



# Lakeland Helps Young Entrepreneur Excel

Michaela Heling is a savvy young entrepreneur, but even she couldn't have predicted her remarkable first year at Lakeland University.



Heling, a business administration major, turned heads this spring by finishing second at The Pitch, a startup business pitch competition among college students in Northeast Wisconsin that was held at Fox Cities Stadium in Appleton, Wis.

She secured one of the two at-large bids in a field of 10 startups from students at schools who are regulars in this annual competition. She's the first Lakeland student to ever compete, and her secondplace finish generated a buzz.

"I was surprised," said Heling, a Sheboygan native and Sheboygan South High School graduate. "I don't think anyone expected that to happen, especially with wellestablished universities there and this being one of the first competitions I have

Heling's startup is Protean Footwear, a softball/baseball shoe with interchangeable metal, molded and turf soles. Heling has played softball most of her life, and, like her fellow players, has always carried multiple pairs of shoes

with different cleats so she's ready for any playing conditions.

"I realized the struggles athletes have putting all their equipment into bags and possibly not being prepared for a game," she said.

Heling's startup, which is already patent pending, saves space and weight in equipment bags and ensures that athletes are prepared for any kind of turf or weather. It also saves money, she said, since her cleats will be less expensive than purchasing three pairs.

"Michaela's idea is an innovative product that has a clear pathway to market that she can explore," said Stephanie Hoskins, Lakeland's Herbert Kohler & Frank Jacobson Chair of Business & Entrepreneurship. "Her initial target market – softball players – is one that she is very familiar with, so that definitely

Protean Footwear was born in the fall in the Intro to Business course taught by Hoskins, who then invited Heling to continue work on the product and develop her pitch this spring in PRO 450, an internship course for entrepreneurial students to work directly with Hoskins to develop a product idea and bring it to market.

Hoskins, a veteran entrepreneur, said Heling's practical idea and access to the course gave her a competitive advantage.

"One of the factors contributing to her success and ability to accomplish so much so quickly is the course and the fact that all of that progress counts towards her grade and is incorporated into the projects assigned," Hoskins said. "Even the application to the pitch competition counted as an assignment toward her weekly hours.

"Several students who were part of the competition made comments about not having the time to do more customer discovery, complete a prototype, look into the market size or to address other early-stage steps."

Heling launched her product website in January and has 17 people on a waitlist for the product. She launched social media pages on Facebook, Instagram and LinkedIn in March. She has started work on a 3-dimensional prototype, product cost and finding a manufacturer.

A motivated student who came to Lakeland with 18 credits thanks to dualcredit courses at South, Heling enrolled at Lakeland because of the business program and the numerous areas of emphasis available.

"It's been a lot of fun," Heling said. "It's interesting to see all the steps that must be taken to get to market. I have a lot of respect for those companies who do bring a product to market.

"This experience also helps reinforce everything I've been learning in the classroom in marketing, accounting and other business concepts. It helps put them in practice right away."

Heling's success is part of the continued evolution of Lakeland's entrepreneurial

Heling is the second of Hoskins' students to successfully develop and pitch a product. In the fall, freshman Ashton Wallace was one of 49 entries to advance to the semifinal round of the 20th annual Wisconsin Governor's Business Plan Contest.

Hoskins is developing an Intro to Entrepreneurship course and an entrepreneurship emphasis. In her role leading Jake's, A Lakeland Community, students have access to entrepreneurial programming throughout the year pitch competitions, grants, accelerators, networking events, etc.

"Lakeland is a very innovative place that can move quickly to meet the needs of students," Hoskins said. "As we identify the students on-campus who are interested in pursuing entrepreneurship, we'll be able to highlight their successes and elevate their ideas so prospective students will be able to recognize the opportunities available at Lakeland."

# June Vollrath Park Going Strong at 20

More than 30 years ago the Elkhart and challenge of available fundraising Lake-Glenbeulah Athletic Association recognized a need for athletic fields in Elkhart Lake for the youth baseball teams that they sponsored which would be comparable to those of other teams they played from neighboring small towns.



The 20th anniversary of June Vollrath Park was celebrated by the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Athletic Association with an entry in the recent Elkhart Lake Parade.

Amenities such as ample parking, cover from the elements and a concession stand were sorely lacking in Elkhart Lake.

