Piedmont Pets

Many years ago, our cat adoption policy was changed to require cats adopted from us to be kept strictly inside. We received criticism about it, but now most shelters require the same thing. It is vital to keep cats inside. Outside cats face many dangers, and their life expectancy is 1-5 years. A cat kept strictly inside has an average life expectancy of 12-18 years. Contact with other cats outside leads to the risk of disease transmission. Feline leukemia and feline immunodeficiency are transmitted from cat to cat and, once contracted, result in the eventual death of the animal. Dogs and other wild animals pose a threat to cats; the very real danger is one of exposure to rabies. Outdoor cats can suffer torn ears, cut eyes, abscesses, and other injuries requiring veterinary treatment. Indoor cats are not generally exposed to fleas, ticks, ear mites, or other parasites that can cause anemia, skin irritations, allergic reactions, and even death. Outdoor cats are at risk to be poisoned. Neighbors may deliberately poison cats they view as nuisances, but accidental poisonings also occur. Chemically treated lawns, bait left out to kill rats or mice, and antifreeze can all be deadly dangers. It is a myth that cats are "streetwise." Cats are intelligent and alert, but they stand very little chance against traffic. We can tell horror stories, and even have the pictures, of outside cats that have been beheaded, scalped, electrocuted, burned, tortured, or starved. A dogfighting investigation seminar I

attended a couple of years ago showed actual video of cats and kittens being used to train dogs to kill. Trees also present hazards for the outside cat. Dogs or loud noises can scare a cat to climb so high, they cannot get down. I have heard repeatedly that a cat can climb down a tree. The reality is, cats cannot easily climb down facing the ground, and they usually do not back down out of a tree. We have had to intervene countless times to get them out of trees. We have also had to rescue countless cats (kittens, mostly) from the engines of cars. Some survive, and some do not. The list of hazards for outside cats goes on and on. Outside cats are at the mercy of the people they encounter, as well as weather conditions and other animals. We encourage everyone to keep their cats inside. It truly is the best life for a cat.

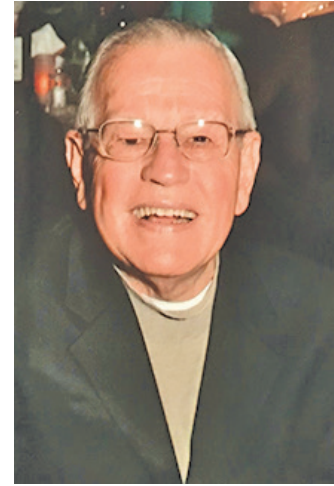

* When baking, you can slow the rising time of dough by placing it in a cool place to rise. You can even let it rise in the refrigerator! Basically, it's done rising when it's doubled in size, so use that as your guide.

* Place individual fabric softener sheets into sneakers to keep them fresh between wearings. You can use this for other shoes, too. Just be aware that the softener sheet should stay inside the shoe; it could discolor certain fabrics on the outside.

* "I have long hair, and it always jams up the shower drain. I tried one of those hair catcher things, but the drain doesn't recess enough. What I did was to cut a piece of stiff screen to fit the drain hole, and I secured it with a hair pin that dangles down. It catches everything. Nothing slips under it, and I can clean it off easily." -- I.R. in Massachusetts

* "It used to be that my kids would do something cute and I'd scramble to dig out the camera, only for the moment to be passed. Now I keep two cameras (digital photos and video camera) charged up and ready to go in a bowl on a high shelf. I grab it and turn it on -- that's it." -- T.F. in Idaho

* When baking savory bread, try substituting vegetable broth for the water in your recipe. It adds a deeper element of flavor to the bread. Just try to use low-sodium broth so you don't add too much salt to your bread.

* "If you have a little one who is afraid of the bedroom because of 'monsters,' try getting your hands on some 'Monster Away Spray.' I used a can of air freshener that I decorated with paper to make a new label. Fooled the kids and eased their fears quickly." -- W.L. in Arkansas

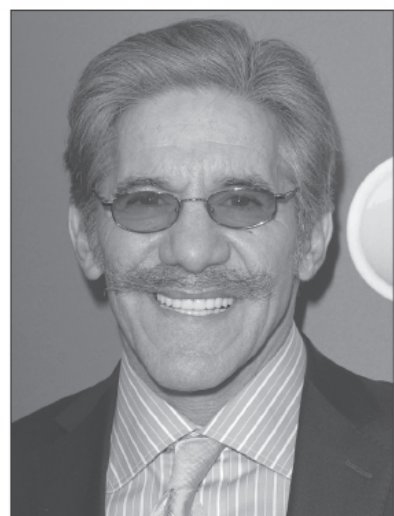

Fresh Peach cobbler



For the filling:

- 8 large fresh peaches, peeled, pitted and sliced
- 1/3 cup organic brown sugar
- 1/3 cup organic sugar
- 1 tsp lemon juice
- 2 tsp corn starch
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp nutmeg

For the topping:

- 1 1/2 cups all purpose flour
- 1/3 cup organic brown sugar
- 1/3 cup organic sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 stick earth balance® butter, cut into small pieces
- 1/3 cup boiling water

Additional topping:

- 4 tsp organic sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp cinnamon

Instructions

Preheat oven to 425°

Peel, remove pits and slice peaches. Add to large mixing bowl.

Sprinkle brown sugar, sugar, cinnamon, corn starch, lemon juice and nutmeg over peaches. Stir until peaches are coated.

Pour into an ungreased 9 x 13 baking dish. Bake for 10 minutes, then remove from oven.

In a medium mixing bowl, whisk flour, sugar, brown sugar, baking powder and salt together. Using a pastry blender, mix butter into flour mixture and blend until mixture becomes crumbly.

Pour in boiling water and stir until combined. Spoon mixture over peaches and spread gently making sure to cover the peaches.

In a small bowl, mix organic sugar and cinnamon together and sprinkle on top of the cobbler.

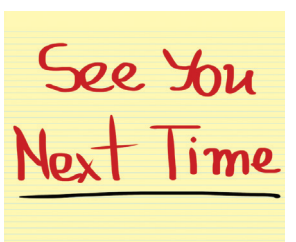

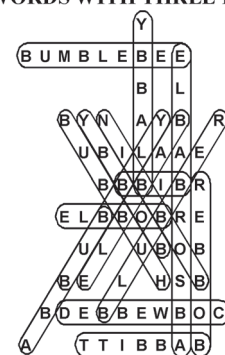
