New no-till drill available to rent

The Cass and Crow Wing Soil and Water Conservation Districts have purchased a native seed drill which can be rented out by landowners. The Truax 7516

drill has a 10-foot planting width and can plant things like cover crops, native prairie, and pasture

mixes. It can be planted directly into wheat stubble, soybean residue, pasture, or corn stalks. The Crow Wing and Cass SWCD's goal is to make equipment more readily available to landowners considering soil health practices. Instead of one landowner purchasing a drill for their operation, this can be used by many and allow landowners to try these practices without fully


committing purchase to a \$50,000 piece of equipment. "This is a real opportunity for landowners to rent this piece of equipment and to see how it could work into their operations on items like cover crops," said Crow Wing SWCD District Technician Adam Maleski.

The Drill will be rented out at \$14.00/acre + \$200 down deposit is required when renting the drill. The deposit

will be returned when the drill is returned in satisfactory condition. Landowners that fall within the Pine River Watershed (reference map below) would receive first priority.

The Truax drill will be located at Hunt Utilities Group Campus in Pine River.

READER RIBBETS Rep. Ben Davis legislative update

[As of]Aug. 1, a whole new round of laws passed by the Democrat trifecta earlier this year [took] effect.

These new laws are not to be confused with the ones related to our state budget that took effect July 1 and included some of the \$10 billion in tax increases Democrats put into law despite a \$17.5 billion surplus.

These Aug. 1 laws are related to policy and include some of the hyper-partisan agenda the Democrat trifecta pushed this year. Some of the extreme changes they made already are in effect, including legislation allowing a 13-year-old girl to become legally sterilized at an unlicensed abortion clinic without parental consent or knowledge and repealing the Born Alive Act.

Here is a look at just some of what does become law as of today:

• Adult-use cannabis legalized, and prior low-level cannabis convictions expunged. Adults aged 21 or older can possess or publicly transport 2 ounces of adult-use cannabis flower, and up to 8 grams of cannabis concentrates. Adults can also possess up to 2 pounds of adult-use cannabis flower in their home. Penalties are established for violating possession limits, making illegal cannabis sales, selling to a minor, and exceeding personal cultivation limits. Criminal records of Minnesotans with petty misdemeanor and misdemeanor cannabis convictions will begin to be expunged. Although the records are not destroyed, they are removed from public view and will not appear in criminal background

checks. • Statement of faith re-

quirement removed from PSEO. Higher education institutions participating in the postsecondary enrollment option program (PSEO) for high school students will no longer be allowed to require a faith statement from applicants for admission. House Republicans fought hard against this provision, which now is the subject of a lawsuit. While this law officially takes effect Aug. 1, a judge already has ordered state officials to not enforce it pending the outcome of this case.

• Universal Background Checks. Private transfers of pistols and semiautomatic weapons without a firearms eligibility background check will be prohibited. A gun purchaser will be required to apply for a permit to carry first. Private transfers must complete a record of transfer which includes detailed information about the weapon and individuals involved. Violent crime remains abnormally high in our state and must be addressed. But this new law seems to place more of a burden on law-abiding citizens than deter bad actors. We could do much better to rid our state of senseless shootings by enforcing current laws and adhering to sentencing guidelines to stop the revolving door in our courts. (Side note: The Red Flag firearm confiscation law does not take effect until Jan. 1, 2024.)

While there certainly were controversial, radical provisions placed into law this year, others received more broad support, including:

• Increased penalties for

catalytic converter thefts. The new law prohibits the possession of a detached catalytic converter with a few narrow exceptions and provides that individuals found with illegally acquired detached catalytic converters could be charged with up to a felony.

• New labor trafficking law. A new law creates a new crime of labor trafficking that results in death with a maximum penalty of 25 years in prison and a \$40,000 fine. It also creates enhanced penalties for labor trafficking a person over an extended period or when a labor trafficking victim suffers great bodily harm because of the trafficking. This crime could be punished by up to 20 years in prison and a \$40,000 fine if the victim is under age 18, labor trafficking occurs over an extended period, or the victim suffers great bodily harm, and the harm was proximately caused by the labor trafficking conduct of the offender.

• Permitting electronic signatures on wills. A new law allows a will to be witnessed and, where allowed, electronically notarized and completed.



The Minnesota Insulin Safety Net Program was created in 2020 to help Minnesotans who face difficulty affording their insulin. During the 2023 legislative session, the Minnesota Legislature made important changes to the program that will improve access to this drug for undocumented Minnesotans who are struggling to afford their insulin.

> The urgent need program is for Minnesotans who are in immediate need of assistance - that is, they have less than a seven-day supply of insulin and will likely face significant health consequences without it. Eligible residents will receive a 30-day supply of insulin right away at a pharmacy and pay no more than a \$35 co-pay, one time per year. The pharmacist also will share helpful resources that cover how to apply for health insurance and how to access other patient assistance or prescription drug discount programs.

> The continuing need program supports eligible Minnesotans who need longer-term help to receive up to a year supply of insulin for no more than \$50 per 90-day refill. MNsure-certified navigators offer free help applying for the continuing need program, and help is available in multiple languages including Hmong, Somali, Spanish,

Russian, and Vietnamese.
