We are currently seeking to add to our list of approved foster homes.

In late summer of 2005, Annette Nolen-Ferguson found a litter of orphaned, unweaned kittens in this area. She took them into her home and lovingly bottle fed them and provided them 24 hours a day care. When they were about seven weeks old, she found all of them homes. People who knew Annette were not surprised by this, because she had loved animals her whole life. Annette and her family had no way of knowing that shortly after that, on October 25, 2005, Annette would pass away suddenly, leaving a grief-stricken family.

Her parents, George and Judy Nolen, decided that they wanted their daughter's life to be remembered and memorialized, and they chose to do that by establishing the Annette Nolen Ferguson Foster Fund with the Danville Area Humane Society.

Although we have had a foster program for special-needs cases, we have a desire to expand that program. As many orphaned, unweaned kittens and puppies come into our open-admission shelter every year (sometimes in the hundreds), the need is great for people to be willing to provide the care in their homes. As a natural consequence of this, they become adoption ambassadors for their foster animals and help find homes with friends and family members, using our regular adoption process. That is a winning situation for the animals, the foster homes, and us!

Our biggest need involves litters of kittens and puppies who come to us without their mother need to be in a home where they can be bottle-fed,

taught basic puppy/kitten skills, and then brought back to us for adoption when they are able to eat solid food.

Until now, foster homes were responsible for the cost of the food and veterinary care. This fund allows us to provide the food and to pay for the veterinary treatment.

The process for being approved to be a foster home is the same for being approved for an adoption. It is not a long process and it helps us ensure the future safety and well-being of shelter animals. Just stop by the shelter during our regular business hours (12-5:30 Monday-Friday and 12-3:30 on Saturday) and fill out a questionnaire to begin the process.

DPS CELEBRATES OPENING OF GWHS TRACK



Danville Public Schools (DPS) recently held an opening ceremony for the brand new, state-of-the-art track and field facility at George Washington High School (GW). The ceremony included a presentation, ribbon cutting, and ceremonial "first run" around the track.

The facility, for which construction began in March 2022, holds an eight-lane, NCAA certified synthetic track, along with field event spaces for long jump, pole vault, steeplechase, javelin, shot put, high jump, and hammer/discus.



The nearly \$4 million track facility is part of a larger \$81 million renovation currently underway at GW. The opening of the track facility marks the end of a more than 20-year period in which GW and Galileo Magnet High School could not host track meets due to the lack of adequate facilities.



"We're looking forward to this athletic venue not only being the showpiece for this city, but for this region and this state," GW Principal Reyhan Deskens said.

"This is what our athletes and coaches deserve, and I'm so honored and proud to be a part of an amazing group of board members and community members to make this happen for our amazing student athletes," Danville School Board Chair Ty'Quan Graves said.

The new track will be used by GW and Galileo runners, as well as Averett University. DPS has partnered with Averett for use of the track, which has allowed for the addition of collegiate track programs in the city. The Averett University track and field indoor and outdoor programs had their inaugural seasons in the 2022-2023 year.

"Today, we celebrate our dreams becoming a reality not just for Averett, not just for the Danville Public Schools, but for the entire community," Averett University President Dr. Tiffany Franks said. "We're creating another point of destination for our region."

Funding for the track facility was made available in part by Danville City Council, who earmarked funds to go towards the track facility.

"One of our priorities [for the city] is education," Vice Mayor Dr. Gary Miller said. "It's not just mental education, it's physical education."

The track is just the first in several improvements to the school's athletic campus. Other renovations to follow include the football stadium and fieldhouse, as well as a new press box.

GW is holding its first home track meet today, May 10, at 5 p.m. In addition, GW is hosting the Piedmont District track meet on May 17, and the Region 4D track meet on May 23.

BEEF TACO SALAD



Ingredients

- FOR THE BEEF:**
1 tablespoon vegetable oil
1 pound ground beef
1 teaspoon ground cumin
1 teaspoon chili powder
1/2 teaspoon paprika
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
1/2 teaspoon dried coriander (or dried oregano)
1/2 teaspoon salt (or to taste)
1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper (or to taste)
2 tablespoons tomato paste
1/4 cup beef broth or water

FOR THE SALAD:

- 1 head romaine lettuce, chopped (about 6-7 cups)
2 cups grape tomatoes, halved
1/2 cup red onion, diced
1 medium ripe avocado, diced
1 cup cooked corn (canned or cooked from frozen)
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese (or Tex-Mex blend)
1/2 cup fresh cilantro, loosely packed
1 cup tortilla chips, crushed (or tortilla strips)

FOR THE DRESSING:

- 1/4 cup Greek yogurt (or sour cream)
2-3 tablespoons lime juice

INSTRUCTIONS

Heat oil in a large skillet for 2 minutes over medium-high heat until the hot oil sizzles. Add ground beef and stir well to cook evenly until browned, about 6-8 minutes. Make sure to break up beef into small pieces to help even browning. Add cumin, chili powder, paprika, garlic powder, oregano, salt, pepper, tomato paste and beef broth. Reduce heat to medium and let the mixture simmer for 3-5 minutes until the sauce thickens a bit, stirring occasionally. Turn off heat and set aside while you assemble the salad. In a large serving bowl, add all salad ingredients including lettuce, tomatoes, red onion, avocado, corn, cheese, cilantro, and tortilla chips (or tortilla strips). In a small bowl, whisk to combine the Greek yogurt and lime juice. The dressing will be a little thick. You can add extra lime juice to taste or to thin it out. Dollop a spoonful of dressing over the salad and toss to combine.

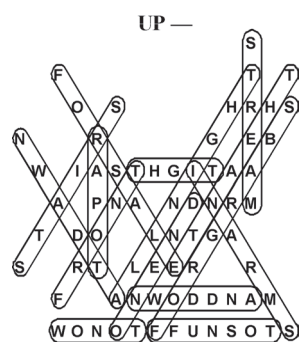
