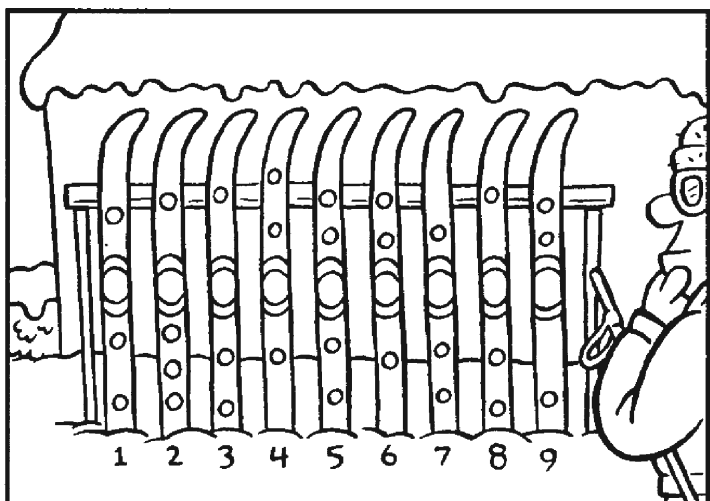
Solution -- Weirdly can travel fewer miles to reach the town by flying in a straight line. Slylock's drive has twists and turns that add additional miles to the trip.
