Each middle school student is paired with a patient at Rocky Knoll Healthcare Center.



The Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Middle School District's "Adopt-A-Buddy Program" helps 7th graders build communication skills while supporting the socialemotional development of both students and residents at Rocky Knoll Healthcare Center. For more than twenty years, the ELMS has partnered with the Rocky Knoll Healthcare Center to provide its seventhgrade students with service learning opportunities that help them succeed Buddy visits help students gain a sense of purpose and connection while writing and visiting their buddies. The Rocky Knoll Healthcare Center benefits from the program by receiving visits from enthusiastic and caring students, which definitely has a positive impact on the Rocky Knoll Healthcare Center.

There was a transportation barrier for the cost of school buses transporting

students for the program. While Rocky Knoll Health Care Center is close to the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Middle School, a bus is needed to transport students. Transportation costs have been a barrier to the success of the program. The ElkhartCares grant will be used to pay for students' transportation costs from Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Middle School to the Rocky Knoll Healthcare Center via school buses. This will enable the continuation of the "Buddy Program", and help spread joy to the patients at Rocky Knoll.

The Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah School District has a mission to challenge, inspire, and empower its students. One way they do this is through the Elkhart Lake Glenbeulah Middle School District's Adopta-Buddy Program. What makes the Buddy Program unique is its ability to bring together young adolescents and elderly residents to meet each other's cognitive and social needs. This intergenerational partnership helps the students succeed academically, and builds a stronger sense of community connection. The adopt-a-buddy program is a win-win for students and elderly residents. Not only do the middle schoolers get to develop their communication skills and socialemotional development, but they also have the opportunity to impact the lives of their adopted buddies in a positive and caring way. Buddy visits have been shown to develop empathy, a sense of purpose, and social skills in students.

Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Middle School hasn't been able to visit their buddies in recent years due to the pandemic. The students are excited to reconnect with



It is located on the corner of Lincoln and Chicago Street (Wisconsin Highway 67). The address is 185 Chicago Street Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin 53020. This Memorial park is a park which features a beautiful tribute to the men and women of the Elkhart lake area who have served in the

of this memorial is a stone wall which has an eagle at the top and below the eagle there is an engraved sign which reads "Dedicated to Men and Women of Elkhart Lake who have served their Country in the Armed Forces". There are six circle inscriptions engraved in the wall. The inscriptions are as follows: United States Army, United States Coast Guard, United States Navy, United States Marine Corps, United States Merchant Marine and United States Air Force. At this site, you will see three flags that fly. The tallest one which is in the center is the United States of America flag, the one on the left is POW

armed forces of our great nation. The back MIA flag and the one on the right is the flag of our State of Wisconsin. There are three benches there as well to sit down and honor your loved ones. There are bricks in front of the benches with names of some of the ones who have served our country. It is a Memorial that was erected by the Elkhart Lake Lions Club and donors. This park was dedicated on May 26, 2007. This is a historical landmark and memorial. It is a beautiful site to pay tribute to our servicemen and servicewomen. A BIG "Thank you" to all those that served or are serving our nation.


ELG Students Sign National Letters of Intent





Elkhart Lake Study Club Celebrates 100 Years



This year marks the 100th anniversary of the Elkhart Lake Study Club started in the fall of 1923 by fourteen women who met in homes twice a month. Dues were 50 cents per year, and their purpose was intellectual improvement and service to the community. And serve they did! A hundred years of Study Club projects included the first library, then located on East Street, which they bought, furnished, supplied books and manned several times a week, a thrift shop at 41 E. Rhine Street (now the Chamber office), purchase of land for the Civic Center and adjoining park, sponsorship of PTA, sponsorship of a Girl Scout Troop, 4-H, activities for Wood

Hospital veterans, an annual scholarship for a high school senior, and donations to many, many worthwhile causes such as the Red Cross and the March of Dimes. Members donated time and money to the war effort during both World War II and the Cold War. These and many other philanthropic deeds were accomplished through some very creative endeavors that entertained the community and the members while bringing money into the coffers. Watch for more about this in a future article.

Meanwhile, intellectual improvement of the members was not forgotten but was thriving with speakers at monthly meetings lecturing on gardening and authors, climate and health issues, fire safety and birdwatching. There were field trips to museums, farms and factories. Bridge clubs were started for beginners and continuing players.

