





Alabama does come with a few challenges, especially when it is a free paper that is mailed to a wide area.

"Without the ability to cover our printing and postage costs with subscription single or copy revenue, we must take every opportunity to keep advertising our low costs while covering huge

areas of the Shoals," said editor and publisher, Tom Magazzu. "Advertisers also have to continue receiving a solid return on their investment."

As a way of reaching as many Shoals area homes as possible, we will begin "feathering" some distribution areas with our August 2 issue. This allows us to offset some of the increased distribution expenses while still reaching a large number of homes with regularity.

The feathering process will actually reach more homes overall since a few areas that were not receiving the paper this year are being reinstated. The only difference is that the feathered areas will be receiving the Courier Journal regularly, but on alternating weeks.

In addition, we have numerous open racks around the Shoals area where a free copy of the *Courier Journal* is always available during a store's business hours.

These include all area Foodland stores, Food Outlet stores in Florence and Central, Hometown Market in Florence, Big Star in St. Florian, HT General Merchandise on Chisholm Hwy, and the Rogersville and Town Creek post offices.

A list of rack locations



also appear in the Courier Journal routinely and it will be updated often.

Regardless, the mailed papers alone will still exceed 50,000 every week.





mountain goats bear their young?" Job 39:1 Uh, no. I do not commence that! I do tend to complain more about people's actions than about God's actions. But it's all tied together.



Proof of auto insurance — that small, usually perforated ID card that arrives in the mail along with your insurance declaration is designed to be slipped into your car's glove compartment. But it can just as easily slip your mind. If it does, and you're stopped for even the most minor infraction, the consequences could run to hundreds of dollars in fines. A digital insurance card can be substituted for the paper card in 49 states, with New Mexico being the exception. It's also a good idea to check with your local Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to help stay informed on proof of insurance card requirements. 

## How to Locate Interesting Volunteer Opportunities in Your Area

For many retirees, finding a volunteer opportunity that meets your interests, utilizes your talents and fits your availability can be challenging. To help you find some interesting and satisfying volunteer opportunities, here are some tips and online tools that can help you search.

#### **Getting Started**

Volunteering is a great way for retirees to make a positive contribution to their community and stay actively engaged, not to mention it's good for your health too. But how can you find the right opportunity for you? Start by asking yourself some basic questions like: What types of organizations or activities are you interested in? What kind of skills can you offer a volunteer organization? How much time are you willing to give? What do you want to gain from your experience (for example, meet new people, learn new skills, help those in need, exposure to a particular issue)?

Once you get a general idea of what you'd like to do, there are dozens of volunteer websites that can help you search for different opportunities in your area and virtually.

Most sites work like search engines that let you choose an area of interest and type in your ZIP code or city and state. The sites will then give you a list of opportunities that you can check into. Depending on your interest and expertise, here are some top websites to help you get started.

General volunteer sites: To find a wide variety of volunteer opportunities in your community that serve causes like children, animals, seniors, education, health, the arts and more check out sites like *VolunteerMatch.org*, Engage. *PointsofLight.org*, *IdeaList.org* and *UnitedWay.org*.

**Retired volunteer sites:** If you're interested in opportunities targeting older adults and retirees, some good options include AARP's *CreateTheGood.org*, along with AmeriCorps Seniors (*AmeriCorps.gov/serve/americorpsseniors*), which matches retirees with community projects and organizations that need experienced volunteer help.

AmeriCorps Seniors offers three different programs: RSVP, which has a variety of volunteer activities with flexible time commitments; the Senior Companion Program that brings together volunteers with homebound seniors who have difficulty with day-to-day living tasks; and the Foster Grandparent Program that matchers volunteers with kids in the community that have exceptional needs.

Niche volunteer sites: There are also a number of niche websites to help you look for specific types of volunteer opportunities in your area. For example, to find natural and cultural volunteer opportunities in places like national and state parks, see *Volunteer.gov*. If you're interested in emergency preparedness and disaster response volunteer services, try Ready.gov or *RedCross.org*. If you have a knack for construction or have an interest in learning about interior design, see *Habitat.org*. Or, if you're interested in longer-term volunteer opportunities check out *AmeriCorps.gov* and *PeaceCorps.gov/50plus*, which offers three-month to two-year programs in the U.S and abroad.

**Professional volunteer sites:** If you have expertise in areas like business planning and development, marketing, communications, finance, fundraising, web and graphic design, or writing and editing there are sites like *Catchafire. org* and *TaprootPlus.org* that can link you to volunteer opportunities with nonprofit organizations in need. Or you can help entrepreneurs and small business owners through the *SCORE.org* volunteer mentoring program.

Manfred loudly proclaimed, "Major League Baseball fundamentally supports voting rights for all Americans and opposes restrictions to the ballot box.'

Did he even read or understand Georgia's law before making that statement, or did he just listen to the political spin put out by Joe Biden, Stacey Abrams, and their ilk? Likely the latter, since he moved the game to Colorado, which ironically had implemented equally stringent election-integrity laws in certain areas, such voter ID and early voting, than Georgia's.

Then there's MLB's horrendous record on partnering with radical LGBTQ+ organizations and promoting their radical ideologies. Most recently, one of MLB's moststoried franchises, the Los Angeles Dodgers, appropriately received widespread backlash over inviting a hate group-the Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence—to its "Pride Night" and bestowing a community "hero" award on it.

The Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence is a group of drag queens who dress up like nuns and put on blasphemous displays. To be sure, it was an egregious example of one MLB team partnering with radical groups. However, it is well-documented that many other teams have quietly engaged in equally egregious conduct. For instance, a National Review article last year showed that "at least 20 teams have promoted or funded groups that advocate or are directly involved in child gender transitions.

And to complete the trifecta, MLB has partnered with and promoted, interests supported by the Chinese Communist Party. In the past several years, companies such as Miken Sports, which the MLB partially owns due to its position in the ownership group of Rawlings, have outsourced jobs to China.

MLB also has aggressively pursued operations and media expansions in China, too. For example, Tony Qi, the managing director of MLB China, has orchestrated deals with large Chinese conglomerates, such as Tencent, by landing broadcasting deals with Tencent Sports and Tencent Video.

The Communist Chinese government has sought to control shares in the company in order to allow it to have a significant say over Tencent's business decisions.

And, of course, MLB continues to do business in and with China despite that government's horrendous record of human rights abuses.

Americans should demand better from the keepers of America's pastime. Regrettably, MLB doesn't seem ready to change its ways. But maybe Americans should demand more from MLB and hold its leadership-and the leadership of each of its teams-accountable until it does.



It sounds like you understand the value of learning about this stuff, and I'm really impressed by that. It's a smart and necessary thing. From here on out, every time you see an investment person—whoever it may be—your goal should be to leave the room smarter, and with more financial understanding, than you had before.

## **Medicare** Minute "4 Parts of Medicare"

Did you know there were four parts to Medicare not two? Did you know that two of the parts you can get through the federal government but the other two parts, if you choose to take them, must be purchased through private insurance companies? This is an excellent website that will tell you everything you want to know about Medicare. You can also refer to the "Medicare and You" handbook.
