people that make fishing opportunities possible across the state, we help support our economy and the premiere outdoor recreation experiences Minnesota is known for."

The state's diverse aquatic habitat, from Lake Superior and Lake of the Woods in the north to small, cold streams in the Driftless Area of the southeast, offers world-class fishing that DNR's hatcheries support through stocking programs. The One Minnesota budget's Get Out MORE (Modernize Outdoor Recreation Experiences) proposal would make a \$118 million General Fund investment, which would combine with additional funds in the Governor's bonding proposal, to ensure all Minnesotans are able to take part in Minnesota's outdoor traditions. The General Fund proposal includes \$35 million to enhance fisheries and fishing infrastructure, \$35 million for modernizing boating access, and \$15 million for restoring streams and modernizing water-related infrastructure to support outdoor recreation.

Minnesotans will head to lakes and rivers for the opening of the walleye, sauger, and northern pike season on Saturday, May 13, and the tradition will be celebrated in many ways. The 2023 Governor's Fishing Opener will be held in the greater Mankato area Thursday, May 11, through Saturday, May 13.May 13-14 is also Take a Mom Fishing Weekend, when Minnesota moms can fish for free without a license and participate in the virtual Minnesota Moms Fishing Challenge.





House Democrats approved a bill against constitutional rights

to free speech is protected by our Second Amendment right to bear arms. These are cornerstones on which our state and nation were founded, yet House Democrats approved a bill this week that threatens to weaken each.

Before we get into the details, I want to make clear I am an ardent supporter of our constitutional rights. I will continue fighting to uphold them and push back against undermining efforts every time.

Back to the bill itself, which the House majority approved this week: It is a public safety package (S.F. 2909) which, again, includes provisions of major concern for both our First Amendment and Second Amendment rights.

One measure in the bill creates a bad-speech registry where the state would create a government database of perceived "hate incidents" that fall short of criminal acts. To be clear, we're not talking about "hate crimes" because those already are tracked.

In other words, the bill gives state authority to collect data about crimes of bias that have not been reported to law enforcement - so there is no documentation that the event happened - but people still

could be placed in a registry. The bill also features anti-Second Amendment language from two controversial gun control bills: H.F. 14 (universal gun registration) and H.F. 15 (red flag). I support our law enforcement officers' concerns about provisions that are unworkable and unrealistic to enforce on the streets. Instead of addressing the root causes of violent crime, this bill will create strict and impractical hurdles for law-abiding Minnesotans seeking to exercise their Second Amendment rights. Criminals looking to acquire complex new process laid out in the proposal and it will do nothing to stop the flow of firearms among criminals.

Let's hope a conference committee does a major overhaul and eliminates these provisions before the bill comes back for a vote on final passage. Our efforts should be focused on enforcing the numerous laws we already have governing firearm transfers before the Legislature creates new ones that will harm law-abiding citizens and are unlikely to deter those with bad intentions.

Nursing homes shorted fund-

House Democrats approved a bill this week which ignores a long-term care crisis in our state by severely underfunding this portion of the state budget.

The House Human Services Finance omnibus package (S.F. 2934) came to the floor accounting for just .01 percent of the Democrats' \$72 billion budget proposal that consumes the state's \$19 billion surplus and increases state General Fund spending by 40 percent.

Not long ago, both sides of the aisle would have jumped at the idea of fully funding nursing homes. Today, that concept doesn't seem to get the attention of the Democrats' special interest groups so it's off the table. This gives us further proof the Democrat party is more interested in sending political paybacks to its radical base than doing what's right for Minnesotans. The fact Minnesota's House majority proposes sending state spending into orbit but also is unwilling to adequately support our seniors and the people who care for them is disgraceful.

Meanwhile, Minnesota is in the midst of a "silver tsunami," with more than 1.3 million state residents aged 65 or older.

Our First Amendment right firearms will not follow the As these residents age, their need for care grows and it is unfortunate to see Minnesota is not keeping up with these needs. A reported 2,597 nursing home beds have been taken out of service in Minnesota since 2020, the equivalent of shuttering 52, 50-bed homes. The long-term care industry in Minnesota, currently is operating with a worker shortage of 53,000 and that, in the month of October alone, 11,000 elderly residents were turned away from nursing homes largely due to lack of staff.

The best we can say right now is thank goodness this bill is headed to a conference committee where there's still a glimmer of hope the bill will be improved before it is considered for final passage. This is the time when it's most important to make sure legislators know where we stand on this issue so a just outcome can be achieved.

Tax bill

The Democrats' tax bill (H.F. 1938) was among the last omnibus finance packages to come to the floor for a vote on preliminary approval and there are some provisions of major concern. House Republicans continue working to eliminate a measure I mentioned in my last newsletter that would end electronic pull tabs as we know them, dealing a severe blow to local charity organizations/ non-profits. Overall, this bill includes \$2.2 billion of the Democrats' \$9.5 billion in proposed tax increases, again, at a time the state has a massive surplus.

I'll come back with a closer look at this bill soon. Until then, please have a good weekend and let me know how I can help.



Fishing reports available

Anglers looking for local information before the Saturday, May 13 fishing opener can look at the regional fishing reports from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. These reports include details about waters in each region and can be found on the DNR website (mndnr.gov/fishing/outlooks.html).

'Catch' the fun of shore fishing this season

For people who want to go fishing but don't have a boat or don't want to use a boat, the DNR has two instructional videos about how to catch fish from shore. The videos can be found on the DNR website by searching

"shore fishing" (mndnr.gov/discover#tab-1-2). Shore Fishing 101 covers general shore fishing basics and Shore Fishing 102 focuses on river fishing from shore.

For those fishing in the Twin Cities area, the DNR has a map of accessible piers and shore fishing locations, and lakes stocked with fish at the DNR's Fishing in the Neighborhood page (mndnr. gov/fin). Stocking in many area lakes is happening through the end of May. For fishing locations across the entire state, the DNR has a map of fishing piers and shore fishing locations on the DNR website (mndnr. gov/fishing_piers).