The Elkhart Lake Study Club has been and continues to be an asset to the community and should be celebrated in its 100th year. Members will be walking and riding in the Firemen's Parade on July 2nd. Let's give a cheer as they go by!







The basement was a creative space for the DeBruin family of New Holstein. It was where they created and bound their book of poems and stories written by friends and family, including "Bernadette Plants A Garden." According to DeBruin, her mother Stacey modeled the story after her. The book didn't have any illustrations though DeBruin loved drawing and thought it would be "so incredibly cool" to illustrate it. little revisions and I was so happy that my dream of being an illustrator finally was seeming realistic!" DeBruin says with pride. "It was such an incredible experience when I held the finished book and could page through something real that I had a hand in creating!"

The Path to Business Owner

Bernadette & Bear is another result of DeBruin's exploration of the arts. In 2021 she started the screen-printing business in her family's garage. According to DeBruin, it has grown into "more of an all things graphic design" business. She says she enjoys growing her skillset through her business and college courses, oftentimes learning something during her coursework that she then applies to her business.

"I still love screen-printing clothing for people as one of my favorite things, but I also really enjoy when I can hand draw something for someone that is entirely unique, or make and design something cool, or even work with photos and videos on occasion," says DeBruin.

Preparing for a Career

DeBruin says she chose to focus on graphic arts and web design for a career because she always wanted to turn artwork, especially her own, into something she could produce, print, or develop into something she could share with others. She knew she wanted to learn in person somewhere she could become part of a community and make new friends. After looking into different graphics programs, DeBruin says Lakeshore's program won her over.

Friendships have developed through her membership in the Makers Club, a student club she joined shortly after it started in the fall of 2022. "I have learned a lot about things like 3D printing, laser cutting, injection molding, and more," she says.

In addition to her involvement in the Makers Club, DeBruin is a member of Lakeshore's Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society and InterVarsity Christian Fellowship.

DeBruin is set to graduate from Lakeshore on May 20. She says she's excited to take all she has learned and apply it to her business. She may also look for a job to gain experience while growing her business. It's also possible she may further her education someday. She may illustrate future books. "I like to keep my options open," says DeBruin.

May 27 Season Opening at Wade House



Marvel at unique, horse-drawn carriages and feel the heat of the forge at a handson blacksmithing workshop

Wade House, a Wisconsin Historical Society site, is excited to announce a May 27 opening of the regular season as well as a robust calendar of upcoming events. The expansive, 240-acre site includes an 1850s stagecoach inn that once served travelers of the Sheboygan & Fond du Lac plank road, an active blacksmith shop, a working water-powered sawmill with a rare up-and-down Muley saw, and a vast collection of impeccably preserved carriages on display in the Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum. Visitors to Wade House experience aspects of everyday life in 19th century Wisconsin before railroads and automobiles transformed the landscape. One of the things that make Wade House special is the promise of a horse-drawn vehicle ride for every visitor from the visitor center to the historic area of the site, reinforcing the site's major theme of the horse-powered economy of the 19th century.

The regular season begins on May 27 and ends on Nov. 4, 2023. Wade House is open Wednesday through Sunday from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. General admission for adults is \$15, \$13 for seniors, \$8 for children, and free for children under five. Wisconsin Historical Society members receive free general admission and 10 percent off ticketed events.

Upcoming Events:

Blacksmithing Workshops - June 10 & 17, Aug. 12 & 19, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Discover the old-world art of blacksmithing at a series of interactive workshops. Strike while the iron is hot, hear the "clang" of the hammer and feel the heat from the forge as you craft your own project. Workshops alternate between a focus on knife-making, camping gear, or basic blacksmithing. Participants must be age 13 or older and advance registration is required. Lunch is included in the ticket price. Cost is \$225 per person.

Into the Wilderness Overnight Adventure for Adults - June 24-25, 9 a.m. to 9 a.m.

