

The Ups and Downs of Empty Nest

A few months ago, I said I would talk a little about empty nest. Well here it goes. I'm in a strange but exciting place in my life right now. While those last few years of high school with my boy were rough, they are already long gone. He's 19 now and leaving this week for another travel adventure; this time Colorado! My daughters will be turning 26 and 22, and my granddaughter is already a yearand-a-half old! Wow...I didn't see this

But how could I not? I suppose I was so busy raising them, and some days just surviving, that I never realized one day they would be all grown up. I heard someone say, when you hear people tell you, "Enjoy it, because it goes by fast", they don't just mean stay in the present and appreciate it. What they really mean is, it's gone in the blink of an eye (just like that Kenny Chesney song). I'd like to claim that someone didn't tell me about how this whole thing would go down, but I'm sure they did. I probably wasn't listening.

I imagine Empty Nest is different for every parent. For me, it's bittersweet. Some days I pinch myself and say, "Phew we made it! I'm done!", other days I cry a little because I miss it. It has taken some getting used to. No longer a taxi, but also not certain of their whereabouts (or safety). Finally done with constant chatter and surprise cannon balls on my bed while I do my makeup, but sometimes a bit lonely sitting there at my vanity in the quiet. No longer tied to varying kids' schedules, but sort of lost in the beginning with the extra time. Even with them entering adulthood at different stages due to the age gaps, it's still been an adjustment. I guess that's to be expected.

I find the most difficult part of parenting now is that I have less control than I did before. When you have human beings walking around outside your body who have feelings, needs, dreams, and desires, but you have absolutely no control...it's like hanging off a cliff. Under-



standing what makes my kids tick after spending so much time and so many years with them...but watching them go through something challenging that I can't do anything about...? It's like no other experience as a parent.

When they were little, sure it was hard watching one of my children get hurt or be disappointed, but I could help. Even if they were too young to have the language capacity to explain what was wrong, I at least had an idea of what to do. A change started happening when they were teens. They sometimes didn't know how (or want) to explain issues. Mom was still there, available on the daily, but they'd need to handle it for the most part. Now that they are adults...it's all out of my hands completely. The only one responsible for them now is themselves. I stand by as they 'adult'. I stay on the sidelines, and unless they ask for guidance, I'm just a spectator. I make myself available, but ultimately I'm observing and loving them from a distance.

I now live for random happy texts or calls from them. Hearing how excited they are to share something they accomplished, I relish in the moments, even the small ones. Like one of them exclaiming their credit score went up by x amount of points, or that they appreciate how I taught them to open mail because "it's easier than how they do it", lol, or they got a full night's sleep. Those things might not seem big, but after decades of being present at the end of each day to

Enjoy Creating Memories & More at Busy Bees Pottery & Arts Studio

Busy Bees Pottery & Arts Studio, located in the Great Lakes Mall, is buzzing with activity seven days a week. From nurturing your little one's creativity without making a mess in your house, to sipping a Syrah with friends while painting a platter, the multi-medium studio allows both budding and accomplished artists of all ages to release their inner Rembrandt.

"Busy Bees goal is to be a destination to forget the stresses of the day, week, life and lose yourself in the creative process. It's the experience that provides the benefit and enjoyment; spending time with your family, friends or for that much needed "me" time. This isn't about creating a museum quality masterpiece, this is "fun" art, not "fine" art." says owner Beth Brinton. "I tell people to come in, relax and enjoy the process. You don't have to have artistic ability. Just the desire to have fun and explore."

The studio, which recently celebrated its sixth anniversary caters to children and

adults and offers open studio times as well as instructor-led programs.

During Toddler Times, Busy Bees Art Instructors read a story and guide youngsters (along with their parent or caregiver) through a corresponding art project.

School-age children can choose among art classes and camps held during evenings, weekends and school vacations. Children's activities occur in the studio or offsite at schools, daycares or other locations. Among the keepsake projects offered are clay projects or pottery involving handprints, fingerprints, and footprints.

The 2022 Summer Art Camp schedule is now available. Parents can register children for one or up to eight different weeklong camps. "We work with various mediums to create projects based on the campers' likes and passions," Brinton explains. Campers create with clay, pottery, glass, mosaics, canvas and more.

Looking for an activity for the entire family? Family workshops allow parents and kids to collaborate on projects, such as painting a canvas, sculpting a clay object or painting a ceramic piece. It's a great alternative to screen time and get the family together for an activity and conversation, a great way to create family memories.

Grown-ups need their creative time too, away from the kids, work, or school. For those occasions, Busy Bees Pottery & Arts Studio hosts Adult Workshops, Ladies' Nights Out, bachelorette parties, baby showers and other events. A party room is available for rent. Guests 21 and over are permitted to bring and enjoy adult beverages (BYOB).

Guests may create projects using a variety of every-changing mediums and techniques. Among them are mosaics, canvas painting, glass fusing, clay hand building, wine glass painting and candle making. The studio offers more than 200 different pottery pieces to paint, from kids' figurines to coffee mugs and serving bowls. Artistically challenged individuals needn't be scared away. "We have stencils, stamps, stickers, silk screens and all kinds of different tricks and tools they can use to enhance their design," Brinton says.
