South Haven's 'Taste' Celebrates Ten Years With Remodel & Refocus

With spring in the air across southwest Michigan, the local trees aren't the only things turning over a new leaf.

South Haven's Taste unveiled a twomonth interior renovation with a "soft" opening in April, and Owners Heidi Gesiakowski and Chef Joel Gesiakowski are ready to show off the restaurant's new look ahead of its 10-year anniversary May 15.

"The opening was *not* soft," Heidi said. "We opened the doors and the floodgates opened. The customer's reactions were just outstanding."

From a more open floorplan and accessible entrance to new booths and expanded bar seating, the Gesiakowskis said with the anniversary coming up, they knew they wanted to make a change to their restaurant at the corner of Kalamazoo and Phoenix Streets.

"We decided to put our twist on it and make it our own," said Joel, who first met Heidi while she was bartending at Harborside Bistro in the mid-2000's. "It's not like we were boring after 10 years, but it just kind of re-excited me about the whole thing. It's like running or opening the brand new restaurant without moving locations. It's like a rebirth."

NO HONOR AMONGST THIEVES

There are two kinds of thieves, an honest thief and the justified thief. An honest thief, despite the obvious misnomer, is a thief that steals to steal. They have no reason or excuse. There is no deception in their actions. They're just plain thieves

A justified thief is one who has a "good reason" to steal. Some see capitalism and corporate greed as a moral wrong, so stealing from organi-zations like these is ok. Unlocked doors and open windows are enough for some to make a hasty decision to take what's not theirs. Other's use hunger, unemployment, and other circumstances to justify stealing. These thieves walk amongst us. They are your neighbors and your coworkers. They are your friends and at times, your family.

Regardless the reason, or the lack thereof, most, although sympathetic to some, would not voluntarily place themselves in the path of either type of thief. One will most definitely steal from you. The other, it's just a matter of time.

Most don't realize there are two real estate housing markets - homes listed on the MLS with Realtors, "on-market", and private property sales, without buyer/seller representation, "off-market". I move properties primarily off-market. The challenge most have with selling off-market, is the lack of oversight and accountability. Most off-market real estate professionals are not licensed. They are wholesalers, landlords, and flip-

pers. These individuals are not held to the same standards as those sworn to uphold specific eth-ics requirements. I'm a hybrid. I am a wholesaler but I'm also licensed so maintaining integrity, offmarket, is very important to me.

The two stories below are what NOT to do as a "wholesaler", off-market.

The first assisted the sale of my rental. I signed a standard purchase agreement indicating the buyer would be covering closing costs and title fees (which is common off-market). A few days before the closing, I received the settlement statement. It said I was to pay closing costs? I called my title company for clarification. I was to pay closing costs however they referenced a contract I had never signed. I forwarded the original contract showing my signature where the buyer indeed was to pay closing costs. This person submitted an altered contract without my signature and claimed we never negotiated closing costs!

This is the off-market. There is no one for me to complain to. There is no ethics board here. negotiated the closing of the sale and moved along.

The second left a business card on the seller's door of a property I had privately under contract in Indiana. This was also an off-market deal my group intended to sell. I was out of town so a partner investor was to meet the buyer. I was assured by the buying party my partner wasn't need for the showing, that I shouldn't wor-ry about them "stealing" the deal,... that I could "trust" them. They met with the seller for the showing. Soon after, they submitted a low offer that didn't work for our group. When they didn't get the answer they wanted, they called the seller directly to negotiate! Needless to say, the seller was distraught and because of that, negotiations were over.

Never judge a book by its cover and always do business with those who choose to be virtuous even when they're not being watched...ESPE-

CIALLY when they're not being watched. Plot twist, the two "professionals" above were not wholesalers. They were Realtors.

Dave Says Is the Threat of **De-Dollarization Real?**

Dear Dave.

I'm hearing more and more about "de-dollarization" and how several countries are moving away from the U.S. dollar as their basis of international trade. Will this affect the strength of the dollar, and should I be concerned about how I'm saving and investing because of this?

Zack Dear Zack,

First and foremost, I care enough about you to say you may be spending way too much time on the internet, buddy. You're drifting into the realm of conspiracy theories here, so let's slow down and take a look at some facts.

China, Brazil and Russia are the three main players in all this. They already don't use the U.S. dollar as their basis of international trade-all three have their own currency, and there's a conversion rate between all those currencies and the U.S. dollar. Those three countries, along with some of the oil-producing countries from the Middle East they're trying to get on board with the idea, are talking about developing one currency they all use. In international trade, that currency would be

converted back and forth to dollars-much like what Europe did with the euro. Which, by the way, really hasn't worked out so well.

Are those countries going to be able to devalue the dollar by doing that? No. Why? Because while those countries take up a lot of land mass, they don't take up a lot of the gross domestic product (GDP) of the world. The United States still represents the vast majority of the world's GDP. Sure, China's big in that regard. But Russia doesn't bring much to the table, and Brazil is barely scraping by in a failed economy. Plus, they're tiny as far as economics are concerned. I mean. Texas probably has a larger GDP than Brazil.

In other words, they just don't have the muscle to take down the dollar mathematically speaking. Now, if they do manage to put this idea together, it still won't end in "de-dollarization." The dollar will not be done away with. Even if they create their own currency, they're still going to have to trade with the 800-pound gorilla, which is America. And they're going to have to trade with us in dollars.

Am I worried about this, Zack? Not one bit. And you shouldn't be either. – Dave

The new half moon-shaped booths seat tables of up to six or seven, according to Heidi and Joel, and were custom built in Detroit.

" I've never actually sat in a more comfortable booth in my life," Joel said. "So, we're really happy with that."

There is also a new private dining room featuring a 10 foot long live edge Red Oak table that seats up to 12 people.

"It's definitely a showstopper," Joel said. "It took six grown men to lift this piece of wood into the restaurant."

"A three-course meal with a drink to match every course," Joel said. "We haven't hashed out all the details yet, but I'm thinking about running a menu for a whole month and doing it maybe two to four times."

In addition to the physical changes, Joel said there are a couple of menu changes, including a seafood dip with shrimp, crab, lobster and cream cheese served with toasted pita. They've also added a new "seafood Rangoon" sushi roll. Both items are already a hit, according to loel.

The Gesiakowskis said they also plan to celebrate their 10-year anniversary with a special deal for their customers. 



Doggin' Picasso

As a globally famous artiste, I enjoy checking out the work of other somewhat well-known creators; in the last couple years, I've partaken of a virtual Van Gogh exhibition, a display of works by street artist Banksy, a show featuring pieces by Andy Warhol, and last week, a collection of landscapes by a fellow named Picasso.

Now even though I'm just a palooka from a small town in Indiana, I don't shy away from trying to broaden my horizons and seeking to "connect" and appreciate art that is universally renowned as "great." 
The intensity of Picasso's affection for Lump is such that Lump has his own Wikipedia page. Showing once again, it's not always what you know, but who you know.