Join Wade House for an overnight camping adventure on the Wade House grounds just for grown-ups. This 24hour experience is packed with activities like learning to build and cook over a



Feel the footfalls of the horses hitched to antique, reproduced and modern carriages as they compete for a coveted blue ribbon in Wade House's brand-new horse arena. The event will consist of three competitions – Dressage, Cones Course and a Cross Country Drive – which will showcase the versatility, training, and talents of both horse and driver. Enjoy the action up-close as the horses show off their different gaits at the subtle command of their drivers. In addition to enjoying the outdoor excitement, guests may access the Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum, home to Wisconsin's largest collection of carriages and wagons. This event will occur rain or shine and concessions will be available for purchase. Tickets are \$17 for adults and teens, \$15 for seniors, \$8.50 for children, and children under 5 are free.



About Wade House

Located in Greenbush, Wisconsin, Wade House is a historic stagecoach inn that was operated in the 1850s to serve traffic along the plank road connecting Fond du Lac and Sheboygan. The site tells the story of frontier entrepreneur Sylvanus Wade and his family during the 1850s in Greenbush. In addition to the inn, the historic site includes the Herrling sawmill, one of the few working, water-powered sawmills of its kind in the nation, as well as the Dockstader blacksmith shop. Wade House is also home to a visitor center with orientation exhibits, gift shop and meeting rooms and the Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum, which houses the state's largest collection of antique carriages and working wagons.

100 Big Number This Season at Quit Qui Oc

For some golfers, 100 is a number they like to stay under for 18 holes.

At Quit Qui Oc Golf Club in Elkhart Lake, 100 is a number they are going over this year as the business celebrates its centennial year in 2023.

Todd and Rachel Montaba are the current owners of the business, carrying on a family tradition which has spanned over half of those 100 years of Quit Qui Oc. Rachel said, "Todd and I are very proud of this business to still be here after 100 years. We're proud of the friends we've made along the way."

The owners and their employees are doing a number of things this year to help celebrate the centennial. They have 100year anniversary merchandise for sale including shirts and hats, and they have a drink special in the clubhouse created just for the centennial.

Anyone who golfs, dines or visits Quit Qui Oc can put their name in to win a \$100 gift card with Quit Qui Oc matching that amount to one of several area charities. Those drawings will take place once or twice per month during the current golf season.

There is also a strong emphasis on recounting the history of the golf course, something which is being done with weekly postings on Facebook and Instagram. It is an interesting history filled with important moments, and here are some of those highlights:

M. E. Wittkopp, Henry Ross and G. W. Brickbauer. Capital stock of \$30,000-300 shares at \$100/share—were sold.

Jan. 3, 1923—Quit Qui Oc Golf Club purchased a 74-acre farm in the village of Elkhart Lake from Edward Wolf.

May 12, 1923—Tom Bendelow, the golf course architect from Chicago, was in Elkhart Lake for two days and laid out the golf course.

June 13, 1923-Quit Qui Oc Golf Club secured the services of Ernest Killick to serve as golf professional. He was previously employed in Florida.


Sunday, July 1, 1923-Quit Qui Oc Golf Club opened for play. Attorney M. C. Snead was the opening day speaker. The course was a nine-hole course.

April 26, 1924—The course was reorganized as a nonstock/nonprofit organization. Forming the corporation were Louis Laun, Lester Laun, Herman Siebken, Joseph P. Wink, Chas. Goldammer, all of Elkhart Lake.

1924 to 1929—Sometime between 1924 and 1929 Quit Qui Oc Golf Club was expanded to an 18-hole golf course. Ernest Killick is credited with the design of the back nine.

April 1939—Ed Leverenz is hired to manage Quit-Qui-Oc Golf Club.

March 28, 1940—Leverenz purchases the golf course from the Wolf estate. He had leased the course the previous year with the option to buy.

Oct. 7, 1922—It is announced that the War years—At some point the 18-hole Elkhart Lake Men's Association is course reverted back a 9-hole course, planning on starting a golf course in the featuring the original 9 holes. It is believed that during World War II with fewer people playing golf that the irrigation metal was sold for scrap and the land sold off as well.

powered golf car he nicknamed "Birdie." Powered by a five hp motor the vehicle had speeds of two to seven miles per hour. Leverenz called it "a golfer's dream" as it was low powered so as not to mar the fairways yet had enough power to make any hills on the course. He built the car because of a leg injury and believed that there were many golfers who would benefit from a golf car.