In 1992 an informal group of pioneers including the Vollrath family, John Buss, Walter Brand and Chuck Tollman provided the spark which allowed the association to purchase a 22-acre parcel of undeveloped property that was then located in the town of Rhine. Fundraising efforts began for two baseball diamonds, and some of the excavating and architectural work was accomplished in 1997.

sources, in 1998 the association and the Village of Elkhart Lake decided the best way to move forward was to work together, and a plan for the village to acquire the park land was agreed upon. This was beneficial as it then qualified the project for a Department of Natural Resources acquisition grant to provide funding upon the condition it was used for an outdoor community park. In turn, the village created the Parks Commission and a binding agreement was reached where the village would pay the utilities, taxes and insurance, and in return the association would raise the funds to develop the fields and manage the dayto-day functions.

While the ELGAA managed to raise about \$20,000 annually via fundraisers and was able to procure some donations, it was obvious that was going to push a completion date into 2006. But 2001 hit a turning point after several area businessmen joined together-led by Walter Vollrath III-to assist the fundraising committee in securing the further sponsorships necessary to meet the \$700,000 goal, which included the cost of a total sports complex with basketball courts, playground and hiking trails. It was the efforts of this group along with the gracious donations of numerous local businesses and thousands of dollars from individuals that got the project across the finish line after a decade and created what is June Vollrath Park.

Paul Schwaller, ELGAA president at that time, said, "The intentions were to make it more than a ball park to ensure the widest possible community use." Faced with the slow pace of donations He also praised the community for providing unimaginable support, not only businesses and industry, but many local tradesmen who donated labor and worked tirelessly on the project.

The Welcome Center was designed to recognize the donors and volunteers who generously supported the project, and a grand opening was held Aug. 23, 2003. The association recently recognized the 20-year anniversary at their Booster Day and celebrated with complimentary cupcakes to mark the occasion.

Former board member Terri Knowles said, "If you see a sponsor name that is displayed at the park or frequent their business, please be sure to thank them for their contribution to a facility that is going to be there for generations to come."

There were many dedicated parents who served on the board—some over 10 years—to see the project to completion, as well as others who offered their talents for maintenance and upkeep on the fields. Fast forward 20 years: The kids who played the very first games on those fields are in their 30s and actually some ELGAA volunteers now. "It's very rewarding to see that the next generation of parents has continued to offer these sports programs as well as maintain the park as a showcase for Elkhart Lake," Knowles said.

The ELGAA organization continues to sponsor soccer and baseball/softball programs, serving area youths. They also coordinate with the school district to host high school baseball and softball games. It depends solely on volunteers and holds several fundraising events throughout the year to cover the costs of upkeep and maintenance, as well as continuing improvements to the park. To support the organization and its programs, a tax-deductible donation can be sent to P.O. Box 543, Elkhart Lake, or watch for information on the Golf Challenge held at Quit Qui Oc Golf Club in conjunction with the EL-G Education Foundation, scheduled for Oct. 7.



# **DEPOT DISPATCH AUGUST 2023 RECAP OF FIREMAN'S PICNIC & VINTAGE WEEKEND**

The Village of Elkhart Lake has been busy in the month of July. The Firemen held another successful Fireman's Picnic. We have had only positive feedback on the weekend including the magnificent fireworks. Thanks to the firemen and the entire Village for making the weekend

Later in July, it was wonderful to have the Concours d'Elegance in the streets of Elkhart Lake. We had a fun-filled weekend with people lining the streets. A thank you to the Police Department, Public Works Department, Administration Department and Road America for putting together a spectacular event.

We are looking forward to a fabulous August which includes Downtown Night and some race weekends.

### **AUGUST UPCOMING EVENTS**

There will be a few road closures in August. Downtown Night will be held on August 14th, with the normal road closures. On Thursday, August 17th, S. Lake and S. Elm Streets will be closed and there will be no parking due to the parade of the Fanatec GT World Challenge cars. The cars will leave the track at 5:00 pm and be parked downtown on S. Lake and S. Elm Streets. They will parade back to the track at 7:30 pm. The public is encouraged to attend the event.

### **BOATING REGULATIONS**

- 1. A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person
- 2. A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 pm-10 am each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.
- 3. Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.
- 4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.
- 5. All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities must have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed person(s).
- 6. NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the 2nd Sunday of June and ending the 3rd Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.
- 7. There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 m.p.h. on the water.

8. A counter-clockwise course should be maintained while water-skiing, jet skiing, etc., and during the times of high-volume boat

A complete listing of Elkhart Lake and the State of Wisconsin Boating Rules Regulations and Statutes is available at the Village Office in Elkhart Lake.

