BEEF STROGANOFF SANDWICHES 6 SERVINGS

## Ingredients

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 cup sliced fresh mushrooms
- 1 small green pepper, finely chopped
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 1 envelope ranch dip mix
- $3 / 4$ cup sour cream
- 1 loaf (about 8 ounces) French bread
- 2 cups shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese Directions

1. Preheat broiler. In a large skillet, cook beef, mushrooms, pepper and onion over mediumhigh heat until beef is no longer pink, breaking up beef into crumbles, 8-10 minutes; drain. Stir in dip mix and sour cream.
2. Cut French bread horizontally in half; place halves on a baking sheet, cut side up. Broil 3-4 in. from heat until lightly toasted, 1-2 minutes. Remove from broiler.
3. Spoon beef mixture over bread. Sprinkle with cheese. Broil until cheese is lightly browned, 1-2 minutes longer. To serve, cut each into 3 pieces.

## HERB \& CHEESE-STUFFED BURGERS

## 4 SERVINGS

## Ingredients

- 1/4 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 2 tablespoons cream cheese, softened
- 2 tablespoons minced fresh parsley
- 3 teaspoons Dijon mustard, divided


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- 2 green onions, thinly sliced
- 3 tablespoons dry bread crumbs
- 2 tablespoons ketchup
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon salt

- $1 / 2$ teaspoon dried rosemary, crushed
- $1 / 4$ teaspoon dried sage leaves
- 1 pound lean ground beef ( $90 \%$ lean)
- 4 hamburger buns, split
- Optional toppings: Lettuce leaves and tomato slices


## Directions

1. In a small bowl, mix cheddar cheese, cream cheese, parsley and 1 teaspoon mustard. In another bowl, mix green onions, bread crumbs, ketchup, seasonings and remaining mustard. Add beef; mix lightly but thoroughly. 2. Shape mixture into 8 thin patties. Spoon cheese mixture onto the center of 4 patties; top with remaining patties, pressing edges firmly to seal.
2. Grill burgers, covered, over medium heat or broil 4 in. from heat until a thermometer reads $160^{\circ}, 4-5$ minutes on each side. Serve on buns with toppings as desired.

## LASAGNA SOUP

## 8 SERVINGS

## Ingredients

- 1 pound lean ground beef (90\% lean)
- 1 large green pepper, chopped
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 cans (14-1/2 ounces each)
 diced tomatoes, undrained
- 2 cans (14-1/2 ounces each) reduced-sodium beef broth
- 1 can (8 ounces) tomato sauce
- 1 cup frozen corn
- 1/4 cup tomato paste
- 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 2-1/2 cups uncooked spiral pasta
- 1/2 cup shredded Parmesan cheese


## Directions

1. In a large saucepan, cook beef, green pepper and onion over medium heat 6-8 minutes or until meat is no longer pink, breaking up beef into crumbles. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Drain.

## TACO CORNBREAD

8 SERVINGS

## Ingredients

- 2 pounds ground beef
- 2 envelopes taco seasoning
- 2 cans (14-1/2 ounces each) diced tomatoes, drained
- 1 cup water
- 1 cup cooked rice
- 1 can (4 ounces) chopped green chiles
- 2 packages (8-1/2 ounces each) cornbread/ muffin mix
- 1 can (8-3/4 ounces) whole kernel corn, drained
- 1 cup sour cream
- 2 cups corn chips
- 2 cups shredded Mexican cheese blend or cheddar cheese, divided
- 1 can (2-1/4 ounces) sliced ripe olives, drained
- Optional: Shredded lettuce, chopped tomatoes and chopped red onion


## Directions

1. Preheat oven to $400^{\circ}$. In a Dutch oven, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink, 8-10 minutes, breaking it into crumbles; drain. Stir in taco seasoning. Add tomatoes, water, rice and green chiles; heat through, stirring occasionally. 2. Meanwhile, prepare cornbread mix according to package directions; stir in corn. Pour half the batter into a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. Layer with half the meat mixture, all the sour cream, half the corn chips and 1 cup cheese. Top with remaining batter, remaining meat mixture and olives.
2. Bake, uncovered, until cornbread is cooked through, 55-60 minutes. Sprinkle with remaining 1 cup corn chips and 1 cup cheese; bake until cheese is melted, 3-5 minutes longer. If desired, serve with lettuce, tomatoes and red onion.

## SOUTHWESTERN GOULASH

## 6 SERVINGS

## Ingredients

1 cup uncooked elbow macaroni
1 pound lean ground beef ( $90 \%$ lean)
1 medium onion, chopped
1 can (28 ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained
1 can (8 ounces) tomato sauce
2/3 cup frozen corn
1 can (4 ounces) chopped green chiles
$1 / 2$ teaspoon ground cumin
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 cup minced fresh cilantro

## Directions

1. Cook macaroni according to package directions; drain. Meanwhile, in a 6-qt. stockpot, cook and crumble beef with onion over medium heat until meat is no longer pink, 6-8 minutes; drain.
2. Stir in tomatoes, tomato sauce, corn, chiles and dry seasonings; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, until flavors are blended, about 5 minutes. Stir in macaroni and cilantro.

## SLOPPY JOE PIZZA

2 PIZZAS 8 SLICES EACH

## Ingredients

- 2 tubes (13.8 ounces each) refrigerated pizza crust
- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 can (15-1/2 ounces) sloppy joe sauce
- 2 cups shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- $1 / 2$ cup grated Parmesan



## Directions

1. Unroll pizza dough; place on two greased 12-in. pizza pans. Bake at $425^{\circ}$ for $6-7$ minutes or until golden brown.
2. In a large skillet, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink; drain. Add sloppy joe sauce. Spread over crusts. Sprinkle with cheeses. Bake at $425^{\circ}$ for 6-8 minutes or until cheese is melted.

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## CLAYBANK MASTER GARDENERS

Greetings Gardener Friends,

## **Check out the fresh new look of the rose garden next to the Holman

House. The Claybank Master Gardeners have fertilized and mulched around the roses by the fountain and benches so stop by and take a breather.


## **Also drop by the pollinator garden at Vivian

B. Adams School. The Claybank Master Gardeners were invited to set up one up a couple months ago, so we began preparing the soil, choosing the plants, mulching with pine straw and it's beginning to look terrific.
**Now that our infamous Alabama heat and humidity is upon us, remember your outdoor plants will need frequent watering to stay healthy, just like us humans. Leaves may turn yellow, droop or curl up when they are thirsty. Try to avoid wetting the leaves, and water the soil just below the leaves early in the day to avoid viral and fungal diseases. Drip irrigation is the most efficient and water-saving method for large garden areas. If you have an automatic sprinkler system water early in the morning before the sun gets high to give the leaves time to dry off before evening.

Mulching the soil with pine straw or leaves also helps to keep the root systems hydrated and cooler. As our weather gets really HOT you may find that keeping most plants in areas of partial shade or afternoon shade will help them thrive. In temperatures above $85^{\circ}$ most tomato plants will not even set new fruit.