March 1955—It was announced that Carl J. Wiese, former vice president of Plymouth Industrial Products Inc., had purchased Quit Qui Oc Golf Club from Leverenz. Wiese is Rachel Montaba's grandfather.

Early 1960s—The back nine was designed and built. In an interesting tidbit, Wolf Excavating did a great deal of the shaping of the back nine holes. They were the sons of Edward Wolf whose farm became QQO. The back nine opened in 1961.

1971—The Quit-Qui-Oc Golf Club Men's Club was established for the betterment of the game. A full schedule of events including a Club Championship—was scheduled.

Jan. 1, 1977—Carl Wiese passed away unexpectedly at his home of an apparent heart attack. His son and daughter-inlaw, Tom and Lynn Wiese, took over operations of the club.

1977—The back nine saw a few changes. The par-3 10th hole was turned into a practice area and range, the 11th hole was modified and became the 10th hole. An uphill par 3 was added that became the new 14th hole and the subsequent holes were renumbered.

Early 1980s—The clubhouse has a screened-in porch around the bar. This area was enclosed, more than doubling the bar seating and creating the horseshoe bar.

Early 1990s—A land Development the Highlands at Quit Qui Oc-was established. The Highlands consisted of 35 lots that weave through the area that would become the Glacial Nine.

1993—The pro shop was expanded. This added 300 feet of floor space, additional storage and a desk for the head professional.

2000—Bob Lohman Golf Design was hired to design and build the Glacial Nine. Construction started in the middle of the 2000 golf season and continued into 2001. In addition to the nine holes that would become the Glacial Nine, Lohman's company redesigned the par-3 16th hole into a par-4 dogleg and redesigned the 17th green. The Glacial Nine opened for play on Sept. 13, 2001.

January 2010—Tom and Lynn's oldest daughter Rachel and her husband Todd purchased the golf course from Rachel's parents, making them the third generation of the Wiese family to own and operate the golf course.

"We're excited that our business is doing really well," Rachel said, crediting the course supervisor, chef, bar manager, wait staff, pro shop staff and all employees for contributing to that success. "They work hard," she said.

Montaba said she thinks it is interesting that the front nine greens (with the exception of #4) are the original greens that were played in 1923. What is now the first hole was actually two holes originally. Hole #1 was a 340-yard par 4 and the second hole was a 150-yard par 3. The current #2 green would have been the old #2 green. When the first hole went from a par 4 to a par 5 the current fourth hole was added. This change happened



The prices of the passes is \$5 for residents and \$40 for school district residents, which are good for an even and odd year (this is the second year of the beach pass, so if you had one last year no need to get a new one this year). > If you are planning a construction project on your home or business, you must apply for a building permit. Permits must be issued prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

VILLAGE-WIDE REVALUATION

Property owners should be receiving their letters for their new assessments due to the revaluation. The Village has not completed a revaluation since 2008. We were out of compliance with State Statutes and needed to complete a revaluation. If you have questions on the value, we request that you call Grota Appraisals at 262-253-1142. The open book is scheduled for June 13th, 2023 from 9 am until noon and 1 pm – 4 pm. It is recommended that you call 262-253-1142 to reserve a specific time for open book or you can email jodi.paulson@ catalisgov.com for questions for to schedule an appointment. The Board of Review will be held on July 19th from 5 – 7 pm. Property values are increasing an average of 42%, but lake properties are seeing larger increases. Even though your property value may increase that does not automatically mean taxes will increase. The levy limit for the Village still remains the same.

PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATE

The Planning Commission continues meeting about the General Capital and Van Horn Development on the apartment and townhouse development on the old County property along Highway 67. At their last meeting they went through the rezoning for the Van Horn property as well as the conditional use permits for both developments. They recommended a conditional use permit with many conditions to public hearing. This public hearing will be held at 5:45 pm before the Village Board meeting on June 19th. The Village is working on drafts of the development agreements. If you are interested in learning more about the projects the next Planning Commission meeting is scheduled for June 14th.

