



"unlimited everything" I was paying for premium cell service. You probably don't, either. So, I wrote an article a few weeks ago detailing my plunge into cheaper waters by switching to Consumer

## **SECRETS AND GOOGLE FI**

by "The Computer Skeptic"

Cellular. I'd like to share with you why I changed to them, then why I switched again to Google Fi.

A quick summary from the last article is that cellular service is dominated by "the Big Three" carriers:: Verizon, AT&T, and T-Mobile. These companies lease some of their excess bandwidth to smaller companies who then resell "cheap" cell service. Companies like Mint Mobile, Consumer Cellular, Xfinity, and Walmart's "Family Talk" are called mobile virtual network operators, or MVNOs.

I had been paying \$65 per month for cell service from T-Mobile. I was satisfied with them for years but can no longer justify the monthly cost for the number of phone calls I make and the amount of data I use. A friend recommended I take a look at Consumer Cellular. I decided on their \$25 per month plan and pondered how I was going to spend the \$480 per year savings. Well, that relationship didn't last long. Shortly after switching to Consumer Cellular (which uses AT&T towers), I traveled to Birmingham for a couple

of days where I experienced far too many "no signal" and slow download speeds. I may be retired but I still don't have all day to wait on a phone to do what I say! So I decided to try Google Fi.

I think this relationship is going to work out nicely. Google Fi works much like the other MVNOs in they use T-Mobile towers exclusively and T-Mobile's coverage map is superior to AT&T and Verizon. One important difference is that Google Fi is not subject to 'deprioritization" (slowing down in crowded areas) like the other cheap providers. I signed up for the "Flexible" plan where I only pay for what I need. According to my usage history with T-Mobile, I almost always use 1 or 2GB per month. The \$20/mo Flexible plan includes 1 GB

of data, unlimited calls, and texts, and if I use more than 1 GB, I simply pay an extra \$10 per GB. If I use over 6GB somehow, any additional data over that is free. So, I'll probably generally pay \$40 per month for excellent wireless service but no more than \$60 if I use lots of data.

I've been with the service for a couple of weeks and so far so good.. I'll be traveling much more so I'll keep this saga updated as necessary.

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If you are qualifying for Medicare by turning 65 you will have a 7 month window to enroll in Medicare. This window is based off of the month you turn 65. It starts 3 months prior to the month you turn 65 and extends 3 months past the month you turn 65. For example, if you are turning 65 in September your IEP begins in June and extends all the way through the month of December. If you are eligible, you may not have to pay a premium for Part A, but Part B will have a premium.

For those electing to sign up for Part B after their IEP a late-enrollment penalty may be assessed. This penalty can last as long as you have Part B and there may be a gap in your health coverage. However, one exception to this rule is being employed and having coverage through your company's group health plan. If this applies to you check with your benefit coordinator, Medicare or contact our office.

In most cases, if you are already drawing your Social Security or Railroad Retirement Board benefits you should automatically be signed up for Part A and Part B. If you are not drawing your Social Security or RRB benefits and want to sign up for Medicare you can do so by signing up online at ssa.gov, visit your local Social Security office or give our office a call and we can help direct you.



"Justice" was not always as fair. Early attempts at justice were often cruel. As far back as 1000 B.C., ancient societies, and later the church, conducted "trial by ordeal": Hot irons, boiling water, and dunking the accused in cold water were used to determine guilt or innocence. Often, simply surviving the ordeal was considered "proof that the accused was not guilty.

Today's jury system evolved from ancient Greece where, about 400 B.C., governors of Athens asked males over 30 to hear the arguments of alleged wrongdoers. As Aristotle

explained it, these men were counseled to apply their understanding of "general justice," not to interpret the law.

Juries express the voice of the population, and that voice can be a powerful force for change. A handful of English barons recognized this when, in 1215, they put a sword to the throat of King John and forced him to sign the Magna Carta. On the grassy plain of Runnymede, the barons received many freedoms, including the right to a trial by their equals, not by the king.

Four centuries later, William Penn was charged with unlawful assembly. Refusing to find him guilty of that charge, his jury was imprisoned and denied food and water. Jury members still refused to convict him. Penn went on to lead the cause of justice in the New World and to found the State of Pennsylvania.

Later, trial by jury was considered an essential right by early Americans. British attempts to deny colonists this right turned out to be a serious mistake. The colonists responded with the bold "Declaration of Causes and Necessities for Taking Up Arms." The Declaration of Independence and the Sixth and Seventh Amendments to the United States Constitution later reaffirmed the right to an impartial jury of fellow citizens, a cornerstone of democracy today.

Juries are the "collective conscience" of our communities. Comprised of our neighbors, friends and relatives, juries call upon our sound judgment and character to decide what is the truth and what is fair compensation for those who have been wronged. Juries bring an openness to the courtroom. And, unlike other institutions, juries have no ambition. They want nothing for themselves, they seek only to find the truth.

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It's only a common fender bender, but all parties involved should know what to do. On many typical weekends, parking lots at malls and supermarkets are packed, increasing the possibility of a fender bender and door dings on your car, truck or SUV.

If you hit, scrape or otherwise damage a parked car or if you're the victim of such an accident — don't panic. Here are some simple steps you can take:

#### What to do when you hit someone's car in a parking lot

- Don't drive away from the scene of the accident, no matter how minor.
- Track down the other car's owner. Head into the store and speak to someone at the customer service desk.
- **Leave a note.** If you're unable to learn the other driver, jot down basic information — your name, phone number and a brief explanation of the accident.
- Call the police (if necessary).

#### What to do if someone hits your car in a parking lot

- Contact your insurance agent. Let him or her know what happened as soon as possible.
- **Record evidence.** Take pictures of the damage with your phone or a camera, if you have one on hand.
- **Take thorough notes.** If the other driver is still around, jot down his or her name, address, phone number, driver's license number and insurance company. Gather as much information as possible.

Provide assistance. If the offending driver is gone, help the other driver document the damage. Give the driver your contact information, in case his or her insurance agent or the police need to contact you for further





Dear Dave,

Should I cash in my 401(k) to pay off my car? I have just enough in the account to pay off the car and free up money in my budget.

Dear Marina,

If I were in your shoes, and I could pay off the car in 18 months or less, I'd live on rice and beans—plus a very strict monthly budget—and just push through until that car payment was out of my life. If that wasn't realistic, then I'd take out ads online and in the local paper, and sell the car as fast as possible.

Cashing out vour retirement plan to make this happen isn't a good idea. I love that you want to get rid of your car payment, but if you use your 401(k) they'll charge you a 10% penalty, plus your tax rate. That means you'll lose anywhere from 30 to 50 percent of it to the government.

I don't know about you, Marina, but I think those guys get way too much of our money already!

#### **NO SECOND MORTGAGE!**

Dear Dave, My husband was recently told layoffs are about to happen at his company, and that it might be a good idea for him to start looking for another job. He has found a couple of good possibilities, but the jobs are located 100 miles away. We've got about \$4,000 in savings, but the agent said remodeling would take between \$2,500 and \$3,000. Should we get a second mortgage to pay

My advice is to wait and see how the whole job situation plays out before making any big decisions. Then if you end up selling the house and moving, you might take \$500 or so from savings to freshen up the kitchen a little bit.

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