### **ROAD PROJECT UPDATE**

The Village completed the Lakeshore Road repaving project in July. Work is being completed on engineering for the drainage on Elkhart Lake Drive. Depending on when this is completed, this road project might not be completed until 2024. The Village is looking at potentially doing a couple other roads (Chicago and Osthoff Avenue), if we cannot do Elkhart Lake Drive this year.

### **TID AMENDMENT APPROVED**

The Joint Review Board approved the amendment to TID #2 & TID #4 4 in July. These two amendments would be potentially for additional developments.

### **GENERAL CAPITAL/VAN HORN DEVELOPMENT**

The Planning Commission and Village Board continues meeting about the General Capital and Van Horn Development on the apartment and townhouse development at 604 S. Lincoln Street (the old County property along Highway 67). The project continues to move forward. The Certified Survey Map has been approved, as has a potential new location for Sohn Manufacturing's driveway. The Village Board approved the conditional use permits, but work continues on the development agreements. This project is continuing to move forward with General Capital and Van Horn hoping to break ground in late summer/fall. As par of this development the Village will be installing curb and gutter and sidewalk/multi use path all the way to Badger Road. The Village is also requiring a playground to be included in this development. # YARD WASTE DUMPSTER

### **VILLAGE ORDINANCE - 8.32 ANIMAL FECES**

Any person owning or having control of any animal shall clean up the feces of such animal immediately and dispose of it in a sanitary manner when the animal has defecated on the property of another or on public property. Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, lake street walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property!!

## VILLAGE-WIDE REVALUATION

The Village has not completed a revaluation since 2008. We were out of compliance with State Statutes and needed to complete a revaluation. If you have questions on the value, we request that you call Grota Appraisals at 262-253-1142. Open book was held on June 13th at the Village Hall and the Board of Review was held on July 19th, from 5:00 - 7:00 pm. Property values are increasing an average of 42%, but lake properties are seeing larger increases. Even though your property value may increase that does not automatically mean taxes will increase. The levy limit for the Village still remains the same. We will not be able to tell you what your tax rates will be until late

### **2022 WATER CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT AVAILABLE**

The Village is always testing its water for contaminants. In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the EPA prescribes regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The Elkhart Lake Water Utility annually files a Consumer Confidence Report about the water quality in the Village. Speedway in Fontana, the roval at Charlotte Motor Speedway, and Bristol Motor Speedway.

"Road America is one of the tracks that's at the top of my list," Mayer proudly

Despite facing challenges in previous events at Road America, including a chain-reaction incident in 2021 and a 20th-place finish in 2022, Mayer's unwavering determination fuels his desire to excel at the legendary track. His impressive experience extends beyond NASCAR, having competed in a pair of Trans-Am Series races in a Camaro, securing a remarkable TA2 victory at Road America during the 2021 season.

Preparing for the forthcoming race, Mayer is well aware of the changes that have taken place at Road America. The track underwent a significant resurfacing project in October 2022, including pit lane, fine grading, a new base layer, and a brand-new final surface asphalt layer. The first repaving since 1995 promises a faster and more challenging track, requiring precise car setup and driving

Mayer anticipates that the track will be exceptionally fast, and he and his crew chief, Taylor Moyer, are leaving no stone unturned in fine-tuning their car setup for the race.

"On the driver's side, it's going to be fast," Mayer confidently expresses. "We're going to be hauling the mail around that place. It's going to be tons of fun, and I'm looking forward to seeing what it provides for these XFINITY cars."

He also recognizes the challenges that await his team. Nevertheless, he trusts in their resources and expertise to ensure they perform exceptionally well from the moment they hit the track.

Even amidst the demanding schedule, Mayer intends to cherish time with family and friends during his visit to Elkhart Lake, where Road America is located.

Mayer's eyes light up with enthusiasm when asked about his favorite section of the track. "I love the back section around Canada Corner," he shares. "You take Canada Corner, and you kind of go up the hill through the esses right there."

For Mayer, stringing together a strong lap at the 14-turn track is challenging. He highlights the importance of precise braking, optimizing braking power, and downforce in the XFINITY cars. Additionally, he emphasizes the need to avoid spinning the tires on the exit, as the track can be notoriously slick.

As Sam Mayer gears up for the NASCAR XFINITY Series race at Road America, fans and fellow racers eagerly await to witness his road-course prowess on display once again.

The NASCAR XFINITY Series weekend will be jammed with on-track and off-track action as the Porsche Carrera Cup, OPTIMA Ultimate Street Car Challenge, and GRIDLIFE will also be on the schedule. There will also be open karting and Super Moto at the Briggs & Stratton Motorplex.