The Planning Commission has also been busy with other projects. They continue to review building permits for properties zoned commercial and manufacturing. Recently they have approved renovations at Kees Manufcaturing, Gessert's garage, 111 E. Rhine Street, and a few others. They have also approved renovation plans for Harry's Vino e Pizza. Sign permits have also been issued for Harry's Vino e Pizza and Gifts of Grace. We welcome both businesses to the Village and can't wait to check them out this summer.

PROPOSED NOISE ORDINANCE CHANGES

The Village is proposing some changes to the noise ordinance. These changes only effect the stationary noise limits. These changes do not pertain to other areas of the ordinance which address noise from construction, lawn maintenance activities, snow blowing, and other non-construction maintenance equipment. The proposed revisions also provide an exemption to the Sunday noise limits. The Board will take up this issue at their meeting on June 5th. The proposed noise ordinance changes are as follows:

Chamber Welcomes Dogs2DogTags

Running completely on donations, and saving two lives with one mission, is



Dogs 2 Dog Tags at 4715 CTH M, Plymouth as they save veterans one dog at a time.

Since D2DT began in 2016, the organization has placed 32 dogs with veterans suffering from Post Traumatic Stress or a military sexual trauma.

Torre Willadsen President and Founder spent many year's in Hunt Test, Field Trials with several of the best trainers in the country, all from Wisconsin. The national level training experience put me in place for getting a position with a Department of Defense contracting program (DOD) Willadsen said. My experience with DEA, FBI and national certifications in explosive and drug search dogs, training team's both military and civilian handlers turned into the mission of dogs2dogtags.

Willadsen worked as a civilian contractor who was deployed to Afghanistan with the 7th Marines, training their handlers and bomb-sniffing dogs. While overseas, one of his Marine Corps handlers lost both legs in a night patrol in an IED attack while on that patrol. Willadsen watched his handlers deployment dog help him through dark moments in his life, and also noticed when he returned home many of the Marines he worked with throughout the Battalion were taking their own lives.

"Nineteen veterans a day will commit suicide, If you have a full banquet hall with 190 people, it will be empty in a matter of 10 days. We are working to stop that.

Working with rescued dogs from various humane societies and rescues D2DT is affiliated with, D2DT are notified by the shelters if they have a dog they think is a good match, which is when D2DT will come and evaluate the dog. D2DT does not use dogs that are aggressive or have a bite history.

Training time for the potential service dogs vary, ranging from 3-4 months to 1-1 ½ years. Their training begins with basic obedience, along with several other items dogs are able to do in regards to PTS such as blocking and alert when the veteran is about to have a panic attack and can help lessen panic attacks.

According to Willadsen 70 percent of dogs being trained to be a service dog fail industry-wide; however, D2DT is able to make dogs that do not pass as service dogs to emotional support animals. "They (emotional support animals) do a lot of the same things, but they cannot go into stores or restaurants. They're then for that veteran, Willadsen says Once the dogs are placed with a veteran, the veterans are given what is needed; crates, leashes and bowls. D2DT will also cover food for one year and covers veterinary costs for the life of the dog. When 2020 hit, a lot of veterans reached out to them saying, "can I give you my dog because I can't afford it?" Because of this, D2DT started the Laika's Fund, which was named in honor of their founding dog, Laika. Laika was a Military Working Dog Willadsen had trained on her 3rd and final tour with the Army TEDD program. Willadsen adopted Laika after her last tour and she became the Dogs2DogTags matriarch of the program, raising 12 of the 1st dogs placed in the program. Veterans can apply for the grant—whether or not the service dog was from their organization or not—so they do not have to worry about their financial situation. Thanks to the Laika's Fund, D2DT has spent \$11,000 to assist veterans.

Willadsen also noticed a number of vetrans dogs that were being brought in during training sessions were not immunized. Veterinary offices can be a high-stress situation with various noises like barking or shouting. As part of a capital campaign, D2DT is hoping to expand on their 10-acres of land, adding a small veterinary clinic specifically for routine immunizations. With the small clinic, D2DT is hoping to create a lowstress place for veterans to bring their service/emotional support dogs.

Willadsen said they are hoping to also add a serenity garden as a quiet place for veterans alongside the trails on their land. D2DT also wants to add 12 kennels which they hope will help double the number of dogs placed with veterans, if not more.






